### Food Security Situation\*

- The World Food Program continues its Darfur operations to address gaps in humanitarian assistance left by the expulsion of 13 international PVOs and disbanding of three national NGOs by the Sudanese government in March.
- As an emergency measure, WFP organized a distribution of two-month food rations in all three Darfur states starting on March 15. These distributions are now complete. All target beneficiaries (1.1 million people) affected by the PVOs expulsion have received their two-month food rations.
- The distributions were carried out by local food relief committees with the help of staff borrowed by WFP from expelled PVOs on a temporary basis. While it is hoped it will allow WFP to cover general food distribution needs in all areas in Darfur, there may be a few gaps particularly in remote rural areas.
