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SCHEDULE

A. Purpose of Grant

The purpose of this grant is to provide support for Grantee's development education program, as more specifically described in Enclosure 2 to this grant entitled "Program Description" and the Grantee's proposal which is incorporated herein by reference. In the event of an inconsistency between the Grantee's proposal, the program description, and this Schedule, the Schedule and then the Program Description shall take precedence.

B. Period of Grant

1. The effective date of this grant is August 1, 1987. The expiration date of this grant is January 1, 1988.

2. Funds obligated hereunder are available for program expenditures from the period August 1, 1987 to January 1, 1988 as shown in D. below.

3. Upon Grantee's successful demonstration of its fund raising capabilities, A.I.D. may provide additional funding in support of this educational development project.

C. Method of Payment and Amount of Grant

1. The total estimated amount of this grant for the period shown in B.1. above is \$58,500.

2. A.I.D. hereby obligates the amount of \$58,500 for program expenditures during the period set forth in B.2. above and as shown in D. below.

3. Payment shall be made to the Grantee in accordance with procedures set forth in Attachment 4, Optional Standard Provision No. 2., entitled "Payment - Periodic Advance".

D. Budget

The following is the Budget for this grant. Revisions to this Plan shall be made in accordance with the Standard Provision of this grant, entitled "Revision of Budget".

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E. Reporting and Evaluation

The Grantee shall prepare and submit to the A.I.D. Project Officer program report not later than 30 days prior to the expiration date of this grant. The report shall reflect progress made in achieving goals and objectives as specified in the Program Description and work plan.

Specifically, the report shall include:

1. A narrative description of work undertaken during the grant period which compares actual accomplishments to the goals and objectives established in the grant agreement.
2. Revised work plan, if necessary, with justification of proposed changes.
3. A list of scheduled activities which have occurred or are planned in the near term.
4. Two copies of any materials which have been produced under this grant (i.e., brochures, curriculum guides, fact sheets, etc.) and one copy of any visual aids (i.e., slide tape presentations, videos, etc.).
5. A detailed pipeline analysis of financial expenditures for the grant period which identifies disbursements by expense category.

The final report/evaluation shall be submitted not later than 30 days after the expiration date of the grant and shall include a summary analysis of project activity and statement of lessons learned. The final evaluation shall also include an assessment of the overall impact of the project on the target audience, the Grantee's own institution, and other pertinent groups.

F. Title of Property

Title to all property purchased under this grant shall be vested in the Grantee and subject to the Standard Provisions entitled "Title to Property - Grantee".

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PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Grantee, WGBH-TV -- Boston's educational television station, in collaboration with scholars at the Harvard Institute for International Development and policy analysts around the U.S., is developing a new television series designed to help stimulate public thinking about the prospects for reducing world hunger and the stakes for Americans. The theme for the TV series is "Breakthrough on Hunger".

In conjunction with the above series, this grant provides assistance to planners who are making efforts to extend the series' benefits beyond the usual PBS audience through a concept called the "public involvement component (PIC)" which has two parts:

1. The series itself shall conclude with a program designed as a forum to help Americans think through what impact America's aid and trade policies have on economic growth in developing countries, and the implications for America's own economic prospects in the years ahead, and what action-oriented individuals can do.

2. PVOs shall be invited to take advantage of the heightened public awareness generated by the series to stage correlative workshops and educational activities of their own.

This project shall enable the networking aspect of the PIC to proceed simultaneously with the production of the TV series. It also shall support the research and development for the series' concluding "Choices for Americans" program, in order to bring developing of this program "up-to-speed" with the planning for the rest of the series. The production of the sixth "citizen-interactive" program shall be carried out with professional film makers at WGBH-TV in Boston (contingent upon fund-raising for production costs).

The expected outcomes and achievements which can be measured at the end of the project include the extent of PIC activities and town meetings, numbers of people in attendance and benefiting from them, and evaluations of the nature and outcomes of these events prepar
