Food Security Situation*

- Pakistan is a low-income, food-deficit country with a predominantly rural population. Some 30 percent of the population lives below the poverty line.

- Including internally displaced persons who fled fighting earlier this year, the United Nations estimates that the total number of registered IDPs stands at more than 2.5 million.

- World Health Organization and United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) assessments indicate high levels of malnutrition among displaced children under age 5 and note the marked decrease in breastfeeding by displaced mothers. Both internally displaced persons and locally affected people have lost their livelihoods. Opportunities for employment inside and outside camps for the displaced are scarce.
