AGREEMENT

between

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

and

EASTERN JAMAICA TRIPLE BASIC SCHOOL/COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT

Authority: Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the General Agreement for Economic, Technical and Related Assistance of October 24, 1963, and in accordance with the General Agreement on Special Development Assistance between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of Jamaica dated March 31, 1978, and the Standard Provisions annexed to this Individual Activity Agreement (IAA).

Maximum dollar amount of U.S. Grant: \$18,000

Terminal date for completion of project: 1 Year after date of agreement

Description of Activity: These three basic schools and one community center will be treated as one project since they need similar assistance and have the same sponsor, Fred M. Jones Estates Ltd. The three schools, Manchioneal and Hectors River (formerly Seaside Basic School) which are situated in Portland, and Amity Hall which is situated in St. Thomas, serve similar socio-economically depressed farming communities. The schools were built in cooperation with Fred M. Jones Estates and other donors like the Women's League in Hectors River, the Sugar Welfare Board and the Social Development Commission. The buildings are also used as community centers for training activities sponsored by the Ministry of Youth. The Community Center at Manchioneal is situated on the same premises as the basic school and was also built through the cooperative efforts of Fred M. Jones Estates and the Social Development Commission. All the schools and the community center were in a state of delapidation for some time, and the problem was further exacerbated by the recent hurricane. Assistance needed in the three schools and the community center is similar and USAID funds will be used to assist with refurbishing the four buildings and procuring classroom and home economics equipment.

U.S. Contribution: USAID will provide \$4,500 to each school and the community center for refurbishing the buildings and procuring classroom and home economics equipment.

Local Contribution: The project will be coordinated by Fred M. Jones Estate and implemented by Committees from the three communities. The communities will supply labor and will continue in small fund raising ventures. The management of the project will be coordinated by the office staff of the estate nearest to each school and the community center. The Ministry of Youth will assist these schools and the community center through their new project for revitalising community centers. The Van Leer Foundation has committed assistance to the basic schools.

Attachment #1 to Individual Activity Agreement No.:

STANDARD PROVISIONS FOR
SPECIAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE

- A. USAID shall expend funds and carry on operations pursuant to this agreement only in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations of the United States Government.
- B. The parties shall have the right at any time to observe operations carried out under this agreement. Either party during the term of an activity under this agreement and until three years after the completion of the activity, shall further have the right:
1. To examine any property procured through financing by that party under this agreement, wherever such property is located, and
 2. To inspect and audit any records and accounts with respect to funds provided by, or any properties and contract services procured through financing by, that party under this agreement, wherever such records may be located and maintained. USAID as the financing party reserves the rights of examination, inspection and audit whenever arrangements for the disposal of any property procured with its funds, are being made.
- C. Any property furnished through financing pursuant to this agreement shall, unless otherwise agreed by the United States Government, be devoted to the project until completion of the project, and thereafter shall be used so far as to further the objectives sought in carrying out the project. Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the United States Government, the recipient shall offer to return to the United States Government, or to reimburse the United States for, any property which it obtains through financing by the United States Government pursuant to this agreement which is not used in accordance with the preceding sentence.
- D. This IAA shall enter into force when signed. All or part of the assistance provided herein may be terminated by either party by giving the other party 30 days written notice of intention to terminate agreement. Termination of the agreement shall terminate any obligations of the two parties, except for payments which they are committed to make pursuant to noncancellable commitments entered into with third parties prior to termination of the IAA.
- E. It is expressly understood that all implementing documents, such as purchase orders, requisitions, procurement actions, etc., must be initiated under this obligating Individual Activity Agreement not later than three months from the effective date of the agreement. Paid invoices for goods purchased under the agreement and a status report will be submitted not later than the end of the fourth month after the Agreement enters into force. A final report will be submitted upon completion of the project but not later than 12 months from the effective date.
- F. The recipient agrees to provide adequate management for the project and report to USAID any problems involved in implementing the project.
- G. All commodities procured under this Grant should be purchased 'off the shelf' and must be from the Limited Free World Source.
