A. Purpose of Grant

The purpose of this Grant is to continue to provide assistance to the cultural resources management program of the American Center of Oriental Research (ACOR) so that it may now undertake the Madaba Archaeological Park Development site in the region of Madaba, Jordan. This purpose is more fully described in Attachment 2 to this Grant entitled "Program Description".

B. Period of Grant

The effective date of this Grant is September 21, 1992. The expiration date of this Grant is September 30, 1993.

C. Amount of Grant and Payments

1. A.I.D. hereby obligates the amount of \$191,003 for purposes of this Grant.
2. Payment shall be made to the Grantee in accordance with procedures set forth in Attachment 3 - Standard Provision 2, entitled "Payment - Periodic Advance".

D. Financial Plan

The following is the summary grant budget. Revisions to the budget shall be made in accordance with Standard Provision of this Grant, entitled "Revision of Grant Budget".

All program funds received by the Grantee through the sale of the Madaba Society Book shall be retained by the recipient and added to funds committed to the project by A.I.D. and shall be used to further eligible program objectives. The accountability of such funds shall be in accordance with the Grantee's financial management system. The audit of such funds shall be in accordance with clause 2 of the mandatory clauses of attachment 2.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Purpose: The purpose of this grant is to continue to provide assistance to the cultural resources management program of the American Center of Oriental Research (ACOR) so that it may now do a base-line study of the historic part of Madaba so that resource materials will be available for use in the further development of the Madaba Archaeological Park, to further enhance the Park by developing necessary infrastructure, and offer to the Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities and to the Madaba Society expertise and development support through ACOR.

Background: For several years and through projects at a number of locations throughout Jordan, USAID has provided financial support to ACOR for its program of cultural resources management. These sites have included the Amman Citadel, Petra, the ancient city of Ayla in Aqaba, and the Roman cities of Pella and Umm Qais. In 1991, at the initiative and under the direction of the Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities, work began on a Mosaics School to be housed in turn-of-the-century structures built by the founders of modern Madaba. These were built near Roman, Byzantine and Umayyad antiquities and, under a grant from USAID, ACOR has used labor-intensive methods to develop the site as an Archaeological Park. The project, consisting of the School and Park, is a major step toward the revitalization of downtown Madaba and holds great promise for increased tourism. It has also brought many needed jobs to the town. As a result of the activities surrounding the project, the Ministry of Tourism acted swiftly to purchase more properties near the school site for further cultural environment protection and for touristic development. The Madaba Society, an indigenous organization, was formed, in part, as a result of the school project. The purpose of the organization is to assist the government in the protection and conservation of the heritage of Madaba and the surrounding region. It will attempt to enhance both local and international interest in the site. In particular they plan to document both the ancient remains at Madaba as well as the historical core of the city of the late 19th to early 20th centuries, to develop an archive housing all of the documentation relating to ancient Madaba and then to assist the Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities to develop a master plan for the site.

This grant is for the American Center of Oriental Research (ACOR) to continue the civic and touristic improvements begun in Madaba in 1991 at the initiative and under the direction of the Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities and the Ministry of Planning. Further, ACOR proposes to do this in cooperation with, and in support of, the Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities and the Madaba Society, an indigenous organization.

Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements

- (A) The grantee certifies that it will provide a drug-free workplace by:
 - (a) Publishing a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the grantee's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation of such prohibition.
 - (b) Establishing a drug-free awareness program to inform employees about-
 - (1) The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 - (2) The grantee's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
 - (3) Any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and
 - (4) The penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace.
 - (c) Making it a requirement that each employee to be engaged in the performance of the grant be given a copy of the statement required by paragraph (a);
 - (d) Notifying the employee in the statement required by paragraph (a) that, as a condition of employment under the grant, the employee will-
 - (1) Abide by the terms of the statement; and
 - (2) Notify the employer of any criminal drug status conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five days after such conviction.
 - (e) Notifying the agency within ten days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d) (2), with respect to any employee who is so convicted-
 - (1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
 - (2) requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
 - (f) Taking one of the following actions within 30 calendar days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d) (2). With respect to any employee who is so convicted-
 - (1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended: or

- (2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal State or local health law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
- (g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f).
