LOCAL CURRENCY PROJECT AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

AND

GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN

THIS AGREEMENT is between the Government of the United States of America, Department of State, Agency for International Development (hereinafter called "USAID") and the Government of Pakistan, Economic Affairs Division (hereinafter called the "Grantee");

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, Section 204 of Public Law 480, as amended, authorizes the use of Title II, PL 480 funds to purchase foreign currencies accruing under Title I of P. L. 480 in order to meet costs designed to assure that commodities made available under Title II of P. L. 480 are used to carry out more effectively the purpose for which such commodities are made available or to promote community and other self-help activities designed to alleviate the causes of the need for such assistance.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that such assistance should be made available to the Grantee in order to meet the costs of an agreed activity designed to survey and analyze data necessary to develop and recommend remedial measures for the control and prevention of malnutrition; and

WHEREAS, it has further been determined that the assistance herein made available will supplement, but not substitute for, funds normally available for such purposes from other U.S. Government sources.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

SECTION I -- RESPONSIBILITIES

A. USAID will:

Grant to the Grantee, pursuant to the conditions outlined herein, up to the rupee equivalent of \$50,000 to assist said Grantee to meet the specific Section 204 costs shown in Grantee's comprehensive National Nutrition Survey Project (hereinafter called "agreed activity") which is attached hereto (Attachment "A") and is made and considered a part of this Agreement. These funds may be utilized during the period beginning on the effective date of this grant and ending two (2) years from said effective date, and shall be limited to expenditures in the categories detailed in the budget attached to the agreed activity.

All references to dollars in this Agreement are the U.S. dollar equivalents of local currency units, calculated at Rs. 9.90 = \$1.00 U.S.

The Grantee will:

Carry out the agreed activity in accordance with and subject to the conditions of this Agreement.

SECTION II - GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. The "General Provisions" attached to this Agreement (Attachment "B") are incorporated by reference as a part of this Agreement.

B. The terms listed below, as used in the General Provisions, shall for the purpose of this Agreement, mean as follows:

"Cooperating country" shall mean "Pakistan"

"Director, A.I. D. Mission" shall mean the "Director, USAID Mission to Pakistan, c/o. American Embassy, Islamabad".

"The effective Date of this grant" shall mean the date of signing of this Agreement.

C. Exceptions to General Provisions:

The following Sections of the General Provisions (Attachment "B") do not apply to this grant:

Section I (a), (b) and Section 2 (h).

SECTION 204
NATIONAL NUTRITION SURVEY PROJECT

1. COOPERATIVE SPONSOR
Government of Pakistan (Nutrition Unit, Planning Division,
Ministry of Finance, Islamabad).
2. TITLE & PURPOSE
The comprehensive National Nutrition Survey will gather
and analyze data necessary to help develop and recommend
remedial measures for the control and prevention of
malnutrition, specifically bearing on:
 - (a) the epidemiology, magnitude and geographical distribution
of malnutrition according to socio-economic groups and
vulnerability;
 - (b) food consumption patterns in different geographical
regions and socio-economic groups;
 - (c) dietary intake and nutritional status of preschool children,
pregnant women and lactating mothers.
3. LOCATION
Selected areas throughout Pakistan.
4. OBJECTIVE
To map the exact nature and magnitude of malnutrition in
Pakistan in order to develop nutritional interventions largely
based on local resources.
5. ACTIVITIES
A three member team of the Nutrition Unit in the Planning
Commission participated in the International Nutrition Planning
Workshop at M. I. T. from July 8 to August 2, 1974, sponsored
by AID/Washington. The Pakistani group, with the help of a
team of experts from M. I. T., carried out preliminary analysis
of the available data on nutrition in Pakistan and identified
both knowledge gaps and opportunities for the systematic
exploration of potentially effective programs. With respect
to the former, a major national nutrition survey design and
questionnaires have been developed for implementation by
the Nutrition Unit of the Planning Commission. M. I. T. will
