



C. Amount of Grant and Payment

1. USAID hereby obligates the amount of \$10,000 for purposes of this Grant.
2. Payment shall be made to the Grantee in accordance with procedures set forth in Attachment 3 -Optional Standard Provision No. 2, entitled "Payment-Cost Reimbursement."

D. Financial Plan

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E. Reporting Requirements

1. Financial Reporting

- a. Financial reporting requirements shall be in accordance with the Optional Standard Provision of this Grant entitled "Payment-Cost Reimbursement" as shown in Attachment 3.
- b. MMR is required to maintain books and records in accordance with general accepted accounting principles.
- c. The original and two copies of all financial reports shall be submitted to USAID/Peru, Office of the Controller, Larrabure y Unanue 110, Lima 1, Peru.

2. Final Report

MMR will prepare a final report which will include the following information:

- Number, names and positions of the participants of the workshop and information meetings
- Presentations of the speakers
- Conclusions of the working groups
- General conclusions and recommendations of the workshop
- Report on the information meeting
- Proposed list of distribution of the workshops report
- Evaluation of the workshop and information meeting regarding accomplishment of their objectives
- Plan of follow-on activities

Five (5) copies of this report, in English and Spanish, will be submitted by MMR to USAID/Peru thirty days after completion of the workshop. Additionally MMR will submit to CDIE/DI, Washington, DC 20523-1802 one copy in English of the final report.

3. Financial Reviews

In lieu of an audit, Financial Analysts from USAID/Peru Controller's Office will conduct a financial review of the Grant.

4. Closeout Procedures

This section prescribes uniform closeout procedures for this Grant.

a. The following definitions shall apply for the purpose of this section:

1) Closeout: The closeout of a Grant is the process by which USAID determines that all applicable administrative actions and all required work of the Grant have been completed by the Grantee and USAID.

2) Date of Completion: The date of completion is the date on which all work under the Grant is completed or the date of the award document, or any supplement or amendment thereto, on which sponsorship ends.

3) Disallowed Costs: Disallowed costs are those charges to a Grant that USAID or its representative determines to be unallowable in accordance with the applicable Federal cost principles or other conditions contained in the Grant.

b. USAID closeout procedures include the following requirements:

1) Upon request, USAID shall make prompt payments to a Grantee for allowable reimbursable costs under the Agreement being closed out.

2) The Grantee shall immediately fund any balance or unobligated (unencumbered) cash that USAID has advanced or paid and that is not authorized to be retained by the Grantee for use in other Agreements.

3) In the event a final report has not been performed prior to the closeout of the Grant, USAID shall retain the right to recover an appropriate amount after fully considering the recommendations on questioned costs resulting from the financial reviews.

F. Special Provisions

1. As set forth in Attachment 3, all Mandatory Standard Provisions for Non-U.S. Non-governmental Grantees apply to this Grant. Applicable Optional Standard

Provisions are indicated on the Checklist.

2. The USAID Project Officer is authorized to issue all approval documents which can clearly and reasonably be considered within the terms of this Grant as written.
3. The "Rights in Data" provision, attached, forms part of this Grant.

G. Title to Property

Title to property acquired hereunder shall vest in the Grantee, subject to the requirements of Standard Provision of this Grant entitled "Title to and Use of Property (Grantee Title)." Disposition of property shall be in accordance with said optional provision.

H. Authorized Geographic Code

The authorized geographic code under this Grant shall be the United States (000) and Peru (subject to Local Cost Financing Provision).

I. Cost Sharing and Other Contributions

1. The grantee agrees to expend an amount not less than the amount shown in the budget of this Grant for financing by the Recipient and/or others from non-federal funds. (See Section D. Financial Plan of the Schedule).
2. The Standard Provisions of this Grant Agreement entitled "Cost Sharing (Matching)" makes reference to project costs. "Project Costs" are defined in Attachment E of OMB Circular A-110 as all allowable costs (as set forth in the applicable cost principles [see the Standard Provisions of this Grant Agreement entitled "Allowable Costs"]) incurred by a Grantee and the value of in-kind contributions made by the Grantee or third parties in accomplishing the objectives of this Grant Agreement during the program period.
3. The restrictions on the use of USAID funds provided hereunder, as set forth in this Grant Agreement, do not apply to cost-sharing (matching) or other contributions unless such restrictions are stated in the applicable federal cost principles and/or imposed by the source of such cost-sharing (matching) funds or other contributions.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

I. Background

The Action Plan approved at the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) held in Cairo in September 1994 emphasizes population policy as an essential component of development policy, and makes the objective of improvement in the quality of life of equal importance to that of reductions in population growth and fertility rates.

The ICPD Conference constitutes a reproductive health landmark, since it not only addressed family planning but also proposed an integrated reproductive health focus that incorporates such other elements as low-risk pregnancy, prevention of sexually-transmitted diseases including HIV/AIDS, and cancer prevention, emphasizing women's rights, freedom of choice and the quality of reproductive health services.

To seek consensus on the new concepts referred to in the Action Plan, it is essential that institutions directly involved in reproductive health carry out a broad nationwide debate on the subject. At a minimum, there must be consensus on the concepts of health and sexual and reproductive rights, so that clear implementation policies and strategies can be drawn up and put into action. These should guarantee and promote the exercise of those rights by Peruvians, especially the most vulnerable. Such consensus will serve to strengthen the actions that must be undertaken to carry out the ICPD Action Plan. Workshops will provide a forum for this debate.

Within this context and to commemorate one year's time since the ICPD took place, a National Workshop on Health and Reproductive Rights will be held. This workshop will be sponsored by the United Nations Fund for Population activities (UNFPA), the Ministry of Health and the Consejo Nacional de Población (CONAPO), with the co-funding leverage from UNFPA. The organization selected to organize this workshop is Movimiento Manuela Ramos (MMR), a leading organization in women's rights advocacy, including reproductive rights. MMR is a private non-profit organization that has been working for the improvement of women's status since 1980. It has been active in the advocacy of policies with a gender approach, the generation of income and employment for women, reproductive health and sex education, prevention of family violence, and promotion of increased political participation by women.



MMR has carried out these activities with the participation of community organizations. The MMR director and founder was the first president of the National Network for the Promotion of Women.

MMR participated in the ICPD, representing the Latin America and Caribbean Network for Women's Health, and is responsible for developing a follow-on plan to the Action Plan approved in Cairo. This responsibility and MMR's leadership among Peruvian institutions qualifies MMR to convoke opinion leaders and decision-makers to discuss and propose future actions in the area of reproductive health within the Action Plan approved at the Cairo Conference.

II. Project Description

This project will consist of a National Workshop on Health and Reproductive Rights and an Information Meeting for journalists, communication and decision-makers.

A. National Workshop on Health and Reproductive Rights

1. Objectives

- a. To contribute to refining concepts in health and reproductive rights, within the framework of the agreements from the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) Action Plan.
- b. To achieve consensus on policies and strategies for implementing them that guarantee the sexual and reproductive rights of Peruvian men and women.

2. Participants

- a. Directors of the Ministry of Health (MoH)
- b. Chiefs of Departments of Obstetrics/Gynecology in the public sector
- c. Directors of the Regional Population Councils
- d. Researchers and university professors
- e. Representatives of NGOs that work in health and women's development

3. Contents

a. **The Reproductive Health Program of the Ministry of Health**

Speaker: Dr. John Nagahata, Director of Social Programs, MoH

b. **Male and Female Perspectives of Health, Sexuality and Reproductive Rights**

- 1) Definitions regarding reproductive health and sexual and reproductive rights
- 2) The socio-cultural context that conditions the exercise of those reproductive rights
- 3) Women's proposals

Speakers: Susana Galdos, General Coordinator of Movimiento Manuela Ramos
Dr. Julio Castro, Congressman

c. **Sexual and Reproductive Rights, Sexually-Transmitted Diseases and HIV/AIDS**

- 1) The right to a healthy and satisfying sexual life
- 2) The conditions that limit or make this possible
- 3) STD and HIV/AIDS incidence in Peru and measures to prevent these diseases

Speaker: Dr. Jorge Sánchez, Director of AIDS Program, MINSA

d. **Safe Pregnancy and Reproductive Rights**

- 1) Conditions necessary to guarantee voluntary, low-risk pregnancy
- 2) The incidence and causes of maternal mortality in Peru
- 3) Prevention of maternal morbidity and mortality and measures to guarantee safe delivery, incorporating women's needs and reproductive rights

e. **Sexuality and Reproduction as Basic Human Rights**

- 1) The legal framework for women's and men's sexual and reproductive rights
- 2) Women's proposals to make sex and reproduction basic human rights

These topics will be presented in the morning. After the presentations a discussion will take place with the participants.

In the afternoon, working groups will be organized by topic, to prepare an action plan that will be presented in a plenary session.

B. Information Meeting for Journalists, Communicators and Decision-makers

A follow-on meeting will be organized for journalists, social communicators, key health authorities, politicians and congresspersons after the conclusions of the workshop will be distributed to the participants and presented by representatives of the CONAPO, MoH, Society of Gynecology and Obstetrics and Movimiento Manuela Ramos. There will be ample time for dialog between participants and presenters.

C. Publication and Dissemination of Conference Contents, Conclusions and Recommendations

Movimiento Manuela Ramos will be responsible for the preparation of a final report on the workshop and its circulation among the participants and other relevant opinion leaders and organizations at the national level.

III. USAID Responsibility

The Office of Health Population and Nutrition will be the liaison for all matters related to the Grant and will be responsible to ensure that project activities conform to USAID regulations and interest and purpose of the Grant.
