UPPER VOLTA - Drought

Data

Date: Late 1977 through 1978 (FY 78)
Location: Most of Upper Volta
No. Affected: 442,000
Damage: Shortages of food grains, seed, and animal feed resulted in nutritional deprivation and livestock losses

The Disaster

Rains during the 1977 planting and growing seasons began late, were below average, and were poorly distributed. As a result poor harvests, especially in the central part of Upper Volta, were approximately 16% below normal. The deficit of food grains was estimated to be about 65,000 MT (including 30,000 MT for security stocks).

Action Taken by the Government of Upper Volta (GOUV)

The Government of Upper Volta made significant internal reorganization changes in an effort to improve its ability to manage programs for marketing, storing, and distributing food grains as well as for its emergency grain program.

Assistance Provided by the United States Government (USG)

The USG contributed 6,105 MT of soy fortified sorghum grits (SFSG), 7,150 MT of soy fortified cornmeal (SFCM), 4,118 MT nonfat dry milk, and 688 MT vegetable oil from P.L. 480 Title II stocks (including transportation) valued at.....\$8,232,000

The Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance (OFDA) made a grant to Catholic Relief Services (CRS) for internal transportation costs for the approximately 12,000 MT of the Title II foods mentioned above that were distributed by CRS.....\$153,769

Assistance Provided by U.S. Voluntary Agencies

In response to the drought, CRS and the Southern Baptists substantially augmented their ongoing programs. CRS distributed approximately 12,000 MT and the Southern Baptists approximately
