The Population Technical Assistance Project (POPTECH), managed by the Regional Coordination Division, is an integral part of the portfolio of centrally funded projects administered by the Agency for International Development (A.I.D.) Office of Population. The project's major purpose is to provide short-term technical assistance services to public and private sector institutions by improving the effectiveness, implementation, and evaluation of the broad spectrum of population and voluntary family planning programs.

POPTECH is the primary mechanism A.I.D. uses to evaluate centrally funded population programs. Through the buy-in component of the project, regional bureaus and USAID missions utilize POPTECH to prepare needs assessments, project identification documents (PID), project papers (PP), and evaluations which affect the course of population and family planning programs worldwide.

## **PREFACE**

DUAL Incorporated (DUAL) is the prime contractor to A.I.D. for POPTECH. The International Science and Technology Institute, Inc. (ISTI) is the subcontractor. The contract began on September 16, 1988 and will end on September 15, 1993. This report is submitted in fulfillment of Section C, Paragraph 5 of the project contract. It meets the requirements of AIDAR Provision No. 752.7026, entitled "Reports." During this reporting period, POPTECH received an additional \$560,715 in incremental funding.

## PERIOD ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- A self-assessment of the project was conducted by the POPTECH staff following an outline provided by the cognizant technical officer (CTO). The assessment used the contract scope of work and the report of the 1989 management review as a baseline for reviewing contract performance from September 16, 1988 through September 30, 1992.
- A final project evaluation was conducted in November 1992 by a three-person A.I.D. team.
- A Workplan was developed to guide the preparations for effective transition to the follow-on contractor in September 1993.

## ASSIGNMENTS

Since the contract award, POPTECH has received 201 assignment requests. As of the ending date of this reporting period, 163 assignments have been completed, 16 assignments are currently active, and 22 have been either cancelled or transferred.

## RESOURCE CENTER

POPTECH is continuing its effort to expand and improve its collection of publications. The Resource Center is organized into four sections: POPTECH Reports, Subject Files, Periodicals and Journals, and Country Files. Each of these sections is regularly updated by the addition of new materials. Currently POPTECH has more than 800 copies of publications related to family planning and development.

## CONSULTANT REGISTRY

During this period, POPTECH added eight new consultants to the Registry, making a total of 1,624 POPTECH consultants. Table 1 on the following page lists the areas of expertise of those consultants.

In March 1993, POPTECH initiated an audit of consultant registry files to eliminate redundant materials and assure that all files contain current locator, biographical, and emergency contact data. Upon completion of the audit, consultants whose files have not been updated since 1991 will be queried to determine their continued interest in registration with POPTECH.


