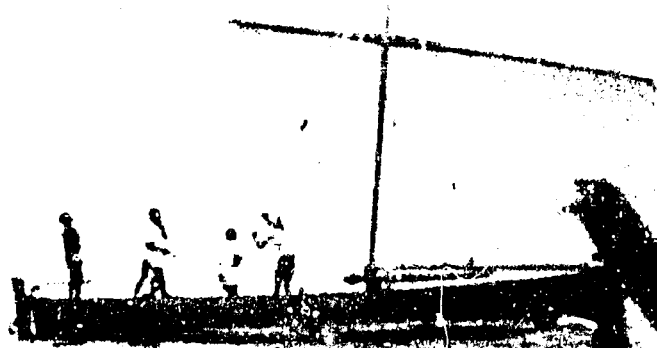

PREFACE

Fisheries development in Africa is varied and complex. Some nations have achieved high levels of modernization in recent years, especially in west and southern Africa. In most places, however, artisanal fisheries is still highly underdeveloped, and has only been given serious attention in the last twenty years or so following independence from colonial rule. This bibliography is an attempt to reveal the state of the literature in fisheries research for East Africa. The references go back as far as Antoine d'Abadie writing on the hydrology of the Red Sea in 1837, concluding primarily in 1980, although a few entries can be found up to 1984.

The bibliography contains almost 600 citations on diverse aspects of the various types of fisheries to be found in the region. In this work, East Africa is defined rather broadly to include the several nations which bound the Great Lakes, such as Zaire, Malawi, Zambia, and Sudan, as well as Somalia, Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Burundi, Ruanda, and the various island nations in the Indian Ocean, like Maritius and Seychelles. The contents are divided into two main subject headings-- General and National. Under these two general headings, users will find such topics as inland lakes and waters, marine and freshwater fisheries, aquaculture, gear and technology, swamps and floodplains, preservation and marketing, and language. The entries in each topical section are arranged alphabetically by author or publisher as appropriate. The bibliography contains two indexes, a subject index and an author's index to assist the user in accessing the citations, and to complement the generalized headings found in the Table of Contents.

For all practical purposes, the references are comprehensive, if not exhaustive in some cases. They were compiled from a variety of sources, including national bibliographies, fisheries references and bibliographies, journals and other periodicals, scholarly papers, and social science texts which focused on the history and culture of East Africa. The majority of these references are noted both in the body of the bibliography and in the References section located at the end of the work. The user is reminded that this is a working document that will be continually updated, and the authors would appreciate receiving information concerning citations and organization in order to improve the quality and value of this bibliography. Comments may be forwarded in care of the Editor by writing to the International Center for Marine Resource Development. The materials cited in this bibliography are not, however, derived from the accessions lists and holdings of the ICMRD library. Readers should not, therefore, write to the ICMRD Librarian for these materials, but write directly to the source cited as authority for publishing the citations.

The authors would like to acknowledge the support of the African and Afro-American Studies Program at the University of Rhode Island for providing staff support, and the invaluable assistance of the library of the International Center for Marine Resource Development and its staff, particularly Ms. Mary Jane Beardsley, the Librarian. ABOUT THE AUTHORS

MELVIN K. HENDRIX is currently director of the African and Afro-American Studies Program and a member of the graduate faculty in International Development Studies at the University of Rhode Island. A Center Associate with the International Center for Marine Resource Development, he has represented the Center as coordinator with West African institutions and as an advisor to the Guinea-Bissau marine technology and fisheries training program funded by USAID. In 1982, he was a visiting scholar of African maritime history at the Institute of Marine Biology and Oceanography, University of Sierra Leone at Fourah Bay College. A graduate of Stanford University in African history, his articles and book reviews have appeared in various academic publications, and his book, An International Bibliography of African Lexicons (1982), is the first comprehensive reference on this body of material. His current research interests include West African maritime history and culture, with a specific orientation towards technological development.

THEOPHILUS R. BRAINERD is a Ph.D. candidate in marine resource economics at the University of Rhode Island. In 1982 he obtained an M.S. degree in animal pathology from the Department of Aquaculture Science, University of Rhode Island, writing a thesis on "The Effect of Dietary Hormone Supplements on Selected Blood Parameters in Brook Trout (*Salvelinus fontinalis*)."

A citizen of Uganda, he has a B.Sc. degree from Makerere University, he worked as a Fisheries Officer with the Uganda Fisheries Department at Entebbe performing research, teaching, and administration in fisheries and aquaculture development. At URI, he has been involved extensively in the international training programs designed for students from less developed countries as an Assistant Coordinator of student and trainee programs and research with the International Center for Marine Resource Development.
