

ASSURANCE OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE AGENCY FOR
INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT REGULATION UNDER TITLE VI

If any personal property is so provided, this assurance shall obligate the Grantee for the period during which it retains ownership or possession of the property. In all other cases, this assurance shall obligate the Grantee for the period during which the Federal financial assistance is extended to it by the Agency.

THIS ASSURANCE is given in consideration of and for the purpose of obtaining any and all Federal grants, loans, contracts, property, discounts or other Federal financial assistance extended after the date hereof to the Grantee by the Agency, including installment payments after such date on account of applications for Federal financial assistance which were approved before such date. The Grantee recognizes and agrees that such Federal financial assistance will be extended in reliance on the representations and agreements made in this assurance, and that the United States shall have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance. This assurance is binding on the Grantee, its successors, transferees, and designees, and the person or persons whose signatures appear below are authorized to sign this assurance on behalf of the Grantee.

SUMMARY

The following is a proposal for the sum of \$50,000.00 to be used by the Breast is Best League to employ an Executive Director to continue the promotion of breastfeeding in the country of Belize beginning Jan. 1, 1985 to Dec. 31, 1987.

ORGANIZATIONAL BACKGROUND

The Breast is Best League was first conceived in late 1981 by the Women's Bureau of the Ministry of Social Services. After the initial organization, the Women's Bureau turned the project over to an autonomous group of volunteers. The League was founded for the purpose of giving help, encouragement, and information, primarily through personal instruction and contact, to those woman who want to breastfeed their babies.

In March, 1982, the League sponsored a series of three lectures by medical personnel in Belize City area. At the close of these lectures a neighborhood group was established in the St. Martin de Porres area of Belize City. In Jan., 1983 a second neighborhood group was established in the King's Park area of Belize City.

In August, 1983 a full time volunteer Director began work. In Oct, 1983 BIB League received a grant from the Canadian High Commission. Also in that month the first eight Breastfeeding Counselors were trained and began work in the Pre-natal Clinics.

In Jan., 1984 BIB League opened an office in the Woman's Bureau in Belize City. A lending library and telephone hotline were established. In June, 1984 nine more Breastfeeding Counselors were trained and began their volunteer work.

ADMINISTRATION

The Breast is Best League has a ten member Advisory Board which meets quarterly. From this Board three officers were elected. These three officers and the Executive Director compose the Executive Board which meets monthly. The members of both of these boards are the following:

PROGRAM TO DATE

Since its inception in late 1981, the Breast is Best League has done the following:

- a) Sponsored three public educational lectures on breast-feeding.
- b) Established two neighborhood mother's support groups in Belize City.
- c) Participated in a teaching program about breastfeeding for locally trained community health workers.
- d) Established an office in the Women's Bureau, Belize City.
- e) Established a lending library.
- f) Operates a Breastfeeding Hotline telephone to answer breastfeeding questions.
- g) Participated in Women's Bureau Workshops in each of the six districts.
- h) Produced a 20 minute video program on the BIB League Official Office Opening and an interview with five breastfeeding mothers. This program was aired in Belize City and Orange Walk.
- i) Produced three breastfeeding commercials done by prominent Belizean women.
- j) Trained 13 Breastfeeding Counselors who are presently working in the Pre-natal and Breastfeeding Clinics and making house calls.
- k) Produced nine information sheets about different aspects of breastfeeding and distributed them to every district.
- l) Worked with the Ministry of Health in writing a Breastfeeding Manual for Health Workers.
- m) Taught breastfeeding classes in secondary schools (6) in Belize City.
- n) Made over two hundred house visits to help women having breastfeeding problems.
- o) Participated in Food and Nutrition Week, Children's Day, Women's Market Day, and Agricultural Fairs for the past two years.
- p) Wrote the Breastfeeding Module for the Post-Graduate Mid-wifery Course for the Belize School of Nursing.
- q) Taught classes on Breastfeeding at the School of Nursing.
- r) Worked with the Ministry of Health on the 1983 Breastfeeding Survey and the 1983 Breastfeeding Workshop.
- s) Sold adult and children's T-shirts to promote breastfeeding and for income generation for BIB League.
- t) Established a Special Breastfeeding Award for women who have breastfed under special circumstances. Three women have received this award.
- u) Published and mailed a quarterly newsletter.
- v) Worked closely with UNICEF to bring Dr. P. Marin from Brazil to Belize to help develop a National Breastfeeding Strategy with the Ministry of Health.
- w) Requested and received a grant from UNICEF to provide Breastfeeding Packets to all 32 Health Centers in Belize.
- x) Presented numerous radio programs on aspects of breastfeeding.
- y) Initiated a membership drive to provide on-going financial support.
- z) Participated in workshops to help train Public and Rural Health Nurses, Hospital Nurses and Red Cross Volunteers.
- aa) Conducted an every house canvas in Ladyville to give information about breastfeeding and BIB League.
- bb) Conducted monthly Breastfeeding Counselors meetings in the St. Martin de Porres and King's Park areas.

OVERALL GOAL OF THE BREAST IS BEST LEAGUE

To improve the nutritional status of babies and infants in Belize by increasing the number of women who fully breastfeed for four months.

This goal will be achieved in the following four areas:

1. Management/Fund Raising
2. Training
3. Educational Programs
4. Promotion

1. ALLOWABLE COSTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS (NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS - OTHER THAN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS)

(This provision is applicable to nonprofit organizations other than educational institutions)

(a) The Grantee shall be reimbursed for costs incurred in carrying out the purposes of this grant which are determined by the Grant Officer to be reasonable, allocable, and allowable in accordance with the terms of (1) this grant, (2) any negotiated advance understanding on particular cost items, and (3) cost principles contained in OMB Circular A-122 entitled "Cost Principles for Nonprofit Organizations" in effect on the date of this grant (hereinafter referred to as "applicable cost principles").

(b) If Grantee contributions in the form of cost sharing/matching are required under this grant, the allowability of costs applied to the grant for such contributions shall be determined by the Grant Officer in accordance with the terms of paragraph 1K, "Cost Sharing and Matching" of Handbook 13 in effect on the date of this Grant.

(c) The requirements set forth in this provision are only applicable to costs incurred with funds provided by AID under this grant. Except for paragraph (b) above, the requirements set forth in this provision are not applicable to costs incurred by the Grantee from non-Federal funds. Such costs will be considered allowable to the extent they conform to the requirements of paragraph (b) above and are incurred for purposes of the grant.

2. ALLOWABLE COSTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS (EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS)

(This provision is applicable to educational institutions)

(a) The Grantee shall be reimbursed for costs incurred in carrying out the purposes of this grant which are determined by the Grant Officer to be reasonable, allocable, and allowable in accordance with the terms of (1) this grant, (2) any negotiated advance understanding on particular cost items, and (3) OMB Circular A-21, "Principles for Determining Costs Applicable to Grants, Contracts and Other Agreements with Educational Institutions," in effect on the date of this grant (hereinafter referred to as "applicable cost principles").

(b) If Grantee contributions in the form of cost sharing/matching are required under this grant, the allowability of costs applied to the grant for such contributions shall be determined by the Grant Officer in accordance with the terms of paragraph 1K, "Cost Sharing and Matching," of Handbook 13 in effect on the date of this grant.

ASSURANCE OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE AGENCY FOR
INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT REGULATION UNDER TITLE VI
OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964

THIS ASSURANCE is given in consideration of and for the purpose of obtaining any and all Federal grants, loans, contracts, property, discounts or other Federal financial assistance extended after the date hereof to the Grantee by the Agency, including installment payments after such date on account of applications for Federal financial assistance which were approved before such date. The Grantee recognizes and agrees that such Federal financial assistance will be extended in reliance on the representations and agreements made in this assurance, and that the United States shall have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance. This assurance is binding on the Grantee, its successors, transferees, and designees, and the person or persons whose signatures appear below are authorized to sign this assurance on behalf of the Grantee.
