Dear Mr. O'Reilly,

Pursuant to the authority contained in the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Agency for International Development (hereinafter referred to as "A.I.D.") hereby grants to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) (hereafter referred to as the "Grantee" or "UNICEF") the sum of \$270,000 to provide support for UNICEF Aircraft Operations for UNICEF's Emergency Program in Kenya as described in Attachment 1 ("Schedule") and in Attachment 2 ("Program Description") of this grant agreement.

This grant is effective and obligation is made as of the date of this letter and shall apply to expenditures made by the Grantee in furtherance of program objectives during the period beginning with the effective date and ending December 31, 1993.

This grant is made to the Grantee on condition that the funds will be administered in accordance with the terms and conditions as set forth in Attachment 1 (the Schedule); Attachment 2 (the Program Description); and Attachment 3 (the Standard Provisions); all of which have been agreed to by your organization.

**SCHEDULE**

**A. Purpose of Grant**

The purpose of this grant is to provide support for the UNICEF Aircraft Operations to meet their Emergency Program requirements. The grant will be applied towards a lease agreement of a Cessna Caravan to move UNICEF staff, food and medications from Wajir base to other districts for the Emergency Program.

**B. Period of Grant**

The effective date of this grant is the date of this agreement letter. The expiration date of this grant is December 31, 1993.

**C. Amount of Grant and Payment**

1. AID hereby obligates the amount of \$270,000 for purposes of this grant.
2. Payment shall be made to the Grantee in accordance with procedures set forth in Standard Provision No. 12, entitled "Letter of Credit."

**D. Grant Budget**

The total grant of \$270,000 will support the aircraft operations for nearly 5 months. This is based on a monthly average of 100 hours flown at an approximate cost of \$56,000 per month. Revisions to this budget shall be made in accordance with the Standard Provision of this Grant Agreement entitled "Revision of Grant Budget".

Approximately \$56,000/month based on 100 flying hours per month  
**TOTAL GRANT BUDGET \$270,000**

**E. Reporting and Evaluation**

See Standard Provision No. 11.

**F. Special Provisions**

1. This grant exercises the option to follow the Grantee's procurement policies and procedures.
2. As this grant is to a Public International Organization, only those Standard Provisions which pertain to grants to Public International Organizations shall apply. The Standard Provisions which shall apply to this grant are contained in Attachment 3, entitled "Standard Provisions For Grants To Public International Organizations."

**PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

The grant will augment UNICEF's Emergency Program by providing funding for the aircraft operations related to the Emergency Program. The aircraft operations move UNICEF staff from Wajir base to the northern districts in which UNICEF is the coordinating agency for supplementary feeding program. The planes are also used to move food, medications, and personnel from other donors/NGOs.

The following letter from the grantee serves as basis for the grant and is attached hereto as the Program Description (Attachment 2) and is made a part of this Grant:

Dear Ms. Beadle,

Thank you for your recent communication and information on the grant of US\$270,000 from the United States Government to UNICEF Kenya to meet operational and support requirements for aircraft utilised in the ongoing Drought Emergency Programme. UNICEF is especially grateful to the consistent and essential support given by the USAID to Emergency Programmes in the Horn of Africa.

Late last year, UNICEF's Representative, Mr. Vincent O'Reilly, outlined the need for a mobile, fast-capacity means of responding to emergency programme requirements across Kenya in his letter to Ms. Farnsworth dated 1 December 1992. In the spirit of the excellent response by USAID which, though not affording UNICEF the means to purchase an aircraft outright, nonetheless makes a generous amount of \$270,000 available, UNICEF would like to apply this grant towards sustaining our present lease agreement with the Cessna Caravan operating on a two month contract for UNICEF in Wajir. Based on a monthly average of 100 hours flown at an approximate cost of \$56,000 per month, UNICEF would be able to continue with this aircraft from June first through the end of October.


Again, having no budgetary means of purchasing an aircraft as originally proposed, UNICEF requests to be able to apply this grant towards meeting the operational costs, basically hourly and fuel expenses incurred.

As per previous contributions to UNICEF from the USAID we would request that the most efficient and mutually acceptable means of transferring this grant would be through our Programme Funding Office in New York.
