PROJECT AUTHORIZATION AMENDMENT



1. Pursuant to Section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, I hereby authorize an increase not to exceed \$37,000,000 in the funding level for the centrally funded project Family Planning IEC Field Support to a new life-of-project total of \$46,995,000 in grant funds for the period FY 1986 to FY 1990. Obligations will be in annual increments subject to availability of funds in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process.
2. The increased funds will be used to continue support for the Johns Hopkins University Population Communication Services program of family planning information, education and communication (IEC) field support worldwide; and to fund other organizations for intensive work in specialized areas of IEC.
3. The cooperative agreements and contracts which may be negotiated and executed by the officer to whom such authority is delegated in accordance with A.I.D. regulations and Delegations of Authority shall be subject to the following terms and conditions together with such other terms and conditions as A.I.D. may deem appropriate.
4. Source and Origin of Commodities, Nationality of Services
 - a. Commodities financed by A.I.D. under the project shall have their source and origin in the cooperating country* or the United States, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing. Except for ocean shipping, the suppliers of commodities or services shall have the cooperating country or the United States as their place of nationality, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing.
 - b. The aggregate cost of all goods and services procured under each subagreement in a cooperating country may not exceed \$750,000.

*Each country where research, training, technical, or other assistance takes place under the project shall be deemed to be a cooperating country for the purpose of permitting local cost financing of goods and services for the activity being conducted in such country. Such activities may be undertaken in any country included in A.I.D. geographic code 935.

c. Ocean shipping financed by A.I.D. under the project shall, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing, be financed only on flag vessels of the United States.

SUBJECT: Family Planning Information, Education and
Communication (IEC) Field Support, 936-3004 (DOC NO. 0003)

Action: Your approval is required to increase the authorized life-of-project funding for subject project from \$9,995,000 to \$46,995,000 to continue assistance to the Johns Hopkins University Population Communication Services (PCS) program and to fund other organizations engaged in work in specialized areas of IEC which are not covered under the PCS program.

Discussion: In the nearly four years that the subject project has been in force it has clearly been demonstrated that LDCs have a great need for technical assistance in the information, education and communication (IEC) field. The PCS program has developed exceptional capability in this area, and has become the principal source of IEC assistance for LDC family planning programs. During this period, however, it has become clear that the needs of the developing countries for IEC assistance are much greater than initially anticipated, and that these needs are likely to continue to increase in range and urgency. As a result, both accomplishments and expenditures in the project have considerably exceeded the original plan. Funds authorized under the original project paper are nearly exhausted.

This authorization provides for additional funds to continue to meet the critical and growing IEC assistance needs. The major portion of the amendment is the continuation of support for the PCS program over the next five years. The amendment also allows for support for other IEC activities, if funds are available. Such activities would be implemented through separate mechanisms (contracts, grants or cooperative agreements) with other U.S. or LDC institutions. They would provide intensive assistance in specialized areas where a particular focus is needed, and would complement the comprehensive assistance being provided through PCS.

In late 1985, A.I.D. organized an external evaluation of the PCS program. The evaluation team found that PCS has succeeded in improving both the quantity and quality of family planning communication materials. The team also found evidence, during their field visits, that PCS activities are positively influencing family planning knowledge and use. They suggested that PCS give additional attention to assessing program activities and to incorporating and disseminating the lessons learned.

Justification to Congress: An Advice of Program Change is in process.

Clearances Obtained: The amended Project Paper has been approved at all relevant levels of the Agency. The Population Sector Council reviewed the PP on March 25, 1986 and unanimously recommended approval. Minutes of that

review are attached. One of the topics of discussion was the relevance for Agency policy priorities of the project's emphasis on improved access and information.

Certification of the Procurement Plan: The certification required in accordance with your memorandum dated November 15, 1985, subject: Increasing the Use of Minority Organizations and HBCUs, is included as Page 27 of the amended Project Paper. The major portion of the project (\$30,000,000) will continue support for the PCS program. Johns Hopkins University does not fall within the criteria for universities under the Gray Amendment. However, the remaining \$7 million is authorized for other organizations to be determined through the competitive and non-competitive process. Full consideration will be given to optimum involvement of "Gray-type" organizations in the selection of these contractors/grantees.

Recommendation: That you sign the attached Project Authorization amendment.
