COOPERATING AGENCIES - 1988 WORKPLANS

JHPIEGO

1. Continue Reproductive Risk Project with BEMFAM.
2. Continue Preservice Training of Physicians and coordinate with Pathfinder.
3. Develop videos for Inservice Training of Physicians in routine family planning including IUD insertion with CPAIMC.
4. International Vasectomy Training with PROPATER.
5. Limited minilap training with BEMFAM.

SOMARC

1. Finalize and implement project with O Segundo Brasil to work with local contraceptive manufacturers to improve the quality of pill use, increase sales and encourage expanded method mix through commercial channels.

WHR

1. Support BEMFAM in services and training in priority areas.
2. Include cost-recovery aspects in all projects.
3. Assist BEMFAM to evaluate their CBD program.

POPULATION COUNCIL

1. Continue family planning research program.

ENTERPRISE

The following possibilities will be pursued:

1. CPAIMC/APRISA Project
 - Marketing Feasibility Study for selling FP to businesses
 - Investment in APRISA Program
2. Ultrasound investment or income generation with CPAIMC.
3. Technical assistance (TA) in new business venture development with PVOs (CEPECS, Profamilia, CNBL, CMI and Sofia Feldman)
4. Fund selected income generation projects with PVOs.
5. Lab equipment purchase for income generation with PROPATER.
6. TA to CPAIMC to look at marketability of education materials.
7. Explore possibility of ABEPF local bulk purchases of contraceptives for sale throughout their network.
8. Explore possibility of co-financing in marketing of diaphragms

FPIA

1. Phase out as planned.
2. Extend current projects as long as possible under current agreement with sustainability plans attached to each extension.
3. Develop contingency plans for supporting the continuation phase out of each project.

AVSC

1. Continue support of PROPATER USC services. Identify new vasectomy projects, especially in the northeast.
2. Phase out of institutional reimbursement part of ABEPF project.

3. Continue training support to CPAIMC, BEMFAM and other ABEPF members.
4. Phase down level of female VSC service projects.
5. Fund Berta Lutz project with cost containment component.

DA

1. Continue work with CPAIMC and CAEMI in preservice training for nursing professors.

WESTINGHOUSE

1. Work with Impact and O Segundo Brasil to disseminate results of survey through state level seminars.
2. Through Population Council, complete secondary analysis of survey and disseminate results.

CDC

1. Technical assistance on further analysis of DHS to include a report on the northeast and analysis of young adult data.
2. Technical assistance to Pathfinder Young Adult Survey in Salvador and CMI in Sao Paulo.
3. In collaboration with FPMT, logistical assistance to PVOs.
4. Continue support to ABEPF training unit. Develop training materials for trainers of Young Adult Training programs and support training trainers.
5. Provide financial consultant to USAID/Brasilia to develop guidelines for budgeting for CA projects in Brasil.

PATHFINDER

1. Preservice training of health personnel in family planning including social workers, pharmacists, physicians and nurses.
2. In-service training and services in target areas.
3. Young Adult Programs to include:
 - conferences and meetings on Young Adult Programs
 - preparation of information and training materials
 - education of adult trainers
 - Young Adult data collection or studies surveys
4. CBD training program evaluation with BEMFAM.
5. Promotion of FP through prepaid health schemes.

TIPPS

1. In collaboration with Pathfinder, establish and implement integrated MCH/FP service delivery model for health maintenance organizations.

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
