1. <u>Agriculture and Natural Resources</u>	<p>The FY 1957 Technical Exchange Program in agriculture will be principally directed in the areas of livestock improvement, soil conservation, land tenure, agricultural extension, food processing, and marketing. The projects will, insofar as possible, be related to the projects included in the Section 109 sales proceeds program. Emphasis will also be placed on projects in the fields of food processing and marketing of agricultural products, in order for Spain to keep pace with quality standards of foreign competitors.</p>	330
2. <u>Industry and Mining</u>	<p>The program will continue to emphasize industrial management and technical studies in the fields of electric power and basic industry where they can be applied as support of the economic aid program. In addition, it will provide for projects in the field of industrial management and distribution. Both Type I and Type II Projects will be employed, with the emphasis in all fields on the training of trainers and the support of Spanish productivity programs for the education of management, technicians, foremen and workers in new attitudes and techniques.</p> <p>As in FY 1956, certain projects directed toward labor-management relations will be included in the industry program. These would include human relations, labor market analysis, industrial safety, and apprenticeship training.</p> <p>The program for Technical Exchange in the building and construction industry should expand in 1957 and will include Type I and II Projects in such fields as pre-planning, organization on building site, foremen training, and use of new and standardized building elements.</p> <p>In the area of defense production, the emphasis will be on the production of ammunition and spare parts for U.S. military equipment delivered under the end-item program, particularly communications equipment, automotive and aircraft components. In addition, the improvement of Spanish POL distribution facilities will be emphasized.</p> <p>The Technical Aids Services for Industry, particularly the film program and question and answer service, will be continued.</p>	600
