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IV - INDIVIDUAL IQC SERVICE SUMMARIES/COMPANY DESCRIPTIONS

DESIGN AND ANALYSIS/EVALUATION SERVICE

Contracts under this service provide AID and/or cooperating agencies with short-term expertise relating to the formulation, analysis and evaluation of development policies and policy issues, program strategies, programs and projects. These may include, (1) policy analyses and evaluative research; (2) socio-economic impact assessments and program evaluations; (3) feasibility, design and evaluation studies; (4) development of design and evaluation systems and methodologies; and (5) training services. The focus of the services will be on broad development issues and on analytical, design and evaluation problems which are not specific to any one functional sector; on skills and methodologies which are not specific to functional sectors, and on formulation of development policies and strategies. This includes:

1. Analyses of policy issues and evaluative research on development policies, strategies and resource allocation criteria at world, program, country, multisectoral, sectoral and cross-project levels.

2. Studies and analyses for assessing, designing or evaluating AID strategies and activities at the program, sector and project levels - including cross-cutting and comparative studies. Studies and analyses will cover such areas as socio-economic structure and change; identification of beneficiaries and analysis of needs; economic and commercial policies, practices and outcomes; financial condition, practices and motivation of households and institutions; cost-benefit analyses; institutional needs and measurement of maturity; management and administrative practice as applied to both the host country and AID roles.

3. Data collection and analysis in support of above studies and analyses; field studies, sample surveys, identification and use of existing records and data sources, pattern and other secondary analyses of classes of programs and projects.

4. Design of assistance to LDC institutions in installing appropriate management information and data collection procedures/systems for planning, management or evaluation of their activities.

5. Development of new programming, design and evaluation concepts, methodologies, and indicators with particular emphasis on the Agency's "New Directions" policies.

6. Formulation of training programs, training of trainers, preparation of materials and the conduct of training courses in support of the activities described above.

The following categories of specialists represent the skills generally available under these IQCs from each contractor: political scientist (institutional development), economist, sociologist, anthropologist, agronomist, engineer (various types), research methodologist, survey researcher, statistician (sampling) and rural sociologist.

HOUSING GUARANTY PROGRAM SERVICE

Five major areas of housing service are economics, policy/planning and programming, market analysis, finance and social/physical support components. Contractors perform analysis and research, conduct specialized studies, evaluate current housing programs, provide technical and management assistance to LDCs and other related services in one or more of the five major areas.

Housing economics may include impact of housing costs and foreign borrowing on a host country economy, cost benefit ratios, alternate land uses, investments infrastructure, impact on employment of housing assistance and relation of specific housing industries to the total economy.

Shelter policy, planning and programming includes the status of shelter in the overall economic situation of an LDC, definition of basic shelter goals and the role of shelter suppliers, shelter users, delivery systems, program mix, national guidelines and evaluation procedures.

Housing market analysis consists of existing housing stock, income levels by housing type, rental and ownership data, occupancy rates, population housing preferences, ownership desire and income available, requirements projections and future demand by price category.

Housing finance activities may include capital generation, savings and loan operations, secondary market operations, mortgage insurance, housing finance regulatory agencies, readjustment mechanisms, housing finance legislation, deposit insurance, new housing finance concepts (such as variable payment mortgages) and the relation of housing finance to the internal capital markets of an LDC.

Social and physical components in support of shelter sector assistance may consist of methodology development to assist in design and implementation of the social and physical infrastructure to accompany shelter programs for lower income neighborhoods. It may also include development of background papers on how the housing guaranty scope of activity might be expanded to include financing of such facilities as clinics, schools, training centers, day care centers and the potential employment effects in terms of skill training, small business loans, technical assistance for small enterprises that employ residents and the planning and management aspect of the physical infrastructure.
