
Dear Ms. Derryck:

Re: Grant No. 80-645-01, Amendment No. 2

I refer to your "Revised Project Description and Implementation Plan, 1983-1984, Lundzi-Mpuluzi Pig Production Project" and to subject Grant, as previously amended. Pursuant to the authority contained in the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Agency for International Development hereby grants to the National Council for Negro Women, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "NCNW" or "Grantee") an additional sum of \$32,000.00 to permit the NCNW to continue its support for activities under this Project in Swaziland. Such activities and their objectives are more fully described in the revised Attachment A attached to this Amendment. This Amendment is effective and obligation is made as of the date of this letter and shall apply to commitments made by the Grantee in furtherance of program objectives through October 7, 1984. This additional Grant is made to the NCNW on the condition that the funds will be administered in accordance with the terms and conditions as set forth in Attachment A, as hereby revised, and Attachment B entitled "Standard Provisions," each of which attachments have been previously agreed to by your organization. Additional funds may be provided in FY 1984, subject to the availability of funds, to complete funding for the revised estimated total cost of the project.

Please sign the original and seven (7) copies of this letter to acknowledge the acceptance of the conditions under which these additional funds have been granted, and return the original and six (6) copies of the Amendment to USAID/Swaziland, Mbabane (ID), Department of State, Washington, D. C. 20520.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

A. Purpose of Grant

The purpose of this Grant is to provide support for the Lundzi-Mpuluzi Pig Production Project in Swaziland sponsored by the National Council of Negro Women, Inc.

B. Specific Objectives

The specific objectives of this Grant are as follows:

1. To increase the income of 75 families in the target area by E400.00 over three years through the development of a pig production and marketing cooperative.
2. To facilitate provision of community education (home economics, nutrition, etc.) so that families will have more information on which to base decisions concerning use of additional income.
3. To provide a mechanism for a mutual learning and sharing experience in rural development between the women of Swaziland and the women of America; also to further understanding between them.
4. To develop a model for increasing incomes of rural families that is developed both within traditional values and the overall national development strategy, and which also fosters the participation of women in economic development.
5. To evaluate the impact of the project and through such analysis, establish a system for continuous review and replanning necessary to achieve the project goals.

C. Implementation

To achieve the above objectives, the Grantee shall carry out the following activities:

1. Organize a Pig Bank cooperative which will provide training and assistance in pig production to its members; provide breeding services and breeding stock to participating cooperative members; provide marketing services; maintain equipment and supplies of feed and other materials; and initiate a credit scheme.

2. Provide technical assistance to assist participating families in all aspects of pig management and production, including proper feeding, sanitation, disease prevention, castration of males, record-keeping and construction of homestead piggeries.

3. Assist in the growing of maize in the area to serve as supplemental feed for the Pig Bank and cooperating families

4. Develop a demonstration vegetable garden in the cooperative complex for the growing of crops recommended for supplementing the feed ration.

5. Provide consultants to organize the initial development of the project, work within the community to sensitize members to the project, and to work with the cooperative.

6. Arrange for visits by three American women to Swaziland and three Swazi women to the United States.

7. Produce a handbook on pig management in SiSwati

8. Provide basic skills training for the cooperative staff in pig management.

9. Assist in establishing the physical facilities for the cooperative.

10. Provide some project commodities including project vehicles.

#### D. Reporting

The following reports are required under this Grant:

##### 1. Fiscal Reports:

All fiscal reports as provided for in the Standard Provisions, Annex B.

##### 2. Program Reports:

a. Progress reports (technical reports), in triplicate, shall be submitted quarterly to USAID/Swaziland.

b. A final project completion report shall be submitted to USAID/Swaziland within 90 days after completion of the Project. This report shall include a statement concerning the impact of the Project on the beneficiaries.

3. Evaluation Reports:

In addition to the final evaluation contained in the final report a mid-term, in-depth evaluation shall be conducted between twelve (12) and eighteen (18) months after this Grant Agreement is signed.

E. Budget

The funds, including local currency, herein shall be used to finance the following items:

The Grantee may not exceed the total amount of the Budget. Adjustments among the line items are limited to 15% without prior approval of the Mission Director, USAID/Swaziland.

F. Special Provisions

1. The following paragraphs are hereby deleted as inapplicable from the Standard Provisions as set forth in Annex B: paragraphs 2, 6, 8, 9, 11, 12, 16, 17, 19, 20, 23, 24, 25.

2. In accordance with a source/origin procurement waiver authorized under this Grant and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in paragraph 15(d) of Annex B the Grantee may purchase one project vehicle from countries included in AID Geographic Code 935.

3. This Grant will be administered by USAID/Swaziland. All correspondence concerning the Grant should be addressed to the Mission Director, USAID/Swaziland, Mbabane (ID), Department of State, Washington, D. C. 20520.

G. Overhead Rates

Subject to audit, the overhead rate for the period of this Grant is 25 percent.

H. Title of Property

Title to motor vehicles and all other property purchased under this Grant shall rest with the Grantee.
