



SCHEDULE

A. Purpose of Grant

The purpose of this Grant is to assist U.S. wheat growers gain a better understanding of foreign aid and economic development and their effects on the demand for U.S. agricultural products. This is more specifically described in Enclosure 2 to this Grant entitled "Program Description." The Grantee's proposal entitled, "The Developing World: Opportunities for U.S. Agriculture," dated September 12, 1989 is hereby incorporated by reference. In the event of an inconsistency between the Grantee's proposal, the program description, and this schedule; the schedule and then the program description shall take precedence.

B. Period of Grant

1. The period of this Grant is January 26, 1990 through February 28, 1991.
2. Funds obligated hereunder are available for the period January 26, 1990 through February 28, 1991.

C. Amount of Grant and Payment:

1. The total estimated amount of this Grant is \$87,462.
2. AID hereby obligates the amount of \$87,462 for the purposes of this Grant for the period cited in paragraph B.2 above and shown in the budget at Enclosure 1a.
3. Payment shall be made to the Grantee in accordance with procedures set forth in Enclosure 3 - Standard Provision, entitled "Payment - Periodic Advance (Quarterly)."

D. Budget

The last page of this Schedule (Enclosure 1a) is the Budget for this Grant. The Grantee may not exceed the total estimated amount or the obligated amount, whichever is less (see Part C above).

Notes To Budget

1. Flexibility: The Grantee is allowed 5% flexibility among line items in the budget.

2. If this award was made on the basis that the Grantee has offered to cost share, the Grantee is required to notify the Grant Officer of any changes in the amount to be cost shared by the Grantee in accordance with the Standard Provision entitled "Revisions to Grant Budget." Such a change may impact on future funding decisions under this Grant.

E. Reporting Requirements

1. Financial Reporting:

a. Financial reporting requirements shall be in accordance with the method of payment Standard Provision cited in Paragraph C above.

b. The original and two copies of all financial reports shall be submitted to AID, Office of Financial Management, Program Accounting and Finance Division (PFM/FM/CMP/DC), Room 700, SA-2, Washington, D.C. 20523. In addition, one copy of all financial reports shall be submitted to the Technical Office specified in the Cover Letter of this Grant.

2. Annual Reporting


a. The Grantee will prepare and submit to the A.I.D. project officer annual program reports not later than 90 days prior to each anniversary date of the grant. Reports will reflect progress made in achieving goals and objectives as specified in the Program Description and workplan.

Specifically, these reports should include:

1. A narrative description of work undertaken during the grant period which compares actual accomplishment to the goals and objectives established in the original grant.
2. Revised workplan, if necessary, with justification of proposed changes.
3. A list of scheduled activities which have occurred or are planned in the near term.
4. Two copies of any materials which have been produced under this grant (i.e., brochures, curriculum guides, fact sheets, etc.) and one copy of any visual aids (i.e., slides, tape presentations, videos, etc.).
5. A detailed pipeline analysis of financial expenditures for the grant period which identifies disbursements by expense category.

A final report/evaluation will be submitted not later than 30 days after the expiration date of the grant and shall include a summary analysis of project activity and statement of lessons learned. The final evaluation should also include an assessment of the overall impact of the project on: the target audience, the grantee's own institution and other pertinent groups.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The NAWG Foundation will conduct a project entitled "The Developing World: Opportunities for U.S. Agriculture."

Through this educational program, producers will gain a better understanding of foreign aid and economic development and their effects on the demand for U.S. agricultural products. They also will learn about the unique needs of specific countries, the likelihood for increasing demand in those markets and the growing economic interdependence of nations.

The major opportunities for future growth in U.S. wheat exports will occur in the less developed countries (LDCs). There are, however, significant constraints to such growth in demand, including low incomes and heavy debt loads. U.S. farmers' understanding of these problems, and of the tremendous opportunities inherent in the LDCs, is not highly developed.

The project will train a group of wheat leaders from each state affiliated with the National Association of Wheat Growers (NAWG). This group then will make presentations on LDC issues to state and local groups. In addition, agricultural counselors from the Washington embassies of selected LDCs will be invited to travel to state wheat producer meetings to provide a perspective to growers on the importance of LDC markets.

Concurrent with these activities, NAWG will stress the theme of LDC growth through brochures and articles in its magazine and affiliated publications and will include a major program segment at its annual convention in 1991.
