I. INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY

The contract was signed on March 23, 1964. Our activities since then have been directed toward: A. Securing and equipping an office for the campus Research Assistants and the Secretary. B. Selecting Contract Staff. C. Drafting a detailed work program to implement the Project. D. Estimating the budget for Year I (March 23, 1964 to March 23, 1965).

Details of items B-D and a summary report follow.

II. CONTRACT STAFF

Selection of the "Central Staff" is virtually complete. Research activities will begin at approximately one-half strength in July, 1964, expanding to nearly full strength in September, 1964.


