

ENCLOSURE 1

SCHEDULE

A. Purpose of Agreement

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide support for SCETV to produce and tape on location at World Affairs Councils throughout the United States three special editions of AMERICAN INTERESTS on international development topics. This is more specifically described in Enclosure 2 to this Agreement entitled "Program Description," and the Recipient's original proposal, dated January 30, 1989, which is hereby incorporated by reference. In the event of an inconsistency between the Recipient's proposal, the program description, and this schedule; the schedule and then the program description shall take precedence.

B. Period of Agreement:

1. The effective date of this Agreement is the date of this letter. The expiration date of this Agreement is August 15, 1990.

2. Funds obligated hereunder are available for program expenditures for the estimated period August 15, 1989 to August 15, 1990.

C. Amount of Agreement and Payment:

1. A.I.D. hereby obligates the amount of \$150,000 for purposes of this Agreement.

2. Payment shall be made to the Recipient in accordance with procedures set forth in Enclosure 3 - Standard Provision, entitled "Payment - Periodic Advance."

D. Budget:

The Budget for this Agreement is shown as Enclosure 1a to this Agreement. The Recipient may not exceed the total-estimated amount or the obligated amount, whichever is less (see Part C above).

1. The Recipient is required to notify the Agreement and Project Officer of any changes in the amount to be cost shared by the recipient in accordance with the Standard Provision entitled, "Revisions to Grant Budget." Such a change may impact on future funding decisions under this Agreement.

2. The Recipient is required to report in its Annual Report to FVA/PVC in the Financial Status Report Form (SF-269) the total amount of cost-sharing to date.

E. Substantial Involvement

The Recipient is required to submit a copy of the subagreement under this Agreement for review and approval by the Grant Officer prior to any funds being drawn down by the Recipient.

F. Reporting Requirements:

1. Financial Reporting:

a. Financial reporting requirements shall be in accordance with the method of payment Standard Provision cited in Paragraph C.2 above.

b. The original and two copies of all financial reports shall be submitted to AID, Office of Financial Management, Program Accounting and Finance Division (PFM/FM/CMP/LC), Washington, D.C. 20523. In addition, one copy of all financial reports shall be submitted to the Technical Office specified in the Cover Letter of this Agreement.

2. Final Report

A final report/evaluation will be submitted not later than 30 days after the expiration date of the Agreement and shall include a summary analysis of project activity and statement of lessons learned. The final evaluation should also include an assessment of the overall impact of the project on: the target audience, the Grantee's own institution and other pertinent groups.

F. Indirect Cost Rates:

Pursuant to the Optional Standard Provision of this Agreement entitled "Negotiated Indirect Cost Rates - Provisional, a rate or rates shall be established for each of the recipient's accounting periods which apply to this Agreement. Pending

establishment of revised provisional or final indirect cost rates for each of the recipient's accounting periods which apply to this Agreement, provisional payments on account of allowable indirect costs shall be made on the basis of the following negotiated provisional rate(s) applied to the base(s) which are set forth below:

The Educational Television Endowment of South Carolina (SCETV) is a non-profit educational television network that is a leading program supplier to the U.S. public television system. In association with The Blackwell Corporation, SCETV is the producer of AMERICAN INTERESTS, the PBS foreign affairs television series carried by more than 165 stations nationwide. The series is entitled AMERICAN INTERESTS to reflect its weekly ambition: to identify and analyze the American stake in international issues.

The SCETV proposal entails a one-year project in which three special editions of AMERICAN INTERESTS on international development topics would be produced and taped on location at World Affairs Councils throughout the United States. The project's goal would be to inform the PVS viewing audience of AMERICAN INTERESTS and the members of America's world affairs organizations of the relationship between overseas development and America's broader foreign policy objectives, and to illustrate the linkages between economic progress in the third world and domestic prosperity.

Participants and collaborating groups would include: 1) the national audience that watches public television in the 165 markets in which AMERICAN INTERESTS is aired, as well as viewers of cable networks that broadcast the series; and 2) members of the more than 100 World Affairs organizations in the U.S. Three of these organizations would participate directly through their involvement in presenting live television events in their individual cities or towns. In addition, videocassette copies of the programs would also be made available to the national World Affairs membership.

Project content and implementation would entail: 1) selection of topics and guests; 2) selection of site and World Affairs organization; 3) preproduction and planning; and 4) on-site production, promotion, broadcast and tape dissemination. The special editions would be scheduled to appear during the fall, winter and spring of the grant year. Guests would be drawn from the development community, government, academia, the media and the business world. World Affairs members, local press and other interested members of the local community would be invited to attend the taping and to participate in a question and answer period that would close each program. A one-half hour edited version of each program would then be aired nationwide on AMERICAN INTERESTS.
