Dear Ms Sharon Zavestoski,

With reference to our agreement, please find enclosed our first narrative report concerning the "Supplementary Feeding for Children and Mothers" programme in Central Bosnia.

We propose a revision of the agreement. The reasons for this will be clear from a study of the report .i.e.

- the gap between the receipt of running costs for the programme(SOROS/UNHCR) on 8th April 1993 and the receipt of the grant towards the purchase of supplies(US.AID/OFDA) on 29th June.
- the possibility, since our agreement, of obtaining supplies in Croatia and Bosnia itself, with the help of UNICEF and MSF/Belgium.
- New priorities as expressed by WHO and medical NGO's in Bosnia.

The budget as set out in the original agreement is as follows:

We request a revision of the grant in two respects:

1. Revision of the budget

Following the identification of certain needs by our medical team in Bosnia, we propose that the allocations in the budget be broken down as follows:

Remarks:

- a. In the initial budget, 100.000 USD was allocated for the purchase of "Whole milk, Vit.D". Since this product is similar to "Vitamed Milk" we are using this sum of 100.000 USD to purchase "Vitamed milk".
- b. The price of "Proteined Biscuits" was estimated at 3.390 USD per ton. Biscuits at this price are manufactured by "Compact", a Danish firm.

We have since located an Italian firm, "Crich", which produces a similar product at a lower cost i.e. 1.421 USD per ton = 242.991 USD for 171MT. (see appendix). This producer is used by UNICEF and AICF.

We propose to purchase the quantity of biscuits as agreed i.e. 171 tons, and to use the balance of 336.699 USD to purchase additional supplies of vitamed milk which is our main priority.

- c. The budget allowed for the purchase of 86MT of "1st Age Milk" (204.680 USD) and 90MT of "2nd Age Milk" (218.700 USD).

We propose to reduce the quantity of each to 32MT and to use the balance to purchase additional supplies of vitamed milk.

2. Completion date

The agreement signed by US.AID/OFDA and Solidarites stipulated that the programme commence on 10th April and finish on 10th August.

Owing to the fact that we did not receive the grant from US.AID/OFDA until the 29th June 1993, and that we are at present negotiating an extension of the running costs with SOROS/ UNHCR to cover the period July, August, September, we request that the completion date be put back to 30 September 1993.

Bearing in mind the urgent nature of this programme we would appreciate a rapid decision on our proposed revision of the agreement.

We look forward to receiving from you, at your earliest convenience, a fax authorizing this revision of the grant.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Annex A

NEWKEY93YUG276 1

1. Project Objective/Overview

At its origins, this project was intended as a Supplementary Feeding Program for 30,000 displaced children in Central Bosnia. However, after an initial evaluation in the field, followed by discussions with members of UNICEF, UNHCR, WHO and WFP, it was decided that this program should be enlarged to include lactating women. We wanted to also include pregnant women and the elderly, but due to the fact that the funding for the procurement arrived very late, we were obliged to begin our program using food from other donors (MSF Belgium, UNICEF, HCR), and the quantities available from these sources were not sufficient to cover all the targeted population.

2. Description of the Beneficiaries

The majority of the beneficiaries are displaced infants from 0 to 12 months, children from 1 to 5 years and lactating women who are accommodated in collective centers or with host families. We soon realized that there was also a definite need to include ambulants amongst the beneficiaries and therefore made them part of the program.

The total number of beneficiaries for the Zenica and Tuzla regions is :

making a total of 58,900 beneficiaries.

3. Implementation Procedures

Solidarités planned on beginning implementation of this project in early April, however, the funds for the procurement (coming from OPDA) did not arrive until the end of June and therefore we were obliged to find other donors so that we could begin our program. An evaluation of both areas (Zenica and Tuzla) was made by our Medical Coordinator over a period of three or four weeks, beginning the 13th of April. In the meantime, we received supplementary food from other sources (MSF Belgium, UNICEF, UNHCR) which we transported from Croatia and which thus enabled us to begin distribution at the end of May. This Supplementary Food was supplied to the following communities: (Zenica area) Breza, Kakanj, Olovo, Vares, Visoko; (Tuzla area) Ranovici, Breko, Celic, Dohaj, Gradacac, Cernanica, Kalezje, Kladanj, Lukavac, Srebrnik and Zivince. Contacts were made with distribution points (ambulants and pharmacies) where local pediatricians and nurses are supervising the delivery of supplemental food. The Medical Coordinator and two expatriate nurses have been monitoring these distribution centers in all the designated communities. All beneficiaries are registered with the ambulants or pharmacy.

4. Related Inputs

The US OPDA funding for the procurement arrived in late June and our Paris office has now placed the order for Supplementary Food to be transported to Croatia where it will be unloaded into a warehouse in Split and then transported to Central Bosnia. As mentioned above, we received Infant Formula from MSF Belgium, Supplementary Food from UNICEF and UNHCR.

5. Description of Assistance

FOOD SECTOR: Supplementary Food Commodities

A purchasing officer in Paris negotiated with suppliers and arranged for the future transportation of the procurement. A warehouse was rented in Split for transit of the procurement from France to Central Bosnia. Given the present difficulties concerning the transit of relief supplies through Croatia to Bosnia, this warehouse will be extremely important for stockage of food awaiting authorization by Croatian authorities.

TRANSPORT / LOGISTICS SECTOR: International Transport (Food)

The OFDA funded procurement will be transported by land by rented trucks coming from various European countries. The present conflict between Croates and Muslims has made it necessary to use international trucks for transport of food from Croatia to Bosnia. These international transporters were used for the transport of the food supplied by UNICEF and MSP Belgium.
