I. INTRODUCTION

This Project Agreement provides for continuing cooperation between the Government of Guyana and the Government of the United States of America as represented by the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Home Affairs and the United States Agency for International Development as represented in Guyana by the Agency's Mission ("USAID").

II. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

At the request of the Government of (then) British Guiana, technicians of A.I.D. surveyed the functions and operations of the Police Force of British Guiana in July 1965. Subsequent to their recommendations, a Public Safety program was initiated by the USAID and the Police which had as its main objectives the strengthening of the Force's capacity to maintain effective law and order by modernizing and expanding their organizations through the provision of technical services, training and commodities.

A communication survey was planned in early 1966 and USAID provided a communications engineer (on a short term basis) who made a thorough survey of existing police-radio equipment and operations, both point-to-point and mobile, throughout the country. Following the survey the engineer made recommendations for a plan to expand and improve the police communications system.

In accordance with his recommendations, new basic communications equipment was provided.

As part of the Public Safety Project in CY 1966 and 1967 vehicles for land transport were provided by the USAID, and radio-equipped as recommended by the Communication Engineer in order that patrols and inspections of posts accessible by roads be increased. Harbor and river craft were provided by the USAID, in order to assist the Police in increasing patrols of harbors and inland waterways. The boats were radio-equipped as recommended by the communication engineer, in order to increase the effectiveness of the patrol operations and assist in the control of contraband and other illegal activities. The USAID also provided some air transport (radio-equipped) in order to increase capabilities to maintain frequent inspections of posts in the interior of the country and for border patrol work, emergency supply, or evacuation purposes.

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ANNEX A

The Government of Guyana agreed to provide needed personnel, maintenance and operating costs for the expanded communication networks. The GOG also agreed to provide for the increased operating costs for the expanded vehicle fleet, water transport and air operations activities, and to provide for any such other costs as are prudent and necessary to maintain increased efficiency in a modern civil police operation.

A further communication survey was made in February 1968 to evaluate the effectiveness of the program in improved communication systems already underway and to develop further improvements in the Force's communication network. Recommendations resulting from this survey emphasized the phased-replacement of older AM-mode radio sets with newer High Frequency - Single Bank equipment (HF-SFB).

Recent civil disturbances by dissident elements in the interior regions of Guyana focused attention on the need for additional communications equipment to establish and maintain dependable communications on a 24-hour basis, not only from established police outposts (some of which are not yet so equipped), but between newly opened stations and between field operational units of the Guyana Defense Force and the Police; thus, there would be inter- and intra-service communications in the field, and to the Guyana Police Joint Operations Center (JOC), Georgetown.

Previous project agreements (1966, 1967, 1968) developed a program of assistance which had as its main objectives the strengthening of the Police Force's capacity to maintain effective law and order by modernizing and expanding the Force's organization through the provision of technical services, training and commodities. The agreements called for the cooperative efforts and resources of the Governments of the United States and Guyana to concentrate in activities having the following targets:

1. To strengthen and improve the police organization through better administration of resources and management.
2. To improve police training capabilities, including basic and advance training and the control of civil disturbances.
3. To improve police patrol methods and procedures, and to develop the effectiveness of river and harbor patrols, in both urban and rural areas.
4. To develop necessary police records and identification procedures.

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- 5. To expand and improve the police communications network.
- 6. To improve police effectiveness through increased mobility, encompassing the use of land vehicles, boats, aircraft and horses where required.

Activities since the original agreement was signed in the spring of 1966 while being directed to all of the targets described above have been concentrated primarily in targets 1, 2, 3, & 4. Given the present objective of increased internal security capability, specifically closer coordination and rapid communication between the two branches of the internal security forces of Guyana - the Police and the Guyana Defense Force - this agreement is intended to direct the activities of both Governments to provide a strengthened communications capability to fully satisfy internal security requirements. To that end this present agreement relates primarily to target 5 above and to the provision of the necessary communications equipment and supplies together with related specialized technical assistance to achieve the objective. The types and quantities of equipment to be provided to the Government of Guyana has been developed through a further survey in February 1969 of the communication systems of the Police and GDF. The list of such equipment is contained in Annex B and has been jointly approved by the USAID, AID/W (Office of Public Safety) and the respective senior officers of the Guyana Police and Defence Force.

III. NATURE AND SCOPE OF THE PROJECT

A. TRAINING:

1. Out-of-Country (U.S.)

The USAID will sponsor and provide an external participant training program for communications branch personnel. With the approval of the Minister of Home Affairs, qualified, regularly assigned communications technicians will be sent to the United States for technical training in order to develop the professional abilities. Every effort will be made to provide training and/or orientation on the specific type of communications equipment provided to the GOG.

For such training outside Guyana, the GOG will provide international transportation of participants and pay their salaries including fringe benefits while on training.

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ANNEX A

Agreement, are to make effective use of technical advice, assistance, and the commodities contributed by the USAID under this project; and, on the part of the Government of Guyana to provide adequate current and future budget support to the two internal security forces (The Police and the Guyana Defense Force) to facilitate the achievement of the continuing objectives of the Project. Therefore the GOG agrees to the following:

1. The Ministry of Home Affairs will appoint an official coordinator within the Ministry to coordinate all contacts between that Ministry and the USAID in connection with this project since the base equipment will be maintained by the Police.
2. The Government of Guyana will pay all international travel costs and salaries of participants selected for training in the United States.
3. The Ministry of Home Affairs and the Guyana Defense Force will maintain, operate and repair any commodities provided by the USAID.
4. The Government of Guyana will consult with the USAID prior to purchasing major items of communication equipment for the police or related agencies in order to avoid duplication of the joint efforts and the procurement (by the USAID) of commodities described in Annex B.
5. The Government of Guyana agrees to provide needed personnel, maintenance and operating costs for the expanded communications network.
6. The Government of Guyana agrees to provide for any other costs as may be reasonable, prudent and necessary to maintain increased efficiency in joint-communications.

V. OTHER PROVISIONS

A. USAID contributions of technical assistance, commodity procurement and participant training are contingent on the GOG making adequate provisions to maintain supporting services and equipment. Therefore, the GOG by signing this Agreement has recognized that

PUBLIC SAFETY

I. BACKGROUND

A Fiscal Year 1969 Project Agreement dated June 30, 1969 obligated \$115,000 to provide equipment to meet specific communications requirements as necessary to support Police-GDF responsibilities and provide joint, inter-service communications capability. This equipment, selected to complement and strengthen existing police communications resources during joint operations with the GDF, as defined and justified in the agreement of June 30, 1969 is now being installed by Police-GDF technicians assisted by two U.S. Public Safety Communications Advisors.

II. NATURE AND SCOPE

The nature and scope of the project remain as defined in the agreement of June 30, 1969. This project agreement provides \$7,500 for the procurement of additional telecommunications equipment which will ensure the complete compatibility of the Police and GDF communications system. It was not technically possible to identify the need for this additional equipment at the time the original telecommunications equipment survey was made in February 1969.

The equipment includes a number of crystals and other ancillary equipment which, for example, when installed in existing FM1/5 radios will place them on the operating frequency of the highway patrol repeater station in case the repeater station failed. Thus continued, uninterrupted communications would be ensured in the case of an emergency. The remaining equipment to be procured will provide a similar type of double coverage and is detailed in the PIO/C which shall be issued under the authority of this Agreement.

III. FUNDING REQUIREMENTS

A. U.S. Contribution

AID agrees to provide the funds for the communications equipment described above up to the maximum amount as shown in Block 8 on the first page of this agreement.

B. GOG Contribution

The GOG agrees to make effective use of the telecommunications equipment as agreed in Sections IV B and V of the Project Agreement issued June 30, 1969.

Prior year Project Agreements (1966 and 1969) developed and implemented a program of Public Safety assistance which had as its main objectives the strengthening of the Guyana National Police Force's capability to maintain law and order. The agreements called for the cooperative efforts and resources of the Governments of the United States and Guyana to concentrate on activities having the following targets:

1. To strengthen and improve the police organization through better administration and management.
2. To improve police training, including basic and advanced training and the control of civil disturbances.
3. To improve police patrol methods and procedures, and to increase the effectiveness of river and harbor patrols, both urban and rural.
4. To develop necessary police records and identification procedures and facilities.
5. To expand and improve the police communications network.
6. To improve police effectiveness through increased mobility, using land vehicles, boats and aircraft.

Prior to delivery of the above commodities, USAID ascertained that all items met the quality and specifications outlined in the procurement documents, and that the equipment was compatible with the objectives for which they were intended.

Pursuant to the terms of the previous Agreements, the GOG contribution to the Project was the full utilization by the Guyana Police of all USAID supplied commodities, and the necessary upkeep and maintenance of such equipment.

Capital items which required periodic replacement of parts and components were to be supported from GOG resources. Wherever possible, physical facilities such as the M W & H, were to furnish support beyond the abilities of the Police Transport workshops.

The radio communications equipment supplied to the Guyana Police has been well and properly utilized to expand and improve the Police network. Maintenance and support of this equipment has been properly carried out and the objectives in item 5 have, to a large extent, been achieved.

III. NATURE AND SCOPE OF THE PROJECT AGREEMENT

To meet the terms of this Agreement, the USAID will provide:

A. TRAINING

1. Participant Training in the United States:

Upon official request, the USAID will sponsor and provide external participant training for selected police officers and police specialists. 
