Dear Colleague:

I am pleased to present the 1994 Activity Report for the Small Project Assistance (SPA) Program.

For more than a decade, Peace Corps and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) have combined resources to create this unique program which supports community-based, self-help development efforts. In 1994, more than 500 SPA-supported projects were undertaken in over 70 countries around the world.

Wherever these projects are being implemented, Peace Corps Volunteers are working with communities to mobilize, organize, and focus resources on grassroots development activities. Through these efforts, SPA grants are being used to complement and help leverage local resources. It is this local resource mobilization that best demonstrates the self-help nature of these initiatives.

In addition to the grants provided, more than 50 technical assistance and training activities were supported by SPA in 1994. These activities focused on increasing Volunteer and host country national skills in project design and management. Technical assistance funds were also used to support the participation of host country nationals in specific sectoral areas such as environment, health and nutrition, education, food production and women in development. Experience has demonstrated that the skills acquired through these various technical assistance activities are integral to effective project implementation at the community level.


Since its inception, the SPA Program has consistently shown that grassroots initiatives have a strong likelihood of success where active community members and interested Peace Corps Volunteers join forces in project design and management. 
Acknowledgements

Overview of the SPA Program

More Than A Decade of Cooperation

"The intent of the funding mechanism is to finance... small "self-help" activities which will have immediate impact at the community level. The activities will be responsive to the needs of communities as expressed by community members through their local group."¹

Support for Sustainable Development

Those words marked the beginning of the Small Project Assistance (SPA) Program which was launched in January of 1983 with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Peace Corps (PC) and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). The program combines the financial resources of USAID with the human resources of Peace Corps Volunteers and capitalizes on the strengths both agencies bring to the development process.

Since its inception, the program has supported more than 5,000 community projects and has directly benefitted over 2,000,000 individuals. In these communities, local contributions of land, labor, material, and financial resources have surpassed \$8,000,000.

The importance of small projects as learning tools is increasingly being acknowledged by development practitioners. By going through the process of project design and management, members of a community or local organization are given the opportunity to participate in needs assessments, problem solving, planning, implementation and evaluation. Each of these activities is an essential step in the process of community development and the opportunity to "practice" these steps through a specific project helps build capacity at the local level.

Such capacity building for community development is the cornerstone of the sustainable development philosophy

shared by Peace Corps and USAID. Both agencies understand that sustainability depends on the participation of local people in all aspects of any development effort. Participation ensures that development initiatives are based on the aspirations and experience of the people involved.

By promoting participation in community development, SPA projects are contributing to Peace Corps' goal of people-to-people assistance at the grassroots level. In addition to the participation of community members, successful SPA projects depend on the participation and sensitive facilitation of Peace Corps Volunteers. Volunteers who become involved in their communities are better able to fulfill the goals of cross-cultural understanding as well as technical assistance.²

SPA projects clearly support USAID's strategic goals as well.³ The majority of projects are related to the following four strategies: (1) encouraging broad-based economic growth, (2) stabilizing population growth and protecting human health, and (3) protecting the environment, and (4) building democracy. Many SPA projects help strengthen democracy by enhancing community participation in the development process and by encouraging the formation and development of grass-roots NGOs. The democratic process begins when people first come together to solve a problem; oftentimes a SPA project will provide the framework around which a community organizes.

A number of projects also provide humanitarian assistance and con-

tribute to post-crisis transitions (USAID's fifth goal). For example, a Volunteer in Hungary is working with Bosnian Refugees on a SPA project designed to better integrate refugees into the local town. Also, in drought prone regions of Africa such as the Sahel, SPA projects help reinforce local people's capacity to pre-

pare and mitigate against the effects of drought. In these areas, Peace Corps Volunteers and communities work together to build wells and cisterns and introduce techniques such as agroforestry for soil conservation. Such projects help provide an important buffer against natural disaster.

Grants and Technical Assistance: Complementary Features

The SPA Program provides grants for community-based, self-help projects identified by local community groups working with Peace Corps Volunteers (PCVs), Peace Corps staff, PCVs, and USAID mission staff review and approve individual project requests for funding. Projects are selected in accordance with the following basic criteria: (1) the activity must be conceived and implemented by a local community group or organization working in conjunction with a PCV; (2) the local group must provide some of its own resources, in cash or in kind, to the activity; (3) to the extent possible, the activity must be scheduled for completion within the PCV's term of service, and preferably within one year of its commencement; (4) the maximum SPA grant contribution for each activity is limited to \$10,000; and (5) the activity must not encourage continued reliance on external assistance.

In addition to small grants, SPA provides financial support for technical assistance (TA). The purpose of TA is to support the participation of Host Country Nationals (HCNs) in training activities that stimulate sustainable development at the local level and enhance the design and management of projects supported by SPA grants. During the IPBS review, and again at each quarter of the fiscal year, a committee of technical and program experts from the Peace Corps regions and OTAPS reviews the requests for SPA technical assistance to determine which of these requests SPA will support.

SPA TA funds are used for the following types of technical assistance activities:

- Project Design and Management (PDM) Workshops – PDMs are

designed to ensure that SPA projects respond to community needs and priorities. PDM content is geared to the training of participants in the project development process. Workshop goals are to: (1) increase participants' understanding of the importance of community involvement and ownership; (2) familiarize participants with new project management tools such as problem-solving, planning, and proposal writing; (3) determine the appropriateness of external assistance in community projects. PC posts are expected to cover PCV and PC staff costs while SPA supports HCN participation. HCNs, whether they are official counterparts or not, should be individuals with whom PCVs will work on community projects.

- HCN Participation in In-Service Trainings (ISTs) – During any given PCV's term of service, Peace Corps posts typically conduct a number of ISTs designed to address PCV and HCN needs for sector-specific technical training. SPA funds may be used to support HCN participation in technical ISTs, particularly in those sectors which receive limited PASA support and which stimulate self-help projects within the broad area of community development.

SPA TA helps increase the capacity of communities and local groups to identify and address their needs. Frequently these trainings lead to SPA grant requests. Moreover, Peace Corps staff and Volunteers report that projects organized by individuals who have benefited from training are generally better managed and demonstrate a higher level of community participation in all stages of project implementation.

The Role of the Volunteer in a SPA Supported Project

The success of a SPA project is determined by more than the end product. The process of a community working together to solve a problem or address an identified need is as much a part of the success as the end result.

SPA projects can enhance a community's ability to organize, plan and make group decisions. PCVs can play an important role in this process by acting as "facilitators" rather than a "doers." As a facilitator, a PCV conveys technical skills while helping to increase leadership capacity and self-reliance within the community.

Experience has shown that successful small projects encompass the following elements:

- Involvement of the community in all phases of project planning and implementation; ensuring "community ownership."
- Clear roles and responsibilities for all those involved with the implementation of the project.
- Well thought-out plans, budgets, and time schedules that allow the project to be completed within the funding limits and within the time allowed.
- A training component that provides community members with the technical and managerial skills required for project implementation.
- An effective monitoring system that measures the project's progress, identifies problems, and provides a mechanism for necessary changes in the project.

In 1994, the following selected recommendations were made by PCVs for others interested in conducting a SPA project.

- Small projects must result from locally identified needs, and be addressed in collaboration with local community members and organizations. *Bolivia, Christine Carley*
- Plan who will do what... involve the beneficiaries as much as possible. *Benin, Teresa Wagner*
- Cash contributions should be obtained from the beneficiaries before the project begins. *Mali, Christopher S. Clore*
- Tell the group you are working with that this is their country and their problem—they must find the solution to satisfy their particular needs. Involve them in drawing a flow chart of the situation that is not working and then ask them what changes can be made so it will work. *Poland, Roberta Jean Gwinn*
- Try to encourage more hands-on activity by participants-beneficiaries. Help them make it theirs! *Czech Republic, Mary K. Murname*
- Involve host-country nationals as co-workers in recommending craftsmen and helping to monitor the quality of work. *Western Samoa, Thomas Barakatt and Ran Mardenly*

² Since its creation in 1961, the mission of the Peace Corps has encompassed three broad goals: (1) helping people of interested countries meet their needs for trained workers; (2) promoting a better understanding of America in other countries; (3) promoting a better understanding of those countries here in the United States.

³ USAID’s strategic goals consist of: (1) Protecting the Environment; (2) Building Democracy; (3) Stabilizing World Population Growth and Protecting Human Health; (4) Encouraging Broad-Based Economic Growth; (5) Providing Humanitarian Assistance and Aiding Post-Crisis Transitions.

Here, a SPA grant was used to purchase 10 looms while SPA technical assistance funds supported women’s weaving workshops.



Highlights from 1994

SPA Grant Activities

A total of 616 small projects were supported by SPA during calendar year 1994 and these activities are expected to directly benefit over 440,000 individuals.¹ In order to complement total SPA grant contributions of \$1,503,205, project participants mobilized \$1,306,059 in local

community contributions to support these efforts.

The table below indicates regional grant totals and the average SPA grant and community contribution per region.

Table 2 illustrates that the average SPA grant amount—less than \$3,000—is considerably lower than the \$10,000 ceiling stipulated in the program guidance. These figures demonstrate the philosophy that “less is more” when it comes to self-help community development.

It is also important to note that community contributions in 1994 accounted for between 40 and 55 per-


cent of total project costs (averaging out at 46%). In the IA and ECAM regions, the average community contribution to a project actually exceeded the average SPA contribution. These statistics underscore one of the most important lessons learned during more than a decade of SPA program experience: the greater the community’s investment of its resources, the greater the chance for project success.

Sectoral Breakdown of Projects

The following chart depicts the distribution of project activities according to primary classification by Peace Corps sector. As the chart illustrates, roughly 80% of all projects are divided between the health, educa-

tion, water/sanitation, and economic development sectors. The environment and food production sectors account for most of the remaining projects.

Grant Projects by Peace Corps Sector




USAID's Strategic Objectives

The following chart illustrates the distribution of projects according to

their contributions to three of USAID's strategic objectives:

*As noted earlier in this report, many SPA projects also enhance local capacity and help build democracy by encouraging constructive civic action.

There is some regional variation in the emphasis given to each strategic objective. For example, as Table 3 indicates, in the ECAM region the primary focus is on economic development and the environment. In the IA region, population and health ac-

count for nearly half of all SPA projects while in both the A/P and Africa regions, the majority of projects are undertaken in support of economic development and population/health.

Regional and Sectoral Breakdown of Technical Assistance

To complement and enhance the grant activities, SPA supported a total of 56 training events during Calendar Year 1994 at a total cost of \$323,569, benefiting 1,181 HCNs. Training workshops were attended by both PCVs and HCNs, however, SPA funds were primarily used to support HCN participation in these events.

Of these workshops, 57% (32) provided training in project design and management. The remaining 43% (24) enhanced the technical skills of participants through sector-specific ISTs. Tables 4 and 5 illustrate the regional and sectoral breakdown of these training activities.


In 1994, three new countries, El Salvador, Madagascar, and Zambia started SPA programs.

SPA Program Evaluation

The current USAID/Peace Corps SPA PASA called for an evaluation of the SPA program in 1994. The primary objective of the evaluation was to assess the development benefits of the SPA program to the Peace Corps and USAID as well as to the local communities served by the program. The consulting firm, Management Systems International, began conducting the evaluation during the latter half of 1994 and delivered the final report approximately seven months later. The following summarizes the evaluation's findings and recommendations:

- SPA projects are extraordinarily successful, achieving all or some of their objectives in 92% of a sample of randomly selected projects.
- The SPA program contributes to sustainable improvements in local communities. More than 80% of the projects examined were still functioning or had left something lasting behind.
- SPA project funds successfully leverage community contributions which represented, on average, 60 percent of total project costs in those projects sampled from the years 1991-1993 (SPA funds accounted for 40% of total costs).
- SPA program management and accountability systems were found to function well.

Many SPA projects increase the earning power of women through income generation.



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- Despite several administrative changes during the life of the program, administrative difficulties persist with regard to the timely transfer of funds to Peace Corps posts, and in the reporting of obligations and expenditures to USAID. In order to alleviate these problems, it was recommended that the program be moved back onto a fiscal year funding cycle.
 - It was also recommended that the SPA Guidance and Handbook be consolidated into one document and reissued with minor revisions in order to clarify procedures and eliminate program criteria that are considered obsolete or redundant.

¹ This total includes 83 projects from Niger that were reported but are not represented in most of the statistical information presented in this report due to missing data. In addition to the Niger omission, no projects were reported on from Romania and one project from the Solomon Islands, submitted late, is also excluded from this report.

Future Directions

Review and Implementation of Evaluation Recommendations

In 1995, the SPA program evaluation results will be reviewed by USAID and Peace Corps staff. Peace Corps will establish a SPA Evaluation Response Committee composed of regional staff and other interested individuals from relevant offices such as the Office of Training and Program Support (OTAPS), the Office of Private Sector Relations (OPSR), and the Office of Planning, Budget and Finance (OPBF). The Committee will be charged with helping decide how to most effectively implement the evaluation recommendations in light of Peace Corps field and head-quarter needs.

Streamlining of the Annual SPA Funding Mechanism

In accordance with the evaluation's recommendations, management of the SPA program will be modified such that funding and other operations (e.g., reporting) occur on a fiscal year basis. This transition is scheduled to take place in FY96. In addition, gaps in the SPA funding cycle will be eliminated by adopting a forward funding mechanism such that the SPA funds received from USAID in one fiscal year will be released at the start of the following fiscal year. Under this new mechanism, Peace Corps posts will also be able to include estimates of future SPA funding needs in their IPBS submissions.

Revision of Guidance and Handbook

Also in response to recommendations that emerged from the evaluation, the SPA Guidance and Handbook will be consolidated into one document and reissued with minor changes aimed at clarifying processes and updating and rationalizing program criteria. A new set of criteria will be established and reviewed with input from Peace Corps headquarters and field staff.

Revision of Project Design and Management Workshop

The PDM workshop offered through the SPA program was developed in 1987 with the aim of fostering greater community participation in the design, implementation, and evaluation of projects. Throughout the last eight years, both trainers and participants have recommended changes and im-


provements in the workshop's curriculum. At the same time, new training methods have emerged in participatory community development. In some cases, the workshop design has been modified by local trainers to incorporate these changes. But these modifications have occurred on an *ad hoc* basis only.

The time has come to capture the lessons learned in a more systematic fashion. Following a review of the PDM materials by a select group of trainers—some familiar with the old curriculum and some well-versed in new training methodologies for community development—the workshop design will be updated to allow for incorporation of relevant innovations in project design and management. This new PDM workshop will be field tested and will then be introduced to local trainers in the four Peace Corps regions through a series of Training of Trainers Workshops.

**Africa Region:

Summary of Regional Activities

Africa

The Africa region represents the largest regional component of SPA, containing more than half of the countries with active programs (refer back to Table 1) and accounting for 63 percent of all grant activities in 1994.

The chart illustrates the sectoral distribution of SPA projects in the Africa region. Health and water and sanitation account for fifty percent of the project activities in this region, followed closely by projects in the education sector.

Case Study: Construction of a Medical Post in Dabola-Berete, Guinea

The district of Dabola-Berete is similar to many others in Guinea where the accessibility to health care is very limited. Infrastructure within the country is also limited; the few existing roads are in terrible condition and many are impassable during the rainy season. A variety of maladies is common: intestinal parasites, other diarrhea-related illnesses, malaria, upper respiratory infections, measles, leprosy, and complications related to pregnancy and childbirth. In the best of all possible worlds, a nurse from the regional health center arrives once a month to perform vaccinations, pre-natal consultations and any other necessary services. But these visits are frequently impossible due largely to transportation problems and difficulties imposed by the rainy season, as well as shortages of personnel and a lack of vaccines.

Michelle Thompson, a health volunteer, arrived in Dabola-Berete two years ago. The Director of the regional health center approached Michelle and asked her if she could work with him to draft a proposal for financing the construction of a medical post in the district of Dabola-Berete, the plan for which had existed since the development of a national reconstruction health plan in 1988. Dabola had been chosen as the site for a medical post because of: (1) its large population; and (2) the distance from the regional health center. The Director assured Michelle that the medical post, upon its completion, would be staffed and furnished with all the requisite supplies.

A project began to take shape. Mr. Momo Camara, the Sous-Prefet, worked with Michelle to write up the proposal for a total project cost of \$13,565. The community contribution amounted to \$3,950 and SPA funds accounted for \$9615. The community provided all the locally available materials (bricks, sand, gravel, etc.) even before the proposal was submitted. They also contributed all of the non-specialized labor during the construction, and all the workers' lunches. The land (2,500 m²) was donated to the district specifically for the medical post.

Plans call for staffing the post with a nurse who will provide general consultations and vaccinations. The post will also serve as a birthing center. The nurse will be able to work with the village midwife, an animated very well-respected member of the community. The maintenance and upkeep of the building will be the responsibility of a local health committee.


According to Michelle, "This is the first project in the district to be completely initiated and actualized by the district residents themselves. Other organizations have come in and donated most of the materials and done all of the work themselves, without requiring a significant community contribution."

**Inter-America Region:
Grant Projects by Sector**



Inter-America

The Inter-America region represents 15 percent of all SPA-supported projects conducted in 1994. Three sectors—water and sanitation, economic development, and health—account for nearly three-quarters of the projects. As the chart illustrates, however, the environment sector represents an ever-increasing sectoral focus in this region.

Case Study: Roasted Plantain "Mini-Industria," Costa Rica

Rio Celeste de Guatuso, Alajuela, Costa Rica consists of 55 families. The community's economic base derives from small-scale production of plantains, cardamom, coffee, beans, tubers and beef cattle. In addition to the sale of their own produce, most families supplement their incomes by working on other farms. Beyond their traditional roles as housewives, the only other employment opportunity for women is the harvesting of cardamom and coffee.

With the goal of increasing their families' incomes, a group of 14 women—"Las Celestinas"—approached PCV Michael Toops about their idea for creating a micro-enterprise for plantain and cassava roasting. The women had already been raising funds through membership dues and by organizing raffles, dances, bake sales, and bingo games. They had also solicited financial and technical support from more than 20 foundations and government sources including the Inter-American Foundation, the National Center for Women and Families, the Institute for Agrarian Development, and others.


Michael was impressed with their initiative. He worked with Doña Digna, Las Celestinas' President, and other members of the group to develop a SPA proposal. By December 1993, the project was approved and project implementation took place throughout 1994. The SPA grant of \$4,416 was used for construction materials (for the micro-industrial plant), kitchen supplies, a refrigerator, and various office supplies. To complete the total project cost, Las Celestinas' members were able to contribute \$8,798 worth of land, labor, and material support.

Michael observed: "I have seen this group tackle problems and find viable solutions on their own. The construction of the plant is of high quality and the production process developed by the women is running smoothly with few glitches." Regarding unexpected outcomes he noted an "overall improvement of some group members' public speaking and leadership abilities, plus the development of writing and mathematical skills."


PC/Costa Rica's Resource Coordinator, Astrid Villarta, reports: "Today the group works 5 days a week, eight hours per day processing the plantain and cassava into roasted chips and distributing the product among the various little grocery stores in and surrounding Rio Celeste. All that they produce is sold and they are planning to investigate other possible markets and increase production."

Asia and the Pacific

Eleven percent of all grant activities took place in the Asia/Pacific region in 1994. Economic development, health, and water and sanitation were the prominent sectors, followed by education and food production.

Case Study: Narewa Women's Kitchen, Fiji

Narewa Village is situated in a particularly beautiful scenic setting by the sea-side with the Nakauvadra Mountain Range in the distance. There is an attractive high outcropping rock formation just at the edge of the village. It is the smallest village in the Rakiraki region with a population of only 120 persons.


The Narewa Women's Group have worked together on various projects such as raising the funds to electrify their village. Together with PCV Joanna Barnes, the women discussed the need to complete the kitchen, toilets and showers in the Narewa Village community hall. Several members of the group were tasked with designing and planning the project. Working with the PCV, they drafted the SPA proposal for a total project cost of \$5,300. Of this, \$2,100 in labor was contributed by the village, and \$3,200 came from SPA funds.

Upgrading the kitchen facilities has allowed the Narewa Women's group to use the community hall for income generating activities. These activities involve "off-beach" tours, specifically overnight stays by backpackers and other visitors to Fiji. The group also hosts "traditional village visits" for customers of tour companies. Income from these visits is about \$6,500 per year. Narewa is also now a regular stop for tours from nearby hotels. During these stops, community members sell refreshments to tourists.


The SPA-funded project has helped make this new source of income possible. The Narewa Village Women's Group maintains the community hall and its facilities. One of the original project designers, Mrs. Susana Lewainituva, manages these activities. The elders of the village indicate that the experience of mobilizing resources and fundraising in an organized manner has been most useful and is being applied to other efforts in the village.

The remaining 11 percent of all SPA projects implemented in 1994 were carried out in the ECAM region. As noted earlier in this report, projects in the ECAM region are characterized by a focus on sectors pertaining to economic development and environment. Most projects in these sectors also include a strong emphasis on education.

Case Study: Environmental Education in the National Parks, Poland

The environmental problems plaguing Poland are daunting. According to Peace Corps/Poland's Environmental Sector Overview, the initial cause of environmental degradation in Poland (i.e., emphasis on increasing production capacity to the detriment of its impact on the environment) is being exacerbated by a general lack of environmental public awareness, and poorly coordinated grassroots activism.


Ryszard Zolnik, a PCV of Polish descent, started working at OEE EKO-OKO (Center for Environmental Education) in February 1993. Although he began by organizing environmental education teacher trainings within EKO-OKO, the program focus eventually shifted in response to teachers' demands for innovative, enjoyable and educational environmental activities that they could share with their students. In order to facilitate this change in emphasis, the members of EKO-OKO looked to SPA.

The SPA project objectives were: (1) to provide teachers with fresh, new environmental education techniques, and (2) to develop teachers' leadership skills during outdoor practical, participatory activities. During the project design process, weekly meetings were held in order to iron out the roles and responsibilities of all the parties involved.

The budget was developed by Ryszard and the Center's accountant. In addition to \$3,019 in SPA funding, the project received funding from several other regional NGOs such as the Regional Environmental Center in Budapest, Hungary and the Free Enterprise Center in Krakow, Poland. SPA funds were released within about four weeks of the project's approval. A separate bank account was opened by the Center for the SPA funds and the Center's accountant was given responsibility for tracking and disbursing daily expenditures. SPA funds were used primarily for: (1) the teaching materials and office supplies required by the teachers involved in the program, and (2) the skilled labor required to produce both an educational video and the book "Zywioly Siemi."

The impact of the project, both within and beyond the EKO-OKO Center, has been extraordinary. Not only did the project expose EKO-OKO members to the tasks of designing, planning, implementing and evaluating a successful project, it trained 25 teachers in participatory, interactive, environmental education techniques. In addition, 300 students participated in the field trips that were organized as a result of the program. Teachers really appreciated the opportunity to experience a "non-traditional," friendly atmosphere in which to work. "Every time teachers convened," Ryszard indicated, "there was an invaluable exchange of information; their experiences stimulated them to incorporate new ideas in their classrooms."

In addition to increased production of goods or services, additional benefits of SPA projects may include increased income and savings, decreased labor inputs, new skills, and better quality control.

Appendix 1

SPA Financial Information

This appendix displays the total grant funds utilized by country. The period covered includes quarter one of fiscal year 1994 (October-December 1993) as well as the four quarters of the calendar year (January-December 1994). This financial information is based on the quarterly and end-of-year close out reports received from Peace Corps posts.

Please note that the amounts presented in this table are not consistent with the cumulative project totals by region depicted as "SPA Amount" in Appendix 2. These inconsistencies are primarily due to the fact that the project data in Appendix 2 cover the calendar year only, while the data presented here cover the calendar year plus the first quarter of the fiscal year for 1994.

Furthermore, the project data in Appendix 2 are based on anticipated project costs, whereas the financial data detailed here reflect actual obligations, liquidations, and final costs. During the course of project implementation, expenditures may actually exceed or be less than anticipated. Or, obligations might be made in various disbursements over the life of a single project, thus affecting the fiscal picture during a specific time period.

These differences in the time period covered and in systems of fiscal reporting account for most of the variation in financial information contained in these two appendices. In a few cases, discrepancies might also be related to posts' omission and/or late submission of financial reports.
