Dear Ms. Wiseberg:

Pursuant to the authority contained in the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Agency for International Development (hereinafter referred to as "A.I.D.", or "Grantor") hereby grants to the Human Rights Internet (hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee") the sum of \$87,100 to provide support for a conference entitled, "Access to Positive Law Remedies and to National, Regional and International Procedures and Organizations for the Promotion and Protection of Human Rights" to be conducted by the Human Rights Internet and the International Human Rights Law Group. The Grantee will administer this grant and record and bill for the costs generated by each organization.

This Grant is effective and obligation is made as of the date of this letter and shall apply to commitments made by the Grantee in furtherance of program objectives during the period July 24, 1981 to April 30, 1982.

Authority is hereby given for pre-grant costs in an amount not to exceed \$2,000 which will be reimbursed to the Grantee for costs incurred for the period July 1, 1981 through the effective date of the Grant, July 24, 1981.

This Grant is made to the Grantee on condition that the funds will be administered in accordance with the terms and conditions as set forth in Attachment A, entitled "Program Description" and Attachment B, entitled "Standard Provisions", which have been agreed to by your organization.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

A. PURPOSE

The purpose of this grant is to support the promotion and protection of international human rights through a pilot seminar in Asia.

B. Implementation

The seminar is to take place in February, 1982 in Manila, Philippines and is expected to last 4 - 5 days with approximately six participants from five ASEAN countries (i.e., Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore and the Philippines) and five (5) from the United States, making a total of 35 attending.

The purpose of the seminar is to promote and protect international human rights through discussion of (1) positive law remedies and procedures concerned with setting and implementing human rights standards, and (2) resources for teaching and training in the promoting and protection of international human rights.

The seminar will cover five subjects:

- (1) formal and informal teaching of human rights;
- (2) analysis of variants in the availability and utilization of domestic remedies and procedures for the protection of international human rights;
- (3) examination of how to employ the petition procedure of the U.N. Commission on Human Rights, UNESCO and ILO procedures and other international and regional systems for communications alleging violations by governments of the human rights of their citizens;
- (4) identification of alternative institutions and procedures for the protection of human rights, and
- (5) discussion of organizing, staffing, funding, etc., of litigation groups for the protection of human rights.

Participants will be selected according to the following criteria:

- (1) prominent individuals well regarded in their country and outside for work on human rights
- (2) active commitment either through teaching, research, or membership in a human rights organization.
- (3) represent difference areas of concerns with human rights.

C. Reports

1. The Grantee shall submit a progress report to AID/PPC/PDPR after completion of the planning trip and a final report after the completion of the conference which will include a list of the participants with background information and a description of how the project promoted the protection of Human rights.
2. The Grantee shall submit to the Grant Officer, AID/W, one copy of the final fiscal reporting of all expenses incurred under this grant within thirty (30) days after the completion of this grant.
