

PREFACE

This document is a provisional version of the core questionnaire for the national migration surveys to be taken in the ESCAP region. The migration surveys were set up in response to the recommendations made in several population conferences held over the last ten years.¹

The migration surveys are components of a regional project "Comparative study on migration, urbanization and development in the ESCAP region". The first phase of this project consists of analysis of census materials on migration and urbanization in the participating countries. Although special tabulations from the 1970 round of censuses have been generated to focus specifically on migration and urbanization, these have limitations in providing information on the relationships between migration, urbanization and development. The main aim of the national migration surveys is to provide the kinds of detailed information that cannot be collected in national population censuses.

The data to be collected in the migration surveys will focus on the following four major issues:

- (a) Patterns and types of population mobility;
- (b) Demographic and socio-economic characteristics of migrants and non-migrants;
- (c) Motivations of people to move or not to move;
- (d) Demographic and socio-economic consequences of migration in areas of both origin and destination.

Preliminary versions of the questionnaire were circulated in 1978 to a large number of experts throughout the ESCAP region and in other parts of the world. Their comments were taken into consideration in the production of a questionnaire which was tested in Indonesia, Pakistan and Thailand in 1979. The results of these tests were discussed at the first session of the Advisory Committee on Migration and Urbanization, held at Bangkok from 29 October to 1 November 1979. The discussions and recommendations of this Committee are published in *Asian Population Studies Series*, No. 47, issued by ESCAP in 1980. The Advisory Committee recommended that a small working group should be set up to revise the questionnaire, taking into consideration the results of the pre-tests and the discussions of the Committee. A revised version of the questionnaire was circulated among the Committee members for their comments and then tested in a pilot survey conducted in Thailand in May 1980. The results of the pilot survey were used to modify this document as well as the manuals required for the national migration surveys. The manuals include:

- (a) Survey organization and monitoring;
- (b) Manual for interviewers;
- (c) Manual for supervisors;
- (d) Manual for interviewer trainers;
- (e) Sample design manual;

(f) Manual for office editors and coders;

(g) Tabulation plan,

(h) Data processing system manual.

The questionnaire presented here has been developed as a "core" and it is hoped that participating countries will follow it as closely as possible, allowing for minor modifications which may be required to meet local circumstances. ESCAP will welcome the opportunity to discuss any modifications which a participating country feels will be necessary. While priority is given to individual country requirements, it is recommended that the information collected should be as uniform as possible to allow standardization of materials and procedures. The results should allow a comparison between countries which will maximize the understanding of a common problem affecting the majority of the countries in the ESCAP region.

Apart from any minor modifications, specific modules can be designed to meet any particular aspect that a country might want to analyse in greater detail. These modules can be added to the core questionnaire. Technical assistance can be made available to help in the design and testing of these modules.

It is hoped that the results of the analyses of the data collected through the national migration surveys will be incorporated into the development of population redistribution policies in the participant countries.

Notes on the household schedule

The purpose of the household schedule is twofold: to record the composition of the population of the household and to form the household universe from which the eligible respondent is selected for the detailed interviewing of the individual questionnaire.

The composition of the population of the household is recorded in three ways. First, usual residents, as defined by the household, are recorded and whether they are present or absent at the time of the survey. Secondly, all visitors and non-usual residents who are in the household at the time of the survey are recorded. The "time of the survey" is taken as the night before the interview takes place, that is, a "floating survey night". Thirdly, all usual residents who have left or moved out of the household within a specified time period before the survey (5 years, or since the household was formed in its present location if that is less than 5 years) are recorded.

This three-way approach will allow an analysis of immigration and outmigration. It combines *de jure* and *de facto* approaches. Combining the results from the three tables will provide a measure of both long- and short-term movements to and from the household, which is one of the principal objectives of the national migration survey.

Basic demographic and socio-economic characteristics of individuals are collected in the first three tables of the household schedule. Where possible, the survey results can be compared with the 1980 round of national census results for the *de jure* or *de facto* resident populations, however defined by the census. Demographic and socio-economic information on outmigrants is collected at the time of their move from the household.

In addition to the basic demographic and socio-economic information, the links between the places of origin and destination are examined through the flows of money and goods in migrant networks. This provides information on migrants' remittances.

Finally, several contextual questions are asked to find out the relative wealth of the household through ownership of land and businesses. The distribution of these properties can be used as an indication of the degree of involvement, or migrant commitment, to the area of residence and the area of origin. The household schedule concludes with questions on basic housing conditions to provide an indication of the standard of living of the household.

One individual between the age of 15 and 64 will be selected at random from the household for detailed interviewing through the individual questionnaire.

Notes on the individual questionnaire

Migration history and experience

This is the most important section of the questionnaire and it is directed at both migrants and non-migrants. For migrants, the objective is to record information on all the movements that a person has made since the age of 15 that have involved a stay at a destination for 12 months or more for any reason, and any other moves involving shorter stays that were specifically for work, to look for work or to study.

For those who moved more than once, detailed information is collected on the first move and the most recent move: the former because it is in many ways the most important migration in one's life and the latter because it more closely reflects the current state of mobility in a country. Clearly, if a person has moved only once, the first migration is also the most recent and allowance is made for this in the questionnaire.

The sequence of movements that a person has made is collected in the life history. In this special table, mobility is related to other important events in a person's life such as changing of activity status, occupation or economic sector, marriage, birth and other demographic events in the family history. Migration, occupation and family history are recorded year by year and any change in any one of them is noted. This information will allow a detailed analysis of the relationships between migration, economic activity and fertility.

Recording the information in this tabular way, relating one event to another, facilitates the flow of the interview and helps the respondent to recall events in his life. Non-migrants will be asked their sequence of occupation and family history only. The information generated from the life cycle history will allow an analysis of patterns of mobility through time that can be related to the stages of development of a country.

Information on why a migrant chose his most recent destination is collected, together with information on problems the person may have experienced on moving and how he or she perceives the situation at the new destination. An attempt is made to discover the process by which a migrant took the decision to move.

Mobility and activities during the 12 months preceding the survey

Particular emphasis is placed on short-term mobility behaviour during the 12 months preceding the survey. This period covers the moves most clearly recalled by the respondents. The starting point is taken as the activity the person is currently engaged in: where it is located and where the person actually lives when he or she is engaged in that activity.

Any change in activity, in location of activity or location of residence is recorded in this section. Short-term moves, including commuting, will be picked up here. Information on labour input (time) for and earnings from the activities will be collected.

This section, and the questionnaire itself, ends with additional questions on commuting – a form of mobility that seems to be becoming increasingly important in developing countries.

Future mobility

This section deals with current intentions so that information may be obtained on the potential for future migration of particular sectors of the population. Information is also collected on reasons for not wanting to move so that an analysis of the determinants and characteristics of both migrants and non-migrants can be made.




