Dear Mr. Floden:

Pursuant to the authority contained in the United States Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Agency for International Development ("A.I.D.") hereby grants US\$222,000 to the Save the Children Federation ("SCF" or "Grantee") for expenses during the first year of operation of a three-year project which is summarized below and more fully described in Annex A entitled "Project Description". The purpose of the project is to enable SCF to collaborate with the Government of Ecuador's Integrated Rural Development Secretariat ("SEDRI") and with the community organizations UPOCAM and the Cabildo Mayor of Cusubamba in the development, testing, implementation, and evaluation of a model process of self-sustaining community development in the IRD areas of Salcedo and Jipijapa.

This Grant and the initial obligation of US\$222,000 are effective as of the date of the signed acceptance of this Letter Grant Agreement by a duly authorized representative of SCF and shall terminate three years thereafter. They will apply only to commitments made by SCF in furtherance of the program objectives as described in Annex A. Additional financing for the project, up to a total amount of US\$499,500, will be provided in increments expected during fiscal years 1984 and 1985. Such increments will be subject to the availability of funds to A.I.D. and to the mutual agreement of the parties, at the time of subsequent increments, to proceed with the implementation of the project.

This Grant is made to SCF on condition that the funds will be administered in accord with the terms and conditions set forth

ANNEX A

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

1. Purpose of the Grant

The purpose of the grant is to develop, test, and implement a model process of self-sustaining community development in the Integrated Rural Development areas of Salcedo and Jipijapa. This model process can be described as the strengthening of community organizations.

2. Specific Objectives

SCF will achieve this purpose by coordinating community planning, implementation, and evaluation of activities responding to community-identified needs in agricultural production, health and nutrition, and cultural revitalization through two second-level community organizations*: the Cabildo Mayor in the parish of Cusubamba in the Salcedo IRD area and UPOCAM in the Jipijapa IRD area.

SCF will coordinate these activities with both base and second-level organizations through the application of a four-point methodology emphasizing the following:

- a. Social Promotion: the initial confrontation by communities of their problems and consideration of how to solve them in the context of their own culture and resources;
- b. Needs-based training: the continuation of the promotion phase, emphasizing the more detailed articulation of needs and the provision of the organizational and skills training necessary to meet them;
- c. Project Implementation: the implementation of activities emphasizing the use of appropriate technology and local resources to solve the problems defined in (a) and (b) above and to provide community groups with 'hands-on' experience in project implementation; and,
- d. Interinstitutional coordination: the establishment, in the course of implementing project activities, of linkages between the second-level organizations and other public and private resource providers in the Salcedo and Jipijapa IRD areas.

*-level organization is composed of representatives of organizations formed by individual communities.

It is hypothesized that the application of this methodology in the design and implementation of the activities noted in the first paragraph of this section will not only improve the quality of community life, but also fundamentally strengthen the base and, especially, the second-level organizations to analyze community problems and mobilize local resources to solve them, independent of external assistance. It is also expected that such application will be useful as a model for effective and culturally acceptable technical and financial assistance which other Ecuadorian and international agencies can utilize for future community-development efforts.

Given that the determination of individual activities will be made by the communities through the application of the methodology noted above, only illustrative examples of these activities are noted below.

- I. Cultural revitalization - Seminars, classes on local history, promotion of local artisanship, community newsletters: all aimed at the rediscovery of community identity and useful traditional values.

- II. Health/Nutrition - Promotion of Potable Water/Sanitation.
 - Community/school gardens.
 - Health/nutrition education.
 - Integration of traditional and occidental medicine.

- III. Production:
 - Construction of Appropriate Technology/Community Centers.
 - Improved agricultural practices and production.
 - Crop diversification.
 - Assistance in obtaining legal title to land, water rights.
 - Food processing.
 - Renewable energy projects (wind, solar, animal power, controlled-burn stoves).
 - Small industries.

When concluded, the project will have evolved two second-level organizations with increased capacities to assist their members to identify problems and to plan, implement, and evaluate projects which mobilize local resources to solve them.

3. Implementation

SCF will employ the four-point methodology to assist the base and second-level organizations to plan, implement, and

evaluate activities of the type listed above. SCF will program these activities, in as much detail as possible given that final decisions will be made by the communities, via three yearly operating plans and budgets in which the activities will be described, scheduled, and costed. To facilitate subsequent evaluations, the individual objectives of these activities should be defined as clearly as possible. These plans will be approved by SEDRI in consultation with the local IRD Executive Units and, as appropriate, by IEOS, INERMI, and the Health Area Chiefs prior to their submission to USAID for approval. USAID may, at its discretion, withhold future increments of funding until it has approved such plans.

4. Reporting Requirements and Evaluations

Fiscal reporting requirements are set forth in Annex C, "Budget and Payment Provisions".

As to program reporting requirements, SCF will submit progress reports to USAID every three months describing progress attained in the project, delays encountered, remedial actions required, and activities scheduled during the next quarter. USAID's grant officer should receive the first of these reports by September 15, 1983 and subsequent reports in approximately three month intervals thereafter.

There will be evaluations at the end of the first year and a half of the project and on the completion of the project. They will be jointly conducted (with the exception of point 9 below) by representatives of SCF, the second degree organizations, SEDRI, and, at its option, USAID and/or its delegate. These evaluations will focus on (1) the project's success in implementing activities as planned, (2) the use of local resources and appropriate technology in implementing those activities; (3) the success of the activities in meeting their objectives, (4) the degree of community participation in their implementation, (5) the nature and efficacy of such participation, (6) the degree of interinstitutional coordination effected in the implementation of the activities, and (7) progress of the second-level organizations in stimulating both the community-based identification of problems and the planning, implementation and evaluation of measures to solve them, (8) the adoption of the SCF model by other institutions, and (9) the progress attained in institutionalizing SCF in Ecuador. To facilitate the evaluation of point 7 above, and to attain a more precise knowledge of the institutional weakness of the second-level organizations, SCF will perform a baseline study describing their capacity to work with their members as noted. This study will be submitted to AID within three months of SCF's signature of the grant agreement.

5. Other

- a. Matching Grant Funds. No funds available to SCF/Ecuador from any matching grant signed between SCF and A.I.D. will be used for any activity promoted or undertaken by the two second-level organizations to be strengthened under this grant or for any activity undertaken by SCF whose principal purpose is to strengthen or assist these organizations or base organizations in Salcedo or Tipijapa.
- b. Institutionalization of SCF in Ecuador. Beginning after the second year of the project, SCF will report yearly and in writing to USAID on the progress attained in institutionalizing SCF as a legally established Ecuadorean institution.
- c. The priority of pilot nutrition activities. SCF will accord a high priority to the design and implementation of pilot nutrition activities under the health and production components of the project.

6. USAID Grant Officer

Until further notice, Mr. J. L. Anderson, Assistant Health Officer, will be the Grant Officer. Mr. Anderson will discharge his responsibilities in close coordination with Dr. Fausto Maldonado of USAID's Rural Development Office.

ANNEX D

ASSURANCE OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE AGENCY FOR
INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT REGULATION UNDER TITLE VI

If any personal property is so provided, this assurance shall obligate the Grantee for the period during which it remains ownership or possession of the property. In all other cases, this assurance shall obligate the Grantee for the period during which the Federal financial assistance is extended to it by the Agency.

THIS ASSURANCE is given in consideration of and for the purpose of obtaining any and all Federal grants, loans, contracts, property, discounts, or other Federal financial assistance extended after the date hereof to the Grantee by the Agency, including installment payments after such date on account of applications for Federal financial assistance which were approved before such date. The Grantee recognizes and agrees that such Federal financial assistance will be extended in reliance on the representations and agreements made in this assurance, and that the United States shall have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance. This assurance is binding on the Grantee, its successors, transferees, and assignees, and the person or persons whose signatures appear below are authorized to sign this assurance of behalf of the Grantee.





Dear Eng. Floden:

Pursuant to the authority contained in the United States Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the original Letter Grant Agreement between the Agency for International Development (A.I.D.) and Save the Children Federation (SCF) is hereby amended to a) extend on-going activities; b) implement new activities as outlined in Attachment No. 1; c) extend the PACD from May 30, 1986 to May 30, 1988; and d) to provide additional funding. The amount of additional funds is US\$~~155,000~~ increasing the total amount of A.I.D. funding to US\$653,800.00.

The additional increment of funds and extension of PACD are based on our review of progress to-date and conclusion that implementation of this Grant is progressing satisfactorily.

It is recognized by both SCF and USAID that Institutional Development of community organizations is a slow process, requiring a minimum of 5 years before the community organizations targeted for development under this grant are able to manage developmental activities on their own.

New activities are to be implemented with an increased number of rural families (2,000) ie. Employment generation, income generation (hand-crafts), literacy training and credit for small farmers to increase agricultural production. Nutritional improvement home/community gardens will also be promoted to complement the SCF/DJC Child Survival Grant activities. Attachment No. 1 "Project Description Amendment", describes the new and on-going project activities to be implemented, this attachment becomes incorporated into the overall Grant Agreement.



PROJECT DESCRIPTION

I. Introduction.

Save the Children Federation (SCF) on May 20, 1983 signed a three year \$499,900 OPG funded by USAID/E to develop, test and implement a model for community-based development through two second degree organizations in two Integrated Rural Development (DRI) areas - Salcedo, Cotopaxi and Jipijapa, Manabí. The purpose was to be achieved by strengthening two secondary level organizations - Cabildo Mayor in Cusubamba and Comité de Gestión in Jipijapa - to implement needs-based activities identified by the communities in agricultural production, nutrition/health services, income generation, cultural revitalization. In addition, institutional development of SCF in Ecuador - Desarrollo Juvenil Comunitario - was to take place. SCF/DJC has requested a two year extension of the Project with add-on funding of US\$220,000, to consolidate and extend the outreach of the project.

In November/December 1984 an evaluation was conducted at mid point of the project. The evaluation determined that the project had achieved 50% of the defined outputs and recommended that the project PACD be extended.

II. Description of Project Activities during the Extension.

The purpose and objectives of the extension are as follows:

1. To consolidate the community-based developmental model and extend the coverage of the project to other areas (4,000 additional families). Implementation of the developmental model is a slow process.

The two community organizations (Cabildo Mayor and Comité de Gestión) are not yet capable of "going it alone". An extension is recommended to assure that developmental activities will continue in the two areas in agricultural production, health/nutrition, income generation, gainful employment, literacy and others.

2. Agricultural production increase.

The Cabildo Mayor and the Comité de Gestión in Jipijapa are only very recently initiating the handling of credit loans to farmers. In Salcedo DJC has just instituted disengagement from direct involvement in project activities and is limiting its role to the provision of technical assistance. In Jipijapa

the development model is further behind. The Comité de Gestión needs at least two more years to develop institutional development strengths. In summary, an extension of the OPG is essential if Salcedo and Jipijapa small farmers are to impact on increased agricultural production.

3. Health/Nutrition.

Health/Nutrition status in the two areas has not improved significantly since the initiation of the OPG. Infrastructure is, however, in place & specific health/nutrition interventions have been defined for implementation in the immediate future. SCF has identified specific activities: School lunch, home and community gardens. The newly approved SCF/DJC Child Survival project will complement the activities with oral rehydration, immunizations, growth monitoring and nutrition education interventions. As a result, within the next two years measurable impact on the health/nutrition status of families in the two areas will be accomplished.

4. Income Generation.

Native crafts are to be identified, improved, promoted and marketed. Women and youth groups will be trained to produce quality crafts for income generation of families. This is a new activity to be initiated in the extension.

5. Gainful Employment Training.

Gainful employment training opportunities have been identified in the two areas for implementation during the extension.

6. Increase literacy.

Functional literacy has been identified as a problem in both DRI areas. Literacy classes would be initiated to provide community members with literacy skills during the two year extension.

7. Cultural Revitalization.

Training in organizational skills to facilitate community level problem-solving will be provided leaders of the Cabildo Mayor in Salcedo and the Comité de Gestión in Jipijapa. The training is essential if strengthening of the two organizations is to be effective. The project extension would bring this about.

8. Institutionalization of 'Desarrollo Juvenil Comunitario.

The institutionalization of DJC as a legal Ecuadorean Private Voluntary Organization (PVO) was stressed as an important OPG objective. No progress has been made to-date. A Condition Precedent to approval of the extension of the OPG is that this objective be met. It is recommended that DJC obtain Personería Jurídica status in the immediate future. DJC would thus, upon the completion of the OPG be established to follow through on project accomplish'ments for the long range future.

III. Financial Analysis.

SCF/DJC estimates an unexpended balance of \$45,700.00 of AID OPG funds by May 30, 1985. These funds will be applied in the extension. SCF/DJC has requested an additional \$174,300.00 to make a total of \$220,000.00 for the two year extension. The request is considered too high for the following reasons:

1. SCF/DJC has been approved for a US\$548,700.00 three year Child Survival OPG Grant that will cover a portion of the administrative costs (the Manabí SCF/DJC Field Team will be responsible for both projects).
2. SCF/DJC receives matching grant funding from Redd Barna Norway.
3. Total funding recommended is \$200,000.00 as follows:

Adjunto encontrará usted debidamente firmada la carta de la referencia, - mediante la cual la AID aprueba la extensión de las actividades por dos años (~~mayo 1986 - mayo 1988~~) que Save the Children (SCF) realiza en Salcedo y Jipijapa, a la vez que provee de US\$ 155,000.00 como fondos adicionales al OPG que por US\$ 499,900.00 SCF firmó con la AID el 20 de mayo de 1983.
