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### Food Security Situation\*

- Although Senegal is relatively stable, challenges persist given its status as a low-income, food-deficit country. Multi-faceted threats to its food security include natural disasters, insufficient food production, poverty and low levels of literacy and sanitation.
- More than 45 percent of households in Senegal are vulnerable to food insecurity, with 20 percent considered highly vulnerable. Approximately 50 percent of households are affected by poverty.
- Malnutrition rates in the countryside are twice as high as in urban areas. About 16 percent of children under age 5 are chronically malnourished and more than 70 percent of women and children under age 5 are iron-deficient.
