1. Grant Cover Letter, Page 1, Paragraph 1, REPLACE "\$2,345,180" WITH "\$3,745,180".
2. Grant Cover Letter, Page 1, Paragraph 2, REPLACE "November 15, 1989" WITH "June 30, 1990".
3. Grant Cover Letter, Page 2, under Fiscal Data, ADD the following:

4. Page 3, Attachment 1, Schedule, A. Purpose of Grant, ADD Paragraph 3. as follows:

"From July 1, 1989 to June 30, 1990 the Grantee will begin to implement a plan which will allow careful transition of components of its program into the Ministry of Health of the Interim Government of Afghanistan. Throughout the projected transition period, the Grantee will continue to retrain paramedics at the Thal training site. Trainees will be selected from areas of existing clinics to supplement current clinic staff and to compensate for a natural attrition rate especially as normalcy returns to Afghanistan. The following program objectives are expected to be met:

1. 50 paramedics will be retrained at Thal. The Chitral training site will be phased out. Training of new paramedics will cease, and there will be no further expansion in numbers of clinics (Poorly sited clinics may be closed).
2. Training will shift to an increased emphasis on primary health care problems of a civilian population. Trauma management will continue to be stressed due to the continuing war condition as well as the potential for mine injuries as refugees return home. A mine awareness program will be included in the paramedic refresher training.
3. Lab facilities at Thal will be upgraded to service the hospital and outpatient departments.
4. Evaluation and debriefing time for paramedics returning for resupply will be shortened with one physician administrator overseeing the medical skills evaluation process. This streamlining will cut costs, free staff time for retraining of paramedics, and speed the return of paramedics to Afghanistan.
5. A model for mid-level supervision of clinic staff inside Afghanistan will be outlined by the Grantee and the Afghan Interim Government representative.

- 6) The Grantee will begin implementation of a 2-year (plus) model plan to transfer program components to the Afghan Interim Government (AIG). An inter-organizational management team composed of representatives from the Ministry of Public Health and the Grantee will oversee a planning phase in which program elements to be transferred will be defined. The Grantee will provide technical assistance to the A.I.G. to facilitate incorporation of program components into the A.I.G. (See FM revised grant proposal, 6/15/1989).

To facilitate supervision of health personnel, the Grantee will reduce the number of clinics it operates in Afghanistan to approximately 100. This will be effected through relocation of a number of clinics, consolidation of personnel and more efficient use of health care resources. Placement of clinics will reflect population need based on interagency mapping data. Elimination of lightly used or poorly located clinics will reduce recurrent costs and permit better deployment of staff inside Afghanistan."
