STATEMENT OF WORK (FY 84)

VITA's planned strategy for fiscal year 1984 is an outgrowth of the activities undertaken in the first four years of the cooperative agreement and complimentary activities developed as a result of the cooperative agreement. Continuing project activities will be brought to fruition, and data will be collected to allow the technical and economic viability to be determined. In the two priority areas, gaps have been identified which VITA will address in order to further refine and expand its institutional capacity to support and promote the worldwide dissemination of cooking and waterlifting technologies. VITA will concentrate cooperative agreement resources on finishing up incomplete activities and the following principal task:

The following specific activities are planned for FY 1984:

Task 1 - Cooking Technologies:

- Worldwide review of the draft manual <u>Testing the Efficiency of Woodburning Cookstoves</u>, prepared as a follow up to the Woodstove <u>Testing Meeting held at VITA in December 1982</u>, will be completed. A final edition of the manual will be widely distributed.
 - -- VITA will participate in and provide partial funding for the International Workshop on Woodstove Dissemination to be held in the Netherlands in October 1983.
 - -- A review, evaluation and analysis of worldwide cookstove projects will be conducted to: one, determine the availability, efficiency, and cost-effectiveness of cookstove designs; two, review and recommend dissemination strategies; and three, identify priority areas for future cookstove efforts.
 - -- Current available socio-economic survey instruments and methodologies to interpret survey data with special emphasis on stove marketing strategies will be reviewed and evaluated.

ORIGINAL

- -- Low-cost charcoal production technologies and portable fuel-efficient charcoal stoves will be evaluated in Montserrat, where project funding has enabled a number of designs to be developed and tested. Data from a large-scale, commercial charcoal manufacturing enterprise in Sri Lanka, partially funded under the cooperative agreement, will be evaluated as well.
- -- The 68 international cookstove research groups, universities, and AID/Washington and Mission staff on VITA's cookstove mailing list will be kept informed about current stove activities.
- -- Stove information and by-mail assistance will continue to be provided to stove practitioners.

Should Funding Permit:

-- A conference will possibly be held at VITA to review the current state of worldwide cookstove programs, the progress made during the five years of the cooperative agreement, and identify priority areas for future cookstove efforts. The conference would emphasize commercial stove manufacture and marketing, especially in urban areas, and the impact of widespread stove use on deforestation.

Task 2 - Water-Lifting Technologies:

- -- Field testing of commercially available windpumps to determine performance under normal operating conditions, to compare several wind test instruments (water flow meters, anemometers) to determine a cost-effective means to monitor windpump performance, to begin development of a standard test procedure for windpumps, and to develop a procedure for comparing commercially available windpumps.
- -- Using the data collected from field testing, refine the microcomputer programs to optimize solar pump and windmill system design. This will include:
 - -- needs assessment of local resources
 - -- storage and distribution systems design
 - -- sensitivity analysis of selected technical/economic parameters
- -- A synthesis review of the current status of windpump development and dissemination will be made, including an analysis of where utilization of wind energy is technically viable and under what conditions it is economically cost-effective.

ORIGINAL

- -- A marketing/feasibility study for the manufacture of a low-cost (sale price of less than \$2,000 U.S.), durable water-pumping windmill will be conducted in the Eastern Caribbean. This will include an assessment of the economic, financial, and technical feasibility of manufacturing windmills, identification of the potential market, estimation of capital, labor and operating costs, and the potential rate of return on investment.
- -- Limited technical assistance will be provided to Windmill Pump, Ltd., a Thai windmill manufacturing company established under the cooperative agreement, to ensure its continued success.
- -- Design and testing of several variable stroke devices, or other devices which when retrofitted to existing windpumps, are projected to double or triple the water output, gather information for analysis and possible publication of other methods to improve waterpumps output.
- -- Wind Energy Activities in Africa will be updated and disseminated to over 200 African institutions.
- -- A new publication, tentatively titled Wind Energy Activities in the Caribbean and Latin America, will list commercial and research development activities and summarize the economic viability of utilizing wind energy in each country in the region.
- -- The performance of existing photovoltaic and water wheel pumping systems, previously funded under the cooperative agreement, will be assessed to further refine their economic and technical viability in developing countries.
- -- Information on water-lifting devices and by-mail technical assistance, including microcomputer analysis of windspeed data (for systems analysis and economics), will continue to be provided to overseas requesters.

Should Funding Permit:

- -- A conference will possibly be held at VITA to draft a standard testing procedure for windpumps, and to verify microcomputer models that identify systems performance cost and economics.
- -- A design review of variable strokes models developed and other methods of output enhancement, will possibly be held to determine future directions of this effort.

ORIGINAL.

Task 3 - Other Renewables:

These activities result either from continuing projects previously funded under the cooperative agreement or from specific requests made by the Energy Division, AID/Washington.

- -- A state-of-the-art synthesis of available solar drying technology and an assessment of its economic viability.
- -- Analysis of the technical and economic viability of producing biogas from chicken manure.
- -- Final evaluation of small grant projects.

Task 4 - Management:

Provide S&T/EY with a program plan including milestone chart and description of publications.

All other terms and previsions in the cooperative agreement remain the same.

STATEMENT OF WORK

A. OBJECTIVE OF AMENDMENT TO COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT (AID/DSAN-CA-0180)

- 1. To enable VITA to make a grant to the Foundation for the Protection of Reefs and Islands from Degradation (PRIDE FOUNDATION, Miami, Florida) for the purchase of a wind generator, foundation concrete, and rebar, batteries, controls, connectors, inverter, and monitoring equipment as specified in the proposal budget.
- 2. Amendment amount requested by VITA is \$60,000.00., as specified in budget, to be used for the purchase of equipment by the Sub-Grantee.

B. PROJECT PURPOSE

- 1. Provide reliable electric power to the Pigeon Island National Park, St. Lucia, with a wind electric system.
- 2. Assist the Park to expand its operation providing a boost to local education, local tourism, and corservation of historic and natural resources.
- 3. Assist the Park in the creation of new jobs in the restaurant, craft shops, etc.
- 4. Demonstrate the technical and economic viability of wind electric power systems for remote commercial operations.
- 5. Monitor technical and economic factors in system installation, operation and maintenance to provide concrete evidence of viability for this type of system, to encourage replication.
- 6. Provide technical training to St. Lucian officials and technicians on general wind system parameters, system operation, and maintenance, to encourage long system operation, and to increase replication possibilities.

C. SCOPE OF WORK (INSTITUTIONAL ROLES)

Project activities will be divided among the participating organizations involved in the project. VITA's scope of work, along with that of others is listed below:

1. VITA

a. Serve as grantor for disbursement of AID grant funds to other organizations.

b. Provide technical assistance:

- 1) Oversee erection of wind system with PRIDE and on-the-job training to St. Lucian technicians (St. Lucia National Trust),
- 2) Select and supervise installation of monitoring and evaluation equipment, and,
- 3) Assist in system design and exact equipment specifications.
- c. Present education sessions in St. Lucia on the wind system to the St. Lucian business, development and financial community, possibly with the use of videotape equipment.
- d. Prepare an <u>evaluation report</u> outlining technical performance, economic factors, institutional issues and public response to the demonstration.
- e, Maintain liaison with AID and present financial reports.

2. PRIDE

- a. Serve as <u>Project Coordinator</u> by facilitating communication and project scheduling, including securing commitments of St. Lucian counterparts.
- b. Procure and arrange for shipment of project hardware from VITA grant funds.

c. Provide technical assistance:

- 1) Provide foundation drawings and all other installation procedures and specifications.
- 2) Provide the system design and exact specifications,
- 3) Oversee erection, commissioning of the wind system, and on-thejob training.

3. PADF

- a. Endeavor to <u>acquire tools</u>, <u>diesel generator</u>, other equipment applicable to the project.
- b. Utilize PADF's ocean freight shipment program to defray overseas costs from point of embarcation to St. Lucia.

4. ST. LUCIA NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (NDC)

- **a.** <u>Project Coordinator</u> of efforts of the <u>various institutions on St. <u>Lucia</u> as noted below.</u>
- b. Handle all <u>public relations</u> aspects of the project, including educational sessions, radio.
- c. Coordinate <u>efforts towards future replication</u> of the system and the general development of wind energy in St. Lucia.
- d. Handle all importation formalities, including customs and duty waivers.
- e. Coordinate power distribution materials donation and shipment from the Venezuelan government.

5. ST. LUCIA NATIONAL TRUST

- a. Carry out all physical construction of wind system, diesel back-up generator and power distribution system with assistance from the Environmental Engineering, Ltd., and the St. Lucia Government Electric Department, with VITA and PRIDE. This will include distribution system design, installation, foundation construction tower and wind generator erection, system interconnection and commissioning.
- b. Accept and carry out system operation and maintenance responsibilities over the life of the system.
- c. Facilitate educational and training efforts with the assistance of the NDC.

D. REPORTS

- 1. VITA will prepare project reports in month 12 and month 18 of the project
 - a. VITA will take the lead role in monitoring and reporting on the project: to comply with donor financial reporting requirements and to document experiences on technical, economic and institutional issues that will allow others to learn from this effort.

STATEMENT OF WORK

A. OBJECTIVE OF AMENDMENT TO COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT (AID/DSAN-CA-0180)

- 1. To enable VITA to make a grant to the Foundation for the Protection of Reefs and Islands from Degradation (PRIDE FOUNDATION, Miami, Florida) for the purchase of a wind generator, foundation concrete, and rebar, batteries, controls, connectors, inverter, and monitoring equipment as specified in the proposal budget.
- 2. Amendment amount requested by VITA is \$60,000.00., as specified in budget, to be used for the purchase of equipment by the Sub-Grantee.

B. PROJECT PURPOSE

- 1. Provide reliable electric power to the Pigeon Island National Park, St. Lucia, with a wind electric system.
- 2. Assist the Park to expand its operation providing a boost to local education, local tourism, and conservation of historic and natural resources.
- 3. Assist the Park in the creation of new jobs in the restaurant, craft shops, etc.
- 4. Demonstrate the technical and economic viability of wind electric power systems for remote commercial operations.
- 5. Monitor technical and economic factors in system installation, operation and maintenance to provide concrete evidence of viability for this type of system, to encourage replication.
- 6. Provide technical training to St. Lucian officials and technicians on general wind system parameters, system operation, and maintenance, to encourage long system operation, and to increase replication possibilities.

C. SCOPE OF WORK (INSTITUTIONAL ROLES)

Project activities will be divided among the participating organizations involved in the project. VITA's scope of work, along with that of others is listed below:

1. VITA

a. Serve as grantor for disbursement of AID grant funds to other organizations.

b. Provide technical assistance:

- 1) Oversee erection of wind system with PRIDE and on-the-job training to St. Lucian technicians (St. Lucia National Trust),
- Select and supervise installation of monitoring and evaluation equipment, and,
- 3) Assist in system design and exact equipment specifications.
- c. Present education sessions in St. Lucia on the wind system to the St. Lucian business, development and financial community, possibly with the use of videotape equipment.
- d. Prepare an <u>evaluation report</u> outlining technical performance, economic factors, institutional issues and public response to the demonstration.
- e. Maintain liaison with AID and present financial reports.

2. PRIDE

- a. Serve as <u>Project Coordinator</u> by facilitating communication and project scheduling, including securing commitments of St. Lucian counterparts.
- b. Procure and arrange for shipment of project hardware from VITA grant funds.

c. Provide technical assistance:

- Provide foundation drawings and all other installation procedures and specifications,
- 2) Provide the system design and exact specifications,
- Oversee erection, commissioning of the wind system, and on-thejob training.

3. PADF

- a. Endeavor to acquire tools, diesel generator, other equipment applicable to the project.
- b. Utilize PADF's <u>ocean freight shipment program</u> to defray overseas costs from point of embarcation to St. Lucia.

4. ST. LUCIA NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (NDC)

- a. <u>Project Coordinator</u> of efforts of the <u>various institutions on St. Lucia</u> as noted below.
- b. Handle all <u>public relations</u> aspects of the project, including educational sessions, radio.
- c. Coordinate <u>efforts towards future replication</u> of the system and the general development of wind energy in St. Lucia.
- d. Handle all <u>importation formalities</u>, including customs and duty waivers.
- e. Coordinate <u>power distribution materials</u> donation and shipment from the Venezuelan government.

5. ST. LUCIA NATIONAL TRUST

- a. Carry out all physical construction of wind system, diesel back-up generator and power distribution system with assistance from the Environmental Engineering, Ltd., and the St. Lucia Government Electric Department, with VITA and PRIDE. This will include distribution system design, installation, foundation construction tower and wind generator erection, system interconnection and commissioning.
- b. Accept and carry out system operation and maintenance responsibilities over the life of the system.
- c. Facilitate educational and training efforts with the assistance of the NDC.

D. REPORTS

- 1. VITA will prepare project reports in month 12 and month 18 of the project.
 - a. VITA will take the lead role in monitoring and reporting on the project: to comply with donor financial reporting requirements and to document experiences on technical, economic and institutional issues that will allow others to learn from this effort.

To "C. 4. Specific Objectives - Regional Appropriate Technology Coordinator" add the following:

"CILSS/VITA Regional Technical Coordinator for Fuel - Conserving Technologies, resident in Omagadougou. His responsibilities will be:

<u> 1982 - 83</u>

- --Follow up regional session of May 1982 with vists to each participating country to ensure that national stove committees/coordinating bodies are in place.
- --Convene 6 national Sahel woodstoves training sessions, continuing the series initiated by CILSS in 1981-82, to provide ongoing technical assistance to national coordinating bodies.
- --Maintain contacts with stove development agencies/institutions through correspondence, travel, and attendance at woodstoves technical sessions.
- --Publish 4 quarterly issues of the French-language woodstoves bulletin Flamme, initiated by the CILSS woodstoves team in 1981, to inform Sahelian stove technicians of developments in stove technology. Provide copies of stove bulletin and occasional technical papers to AID/Sahel mission directors, REDSO/WA, AID/S&T/EY and AID/Africa Bureau.
- --Establish, through continued research, testing, and analysis, prototype stove models for promotion in each participating country. As part of this effort, continue materials testing to optimize stove strength and durability.
- --Through extensive regional travel, advise local and national stove groups in their research efforts, to standardize test data and assist with establishing centralized data analysis capabilities.
- --Help set national goals and develop plans for large scale dissemination in 6 CILSS member countries.
- --Submit through VITA annual report of accomplishments to AID/Office of the Sahel.

-- Help achieve national and regional goals in wood fuel conservation and improved stove development, by assisting with the implementation of plans for large scale stove dissemination, including:

local radio and newspapaer coverage of the problems and proposed solutions; posters, TV braodcasts, films and videotapes

demonstration of improved stoves at local artisanal or technical centers

establishment and support of mobile stove training teams, local entrepeneurs and artisans

integration of stove projects into larger rural development, women in development, and other programs

- --Prepare final report to AID/Office of the Sahel which assesses accomplishments and provides recommendation for continued activities that AID might consider for support.

I. Problem: Authorization is needed for the use of \$250,000 of PD&S funds to provide immediate support funds to the USAID mission in Somalia for the proposed CDA Forestry and Fuelwood Sector Initiatives.

II. Discussion:

Introduction

As noted in the Information Memorandum from Haven North (attached), the CDA collaborative forestry initiative has been progressing and is producing desirable preliminary results. Namely, the governments of the "initial focus countries" are preparing in-country reviews of the sector, and communications between the actors involved in forestry within the countries have increased considerably. These preliminary discussions and analyses of the sector have resulted in the identification of a number of activities that the CDA committee feels require immediate attention.

B. Background

The Somalia forestry situation is bleak. Fuelwood and charcoal are at present the main forestry products and the major source of household energy. rate of deforestation has increased with the influx of refugees and the resulting demand for fuel has risen drastically. It is around these centers of population that biomass production capabilities have been severely strained.

The government has developed a long term program to combat the deforestation and desertification problem within the CDA framework and following our recommende? procedure. The USAID mission is preparing a PID for Washington review, proposing how we best can support and complement planned efforts to achieve the goal of CDA in Somalia, i.e. CDA donors should bilaterally and collectively use their influence and overall assistance resources to help African governments to increase their capacity to undertake, as fast as is technically possible, larger scale forestry and fuelwood production programs as part of their overall land use planning and socio-economic development efforts.

C. Discussion

In the interim, each of the CDA donors in Somalia, plus Italy and FAO/UNDP, have pledged financial support for certain preliminary, pre-project activities. The sum of these pledges total in excess of \$1,500,000 for such assistance as improved charcoal production, research assistance on frankincense and myrrh, training, and reforestation in the Northeast.

The U.S., as principal contact and liaison between the CDA donors and Somalia government officials, has designed and championed the very simple but essential process which has identified certain essential fuelwood components necessary for any successful nationwide reforestation effort. One result of this analytical process is the CDA forestry project, which is currently being reviewed.

During the period before the forestry project becomes a reality, the mission wishes to fund a series of activities which it feels cannot be delayed. The reasons for the immediacy include:

- 1. demonstrate U.S. support for the CDA process, following the initial pledges of other CDA donors.
- need for certain reconnaissance and feasibility studies to determine if the proposed long term cooperative sector program has sufficient merit.
- the expressed desire and obvious need for arestructuring of forest legislation.

Those immediate action interventions USAID/Mogadishu has expressed a desire to support include:

1. Technical assistance to the government for a review of existing legislation concerning forestry and renewable natural resources and assistance in drafting an updated and amended version of existing forestry legislation. \$100

3.	Initiate a soil and water project in the Northwestern portion of Somalia (identified as a particularly critical area for which \$535,000 has been requested) our contribution	. 60,000

Selected Countries: A Progress Report

At the September policy meeting in Ottawa, the U.S. and its CDA colleagues reached agreement on the general approach and in-country procedures by which we would collaborate more closely to encourage African governments to undertake expanded national programs in reforestation and fuelwood supply. We also agreed to begin in five countries: Senegal, Malawi, Somalia, Burundi and Upper Volta. In each of these countries, surrent CDA and other comor bilateral projects in this sector already provide a substantial assistance base.

During the course of a year of consultations, the U.S. has emphasized the importance of generating joint in-country reviews to (a) quantify the reforestation and fuelwood supply needs, including the implied land requirements; and (b) inventory current combined African and domor efforts in terms of their effectiveness in providing the main components needed for successful national programs. To consider the process by which African governments are encouraged to review their fuelwood needs as important as any additional projects which may be recommended to domors and considered by they for support.

He now have preliminary reports from three of the countries indicating that the governments of Somalia, Halaui and Somegal are already engaged in undertaking the desired in-country reviews:

- A. The Government of Somalia has circulated a five-year forestry sector paper and proposed program. With U.S. encouragement, the government has organized an informal in-country donor group to review the sector needs and the proposed projects. Based on these findings, USAID Somalia is preparing project identification documentation and recommendations for U.S. participation in Somalia's longer term forestry planning and programming.
- In Halawi, the Maiawi Forestry Department is preparing a forest strategy paper along the lines of the suggested CDA approach which will be submitted to the local CDA group. This is being chaired, at our invitation, by the U.M. Migh Commissioner who will arrange a working meeting with other donors to discuss the Malawi report and recommendations once they have been received.

C. In Senegal, the Sanegalese Ministry of Mater and Porests is completing its review of a long range sector plan developed, with French assistance, during the past two years. France has accepted the U.S. invitation to serve as principal point of CDA member contact in Senegal and has appointed the Chief of the Ferestry Section of the Ministry of Cooperation and Development to serve in that capacity. He and the USAID Mission director are planning a working session to be held in Dakar sometime during the next three months, under the sponsorship of the CILSS/Club du Sahel. Donors will jointly examine with Senegalese officials the conslusions of the sector Plan and consider the most effective ways to assist in the progressive execution of the proposed program.

As partners in the CDA effort and particularly as the coordinator of this initiative we wish to be able to move promptly in responding to any Mission requests and recommendations which may result from these first in-country joint reviews.*

I recognize that these developments have come in the midst of funding stringencies. Although all the Missions in the selected countries had expressed interest in being included in these pilot CPA initiatives, any additional activities will be competing with previously established country program ceilings and priorities. We will need the active support of our Office Directors and Division Chiefs in order to neld any additional start up activities with AID's regular programming procedures. As previously planned, we hope to be able to draw on funds carmarked for the Energy Initiatives for Africa Project (609-0424) to finance initial activities of the type mentional in the footnote, which may not be included in current approved country programs. Beyond this stage, we will expect each Mission to program further recommended support as part of the USAID annual country submissions through AID's regular planning and budgeting cycle.

I consider this more systematic in-country African/donor sectoral planning and coordinating process an important AID programing initiative. It can provide opportunities for AID to make more efficient use of its current and future development assistance, not only in this sector but in others as well. We have a great deal to gain if an improved programing process for forestry and fuelwood takes hold in these pilot countries.

He will keep you informed of further developments.

^{*}Note: Possible requests might be for project design, training or for Landsat-based production and printing of maps tailored to the African government's land use or other development planning needs, a service CDA members have agreed could be useful. (Praliminary estimates from the IDRD and from the Demote Sensing Nauping Facility in Nairobi suggest costs in the range of \$150,000 to \$300,000 per country for a map reproduction service of this type.) However, he to not know at this stage whether these will be among activities the African governments may request or that MSAITs might recovered for AID funding.

SCOPE OF WORK

MALI

- 1. The evaluation will be primarily an in-depth assessment of the technical work of the Solar Energy Laboratory in developing, testing and modifying for village use the technologies which are to be deployed for field testing. The evaluation will include:
 - a. a careful review of records kept by the lab on tests it will have performed on each device;
 - b. the device's cost and performance characteristics under given conditions;
 - c. input and output records;
 - d. an examination of the physical equipment to assess whether it is functioning properly, whether it is receiving proper care and maintenance, whether it is being used in a cost effective manner, i.e., the amount of use justifies the investment and whether lab personnel understand its operation and are effectively using it:
 - e. an assessment of whether the results of tests, insolation and weather data are being properly recorded, reduced, analyzed and compared to theoretical models;
 - f. an examination of the effectiveness of the technical assistance supplied to the lab and an assessment of the lab personnel's ability to carry on the work without a visiting engineer/scientist in residence;
 - g. an examination of the effectiveness of the lab management in the technical program, in outlining goals and paths to reach them, in communication with lab personnel, in utilizing personnel and in collaborating and coordinating with other organizations working on renewable energy and with the survey organization;
 - h. an examination of the lab's commitment to the survey, its liaison with the survey organization, its technical contribution to the survey and its use of potential for use of the survey data;
 - given available survey data assess the relevance of the lab R&D work to the rural village needs.

- 2. When assessing the technical program the evaluation team should consider whether the Phase I tasks have been accomplished. These include:
 - a. installation and operation of insolation, temperature and wind measuring equipment;
 - b. performed quantitative performance tests on the lab's present hot water heater;
 - c. improvement of the construction of the hot water heater;

Pursuant to the authority contained in the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, and the Federal Grant and Cooperative Agreement Act of 1977, the Agency for International Development hereby amends the subject Cooperative Agreement effective the date of this letter to provide funds for an evaluation of the Fuelwood and Alternative Energy Project in Central America.

A. Cover Page

From "Amount Obligated" delete "\$4,425,294" and substitute in lieu thereof the amount "\$4,464,294."

B. Article I - Cooperative Agreement

- 1. Delete from paragraph B.1 the figure "\$4,425,294" and substitute in lieu thereof the amount "\$4,464,294."
- 2. Delete from paragraph B.2 the figure "\$5,563,706" and substitute in lieu thereof the amount "\$5,524,706."

C. Program Description

To "C. Specific Objectives" add the following:

- "8. Evaluation of Project No. 596-0089, Fuelwood and Alternative Energy Sources Central America.
 - a. The evaluation will concentrate on an in-depth review of the administrative, technical, organizational, planning and operational aspects of the project to determine whether the stated project objectives can be reached on schedule.

ORIGINAL

The degree of effectiveness of liaison, exchange of data and cooperation between CATIE and ICAITI as well as between these institutions and participating national agencies will also be assessed. The evaluation will ascertain the capability of CATIE and ICAITI to work with and assist national counterpart agencies in agreed upon areas of research and technical endeavors. The evaluation will review the appropriateness of planned activities in the project and suggest possible reorientation or renewed emphasis of certain aspects of the project.

b. The evaluation team will:

- 1. Assess the organization and operation of CATIE and ICAITI research teams and their effectiveness in carrying out the planned research programs at CATIE, ICAITI and the country level. Assessment of the quality and thoroughness of planning, selection and assignment of responsibilities and authority to carry out the assigned research tasks at CATIE, ICAITI and in the collaborating countries is essential.
 - 2. Conduct technical reviews at Central America and Panama country sites, including a review of methods used to establish demonstration units, receptivity by potential users and potential impact of the stove and other energy units and selected tree species on energy savings and the environment.
 - 3. Examine regional linkages and information exchange between CATIE, ICAITI, IICA and the relevant national agencies and suggest possible areas and ways in which efficiency of information exchange can be enhanced. Examine the feasibility and need for CATIE and ICAITI to conduct research in the same geographic areas to complement regional activities.

- 4. Assess: 1) the utilization, organization and effectiveness of efforts to involve national institutions and personnel in the implementation of project activities; 2) do they effectively incorporate Peace Corps and the PIADIC system; 3) have the experiences of Centro Choqui, CEMAT and Save the Children stove programs been adequately incorporated in ICAITI planning?
- 5. Determine whether relationships between CATIE, ICAITI, international, public and private organizations are being developed as potential agent; for cooperative development and dissemination of energy information.
- 6. Evaluate methodologies and procedures used by the integrated research and technical teams at CATIE as applied to site selection of critical and potentially critical areas, experiemental design, basis for selection of test species and research treatments, conduct of field research trials, data collection and processing, and laboratory and pilot plant testing.
- 7. Review reports to determine 1) whether they are prepared in a fashion which makes clear what CATIE, ICAITI and national agencies are going; 2) whether the bilateral USAID missions, host country officials and AID/W are aware of these reports; and 3) how they can be improved.
- 8. Examine presently planned levels of financial contributions by CATIE, ICAITI, national agencies and ROCAP and assess whether they are sufficient to achieve project objectives. If the availability of human and/or financial resources is a constraint, recommendations will be made on what can and should be done to relieve the situation.
- 9. Analyze the relationship of this project to any other AID funded forestry/fuelwood/energy projects at the country level within the region and recommend how relationships can be fortified.

- c. The evaluation team will be comprised of at least three consultants. A team leader will be designated who will be responsible for completion of a final report and debriefing CATIE, ICAITI, and ROCAP. Spanish fluency at S-3, R-3 is necessary. Team composition should include as minimum:
 - 1. Forester with extensive field experience in research, tropical species and land use.
 - Economist/Sociologist with background experience in utilization and interaction between man and forest land in the tropics and knowledgeable on information dissemination.
 - 3. Renewable energy generalist in non-conventional energy with working knowledge of fuel efficient stoves, biogas and solar applications, and experience in the application of these technologies in the developing countries.

d. Timing

The evaluation will require the services of the team for five weeks during April/May. The team will spend up to ne week at both CATIE and ICAITI. Short trips byteam or individuals are necessary within Costa Rica and Guatemala as well as to Panama, Honduras and possibly Nicaragua to visit field sites, counterpart agencies, and USAIDs. Pre and post evaluation interviews with CATIE, ICAITI and ROCAP are essential. Team will work with CATIE and ICAITI personnel at all levels during evaluation.

e. Reports

A draft final report will be prepared in English before departure with 10 copies of final report submitted to ROCAP within two months after completion of evaluation. Secretarial assistance will be provided by ROCAP while in Guatemala and Costa Rica. Funds for secretarial assistance in the U.S. are provided in the Agreement budget.

STATEMENT OF WORK

- A. The purpose of this activity is to conduct an evaluation of project 596-0089. Fuelwood and Alternative Energy Sources.
- B. The proposed evaluation will concentrate on an in-depth review of the administrative, technical, organizational, planning and operational aspects of the project to determine whether the stated project objectives can be reached on schedule. The degree of effectiveness of liaison, exchange of data and cooperation between CATIE and ICAITI as well as between these institutions and participating national agencies will also be assessed. The evaluation will ascertain the capacity of CATIE and ICAITI to work with and assist national counterpart agencies in agreed upon areas of research and technical endeavors. Finally, the evaluation will review the appropriateness of planned activities in the project and suggest possible reorientation or renewed emphasis of certain aspects of the project, if deemed necessary.

C. Scope of Work

The team will:

- 1. Assess the organization and operation of the CATIE and ICAITI research teams and their effectiveness in carrying out the planned research programs at CATIE, ICAITI and the country level. Assessment of the quality and thoroughness of planning, selection and assisgnment of responsibilities and authority to carry out the assigned research tasks at CATIE, ICAITI and in the collaborating countries is essential.
- 2. Conduct technical reviews at Central America and Panama country sites, including a review of methods used to establish demonstration units, receptivity by potential users and potential impact of the stove and other energy units and selected tree species on energy savings and the environment.
- 3. Examine regional linkages and information exchange between CATIE, ICAITI, IICA and the relevant national agencies and suggest possible areas and ways in which efficiency of information exchange can be enhanced. Examine the feasibility and need for CATIE and ICAITI to conduct research in the same geographic areas to complement regional activities.
- 4. Assess: 1) the utilization, organization and effectiveness of efforts to involve national institutions and personnel in the implementation of project activities; 2) do they effectively incorporate Peace Corps and the PIADIC system; 3) have the

- 5. Determine whether relationships between CATIE, ICAITI, international, public and private organizations are being developed as potential agents for cooperative development and dissemination of energy information.
- 6. Evaluate methodologies and procedures used by the integrated research and technical teams at CATIE as applied to site selection of critical and potentially critical areas, experimental design, basis for selection of test species and research treatments, conduct of field research trials, data collection and processing, and laboratory and pilot plant testing.
- 7. Review reports to determine 1) whether they are prepared in a fashion which makes clear what CATIE, ICAITI and national agencies are doing; 2) whether the bilateral USAID missions, host country officials and AID/W are aware of these reports; and (3) how they can be improved.

All references to "Subpart 1-15.2-Contracts with Commercial Organizations" shall be deleted wherever they appear, and in their place reference to "Subpart 1.15-6--Contracts with Nonprofit Organizations" shall be inserted.

Bid and proposal costs of the current accounting period are allowable as indirect costs. Bid and proposal costs of prior accounting periods are unallowable in the current period. In this regard, bid and proposal costs incurred for the preparation of requests for specific projects and programs are acceptable for recovery as indirect costs. However, proposal costs incurred in the attempt to obtain unrestricted funds are to be treated as fund raising and must be included in the organization's direct cost base. Bid and proposal costs do not include independent research and development costs which are covered by paragraph (2) below, or preaward costs covered by Attachment B, Paragraph 33, of OMB Circular A-122. (FPR 1-15.603-2)
- 2. Independent research and development costs. Independent research and development is research and development conducted by an organization which is not sponsored by Federal or non-Federal grants, contracts or other agreements. Independent research and development costs must be included in the organization's direct cost base for allocation of its proportionate share of indirect costs. The costs of independent research and development, including its proportionate share of indirect cost, are unallowable under AID agreements.

I. Statement of Work

A. Stove Designer

- 1) to work with ONATOUR and Project in the design of portable and fixed peat burning stoves. Stoves may require a design suited to a range of clientele purchasing power.
- 2) prepare technical specifications and drawings including details of construction technique, quantities of materials required, costs, etc. Those will be subsequently required for ONATOUR extension workers who will develop artisanal extension programs.

B. Sociologist

- 1. To provide to the stove designer initial information on socio-economic aspects of urban and rural households to facilitate preliminary analysis as to potentially feasible designs for peat burning stoves. Most of the information needed on urban households is available in reports from the Peat I Project, but there is a scarcity of data on rural households. The sociologist will spend a few days in rural areas collecting information required for developing a peat burning stove for rural households based on the assumption of an increasing scarcity of free fuelwood. (Consult Project Paper for further elaboration). Priority, however, will be given to urban areas.
- 2. To critique the socio-economic and technical aspects associated with acceptance of stoves tested under Peat I Project. The sociologist will identify factors influencing continued use of these stoves and their suitability for wider use.
- 3. To assess social and economic soundness of peat burning stoves developed by the stove designer. This assessment will cover information on use of charcoal and wood following current cooking methods in comparison to use of models of portable and permanent peat burning stoves. The data will include information on:
 - a) time (e.g. preparing and feeding the fire, cooking certain common foods and boiling water, cleaning stove and utensils.)
 - b) financial costs (e.g. investment in stove and any special utensils, and recurrent fuel costs)
 - c) efficiency (e.g. amount of fuel needed to cook identical amount of food under similar conditions, and conversion of amounts into suitable comparable units, and comparison of time)
 - d) cultural behavior and preferences (e.g. number of cooking spaces, type and size of pans/pots)

- 4. To recommend procedures for field testing of peat burning stoves recommended by stove designer, including criteria for selection of households. Criteria for selections of households should permit each model of peat burining stove to be assessed in relation to key socio-economic characteristics of potential adopters.
- To provide other information deemed necessary for accomplishment of objective.

II. Reports

Prior to departure from Burundi, the stove designer will submit a report to the Project Manager on activities completed and which will include design specifications as well as recommendations thought suitable for accelerating the introduction of peat burning stoves.

Prior to departure, the sociologist will submit a report to the Project Manager on activities completed, including a critique of stoves developed under the Peat I Project, statistics on efficiency of models developed by the designer in comparison to cooking with wood and with charcoal, other vactors influencing the acceptance by the majority of households of the model stoves developed, and recommednations for field testing the model stoves.

III. Relationship and Responsibilities

The designer and sociologist will report to the Project Manager and will be responsible to him for completion of contract activities. The designer and sociologist will be provided with project assistance in respect to transport, materials, and secretarial services necessary to accomplish their work. In the event that the Project is unable to provide transport, car hire facilities will be provided from this budget.

IV. Term of Performance

Five weeks each.

V. Level of Effort

Services of two persons will be required for five weeks each. A six-day working week is authorized in the country

VI. Qualifications

A. Stove Designer

Proven practical field experience of stove design and construction for domestic use, employing locally available materials, essential experience of domestic or rural extension stove construction work in Third World Countries, and ability to produce simple design drawings desirable.

B. Sociologist

At least two years field experience in developing countries, preferably on the African continent, is required. The sociologist must have practical experience in assessing the efficiency of low-cost domestic stoves and socio-economic factors influencing adoption of stoves in a developing country. A masters degree in one of the social science disciplines is desirable. Working knowledge of French is essential. Preference should be given to female candidates if all other factors are equal due to the nature of the society in which the sociologist will work.

Except as expressly amended herein, the Cooperative Agreement remains in full force and effect in accordance with its terms.





The Contractor will provide specialists and consultants in the field of renewable and improved traditional energy resources to assist the Rwanda Center for Applied Study of Energy at the University of Rwanda, located at Butare. The technicians to be provided will include:

Long-term: The technician should have training in mechanics, electrical chemical or rural engineering, or physics, with a strong background both in the mechanics and sciences of at least one energy technology. The contractor should be experienced in project and research management, preferably with experience working in a developing country. Eighteen months services are required. French language capability will be essential.

Short-term: Up to four months consultancies will be required in energy and energy related fields. The exact requirements will be determined by the long-term technician. Contractor should have access to a wide range of expertise. French language capability is important but not a requirement.

The long-term energy expert being contracted under this PIO/T will serve as technical advisor to the Director of the Centre d'Etudes et d'Applications de l'Energie au Rwanda (CEAER) at the University of Rwanda, situated at Butare, and as project officer for implementation of the AID financed Rwanda Renewable and Improved Traditional Energy Project. Short-term experts will provide specific assistance determined to be essential to the project and not available otherwise.

CEAER was created in 1974 and is jointly funded by the Government and the University for the following reasons:

- Study and develop technologies to use local indigenous energy resources to meet needs for national economic development.
- Demonstrate the potential for mass extension and use of these technologies via field testing of prototypes.
- Train students to be able to carry on both the work of CEAER and to acquire the skills to meet the nation's energy manpower needs.

CEAER is relatively well staffed and equipped for carrying out research. Their most significant work has been in adapting a solar water heater to Rwandan conditions. They are now moving to upgrade the preliminary work on other alternate energy applications for rural areas, including solar cell pumping, bio-gas conversion, solar crop dryers, solar refrigeration, peat for use as a fuel, improved charcoal production and more efficient wood burning stoves. The AID financing will assist in research and adaptive testing of the more viable of these options.

Reports: The contractor will be required to work with CEAER to:

- 1. Assure an appropriate technology approach, emphasizing the use of non-imported materials.
- 2. Assure a multi-disciplinary approach to research and testing to ensure that prototype devices are socially acceptable and economically viable.
- 3. Provide technical advice on research and testing.
- 4. Prepare annual work plans for laboratory and field research and extensive field testing. Set up field testing/evaluation models.
- 5. Determine requirements for short-term technical consultancies, Draft TOR's for consultancies.
- 6. Assist in designing training programs for Rwandan university students and for rural energy technicians.
- 7. Determine commodity and equipment requirements at the CEAER and prepare specifications for U.S. and local procurement.
- 8. Devise criteria for a Rural Energy Fund to extensively test energy devices in rural commodities.
- 9. Participate in energy colloquia sponsored by the University.
- 10. Contribute to progress reports required of CEAER.

Funds for the above level of effort in Rwanda will be provided by USAID/Rwanda as follows:

ARTICLE I - Cooperative Agreement

- A. Pursuant to the authority contained in the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Agency for International Development (hereinafter referred to as "A.I.D.") hereby enters into a Cooperative Agreement with the Volunteers in Technical Assistance (hereinafter referred to as "VITA" or "Recipient"). Under this Agreement, the amount of \$914,000 is provided by A.I.D. to support a program in Alternative Energy Strategies as more fully described in Attachment A to this Cooperative Agreement entitled "Program Description," and in VITA's proposal entitled "Proposal for an International Program to Develop, Transfer, and Ciffuse Low-Cost Alternative Energy Technologies For Rural Areas of the Third World," which is hereby incorporated by reference. The recipient's expenditures hereunder may not exceed that amount. Subject to the availability of funds, and as otherwise mutually agreed, it is anticipated that additional AID funds of up to \$9,075,000 may be added to this agreement for a total estimated amount of \$9,989,000 for the period stated below.
- B. This Agreement is effective as of the date indicated on the cover page and shall remain in effect until August 30, 1984.
- C. This Cooperative Agreement is made with the Recipient on condition that the funds will be administered in accordance with the terms and conditions as set forth in Attachment A entitled "Program Description," and Attachment B entitled "Standard Provisions." In the event of an inconsistency between the program description, the Standard Provisions and VITA's technical proposal; the program description and the Standard Provisions shall govern.

ARTICLE II - Provisions

A. Negotiated Overhead Rates

Pursuant to the Provisions of Standard Provisions 4 of the Cooperative Agreement entitled "Negotiated Overhead Rates - Non-Educational Institutions," a rate or rates shall be established for each of the Recipient's accounting periods furing the term of this Cooperative Agreement. The rate for initial period shall be as set forth below:

Program Description

A. Purpose of Cooperative Agreement

The purpose of this agreement is to make effective use of the broad experience and demonstrated competency of the Volunteers in Technical Assistance (VITA) in the field of alternative energy technologies. It is to enable VITA to enhance its ability to extend appropriate energy technologies to the LDCs and to provide material, information, financial and human resources for the support and advancement of low cost energy technologies based on renewable resources. The recipient will develop and implement alternative energy technology activities and programs, including related information, education and training activities, provide technical manuals and demonstration equipment; develop and demonstrate new and improved alternative energy technologies for acceptance and practice; support small scale alternative energy activities already in operation; encourage the development of international cooperation and information exchange by initiating regional centers and an international network of information and experience exchange; and support other appropriate programs which may be mutually acceptable in a broad field of alternative energy technology.

B. AID-VITA Cooperation

The cognizant AID Technical Office and recipient will establish a close cooperative and collaborative relationship in the development of this program. To this end VITA will submit to the Project Manager in the Office of Energy a quarterly report which will review the program activities of the previous three months and also project a work plan for the following three months which will be mutually agreeable to the parties and in conformity with the criteria for project proposals stated in paragraph E below. Consultations between the parties on this and other matters considered appropriate by either party may be initiated and will be conducted by the Project Manager of the AID Office of Energy and the Director of Research and Development, the VITA person responsible for this program. The AID Project Manager will participate as AID's representative in VITA sponsored conferences/meetings on development and implementation of the alternative energy program and in other ways serve as liaison to and evaluator of project activities.

C. Specific Objectives

- (1) Technology Transfer Services: To expand VITA's existing technical assistance mechanisms to include outreach capability in following activities:
 - a. The provision of on-site consultations by expert volunteers and staff to promote and facilitate use of alternative energy technologies.

- b. The provision of technical documentation on alternative energy technologies to LDCs which is most relevant, up to date and can be delivered most rapidly.
- c. The provision of by-mail technical and consulting services to enable volunteer and staff expertise to address LDC energy problems and efforts effectively and rapidly including use of expert panels in key technical areas, conferences to promote close-collaboration between university based research and development and in-country programs, construction and adaptation of prototypes to test technologies and use of multidisciplinary advisory panels to monitor and evaluate these energy activities.
- d. The provision of alternative energy publications including technical manuals, technology-specific bulletins and resource directories, in appropriate languages (English, Spanish, French, Arabic, and as appropriate major third world languages) for the LDCs, to make alternative energy technologies understandable to, available to and used by the widest possible audience.
- e. The provision of education and training in alternative energy technologies through use of in-country training involving audio-visual materials, seminars, workshops and training sessions to encourage and facilitate the initiation, continuation and expansion of alternative energy technologies usage.
- (2) International Alternative Energy Network: To establish an alternative energy network including all those working to solve rural energy problems to serve as a primary mechanism to facilitate the transfer and broadest diffusion of such technologies.
 - a. The establishment of a global energy information network to provide local institutions with access to current activities in the area of alternative renewable energy programs and projects.
 - b. The promotion, strengthening and development of the information base and the research and development capabilities of the local LDC institutions.
 - c. The direct access of the global energy network to VITA's computerized documentation center and volunteer expert capabilities to provide a focal resource point for those working on alternative energies everywhere in the world.
 - d. The support of appropriate LDC organizations to develop the capability to serve as regional energy technology transfer and diffusion centers, each with their own energy data bases and outreach capabilities to strengthen LDC capabilities in alternative energy.

- (3) Program Implementation Fund: To establish a program implementation fund to support the ability of local implementing organizations to carry out activities in the following areas of low cost energy technology based on renewable resources:
 - The demonstration of alternative energy technologies to show the utility, effectiveness, low operating cost and reliability of these technologies to wide LDC audiences.
 - b. The practical application of alternative energy technologies to demonstrate their ability to perform specific tasks with energy based on renewable resources.
 - c. The provision of training in low cost technologies to rural extension agents and others who will disseminate this expertise to rural and urban poor.
 - d. The support of local LDC institutions to improve their ability to promote, support, identify, select and implement their own alternative energy projects.
 - e. The support of applied or adaptive research and development to produce alternative energy technology equipment or processes which can be successfully replicated in broad sectors of the country.
 - f. The development and conduct of activities which will bring to the attention of the leadership and/or the population the benefits and advantages of alternative energy technologies based on renewable resources.

D. Implementation of Program Implementation Fund Projects

The recipient will make three types of subgrants: Travel/Training Subgrants; Equipment Subgrants; and Project Subgrants. These subgrants will be developed in a variety of ways but would generally include PVOs and LDC institutions, organizations and individuals whose capabilities are already known to VITA or about whom VITA is able to judge that such capabilities exist by reason of reference by USAID Missions, AID Geographic Bureaus and the Energy Office; others may be developed in other acceptable ways to meet targets of opportunity as these arise.

In all cases subgrants will be based on the criteria set forth in paragraph E below.

(1) Travel/Training Subgrants: These subgrants would be made to LDCs and other selected (non-VITA) individuals important to the advancement of alternative energy programs in their countries to attend conferences, seminars, workshops, orientation courses and similar events (site visits) which will perceptively and significantly improve their ability to advance the objectives of this project in-country, regionally, or worldwide. The subgrants are made to cover the costs of specific travel and/or training for specific individuals involved in energy programs in the LDCs. It is understood that AID may nominate individuals for travel awards for consideration by the recipient.

(2) Equipment Subgrants

These subgrants would be made to LDC individuals and other selected (non-VITA) individuals, organizations and institutions for specific equipment and supplies and involve funds only for procurement and shipping. The equipment would be restricted to relatively low cost technology for demonstration, pilot programs, testing or use to advance the objectives of low cost energy technology based on renewable energy resources, and would include such items as Stirling engines, cooking stoves, hydraulic rams et al. Responsibility for maintenance and replacement parts for duration of subgrant will be determined on a case by case basis.

(3) Project Subgrants

These subgrants would be made to other PVOs and selected individuals or organizations working in the LDCs on alternative energy related programs and to LDC individuals, organizations and institutions to advance the objectives of this project which involve increased use of appropriate low cost energy technology based on renewable energy resources through small activities facilitating the flow or interchange of reliable technology to the largest groups of people in the rural areas, small activities to demonstrate or test the low cost reliability, safety, and acceptance of appropriate alternative energy technology, small pilot projects to encourage wider acceptance of these technologies and other activities which improve and accelerate the acoption of these technologies. These subgrants may include travel, training, equipment and/or supplies but will always include financial support for other purposes.

E. Criteria for AID Approval in Project Proposals

Projects selected for funding by VITA will be described in the quarterly report projection according to the format agreed to by the parties. It is understood that projects up to \$10,000 may be committed by designated senior VITA personnel in the field. All projects will conform to the following criteria:

- (1) Consistency with AID's energy strategy for the proposed country or region as determined through consultation with appropriate country or regional AID officials.
- (2) The training, demonstrated ability, and general competence of subgrantees to undertake proposed sub-project activities.
- (3) The adequacy of facilities and support personnel identified as project subgrantees, or identified as support elements to project subgrantees.

- (4) Other work underway (sponsored by AID, other agencies or host governments) on the proposed activity, which might result in undesirable overlap and duplication.
- (5) The suitability of proposed technology or procedures to the needs, attitudes, and alternative energy activities in less developed countries.
- (6) Such other factors as the parties may deem appropriate for consideration.

F. Staffing

(1) To carry out the objectives of this agreement, the recipient will assemble a staff to manage the alternative energy program, to develop and implement its technology transfer services, the international alternative energy network and the Program Implementation fund and to evaluate the report on its achievements.

The recruitment and selection of staff to be employed by VITA will be the Grantee's responsibility and will be conducted in accordance with the Grantee's regular personnel policies. However, the grantee staff officers listed below are considered essential to the successful achievement of the objectives of this grant. The Project Manager will be consulted on the biographical data including earnings over the prior three year period for new or replacement personnel.

a. Headquarters

1. Program Management Staff

Director of Research and Development

The Director, who reports directly to VITA's Executive Director, directs all Energy Program activities.

Project Officer

The project officer screens all incoming energyrelated requests for technical assistance and determine the most appropriate response to each.

2. <u>Senior Technical Advisors</u> (initially five, up to eight)

The Senior Technical Advisors shall consist of specialists with background in engineering, energy technologies, agriculture, social science, anthropoloby, economics, health and small business.

All will have extensive energy-related technical and overseas backgrounds, including experience in the design, management, and evaluation of field projects. Thoroughly grounded in AT philosophy and practices, they will also have language skills or have plans to obtain such in: Spanish, French or Arabic. Based in the U.S., all will travel overseas as necessary to identify and evaluate Grant projects.

3. Publications Staff

Editor

The Editor will have responsibility for production of materials published under the Energy Program.

b. Field Representatives

1. The field staff shall consist of Regional Representatives for Latin America. Asia. Near East and Africa.

These field representatives will be development specialists thoroughly familiar with the political, economic, and cultural structures of their region. Actual field experience in the regions and fluency in appropriate language(s) will be required. When possible, individuals already residing in the regions -- especially Third World nationals -- will serve in these positions.

G. Evaluation

AID and VITA will undertake an interim evaluation of the project six (6) months after the Cooperative Agreement is signed to obtain an early assessment of progress and to make any adjustments or accommodations that appear necessary. An intensive evaluation will be conducted by AID and VITA 18 months after the Cooperative Agreement is signed which will:

- (1) Be used as a basis for surveying the management activities and the progress of the technical and advisory services in achieving the stated objectives.
- (2) Help AID determine whether the project should be extended, amended or terminated.

H. Reporting Requirements

VITA will prepare and submit to AID a quarterly program activity report which will review the activities of the previous three months and project those of the next three months. In addition, a comprehensive annual program activity report on each anniversary date of the cooperative agreement will be submitted which will summarize program and financial activities under the agreement for all previous program years, detail current program year information and propose activities for the next program year. Twenty copies of each report will be sent to the AID Project Manager and one copy to the Grant Officer. The reports should cover:

- (1) General comprehensive assessment of the extent to which the purposes of the grant are being achieved, including:
 - a. How subgrants or activities undertaken in the major areas of Alternative Energy Technology (as set forth in Paragraph E) helped achieve the purposes of the grant.
 - Description of the subgrants completed.
 - c. General problems encountered, requiring action.
 - d. Assessment of compliance with staff levels and functions.
 - e. Significant actions taken pursuant to any outside eveluations of VITA.
 - f. The status of proposals for procurement of equipment pending approval, approved, orders placed, amounts shipped.

(2) For Each Subgrant

- a. Details of specific services or activities carried out under the subgrant in relation to the plan initially approved by AID.
- b. Assessment of whether and how the actual services provided or activity undertaken are meeting the established goals of the project and promoting the general activity (as set forth in Paragraph E).
- c. Demonstration of catalytic effects of subgrant in terms of such factors as: Has project provided evidence of effectiveness of approach used? Has it been possible to present these results to the host government or other influential organizations? What was the impact?
- d. Reports should include the line item budget as set forth in the subgrant proposal showing expenditures against each line item semi-annually.

- e. Amounts of equipment received, by type: Amounts, by type, used during the reporting period and amounts, by type, remaining on hand:
- f. For each completed subgrant, an end of project status report.

The quarterly reports will cover as much of the information required in (1) and (2) above, as possible. In addition, they will show any expected short-falls in funding.

STANDARD PROVISIONS

1. DEFINITIONS

(a) "Administrator" means the Administrator or the Deputy Administrator of the Agency for International Development.

(b) "AID" means the Agency for International Development.(c) "Consultant" means any especially well qualified person who is engaged on a temporary or intermittent basis to advise the Recipient and who is not an officer or employee of the Recipient who performs other duties for the Grantee.

(d) "AID Grant Officer" means the person executing this Agreement on behalf of the United States Government, and any other Government employee who is a properly designated AID Grant Officer; and the term includes, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, the authorized representative of an AID Grant Officer acting within the limits of his authority.

(e) "Recipient Employee" means a person in the employ of

the Recipient assigned to work under this Agreement.

- (f) "Cooperating Country or Countries" means the foreign country or countries in or for which assistance is to be provided hereunder.
- (g) "Cooperating Government" means the government of the Cooperating Country.
- (h) "Economy Class" air travel (also known as jet economy, air coach, tourist class, etc.) means a class of air travel which is less than first class.
- (i) "Recipient" means the institution entering into this Agreement with the Government.
 - (j) "Government" means the United States Government.
- (k) "Mission" means the United States Mission to, or principal AID office in, the Cooperating Country.
- (1) "Mission Director" means the principal AID officer of the Mission in the Cooperating Country, or his designated representative.
- (m) "OMB Circular No. A-110" means the Managment and Budget Circular entitled Grants and Agreements With Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals and Other Nonprofit Organizations: Uniform Administrative Requirements (41 CFR 32016; July 30, 1976), including any amendments
- thereto.
 (n) "41 CFR 1-15.2" means the cost principles set out in
 - (o) "Handbook 13" means AID Handbook 13, entitled Grants
- (p) "Assistance Instruments" means either grants or cooperative agreements.
- (q) "Subrecipient" means any organization other than the Recipient undertaking by subagreement hereunder program or project activities in fulfillment of the purposes or objectives of this Agreement.

(r) "AID Project Officer" means a designated representative of the cognizant AID Scientific/Technical Office named on the Cover Page.

2. ALLOWABLE COSTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS

- (a) Allowable costs under this Agreement shall be limited to those costs which are reasonable, allocable, and allowable in accordance with the terms of (1) this Agreement, (2) any negotiated advance understanding on particular cost items, and (3) 41 CFR 1-15.2, in effect on the date of this Agreement.
- (b) With regard to the allowability of non-Federal cost sharing contributions under this Agreement, Attachment E, "Cost Sharing and Matching", to OMB Circular No. A-110 (as set out in paragraph 1K of Handbook 13) shall also apply.

3. ACCOUNTING, AUDIT, AND RECORDS

- (a) The Recipient shall maintain a financial management system in accordance with the requirements set forth in OMB Circular A-110 (as implemented in Paragraph 1L of Handbook 13). A copy of reports of audits resulting from this system as they concern this Agreement will be furnished to the Grant Officer.
- (b) The AID Auditor General and the Comptroller General of the United States or their duly authorized representatives (see paragraph 16, Chapter 1 of Handbook 13) reserve the right to conduct an audit of the Recipient's books and records to determine whether the Recipient has expended AID's funds in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Recipient agrees both to make available any further information requested by AID with respect to any questions arising as a result of the audit and to include the requirements of this provision in any subordinate agreement, including subgrants, entered into with a U.S. institution.

4. NEGOTIATED OVERHEAD RATES - NON-EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

(This provision is applicable to non-educational institutions which do not have an acceptable indirect cost system).

(a) Pursuant to this provision, an overhead rate(s) shall be established for each of the Grantee's accounting periods during the term of this Grant. Pending establishment of a final rate(s), the parties have agreed that provisional payments on account of allowable costs shall be at the rate(s), on the base(s), and for the period(s), shown in the

Schedule to this Grant.

(b) The Grantee, as soon as possible but not later than ninety (90) days after the close of its accounting periods during the term of this Grant, shall submit to the AID Grant Officer with copies to the Office of Contract Management, AID, Washington D.C. 20523 and to the Office of the Auditor General, AID, Washington, D.C., proposed final rate(s) for the period, together with supporting cost data. Negotiation of the final overhead rates by the Grantee and the AID Grant Officer shall be undertaken as promptly as practicable after receipt of the Grantee's proposal.

(c) Allowability of costs and acceptability of cost allocation methods shall be determined in accordance with 41

CFR 15.2 as in effect on the date of this Grant.

(d) The results of each negotiation shall be set forth in a written overhead rate agreement executed by both parties. Such Grant shall specify (1) the agreed final rate(s), (2) the base(s) to which the rate(s) applies, and (3) the period(s) for which the rate(s) applies. The overhead rate agreement shall not change any monetary ceilings, Grant obligation, or specific cost allowance or

disallowance provided for in this Grant.

(e) Pending establishment of the final overhead rate(s) for any period, the Grantee shall be reimbursed either at a negotiated provisional rate(s) as provided above or at billing rate(s) acceptable to the AID Grant Officer, subject to appropriate adjustment when the final rate(s) for that period is established. To prevent substantial over or under payment, the provisional or billing rate(s) may, at the request of either party, be revised by mutual agreement, either retroactively or prospectively. Any such revision of negotiated provisional rate(s) provided for in this provision shall be set forth in a modification to this Grant.

5. SALARIES

All salaries, wages, fees, and stipends, which will be reimbursable by AID under this Agreement, shall be in accordance with both the Recipient's usual policy and practice and 41 CFR 1-15.2. To the extent that the Recipient's policy and practice conflict with 41 CFR 1-15.2, the latter shall prevail, unless the Schedule of this Agreement expressly provides otherwise.

Salaries and wages paid to Cooperating Country and Third Country Nationals may not, without specific written approval

of the Grant Officer, exceed either the Recipient's established policy and practice; or the level of salaries paid to equivalent personnel by the AID Mission in the Cooperating Country as determined by AID, paid to personnel of equivalent technical competence.

The compensation, leave and holidays, allowances and differentials, travel and transportation, and shipment of effects for Cooperating Country Nationals and Third Country National employees will be subject to AID's policy as set forth in Manual Order 1423.7.

6. TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION

(This provision is applicable when air travel or air shipment (both domestic and international) costs are reimbursable by AID under this Agreement.)

- (a) Allowable costs of travel under this Agreement shall be in accordance with both the policy and practice of the Recipient and 41 CFR 1-15.2. To the extent the Recipient's policy and practice conflict with 41 CFR 1-15.2, the latter shall prevail unless the Schedule of this Agreement provides otherwise.
- (b) The AID Grant Officer hereby approves international travel hereunder provided that the Recipient shall obtain written concurrence from the cognizant AID Project Officer prior to sending any individual outside the United States to perform work under this Agreement. For this purpose the Recipient shall advise the AID Project Officer at least 30 days in advance of any travel to be undertaken outside the United States. After concurrence is received the Recipient shall provide the cognizant Mission or U.S. Embassy advance notification (with a copy to the AID Project Officer) of the arrival date and flight identification of AID financed travellers.
- (c) Travel to certain countries shall, at AID's option, be funded from U.S.-owned local currency. When AID intends to exercise this option, it will so notify the Recipient after receipt of advice of intent to travel required above. AID will issue a Government Transportation Request (GTR) which the Recipient may exchange for tickets, or AID will issue the tickets directly. Use of such U.S.-owned currencies will constitute a dollar charge to this Agreement.

(d) All international air travel and all international air shipments under this Agreement shall be made on United States flag carriers. Exceptions to this rule will be allowed in the following situations, provided that the Recipient certifies to the facts in the voucher and other documents

retained as part of the Agreement records required by Standard Provision 3 above:

- (1) where the traveler, while enroute, has to wait 6 hours or more to transfer to a U.S. flag air carrier to proceed to the intended destination, or
- (2) where a flight by a U.S. flag air carrier is interrupted by a stop anticipated to be 6 hours or more for refueling, reloading, repairs, etc. and no other flight by a U.S. flag air carrier is available during the 6 hour period, or
- (3) where by itself or in combination with other U.S. flag or non-U.S. flag air carriers (if U.S. flag air carriers are "unavailable") it takes 12 hours or longer from the original airport to the destination airport to accomplish the Recipient's program than would service by a non-U.S. flag air carrier or carriers, or
- (4) when the elapsed travel time on a scheduled flight from origin to destination airports by non-U.S. flag air carrier(s) is 3 hours or less, and services by U.S. flag air carrier(s) would involve twice such travel time.

NOTE: Where U.S. Government funds are used to reimburse Recipient's use of other than U.S. flag air carriers for international transportation, the Recipient will include a certification on vouchers involving such transportation which is essentially as follows:

CERTIFICATION OF UNAVAILABILITY OF U.S. FLAG AIR CARRIERS I hereby certify that the transportation service for personnel (and their personal effects) or property by U.S. flag air carriers was unavailable for the following reason(s): (State appropriate reason(s) as set forth above; see 41 CFR 1-1.323-3 for further guidance).

(e) Travel allowances shall be reimbursed in accordance with 41 CFR 1-15.2 and the regulations contained in AID Handbook 22 entitled "Travel and Transportation"; however, if the Recipient's domestic and international travel allowance policies and procedures have been reviewed and approved by AID or another Federal department or agency pursuant to the applicable Federal cost principles, the Recipient may use its travel allowance system in lieu of that in Handbook 22 after it has furnished the AID Grant Officer with a copy of such approval. For travel outside the conterminous United States, reimbursement for each per diem locality will be the average cost of lodging rounded to the next whole dollar plus 50 percent of the maximum locality rate. Total reimbursement shall not exceed the maximum per diem for each locality,

unless specific approval is given in advance for actual expenses. Maximum locality rates shall be those established by the Department of Defense for non-foreign areas and by the Department of State for foreign areas. When staff house or other free or low cost facilities are used, the reduced rates indicated by footnote 1 on the per diem supplement (section 925) to the Standardized Regulations (Government Civilians, Foreign Areas) will be used directly as per diem. These low rates have already been computed on a basis similar to lodging plus, and no further computation is necessary.

- (f) Fifty percent of all international ocean shipment made by the Recipient, to be financed hereunder, shall be made on U.S. flag vessels. Where U.S. flag vessels are not available, or their use would result in a significant delay, the Recipient may request a release from this requirement from the Transportation Support Division, Office of Commodity Management, AID, Washington, D.C. 20523, giving the basis for the request.
- (i) When the AID Transportation Support Division makes and issues a determination to the Recipient that U.S. flag vessels are not available, the ocean shipment costs on foreign flag vessels, as named in the determination, will be eligible for reimbursement under the Agreement. In all instances Recipient vouchers submitted for reimbursement under the Agreement which include ocean shipment costs will include a certification essentially as follows: "I hereby certify that a copy of each ocean bill of lading concerned has been submitted to the Maritime Administration, Cargo Preference Control Center, Commerce Building, Washington, D.C. 20235, and that such bill(s) of lading state all of the carrier's charges including the basis for calculation such as weight or cubic measurement, and indicate the applicable A.I.D. Agreement Number."

(ii) Shipments by voluntary non-profit relief agencies (i.e., PYOs) shall be governed by paragraphs (a) and (b) above and by AID Regulation 2, "Overseas Shipments of Supplies by Voluntary Non-Profit Relief Agencies" (22 CFR 202).

7. PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES UNDER \$250,000

(This provision is applicable when the total procurement element, i.e., the sum of all purchase orders and contracts for goods and services, of this Agreement does not exceed \$250,000.)

(a) Ineligible Goods and Services

Under no circumstances shall the Recipient use AID funds to procure any of the following under this Agreement:

(1) military equipment,

(2) surveillance equipment.

(3) commodities and services for support of police or other law enforcement activities.

(4) abortion equipment and services,

(5) luxury goods and gambling equipment, or

(6) weather modification equipment.

(For a more detailed discussion of the subject, see AID Handbook 1, Supplement B, Chapter 4D.)

If AID determines that the Recipient has procured any of the ineligible goods and services specified above under this Agreement, and has received reimbursement from AID for such purpose, the Recipient agrees to refund to AID the entire amount of such reimbursement.

(b) Restricted Goods

The Recipient shall not use AID funds to procure any of the following goods or services from a non-U.S. source (i.e., other than AID Geographic Code 000) without the prior written authorization of the AID Grant Officer:

- (1) agricultural commodities,
- (2) motor vehicles,
- (3) pharmaceuticals,
- (4) pesticides,
- (5) plasticizers,
- (5) used equipment, or
- (7) U.S. Government-owned excess property.

(In addition to the foregoing rule regarding source, to be eligible for procurement with AID funds, the above commodities must meet the requirements contained in AID Handbook 1, Supplement B, Chapter 4C.)

If AID determines that the Recipient has procured any of the restricted goods specified above under this Agreement from non-U.S. sources without the prior written authorization of the AID Grant Officer and has received reimbursement from AID for such purpose, the Recipient agrees to refund to AID the entire amount of such reimbursement.

(c) Geographic Source and Order of Preference

Except as may be specifically approved or directed in advance by the AID Grant Officer under paragraph 7(b) above, all other goods (e.g., equipment, materials and supplies) and services, the costs of which are to be reimbursed under this Agreement by AID and which will be financed with United States dollars, shall be purchased in and shipped from only "Special Free World" countries (i.e., AID Geographic Code 935) in accordance with the following order of preference:

(1) the United States (AID Geographic Code 000).

(2) "Selected Free World" countries (AID Geographic Code 941),

(3) the Cooperating Country.

(4) "Special Free World" countries (AID Geographic Code 935).

(d) Application of Order of Preference

When the Recipient uses AID funds to procure goods and services from other than U.S. sources under the order of preference in 7(c) above, it shall document its files to justify each such instance. The documentation shall set forth the circumstances surrounding the procurement and shall be based on one or more of the following reasons, which will be set forth in the Recipient's documentation:

- (1) the procurement was of an emergency nature, which would not allow the delay attendant to soliciting U.S. sources.
- (2) the price differential for procurement from U.S. sources exceeded by 50% or more the delivered price from the non-U.S. source,
- (3) impelling local political considerations precluded consideration of U.S. sources,
- (4) the goods or services were not available from U.S. sources. or
- (5) procurement of locally available goods or services as opposed to procurement of U.S. goods and services, would best promote the objectives of the Foreign Assistance Program under this Agreement.
 - (e) The Recipient's Procurement System
- (1) The Recipient may use its own procurement policies and procedures provided they conform to the geographic source and order of preference requirements of this provision and paragraphs 3 and 4, Attachment 0 of OMB Circular No. A-110 (as set forth in paragraphs 1U.3 and 1U.4 of Handbook 13).

(2) If the Recipient's procurement policies and procedures have been reviewed against the procurement requirements of paragraphs 3 and 4 of Attachment 0 to OMB Circular No. A-110, (as set forth in paragraphs 1U.3 and 1U.4 of Handbook 13) and have been approved by AID or another Federal department or agency, the Recipient shall furnish the AID Grant Officer a copy of such approval; otherwise the Recipient's procurement policies and procedures shall conform to the specified requirements of OMB Circular No. A-110. (See Handbook 13, Chapter 1, paragraph 1U.)

(f) Procurement Systems - Subrecipients

- (1) U.S. subrecipients may use their own procurement policies and procedures provided the Recipient determines that they comply with the intent of paragraph 3 and the requirements of paragraph 4 of Attachment 0 to OMB Circular A-110 (as set forth in paragraphs IU.3 and IU.4 of Handbook 13).
- (2) Non-U.S. subrecipients, who are located abroad and who do not perform in the U.S. under this Agreement, may use their own procurement policies and procedures provided that the Recipient determines that they comply with the intent of paragraph 3 of Attachment 0 to FMC Circular No. 73-8 (as set forth in paragraph IU.3 of Handbook 13); Paragraph 4 of Attachment 0 to OMB Circular No. A-110 (as set forth in paragraph IU.4 of Handbook 13) does not apply to such non-U.S. institutions.

(g) Small Business

To permit AID, in accordance with the small business provision of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, to give United States small business firms an opportunity to participate in supplying commodities and services procured under this Agreement, the Recipient shall, to the maximum extent possible, provide the following information to the Small Business Office, AID, Washington, D.C. 20523 at least 45 days prior (except where a shorter time is requested of, and granted by the Small Business Office) to placing any order or contract in excess of \$25,000:

- (1) brief general description and quantity of goods or services.
- (2) closing date for receiving quotations, proposals, or
- (3) address where invitations or specifications can be obtained.

(h) Ineligible Suppliers

AID funds provided under this Agreement shall not be used to procure any commodity or commodity-related services furnished by any supplier whose name appears on the List of Ineligible Suppliers under AID Regulation 8, Suppliers of Commodities and Commodity-Related Services Ineligible for AID Financing (22 CFR 208). The Recipient agrees to review said list prior to undertaking any procurement the cost of which is to be reimbursable by AID under this Agreement. AID will provide the Recipient with this list.

8. REFUNDS

(a) If use of AID funds results in accrual of interest to the Recipient or to any other person or entity to whom Recipient makes such funds available in carrying out the purposes of this Agreement, the Recipient shall refund to AID an amount equivalent to the amount of interest accrued.

(b) Funds obligated hereunder but not disbursed to the Recipient at the time this Agreement expires or is terminated, shall revert to AID, except for funds encumbered by the Recipient by a legally binding transaction applicable to this Agreement. Any funds disbursed to but not expended by the Recipient at the time of expiration or termination of this Agreement shall be refunded to AID.

(c) If, at any time, during the life of this Agreement, it is determined by AID that funds provided under this Agreement have been expended for purposes not in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, the Recipient shall refund such amounts to AID.

9A. PAYMENT - FEDERAL RESERVE LETTER OF CREDIT (FRLC) ADVANCE

(This provision is applicable when the total advances under all the Recipient's cost-reimbursement contracts and assistance instruments with AID exceed \$120,000 per annum and AID has, or expects to have a continuing relationship with the Recipient of at least one year.)

(a) AID shall open a Federal Reserve Letter of Credit (hereinafter referred to as an "FRLC") in the amount of this Agreement against which the Recipient may present payment vouchers (i.e, Form TFS 5401). The payment vouchers shall not ordinarily be submitted more frequently than daily and shall not be less that \$5,000 or more than \$5,000,000. Since the FRLC method enables the Recipient to obtain funds from the U.S. Treasury concurrently with and as frequently as disbursements are made by the Recipient, there need be no

time lag between disbursements by the Recipient and drawdowns from the U.S. Treasury by FRLC. Therefore, there is no necessity for the Recipient to maintain balances of Federal cash other than small balances.

(b) In no event shall the accumulated total of all such

payment vouchers exceed the amount of the FRLC.

(c) If at any time, the AID Controller determines that the Recipient has presented payment vouchers in excess of the amount or amounts allowable in (a) and (b) above, the AID Controller shall advise the AID Grant Officer who may: (1) cause the FRLC to be suspended or revoked; (2) direct the Recipient to withhold submission of payment vouchers until such time as, in the judgment of the AID Controller, an appropriate level of actual, necessary and allowable expenditures has occurred or will occur under this Agreement. and/or (3) request the Recipient to repay to AID the amount of such excess. Upon receipt of the AID Grant Officer's request for repayment of excess advance payments, the Recipient shall promptly contact the AID Controller to make suitable arrangements for the repayment of such excess funds. Advances made by primary Recipients (those which receive directly from the Government) to Recipients shall conform to the same standards applicable to advances made by the Government to the primary Grantee.

(d) Procedure for Recipient.

(1) After arranging with a commercial bank of its choice for operation under the FRLC and obtaining the name and address of the Federal Reserve Bank or branch serving its commercial bank, the Recipient shall deliver to the AID Controller 3 originals of Standard Form 1194, Authorized Signature Card for Payment Vouchers on Letters of Credit, signed by those official(s) authorized to sign payment vouchers against the FRLC and by an official of the Recipient who has authorized them to sign.

(2) The Recipient shall subsequently receive one certified copy of the FRLC.

(3) The Recipient shall confirm with its commercial bank that the FRLC has been opened and is available when funds are needed.

(4) To receive payment, the Recipient shall:

- (A) Periodically, although normally not during the last five days of the month, prepare payment vouchers (Form TFS 5401) in an original and three copies.
- (B) Have the original and two copies of the voucher signed by the authorized official(s) whose signature(s) appear on the Standard Form 1194.
- (C) Present the original, duplicate and triplicate copy of the Form TFS 5401 to its commercial bank.
 - (D) Retain the quadruplicate copy of the voucher.

(5) After the first payment voucher (Form TFS 5401) has been processed, succeeding payment vouchers shall not be presented until the existing balance of previous payments!has been expended or is insufficient to meet current needs.

(6) In preparing the payment voucher, the Recipient assigns a voucher number in numerical sequence beginning with 1 and continuing in sequence on all subsequent payment

vouchers submitted under the FRLC.

(7) A report of expenditures (i.e., SF 269, Financial Status Report) shall be prepared and submitted not less than quarterly within 30 days of the end of the period to the AID Controller, AID, Washington, D.C. 20523. This SF 269 Report, submitted with Standard Form 1034, Public Voucher for Purchases and Services Other Than Personal, shall be in an original and 2 copies.

- (8) The SF 269 report is reviewed against this Agreement's provisions, and any improper disbursement is disallowed. The Recipient is notified of the reason for the disallowance and is directed to adjust the next periodic report of expenditures to reflect the disallowance and to reduce its next payment voucher against the FRLC by the amount of the disallowance.
- (9) In addition to the submission of the SF 269 and the SF 1034, the Recipient shall submit an original and 2 copies of SF 272, Federal Cash Transaction Report, as follows:

(A) For advances totaling less than \$1 million per year, the Recipient shall submit the SF 272 within 15 working days

after the end of the reporting quarter.

(B) For advances totaling more than \$1 million per year, the Recipient shall submit the SF 272 within 15 working days after the end of each month, and

- (C) The Recipient's cash needs for the ensuing period (i.e., quarter or month) shall be explained under the "Remarks" section of the SF 272.
 - (e) Refund of Excess Funds.
- (1) If all costs have been settled under the Agreement and the Recipient fails to comply with the AID Grant Officer's request for repayment of excess FRLC funds, the Government shall have the right, on other contracts or assistance instruments held with the Recipient, to withhold reimbursements due to the Recipient in the amount of the excess being held by the Recipient.
- (2) If the Recipient is still holding excess FRLC funds on a contract or an assistance instrument under which work has been completed or terminated but all costs have not been settled the Recipient agrees to

settled, the Recipient agrees to:

(A) Provide within 30 days after requested to do so by the AID Grant Officer, a breakdown of the dollar amounts which have not been settled between the Government and the

Recipient. (The AID Grant Officer will assume no costs are in dispute if the Recipient fails to reply within 30 days.)

(B) Upon written request of the AID Grant Officer, return to the Government the sum of dollars, if any, which represents the diffence between (i) the Recipient's maximum position on claimed costs which have not been reimbursed and

(ii) the total amount of unexpended funds which have

been advanced under this Agreement; and

(C) If the Recipient fails to comply with the AID Grant Officer's request for repayment of excess FRLC funds, the Government shall have the right, on other contracts or assistance instruments held with the Recipient, to withhold payment of FRLC or other advances and/or withhold reimbursements due the Recipient in the amount of the excess being held by the Recipient.

9B. PAYMENT - PERIODIC ADVANCE

(This provision is applicable when total advances under all the Recipient's cost-reimbursement contracts and assistance instruments with AID do not exceed \$120,000 per annum or if total advances aggregate more than \$120,000 per annum but there is not a continuing relationship of at least one year.)

(a) Each month (or quarter, if the Recipient is on a quarterly basis) after the initial advance, the Recipient shall submit to the AID Controller an original and 2 copies of SF 272, Federal Cash Transaction Report, as follows:

(1) The Recipient shall submit the SF 272 within 15

working days after the end of the reporting period, and

(2) The Recipient's cash needs for the ensuing period (1.e., quarter or month) shall be explained under the "Remarks" section of the SF 272.

- (b) Along with each SF 272 submission, the Recipient shall submit an original and 3 copies of SF 1034, <u>Public Voucher for Purchases and Services Other Than Personal</u>, each voucher shall be identified by this Agreement number and shall state the total actual expenditures for the reporting period.
- (c) Each quarterly voucher (i.e., SF 1034) or third monthly voucher, if the Recipient is on a monthly basis, shall also be supported by an original and 2 copies of an SF 269, Financial Status Report. The SF 269 shall be submitted within 30 days after the end of the reporting quarter and may be submitted separately from the SF 1034 and the SF 272; however, the SF 269 shall cover the same period as the SF 1034(s) and the SF 272(s).
 - (d) Refund of Excess Funds.
 - (1) If all costs have been settled under this Agreement

and the Recipient fails to comply with the AID Grant Officer's request for repayment of excess advance funds, the Government shall have the right, on other contracts or assistance instruments held with the Recipient, to withhold reimbursements due to the Recipient in the amount of the excess being held by the Recipient.

(2) If the Recipient is still holding excess advance funds on a contract or assistance instrument under which the work has been completed or terminated but all costs have not

been settled, the Recipient agrees to;

(A) Provide within 30 days after requested to do so by the AID Grant Officer, a breakdown of the dollar amounts which have not been settled between the Government and the Recipient. (The AID Grant Officer will assume no costs are in dispute if the Recipient fails to reply within 30 days.)

(B) Upon written request of the AID Grant Officer, return to the Government the sum of dollars, if any, which represents the difference between (i) the Recipient's maximum position on claimed costs which have not been reimbursed and

(ii) the total amount of unexpended funds which have been

advanced under this Grant; and

(C) If the Recipient fails to comply with the AID Grant Officer's request for repayment of excess advance funds, the Government shall have the right, on other contracts or assistance instruments held with the Recipient, to withhold payment of other advances and/or withhold reimbursements due the Recipient in the amount of the excess being held by the Recipient.

10. LIMITATION OF FUNDS

(This provision is applicable to all incrementally or partially funded Agreements.)

- (a) It is estimated that the cost to AID for the performance of this Agreement will not exceed the estimated cost specified in the Schedule as being the estimated cost to AID for this Agreement, and the Recipient agrees to use its best efforts to carry out the program specified in the Schedule and all obligations under this Agreement within such estimated cost.
- (b) The amount of AID funds presently available for payment and allotted to this Agreement, the items covered thereby, and the period of performance which it is estimated the allotted amount will cover, are specified in the Schedule. It is contemplated that from time to time additional funds will be allotted to this Agreement up to the full estimated cost to AID set forth in the Schedule. The Recipient agrees to carry out, or have carried out, the

program under this Agreement up to the point at which the total amount paid and payable by AID pursuant to the terms of this Agreement approximates but does not exceed the total amount actually alloted to this Agreement.

- (c) (1) If, at any time, the Recipient has reason to believe that the costs which it expects to incur in carrying out the program of this Agreement in the next succeeding 60 days, when added to all costs previously incurred, will exceed 75 percent of the total amount of AID funds then allotted to this Agreement, the Recipient shall notify the AID Grant Officer in writing to that effect. The notice shall state the estimated amount of additional funds required to continue the program for the period set forth in the Schedule. (2) Sixty days prior to the end of the period specified in the Schedule, the Recipient will advise the AID Grant Officer in writing as to the estimated amount of additional AID funds, if any, that will be required for the timely carrying out of the program under this Agreement or for such further period as may be specified in the Schedule or otherwise agreed to by the parties. (3) If, after notification, pursuant to (c)(1) or (c)(2), above additional AID funds are not allotted by the end of the period set forth in the Schedule or an agreed date
- substituted therefor, the AID Grant Officer will, upon written request by the Recipient, terminate this Agreement pursuant to the provisions of the TERMINATION provision on such date. If the Recipient, in the exercise of its reasonable judgment, estimates that the funds available will allow it to continue to discharge its obligation hereunder for a period extending beyond such date, it shall specify the later date in its request and the AID Grant Officer, in his discretion, may terminate this Agreement on that later date.
- (d) Except as required by other provisions of this Agreement, specifically citing and stated to be an exception from this provision, the Government shall not be obligated to reimburse the Recipient for costs incurred in excess of the total amount of AID funds from time to time allotted to this Agreement, and the Recipient shall not be obligated to continue carrying out the program under this Agreement (including actions under the TERMINATION provision) otherwise to incur costs in excess of the amount of AID funds allotted to this Agreement, unless and until the AID Grant Officer has notified the Recipient in writing that such allotted amount of AID funds has been increased and has specified in such notice an increased amount constituting the total amount then allotted to this Agreement. To the extent the amount of AID funds allotted exceeds the estimated cost to AID set forth in the Schedule, such estimated cost to AID shall be correspondingly increased. No notice, communication

or representation in any other form or from any person other than the AID Grant Officer shall affect the amount allotted to this Agreement. In the absence of the specified notice, AID shall not be obligated to reimburse the Recipient for any costs in excess of the total amount of AID funds then allotted to this Agreement, whether those excess costs were incurred during the course of this Agreement or as result of termination. When and to the extent that the amount of AID funds allotted to this Agreement has been increased, any costs incurred by the Recipient in excess of the amount of AID funds previously allotted shall be allowable to the same as if such costs had been incurred after such increase in the amount of AID funds allotted, unless the AID Grant Officer issues a termination or other notice and directs that the increase is solely for the purpose of covering termination or other specified expenses.

11. USE OF FOREIGN CURRENCY

- (a) Whenever the Recipient has a need to convert U.S. dollars into local currencies, such conversion shall be made through the U.S. Disbursing Officer. If the Disbursing Officer is unable to effect such conversion, the Recipient is free to use the facilities of any accredited financial institution.
- (b) All expenditures of the Recipient in excess or near-excess currency countries, including per diem (subsistence) expenses, which will be reimbursable by AID under this Agreement, shall be funded from U.S. owned foreign currencies, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the AID Grant Officer.

12. AGREEMENT AMENDMENTS

This Agreement may be amended by formal written modifications to the basic document. Amendments may be proposed by either party to this Agreement; however, they must be acceptable to both parties before they become effective and binding.

13. DISPUTES

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under this Agreement which is not disposed of by agreement shall be decided by the AID Grant Officer, who shall reduce his decision to writing and mail or otherwise furnish a copy thereof to the Grantee. The decision of the AID Grant

Officer shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of such copy, the Recipient mails or otherwise furnishes to the AID Grant Officer a written appeal addressed to the Administrator, Agency for International Development, Washington, D.C. 20523. The decision of the Administrator or his duly authorized representative for the determination of such appeals shall be final and conclusive unless determined by a court of jurisdiction to competent have been fraudulent. or or so grossly erroneous capricious, or arbitrary, as necessarily to imply bad faith or not supported by substantial evidence. In connection with any appeal proceeding under this provision, the Recipient shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence in support of its appeal.

(b) This DISPUTES provision does not preclude consideration of law questions in connection with decisions provided for in paragraph (a) above; provided that nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as making final the decision of any administrative official, representative, or board on a question of law.

14. TERMINATION

- (a) For Cause. This Agreement may be terminated for cause at any time, in whole or in part, by the AID Grant Officer upon written notice to the Recipient, whenever it is determined that the Recipient has failed to comply with the conditions of the grant.
- (b) For Convenience. This Agreement may be terminated for convenience at any time by either party, in whole or in part, if both parties agree that the continuation of this Agreement would not produce beneficial results commensurate with the further expenditures of funds. Both parties shall agree upon termination conditions, including the effective date and, in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated. The agreement to terminate shall be set forth in a letter from the AID Grant Officer to the Recipient.
- (c) Termination Procedures. Upon receipt of and in accordance with a termination notice as specified in either paragraph (a) or (b) above, the Recipient shall forthwith take immediate action to minimize all expenditures and obligations financed by this Agreement, and shall cancel such unliquidated obligations whenever possible. Except as provided below, no further reimbursement shall be made after the effective date of termination, and the Recipient shall, within 30 calendar days after the effective date of such termination, repay to the Government all unexpended portions of funds theretofore paid by the Government to the Recipient

which are not otherwise obligated by a legally binding transaction applicable to this Agreement. Should the funds paid by the Government to the Recipient prior to the effective date of the termination of this Agreement, be insufficient to cover the Recipient's obligations pursuant to the aforementioned legally binding transactions, the Recipient may submit to the Government within 90 calendar days after the effective date of such termination, a written claim covering such obligations, and subject to the limitations contained in this Agreement, the AID Grant Officer shall determine the amount or amounts to be paid by the Government to the Recipient under such claim in accordance with the applicable Federal cost principles.

15. SUBORDINATE AGREEMENTS

The placement of subordinate agreements (e.g., leases, options, agreements, or contracts) with other organizations, firms or institutions and the provisions of such subordinate agreements are subject to prior written consent of the AID Grant Officer if they will be funded by AID hereunder, unless the Recipient's procurement system has been reviewed and approved pursuant to the appropriate section(s) of Paragraph IU of Chapter 1, Handbook 13. In no event shall any such subordinate agreement be on a cost-plus-a-percentage-of-cost basis. Subordinate contractors (including suppliers) shall be selected on a competitive basis to the maximum practicable extent consistent with the obligations and requirements of this Agreement.

16. PUBLICATIONS

(This provision is applicable to any agreement which produces any book, publication, or other copyrightable material.)

(a) If it is the Recipient's intention to identify AID's contribution to any publication resulting from this Agreement, the Recipient shall consult AID on the nature of the acknowledgement prior to publication.

(b) The Recipient shall provide the AID Project Manager with one copy of all published works developed under this Agreement. The Recipient shall provide the AID Project Manager with lists of other written work produced under this Agreement.

(c) In the event these Agreement funds are used to underwrite the cost of publishing, in lieu of the publisher assuming this cost as is the normal practice, any profits or royalties up to the amount of such cost shall be credited to this Agreement.

(d) The Recipient is permitted to secure copyright to any publication produced or composed under this Agreement in accordance with paragraph 178.b. of Chapter 1, Handbook 13; Provided, that the Recipient agrees to and does hereby grant to the Government a royalty-free, non-exclusive and irrevocable license throughout the world to use, duplicate, disclose, or dispose of such publications in any manner and for any purpose and to authorize others to use the work for Government purposes.

17. PATENTS

(This provision is applicable to any Agreement which produces patentable items, patent rights, processes or inventions.)

- (a) The Recipient agrees to notify the AID Grant Officer in writing of any invention or discovery conceived or first actually reduced to practice in the course of or under this Agreement. The AID Grant Officer will determine the patent rights to be afforded the Recipient in accordance with the Presidential Memorandum and Statement of Government Patent Policy (36 FR 16889) and paragraph 178.a. of Chapter 1, Handbook 13.
- (b) Nothing contained in this provision shall imply a license to the Government under any patent or be construed as affecting the scope of any license or other right otherwise granted to the Government under any patent.

18. INELIGIBLE COUNTRIES

Unless otherwise approved by the AID Grant Officer, no AID funds will be expended for costs incurred in countries ineligible for assistance under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, or under acts appropriating funds for foreign assistance.

19. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY IN EMPLOYMENT

(This provision is applicable to all Recipients, subrecipients and contractors under this Agreement who either perform work in the United States or who recruit personnel in the United States to do work abroad.)

(a) With respect to the employment of persons in the U.S. under this Agreement, the Recipient agrees to take all reasonable steps to ensure equality of opportunity in its employment practices without regard to race, color or

national origin of such persons and, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, when work funded by this Agreement is performed in the U.S., no person shall, on the grounds of race, color or national origin, be excluded from participation, be denied benefits, or be subjected to discriminaton. In addition, the Recipient agrees to comply, in accordance with its written assurance of compliance, with the provisions of Part 209 of Chapter II, Title 22 of the Code of Federal Regulations, entitled Non-discrimination in Federally Assisted Programs of the Agency for International Development - Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

(b) In addition, the Recipient agrees to take all reasonable steps to ensure equality of opportunity in its employment practices without regard to sex, religion, age, and handicap, in accordance with P.L. 92-261, P.L. 93-259, P.L. 93-112 and P.L. 93-508. When work funded by AID under this Agreement is performed in either the U.S. or overseas, no person shall on the grounds of sex, religion, age, or handicap, be excluded from participation, be denied benefits, or be subjected to discrimination.

20. U.S. OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT

No member of or delegate to the U.S. Congress or resident U.S. commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or to any benefit that may arise therefrom; but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this Agreement, if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

21. COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES

The Recipient warrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this Agreement upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee except bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by the Recipient for the purpose of securing business. For breach or violation of this warranty, AID shall have the right to cancel this Agreement without liability, or in its discretion, to deduct from the Agreement an amount, or otherwise recover, the full amount of each commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee.

22. NONLIABLILITY

AID assumes no liability with respect to any third party for any claims for damages arising out of the program supported by this Agreement.

23. TITLE TO, USE, AND CARE OF PROPERTY

- (a) The term "property" as used in this provision shall mean Recipient purchased property the cost of which is reimbursed by AID under this Agreement. The term "non-expendable property" means property which is complete in itself; does not lose its identity or become a component part of another article when put into use; is durable, with an expected service life of two years or more.
- (b) The Schedule of this Agreement shall specify (or the AID Grant Officer may direct) that title to specific property shall be vested in the Recipient, or in the Cooperating Country. When title is to be vested in the Recipient, paragraph (c) of this provision is applicable. When title is to be vested in the Cooperating Country, paragraph (d) of this provision is applicable. If specific direction regarding placement of title is not provided either in the Schedule of this Agreement, or by the AID Grant Officer, then title shall be vested in the Recipient, and paragraph (c) of this provision is applicable.

(c) Recipient Titled Property.

(1) The Recipient shall not charge for any depreciation, amortization, or use of property, title to which remains in the Recipient under this Agreement, or any other U.S. Government agreement, subagreement, contract, or subcontract.

(2) The Recipient agrees to use and maintain the property for the purpose of this Agreement in accordance with the requirements of paragraph 1T of Chapter 1. Handbook 13.

- (3) With respect to nonexpendable property having an acquisition cost of \$1,000 or more, title to which vests in the Recipient, the Recipient agrees:
- (i) To report such items to the AID Grant Officer from time to time as they are acquired and to maintain a control system which will permit their ready identification and location.
- (ii) To transfer title to any such items in accordance with any written request therefor issued by the AID Grant Officer at any time prior to final payment under this Agreement.

(d) Cooperating Country Titled Property.

(1) Property titled to the Cooperating Country shall be under the custody and control of the Recipient until the owner of title directs otherwise, or completion of work under this Agreement, or its termination, at which time custody and

control shall be turned over to the owner of title, or disposed of in accordance with its instructions. All performance guarantees and warranties obtained from suppliers shall be taken in the name of the title owner.

- (2) The Recipient shall prepare and establish a program to be approved by the Mission, for the receipt, use, maintenance, protection, custody, and care of the Cooperating Country titled property for which it has custodial responsibility, including the establishment of reasonable controls to enforce such program. The Recipient shall be guided by the requirements of paragraph 1T of Chapter 1, Handbook 13.
- (3) Within 90 days after completion of this Agreement, or at such other date as may be fixed by the AID Grant Officer, the Recipient shall submit an inventory schedule covering all items of property under its custody, title to which is in the Cooperating Country or public or private agency designated by the Cooperating Country, which have not been consumed in the performance of this Agreement. The Recipient shall also indicate what disposition has been made of such property.

24. AUDIT AND RECORDS - NON-U.S. SUBRECIPIENTS

- (1) The Recipient shall require non U.S. subrecipients (see paragraph L3, Chapter 1 of Handbook 13) to maintain books, records, documents and other evidence and accounting procedures and practices sufficient to reflect properly that funds provided by the Recipient were expended exclusively for the purposes of the subordinate agreement. Such records shall be maintained for three years following the expiration of the subordinate agreement.
- (2) The Recipient shall ensure that, after each twelve months of a subordinate agreement with a institution, an audit is conducted on the subrecipient's records by an independent public accountant with a national certification similar or equivalent to a certified public accountant. If the Recipient determines that an audit is not possible or feasible it shall submit to the AID Grant Officer the reasons why such an audit is not possible or feasible, and present for the approval of the AID Grant Officer, alternatives which will achieve the objectives, set forth in this provision. The Recipient shall include in each subordinate agreement hereunder, a provision by which the Recipient asserts the right to audit if the independent audit does not take place or is unacceptable. The subordinate agreement shall also require that the subrecipient shall make available any further information as requested by Recipient with respect to questions concerning the audit. The report of independent audit shall be submitted to the

Recipient and retained by it in accordance with the standard

provision entitled ACCOUNTING, AUDIT AND RECORDS.

(3) The purpose of the independent audit shall be to determine the propriety and necessity of the subrecipient's expenditures in terms of the purposes for which the funds were made available, and the adequacy of the subrecipient's financial management. Notwithstanding the requirement for an independent audit. the AID Auditor General Comptroller General of the United States or their duly authorized representatives (see paragraph 16, Chapter 1 of Handbook 13) reserve the right to conduct an audit of the subrecipient's books and records to determine whether the subrecipient has expended AID's funds in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The terms of this Provision are applicable only to subordinate agreements with non-U.S. institutions.

25. REGULATIONS GOVERNING EMPLOYEES OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES

(This provision is applicable only to the Recipient's U.S. or third country national employees; it is not applicable to the Recipient's cooperating country national employees.)

(a) The Recipient's employees, when employed in work overseas, shall maintain private status and may not rely on local U.S. Government Offices or facilities for support while so engaged.

(b) The sale of personal property or automobiles by Recipient employees and their dependents in the foreign country to which they are assigned shall be subject to the same limitations and prohibitions which apply to direct-hire AID personnel employed by the Mission, except as this may

conflict with host government regulations.

(c) Other than work to be performed under this Agreement for which an employee or consultant is assigned by the Recipient, no regular or short term employee or consultant of the Recipient shall engage directly or indirectly, either in his own name or in the name or through an agency of another person, in any business, profession, or occupation in the foreign countries to which he is assigned, nor shall he make loans or investments to or in any business, profession or occupation in the foreign countries to which he is assigned.

(d) The Recipient's employees, while in a foreign country, are expected to show respect for its conventions, customs, and institutions, to abide by its applicable laws and regulations, and not to interfere in its internal

political affairs.

(e) In the event the conduct of any Recipient employee is not in accordance with the preceding paragraphs, the Recipient's chief of party shall consult with the Mission Director and the employee involved and shall recommend to the Recipient a course of action with regard to such employee.

(f) The parties recognize the right of the U.S. Ambassador to direct the removal from a country of any U.S. citizen or the discharge from this Agreement of any third country national when, in the discretion of the Ambassador,

the interests of the United States so require.

26. NOTICES

Any notice given by any of the parties hereunder, shall be sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person or sent by telegraph, cable, registered or regular mail as follows:

TO THE: AID Grant Officer;

TO THE: Recipient at Recipient's address shown in this Agreement;

or to such other address as either of such parties shall designate by notice given as herein required. Notices hereunder shall be effective when delivered in accordance with this provision or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.
