SUBJECT: MEDEX NURSCARE Project

Problem: Your approval is required to authorize the MEDEX NURSCARE Project, 936-5932, for a period of five years at an estimated Life of Project amount of \$6 million including \$3.5 million of S&T Bureau funding and \$2.5 million of buy-ins. An obligation of \$640,000 is planned for FY 1989. The Project Assistance Completion Date will be November 30, 1994.

Discussion: The MEDEX NURSCARE Project is a follow on to nurse training activities in Kenya and Costa Rica by MEDEX under the current MEDEX Support Contract funded by S&T/Health over the past three years. MEDEX has worked with the development of pre-service (basic) nursing curriculum in Kenya and in developing in-service training in Costa Rica. Both programs feature the use of competency based instructional methods in which MEDEX specializes.

Project activities will focus on strengthening nursing training in child survival and maternal health, and in management for primary health care service delivery. The project will work in Kenya, Costa Rica, and up to four other Child Survival emphasis countries in Africa and Latin America. Project activities will not be carried out in any country which is subject to a statutory prohibition on assistance.

The NURSCARE Project directly supports and complements other child survival activities in the S&T Portfolio. Nurses represent the largest number of trained health personnel in developing countries and carry the major responsibility for the delivery of primary health care services. However most nurses in LDCs continue to be trained in outdated curricula that emphasizes hospital based curative care, and are not well prepared for the delivery of primary health care or maternal/child interventions. The NURSCARE Project will work with nurse faculties in Africa and Latin America to revise nursing curricula so that it is more relevant to the needs of the health care services. The project will also assist nursing leaders in developing administrative and management skills to further strengthen the delivery of health services in primary care.

The NURSCARE Project will be managed by S&T/Health. The University of Hawaii MEDEX Group will implement the project under a non-competitive Cooperative Agreement, based on MEDEX's successful and unique training methodology in Primary Health Care for nurses and mid-level health workers. The MEDEX Group is expected to contribute approximately \$1 Million to the cost of the project over its five year estimated life.

Evaluation: The project will be subject to one external evaluation scheduled at the end of the third year.

Justification to the Congress: An Advice of Program Change is being prepared.

Recommendation: That you sign the attached project authorization approving the NURSCARE Project for a five year period with a life of project funding of \$3.5 million in central S&T/Health and Child Survival funds. \$2.5 million in Health, Nutrition, and Child Survival funds will be provided through Mission and Regional Bureau buy-ins.

PROJECT AUTHORIZATION

Name of Country: Interregional
Project Title: MEDEX
Project Number: 936-5932

1. Pursuant to Section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, I hereby authorize the MEDEX NURSCARE Project, involving centrally funded planned obligations of \$3.5 million over a five year period from the date of authorization, subject to the availability of funds, in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process, to help in financing foreign exchange and local currency costs for the project. Additional funding in the amount of \$2.5 million may be provided to the project by other A.I.D. Bureaus and Missions.

2. Funds authorized under Section 104 Health and under the Child Survival Program may be used without regard to authorized dollar limits for each appropriation so long as the total authorization of \$6,000,000 for the project is not exceeded. Allocations between these accounts may be established according to the annual OYB process.

3. The project will support A.I.D.'s worldwide efforts in training to achieve Agency objectives in health and child survival.

4. The agreements(s) which may be negotiated and executed by the officer(s) to whom such authority is delegated in accordance with A.I.D. regulations and Delegations of Authority shall be subject to the following terms and conditions, together with such other terms and conditions as A.I.D. may deem appropriate.

5. Source and Origin of Commodities, Nationality of Services

a. Commodities financed by A.I.D. under the project shall have their source and origin in the cooperating country(*) or the United States. Except for ocean shipping, the suppliers of commodities or services shall have the cooperating country or the United States as their place of nationality, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing.

b. Ocean shipping financed by A.I.D. under the project shall, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing, be financed only on flag vessels of the United States.
