Food Security Situation*

- Large-scale displacement caused by political instability, limited infrastructure and high transport costs, and inadequate access to medical facilities all combine to exacerbate Cote D'Ivoire's food insecurity.
- Beginning in 2002, the country was effectively cut in half which has led to the displacement of some 800,000 people.
- The ongoing complex humanitarian emergency has resulted in a steady decline in living conditions, livelihoods, land access, and food security. Northern and western areas of the country are most imperiled.
