






Country Strategic Plan 2004-2009 – Results Framework

Country Strategic Plan 2004-2009 and **NEEDS**

□ **USAID directly supports the NEEDS goals:**

- Wealth creation
- Employment generation
- Poverty reduction
- Value reorientation

□ **And strategies:**

Strengthened Foundations for Democratic Governance (\$53 million)

■ **Civil Society**

- Indigenous Nigerian citizens' organizations empowered to demand transparency and accountability from their government and advocate for their priorities

■ **Institutional Capacity Building**

- National Assembly, State Legislatures, Political Parties

■ **Elections Support**

- Strengthening INEC and SIECs

■ **Conflict Mitigation and Management**

- Conflict early warning and sensitization



Improved Livelihoods (\$63 million)

- **Maximizing Agricultural Revenue and Key Enterprises in Targeted Sites (MARKETS)**
- **Restructured Economic Framework for Openness, Reforms and Macroeconomic Stability (REFORMS)**
- **Sustainable Agriculture in Critical Environments (SPACE)**
- **Cassava Enterprise Development Program**
- **Microfinance**



Increased use of Social Sector Services (\$169 million)

- **Social Sector Services Program**
 - 23 million target population
- **Basic Education**
 - Interactive Radio Network and Teacher Training
- **Reproductive Health/ Family Planning**
 - Contraceptive procurement, social marketing, and logistics management
- **Child Survival**
 - Routine immunizations and polio program
- **Malaria**
 - Social marketing of insecticide treated nets



Reduced Impact of HIV/AIDS (\$175 million)

- **HIV/AIDS and Tuberculosis**
 - ARV Treatment, Prevention, and Care and Support
- **HIV/AIDS Program 2008 Targets under President Bush's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief:**
 - 350,000 PLWHA receiving Anti-retroviral Therapy
 - 1,750,000 receiving care and support, including 400,000 Orphans and vulnerable children
 - 1,145,545 new infections prevented



Key Issues: Governance

- The establishment of NEEDS and SEEDS demonstrates the Nigerian government's commitment to progress.
- State governments are developing their SEED Strategies.
- Donor Community is engaging state governments on requests for assistance.



Key Issues: Youth

- Over 70 million Nigerians are 18 years old or younger.
- HIV prevalence in Nigeria is highest among 20-24 year olds at 5.6%.
- Many young people have migrated to urban areas seeking jobs that either do not exist or for which they are not qualified.



Key Issues: Equity

- While problems of poverty and inadequate basic health services are widespread, the Niger Delta and the North have the most acute conditions within Nigeria.
- The North faces the gravest challenges in immunization rates, under 5 mortality, and women's literacy rates.
- The Niger Delta faces instability due to lack of economic opportunity for youth



Summary

- Nigeria's 5 year plan is well positioned to address many of the issues Nigeria faces today.
- Given the changes in Nigeria over the past 2 years and the key issues, what strategic adjustments are necessary?
- Broad stakeholder consultations, including input from Governors, are providing us with the information necessary to ensure our strategy is appropriately aligned to address the most pressing issues in Nigeria.
