
Pursuant to the authority contained in the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Agency for International Development (hereinafter referred to as "A.I.D." or "Grantor") hereby grants to the American Center of Oriental Research (hereinafter referred to as "ACOR" or "Grantee"), the sum of \$599,999 to provide support for the cultural touristic development of the Amman Citadel by excavation and reconstruction of the Temple of Hercules at the site, as described in Attachment 1, entitled "Schedule" and Attachment 2, entitled "Program Description".

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## SCHEDULE

A. Purpose of Grant

The purpose this Grant is to provide financial support to excavate archaeologically and to restore the Temple of Hercules located on the Amman Citadel, the surrounding temple enclosure, the Propylaeon overlooking downtown Amman, and the adjacent southwest section of the Citadel defensive walls, as more specifically described in Attachment 2 to this Grant entitled "Program Description".

B. Period of Grant

The effective date of this Grant is June 26, 1990. The expiration date of this Grant is June 30, 1992.

C. Amount of Grant and Payments

1. A.I.D. hereby obligates the amount of \$599,999 for purposes of this Grant.

2. Payment shall be made to the Grantee in accordance with procedures set forth in Attachment 3 - Standard Provision 2, entitled "Payment - Periodic Advance".

D. Financial Plan

The following is the Grant Budget, including authorized local cost financing items. Revisions to this budget shall be made in accordance with Standard Provision of this Grant, entitled "Revision of Grant Budget".

ACOR Overhead Contribution

USAID is providing \$599,999 for the program (see Attachment 2 for a breakdown). Phase I, excavation and clearance of the site, has a detailed budgetary breakdown. As the costs associated with Phases II and III are, to some extent,

dependent on the results of Phase I, the budgets for Phases II and III project elements, (i.e., recording of Temple architecture and classical architectural reconstruction drawings, and actual restoration) are estimated in less detail.

The estimate for all the work to be accomplished under the grant is \$649,426. This figure is based on ACOR's overhead charge of 41.4% on all direct costs less materials. To keep USAID's funding to below \$600,000, ACOR has offered to forego \$49,427 in overhead charges as its contribution to the project. The amount of this contribution is variable for two reasons.

First, the purpose of ACOR's contribution is to keep the USAID funding below \$600,000. Therefore, should ACOR's overhead rate for all or part of the activity change from the percentage used to arrive at the grant budget estimates, ACOR's contribution to the project from its overhead would change in a like proportion.

Second, as ACOR's offer of contribution is premised on the aforementioned limitation of USAID funding, ACOR will in no case contribute from overhead or otherwise more than the difference between the grant amount of \$599,999 and the total cost of the project, determined by applying ACOR's full overhead rate, and ACOR will make no contribution from overhead if the total cost of the project is less than \$600,000.

E. Reporting and Evaluation

ACOR will provide to USAID quarterly reports on the progress of restoration activities.

F. Authorized Geographic Code

The authorized geographic code for procurement of goods and services under this grant is 000 (United States only) and the host country (Jordan).

G. Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements

A Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements has been signed by the grantee, and is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

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Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements

- (A) The grantee certifies that it will provide a drug-free workplace by:
- (a) Publishing a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the grantee's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation of such prohibition.
  - (b) Establishing a drug-free awareness program to inform employees about-
    - (1) The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
    - (2) The grantee's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
    - (3) Any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and
    - (4) The penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace.
  - (c) Making it a requirement that each employee to be engaged in the performance of the grant be given a copy of the statement required by paragraph (a);
  - (d) Notifying the employee in the statement required by paragraph (a) that, as a condition of employment under the grant, the employee will-
    - (1) Abide by the terms of the statement; and
    - (2) Notify the employer of any criminal drug status conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five days after such conviction.
  - (e) Notifying the agency within ten days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee who is so convicted-
    - (1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
    - (2) requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
  - (f) Taking one of the following actions within 30 calendar days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2). With respect to any employee who is so convicted-
    - (1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; or
    - (2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal State or local health law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
  - (g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f).

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Purpose:

The purpose this Grant is to provide financial support to archaeologically excavate and to restore the Temple of Hercules located on the Amman Citadel, the surrounding temple enclosure, the Propylaeon overlooking downtown Amman, and the adjacent southwest section of the Citadel defensive walls.

By achieving the purpose, this activity will contribute to USAID/Jordan's assistance in the development of the tourism industry in the Kingdom by providing additional tourist attractions in Amman. Increased foreign exchange earnings and employment are expected as a consequence.

Background:

The ACOR feasibility study on the touristic enhancement of the Amman Citadel presented a comprehensive program for the preservation and touristic improvement of the site. One of the recommendations of the study was the restoration of the Temple of Hercules, which is probably the largest and most visible of the ancient remains on the Citadel. This proposal was endorsed by the Jordanian Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities, and the Ministry of Planning asked USAID to provide funding for the effort.

Activity:

The grant will provide substantial financial support to restore, as much as the available remains allow, the Temple of Hercules on the Amman Citadel, the surrounding temple enclosure, the Propylaeon overlooking downtown Amman, and the adjacent southwest section of the Citadel defensive walls. This is a two year project which will more visibly establish Amman as the Philadelphia of the Decapolis, a great Roman city of the first century A.D.

No significant restoration work has been done on the Temple of Hercules since an Italian team worked on the site several decades ago. The restoration of the Roman temple will complement work on the Umayyad Palace by a Spanish team, and improvements to the Citadel Museum being supported by the Friends of Archaeology. Moreover, USAID-sponsored restoration of the Temple will induce the Department of Antiquities to clear-up the site, making it more attractive for tourists, and for the security presence to be moved to another location.

This new tourist site is expected to lengthen tourist stays in Amman and to attract tourists now drawn to Petra and Aqaba to change their itineraries to devote more time to Amman and northern Jordan.
