His Beatitude the Latin Patriarch Monsg. James Beltritti cutting the ribbon to declare the opening of the new Salesian wing.





Before the closing of this most meaningful Ceremony of the Dedication of the New Wing of the Salesian Technical School, may I express and share my deepest gratitude for this achievement. On behalf of all the Salesians of Don Bosco, especially those working in the Middle East Province, our sincerest thanks.

1. In the Autumn of 1841 Don Bosco, a few months after his ordination, settled in Turin, at the Ecclesiastical College, to ensure a sound complement to his theological studies. In the very first weeks of his residence at the College, Don Bosco saw first hand the state of moral decay in which most of the youth of the masses wallowed. In the slums of Turin and in the reformatories, he began visiting many abandoned youths who were victims of a world of unruly passions, made worse by the reckless social environment.

2. These half-grown young people needed a friend and indeed Don Bosco began to approach them with a kindness and love which they had never known before. For them he built boarding houses, schools, workshops... His activities have been continued after his death by his Sons, the Salesians of Don Bosco.

3. After one hundred years (1888-1988) Don Bosco's dream has been faithfully carried on, all over the world. Today there are 125 Salesian Technical Schools in the world, with 45,000 student-apprentices. In the Middle East the Salesians of Don Bosco run 17 centres for the youth, of which 5 are Technical Schools, with more than 2000 students trainees, and with accelerated courses in technical training for over 1000 trainees preparing to enter the work force of their country as skill workers or to up-date existing skills.

4. Everywhere the young people face the same problems: they must be helped to avoid despair, ignorance, poverty, technical incapacity and isolation. They must be allowed the choice, indeed the right of a sound education and preparation for life. Only then will they become the builders of a "better world".

5. The Salesians, following in Don Bosco's steps, do intend to continue to assist with their small share of the hard work, by creating and enkindling hope through new educational and technical skills for the youth of this area and country. With the continued generous support and friendship of all peace-loving individuals, justice and a better life may be brought to our people.

6. It is indeed to all our friends and benefactors that I express the deepest gratitude and appreciation of all Salesians especially in the Middle East. Additionally, our young people who are now learning a job and those who are making their lives with skills learned in the past in our boarding house and Technical School - I mean our past-students whom I am happy to welcome here today in such a large number, also thank you.

7. First of all, I thank His Beatitude Patriarch Mons. Beltritti for his continual encouragement, help and guidance.

I thank very much the Agency for International Development of the United States for the funds granted towards the construction of the New Wing of the Salesian Technical School.

I thank the Catholic Relief Services, responsible for the proper disbursement of the grant.

I thank also MISEREOR Organization of West Germany and ANERA of the United States for providing for the continual up-dating of the workshops.

I thank you Mr. Elias Freij, Mayor of Bethlehem, and the members of your city-council, for the interest and assistance to the Salesians in their work for the local youth.

I thank Engineer Nasser and Architect Khoury for their management and engineering assistance.

I thank all other friends and benefactors of whom there are so many that there is not sufficient time to list them. I thank them all for their assistance and support in the implementation of this project which today is a reality.

In closing, I pray for Don Bosco intercession for an abundance of blessings to be bestowed on all of you. The Salesians of Don Bosco and their School will continue to pray for their benefactors and friends, that they may be filled with joy and peace in the Lord.

Final Report on the Salesian technical School.  
Grant No. NEB-0159-G-SS-5133-00  
Project No. JWB 4D-003  
Fund No. 568

- AID granted the sum of \$ 354,000.- to provide support to Catholic Relief Services (CRS) to expand the facilities of the Salesian Technical School in Bethlehem. The school was founded in Bethlehem in 1891 and trains young men in various vocational programs and skills.
- Project objectives:-
  - Construct a three-story building in the present Salesian Technical School compound in Bethlehem.
  - Increase classrooms and technical shop space.
  - Increase the number of students trained as skilled tradesmen from 63 to 99 per year.
  - Produce 36 graduates per year with qualifications in Electro-Pneumatics, a new study area for the school.
- The project aims to address the enrollment problem and upgrade the learning environment by making more space available for classrooms and shops.
- Work at the Salesian Technical School project started on 1 September 1985 and was successfully completed on 17 October 1986, though the new building was put in use as from the beginning of the current Academic Year. (Sept. 1986)
- The work started by dismantling the existing old building. The demolition and the leveling of site created a major problem. The foundations of the two adjacent buildings were exposed, causing cracks. One building was first supported by a reinforced column, then by a reinforced retaining wall. The second building was protected by a retaining wall which served as a part of the new construction.

- The Ground Floor of the new building is used as a carpentry shop. Instead of 270 sq. m. , it was made up of 330 sq. m., with a capacity for 30 students. Carpentry is a one year course with 16 students enrolled this year. The number is expected to rise to thirty for the next year. Lighting and ventilation in the new shop are superior. The problem of overcrowding no longer exists. This improved environment should significantly enhance the students's learning experience.
- The second floor is the Electronics shop with 18 workspaces. It is 270 sq. m., with 26 students this year. The electricity students will be split into two tracks after the first Year. Some continue in electricity, while the others go into electronics. The third year electricity shop includes 8 workspaces for Electro-Pneumatics, which all Third Year students will rotate through (2 - 3 months rotation.)
- The third floor is 270 sq. m. It consists of two classrooms and a meeting room for the instructors. As from the next year, the school will be able to accomodate nine sections rather than the present six. This will permit a greater number of students to be enrolled.
- The total number of students enrolled at the Salesian Technical School for this year is 157 distributed as the following:-
 

- Tool & Die	35
- Electronics	26
- Electricity	96

 180 students are expected next year.
- This project is entirely consistent with an ambitious long-term Master Plan which the Salesians commissioned in 1980 for the eventual expansion of their facilities. The plan involves repairs, alterations and new construction throughout the Salesian compound including provincial house, lodgings for students, and an auditorium. Total cost of the Plan is over \$ 2 million; therefore the plan includes implementation in several stages, according to prioritized needs and availability of funding. The Salesians have identified as their top priorities: the expansion of school facilities and scope of training, enabling more young men to benefit from more relevant education and training.

- Other inputs by the Salesian Technical School included:-
  - Re-tiling of Tool & die Shop Floor (\$ 13,900.-)
  - Purchasing of 180 Classroom Desks (\$ 7,500.-)
  - Purchasing of 50 Drawing Desks (\$ 1,479.-)
  - Purchasing of Equipment for Electricity Workshop including 8 Electro-Pneumatic Units. (\$ 82,300.-)
  - Reasphalting the playground. (\$ 2,020.-)
  
- CRS inputs included:-
  - Tool & Die Machines (\$ 23,000.-)
  - Carpentry Machines (\$ 6,500.-)
  - Bakery Machines. (\$ 40,500.-)
  
- In the same amount granted by AID, CRS in cooperation with the Salesian were able to construct a total of 870 sq. m. rather than the planned 810 sq. m. The following were also achieved:-
  - The reinforcement of adjacent buildings.
  - The reasphalting of the playground partially damaged by the demolition of the old building.
  - Covering with stones the retaining wall adjacent to the new building.
  - Painting of the hallways leading to the new wing.
  - Tiling of a corridor that was partially damaged during demolition works.
  
- The following factors helped in achieving the above mentioned things:-
  - No general contractor was hired and all the work was directly performed by CRS and Salesian personnel
  - All materials were bought directly from wholesalers, with no middle men.
  - The Salesians provided the following on their own expense:-
    - All temporary electrical connections. (\$ 580.-)
    - Electricity (\$ 625.-)
    - Water (\$ 240.-)
    - Storage Area






Photo shows the Salesian Technical School after that the old building was demolished and a new wing constructed in its place.




The back side of the completed Salesian new building.




Photo shows the main entrance to the new wing.











