Attachment 1. Scope of Work and Budget

Background

There is increasing concern in the region about the Environment and the effects of development on its fragile ecosystems. In addition, RDO/C is in the process of designing an Environmental Management Project. AID, as well as other donors, are also required to analyze regional projects developed for their impacts on the environment.

While there is considerable evidence of expertise resident in the region, there is no single published source of data to easily locate or tap regional expertise. CARICOM has periodically developed data bases of other specialized expertise and has expressed a willingness to assemble a listing of persons and institutions with regional expertise in environmental fields. It is expected that CARICOM will maintain and periodically update this data base in the future.

RDO/C requires this information to identify regional consultant expertise for project design and evaluation in environmental areas.

1. Scope of Work

The CARICOM Secretariat shall:

A. Assemble a report of environmental expertise in the region with emphasis on the Eastern Caribbean. The Secretariat is expected to canvass the region to identify individuals with special skills and to verify this information through personal interviews or other such methods, as appropriate. Information contained in other publications may be incorporated, as appropriate. To the extent possible, the listing should be comprehensive, including all members of CARICOM.

Principal areas of interest are: agriculture, watershed management, forestry, park and recreation management, land use planning, oceanography/fisheries, coastal zone management, water quality monitoring, environmental engineering, and environmental law.

This report, A Technical Assistance Guide to West Indian Human Resources on the Environment, will include:

1. A listing of people in the public and private sectors that have demonstrated skills in the areas of planning, applied technology, and research in environmental problems.
2. Data entries for each person will show experience, training and education, and previous exposure working in environmental protection planning.
3. Each listing will show present employer and/or contact address, with FAX numbers, when available.

4. Data similar to that required for items 1 through 3 above will be included, to the extent possible, for non-government organizations in the region that have expertise in environmental endeavors.

B. CARICOM will prepare and submit to AID 25 copies of a guide that lists the people and organizations identified in A., above. This guide should list the human resources: arranged by country; by principal skill area, e.g. oceanography, forestry, fisheries, water quality, etc.; and in alphabetical order.
