Food Security Situation*

- A low-income and food-deficit country and the third poorest nation in Latin America and the Caribbean, Honduras is affected by recurring natural disasters. Hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, land degradation, deforestation and soil erosion all constitute threats to Hondurans' food security.

- Malnutrition and HIV/AIDS are both acute food security threats. In some rural communities in the west, chronic malnutrition can reach 88 percent. Countrywide, one-third of children are chronically malnourished. The AIDS pandemic is becoming a serious and growing threat for the country, with an estimated 1.8 percent of the population living with HIV/AIDS.
