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Food Security Situation*

- A post-civil war context, low soil productivity linked to erratic rainfall, poor infrastructure, and population displacement all undermine Burundi's food security.
- More than 80 percent of Burundians are food insecure and almost 50 percent are chronically malnourished. Burundi is classified as a "red zone" country by both the World Food Program and the U.N. Food and Agriculture Organization meaning the country is likely to be adversely impacted by heightened food prices.
- Food production is a major problem as output has stalled at pre-1993 levels. Per capita agricultural production has declined by almost 25 percent since the early 1990s.
