

## INTRODUCTION

An increasing U.S. interest in Southern Africa over the past few years has been paralleled by a rapid expansion of organizations concerned with the political, social and economic development of the region. This guide has been prepared in an effort to identify those non-governmental organizations in the United States with expertise and capabilities relevant to developmental issues in Southern Africa. It is necessarily a partial and selective identification, which is intended to be used for information and reference purposes. Information is based on the African Bibliographic Center's continuing resource files, and its 1975 publication, AF-LOG: African Interests of American Organizations.

The organizations included have been categorized according to their scope and primary focus, and where available, each listing includes a brief description of organizational activities and official publications. In those instances in which an organization could reasonably be categorized under more than one section (such as a consulting firm involved in health care), cross-indexing of entry numbers has been included at the end of appropriate sections.

Effort has been made not to duplicate other existing informational sources. For example, identification and descriptions of current university research and assistance programs and African studies programs concerned with Southern Africa are included in the bi-monthly African Studies Newsletter published by the African Studies Association, Epstein Service Building, Brandeis University, Waltham, Massachusetts 02154. A listing of American firms, subsidiaries and affiliates operating in the Republic of South Africa is available from The Africa Fund, 305 East 46th Street, New York, N.Y. 10017. Further information on U.S. business interests may be noted in two January 1978 reports to the United States Senate, Committee on Foreign Relations, by the Subcommittee on African Affairs: U.S. Corporate Interests in Africa and U.S. Corporate Interests in South Africa.

This guide may be up-dated as additional organizations with relevance for the Southern Africa region are identified. We would appreciate your cooperation in notifying us of organizations which might be included, or of changes in information contained in this listing.
