


PROJECT DESCRIPTION

I. Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to provide funding to the Faculty of Agriculture of the University of the West Indies to assist in mounting a Regional Seminar and Workshop on Water Resources Management.

II. Description of Activities

A. Background

A Nation's water resource is widely recognized as one of its most important assets. In the Caribbean, as elsewhere, there are competing demands for water: domestic, industrial, irrigation, wastewater disposal and the frequent visitations of destructive floods in urban and agricultural areas. These problems draw attention to the need for more efficient management of this resource. Yet there is little manifestation in national development planning of a proper appreciation of the inter-relationships of one type of use with another and of various uses with wastewater disposal, drainage and flooding. Planning and management of water resources are vested in separate agencies each concerned, almost exclusively with its own narrow area of activity. The time has come for the region to be more sensitive to the importance of integrated planning and management of this vital resource in the interest of its more efficient use and of optimising the investment of scarce capital resources.

B. Objectives

1. Review the status of water resources management in CARICOM countries in order to make recommendations for the development of a National Water Resources Development Program in each member country.
2. Examine the procedures and practices in water management in agriculture in order to encourage the strengthening of such programs by agricultural agencies in the area.

C. Participants

The workshop is aimed at senior officers of Ministries of Agriculture, Water Authorities, Meteorological Officers and Planning Agencies in CARICOM countries.

III. Implementation Arrangements

A. This Project will be implemented by the Faculty of Agriculture with assistance from the Faculty of Engineering, both of the University of the West Indies, St. Augustine, Trinidad.

B. The Faculties shall jointly name a Project Manager with responsibility for day to day management of the seminar. This person will be the principal contact with RDO/C Barbados and will be responsible for submitting a final financial statement and written report on the results of the seminar.

C. All Standard Provisions attached are applicable to this agreement.

D. The grantee may request an advance of the total amount of this grant by submitting a Standard Form (SF) 1034 to AID along with an illustrative budget on the use of the funds being requested. The advance must be liquidated at the completion of the workshop by submitting a SF 1034 voucher accompanied by a certified schedule of actual expenditures with supporting documentation made in connection with the workshop.
