Pursuant to the authority contained in Section 214 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Government of the United States of America, acting through the Agency for International Development (hereinafter referred to as "A.I.D."), hereby makes a grant of Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) to the American Friends of Maru a Pula School, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Grantee") to be used solely for the benefit of the Maru a Pula School located in Gaborone, Botswana, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Appendices hereto attached and made part of this grant, as follows: Appendix A (Special Provisions), and Appendix B (General Provisions; (2) Procurement of Construction Services, (3) Procurement of Commodities, (5b) Disbursement Procedures for Periodic Advances, (6) Administrative and Other Provisions).

This grant is to cover authorized expenditures incurred from the date of execution of this grant and ending June 30, 1985.

APPENDIX A
SPECIAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE I - PURPOSE OF THE GRANT

1. Under Section 214 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 as amended, the United States Government is authorized to provide assistance to schools outside the United States, sponsored by United States citizens and serving as study and demonstration centers for ideas and practices of the United States.

2. Grantee, a non-profit organization, incorporated in 1974 in the State of Delaware, sponsors the Maru a Pula School. Americans were involved in the founding of the school in 1972.

3. The Maru a Pula School is committed to providing coeducational secondary academic programs of high quality. The school demonstrates that a multi-racial educational program can be successful in southern Africa.

4. Grantee has requested assistance to construct science laboratories and classrooms to accommodate increased enrollment. A.I.D. has determined that \$550,000 should be provided for these purposes.

ARTICLE II - AUTHORIZED EXPENDITURES

Except as otherwise approved by A.I.D. in writing, the \$550,000 provided by this grant shall be expended as follows:

Procurement of services and commodities for the construction of science laboratories and classrooms totalling approximately 7,300 square feet. Cost of commodity related services, such as shipping, insurance and installation, are allowable under the grant.

ARTICLE III - OTHER SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. Cost Sharing

A portion of the funds necessary to construct the additional facilities to complete the expansion program described in the FY 1984 application will be raised by the Grantee and the school from sources other than the Government of the United States of America.

2. Customs, Duties and Taxes

Funds provided by this grant shall not be used to pay any value added tax, import tax or duties on commodities imported to Botswana for this project.
