Food Security Situation*

- There have been gradual improvements in human security and development since the 1990s. Specifically, the proportion of the population living below the national poverty line declined from 56 to 31 percent between 1992-1993 and 2002-2003. Uganda's score on the UN human development index has increased steadily since 1995 and it now ranks 154 out of 177 countries worldwide.

- Crop supplies to regional and district market centers in the country have declined, although they continue to be available, mainly from trader stocks, according to anecdotal information from district officials and traders. Overall, commodity prices remain higher than the five-year average, as seasonal price rises have been observed for most commodities.
