

Matching Grant Program

The Matching Grants Program awards competitive grants to PVOs to support clearly defined and delineated field-oriented programs to be carried out in a number of countries. The programs must be well conceived and incorporate rigorous evaluation criteria. Such a program may be as broad as the overall scope of a PVO's work or as specific as community-based health services or small enterprise development. It must be consistent with the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID) legislative mandate and with development priorities.

Through the Matching Grant Program, a PVO will address particular priorities which it shares with USAID. The grant will normally allow a PVO to expand a proven program in new places or initiate new projects. It may also enable a PVO to undertake an experimental or innovative project on the cutting edge of development efforts that offers potential for learning and replication. Additionally, the matching grant may allow a PVO to further professionalize its management systems and technical backstopping of its field programs.


For USAID, the Matching Grant Program offers a mechanism to consolidate multiple grant relationships with a PVO, provide for better program integration, reduce overlapping administrative procedures, and allow maximum program flexibility.

To qualify for a matching grant, a PVO must have a successful record in implementing development programs as well as a demonstrated private fund-raising ability. The PVO must supply at least 50 percent of the cost of the program in cash; USAID will match the PVO's contribution dollar-for-dollar. The program life runs from three to five years.




The Child Survival and Vitamin A Program awards competitive grants to PVOs engaged in primary health programming as part of their international development efforts. These grants support projects designed to have a demonstrable effect on the health status of children and mothers living in target areas in developing countries. The program focuses on a few technologies which have a high potential for saving lives and are technically and logistically deliverable at reasonable cost. It recognizes the paramount need for interventions which are epidemiologically sound, cost-effective, and address the communities' needs.

A project must focus on the main causes of childhood morbidity and mortality and propose cost-effective interventions that will have a positive impact. Among the limited, manageable mix of interventions emphasized are: immunization, management of diarrheal diseases, nutrition (including promotion of exclusive breastfeeding, proper weaning practices, promotion of vitamin A), maternal care, management of acute respiratory infections, malaria control and HIV/AIDS education. In addition, projects address issues of sustainability as they relate to project activities. At least 25 percent of the project costs must be borne by the grantee.

As a result of both the Humphrey Amendment to the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 and the Alliance for Progress, the U.S. has dedicated substantial support to the use and development of Cooperative Development Organizations (CDOs). U.S. CDOs represent more than 90 million members, including approximately two million farmers. CDOs provide assistance both nationally and overseas in areas such as local institution building, capital formation, infrastructure development, technology transfer, democratic institution strengthening, financing and marketing functioning, and the use of cooperative structures in development projects. The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) works with CDOs in order to enhance development in the particular areas of agriculture credit, dairy development, housing, private enterprise development, rural electrification, and insurance protection. USAID's Cooperative Development Program provides financed assistance through two grant vehicles:

(1) Cooperative Program Support Grants (CPSG) which strengthen and expand the CDOs' international operations through program and organizational development, resource enhancement, and limited program services.


(2) Cooperative Initiatives Grant Program (CIGP) which provides funding to smaller grants for periods of less than three years. The CIGP has become a valued component of the Cooperative Development Program as it explores new and creative approaches, involves new participants, and mobilizes additional resources for international cooperative development.

All centrally funded grants to the CDOs under the Cooperative Development Program have Central Bureau/Mission Add-On Authority. This provides an alternative funding mechanism for missions to fund short-term activities of CDOs, such as feasibility or planning studies, training for host country participants, or pilot studies. Mission contributions added to CDO core grants through this mechanism must be for purposes consistent with the core grant and in support of the CDO's program to assist host-country government or non-governmental organizations in cooperative development. These instruments are not to be used for development of USAID project papers or scopes of work. Long-term and large-scale activities should be developed as mission-awarded grants or contracts.





Farmer-to-Farmer Program

The Farmer-to-Farmer (FTF) Program provides short-term, agricultural, technical assistance on a people-to-people basis since 1985. Its purpose is to provide assistance in the practical aspects of increasing food production and distribution and to improve the effectiveness of farming operations.

The Agricultural Development and Trade Act of 1990 reauthorized the program and amended it to target developing countries, emerging democracies, and middle-income countries. The Act also doubled the available funding for this program and encouraged the participation of PVOs, cooperative development organizations, non-governmental organizations, and private agribusinesses. USAID instituted a competitive program in FY 1991 that seeks new, creative approaches to this development concept. The objectives of the worldwide FTF Program are to provide technical assistance to farmer associations, cooperatives, and other farm groups to enhance the potential for substantial increases in food processing, production, and marketing to stimulate private-sector enterprises and democratic institutions.

The programs of the four worldwide FTF Program implementors have been designed to reflect a regionalized and/or focused country approach and are briefly. A 30.0 million Special Initiative under the Farmer-to-Farmer Program in the Newly Independent States (NIS) of the former Soviet Union was inaugurated in early 1992. This people-to-people program was deemed an effective mechanism to transfer the vast technology, knowledge, and skills of U.S. farmers/agribusinesses to farmers and farm groups in the NIS.


The objectives of the three-year program are (1) to increase food availability to consumers in the near term, and (2) to take steps to help ensure that existing food shortages and distribution problems do not continue over the long term. Activities are directed at accelerating agribusiness development in food processing, packaging, distribution, transportation, and other related areas. This Special Initiative will field about 1,700 volunteers in all 12 of the NIS with the greatest concentration in the Russian Federation, Ukraine, and Kazakhstan.

These programs are managed by the Office of Private and Voluntary Cooperation and are funded through Public Law 480.




