

1. Pursuant to Section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, I hereby authorize the centrally-funded project, Global AIDS Prevention and Control Program, involving planned obligations not to exceed \$1,150,000 in grant funds over a one-year period from the date of authorization, subject to the availability of funds in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process.

2. The project will provide grant funds to the World Health Organization (WHO) in Geneva to finance the development of a global program to prevent and control AIDS.

ACTION MEMORANDUM FOR THE AGENCY DIRECTOR FOR HEALTH

SUBJECT: Approval of a New Project--Global AIDS Prevention and Control Program (936-5965)

Problem: Your approval is required to authorize a new project, Global AIDS Prevention and Control Program, to provide funding to the World Health Organization (WHO) in Geneva. Grant funds of up to \$1,150,000 for a one-year project will finance the development of a global program to prevent and control AIDS.

Discussion: Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) is increasingly recognized as an extremely serious public health problem. AIDS and LAV/HTLV-III infection have been identified as an international health concern with the potential of becoming a major barrier to the goal of health for all by the year 2000. In the face of the continuing increase in the cases of AIDS worldwide and the potential drain of country health resources, WHO has assumed an active role as the lead agency on AIDS. A consensus regarding the fundamental components of AIDS control has emerged from a series of consultations and meetings with Directors of the WHO network of Collaborating Centers. The principal components are:

- o Exchange of information;
- o Preparation and distribution of guidelines, manuals, educational materials for the public, etc.;
- o Assessment of commercially available LAV/HTLV-III antibody test kits; development of a simple, inexpensive test for field application; and establishment of WHO reference reagents;
- o Cooperation with Member States in the development of national programs/actions for the containment of LAV/HTLV-III infection;
- o Advice to Member States on the provision of safe blood and blood products;
- o Coordination of research, in particular on: (1) the development of therapeutic agents and vaccines; and (2) simian retroviruses.

This activity is part of a larger package of assistance being planned for WHO. The Africa Bureau is providing \$1.0 million to the WHO Office in Africa to strengthen its AIDS response capabilities throughout Africa.

This action approves funding for the S&T Bureau's participation in the program of assistance to the WHO Office in Geneva and is pursuant to the Administrator's approval of Agency policy on AIDS, dated June 6, 1986 and his subsequent news release of June 13, 1986 entitled "U.S. AID ASSISTS WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION TO CONTROL GLOBAL AIDS".

\$1.0 million of the required funds is available in the S&T/Health FY 1986 OYB. Additional funds totaling approximately \$150,000 will be provided by The National Institutes of Health's National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) and National Cancer Institute (NCI) through an Interagency Agreement currently in process.

WHO estimates the total cost for the 1986-87 global control activities to be approximately \$2,596,500 over and above the \$1,150,000 committed by WHO for the Headquarters Control Program. In addition to the funding proposed to be provided by A.I.D. and NIAID and NCI, pledges have been made by Sweden, Belgium and Germany.

In accordance with Agency policy set forth in Handbook 1, Supplement B, Chapter 16, Paragraph 16 C III(2), A.I.D. will rely on WHO audit and procurement policies and procedures since A.I.D. is not the only donor to the program.

An Advice of Program Change to Congress is in process.

Recommendation: That you approve this project by signing the attached project authorization.
