

I. INTRODUCTION

The Federal International Development Offices (FIDO) Directory is a listing of U.S. Government units involved in foreign development or technical assistance activities. As the publisher of the Directory the Agency for International Development (AID) has excluded its own units and activities from this guide. The intention here is to highlight the work and scope of lesser-known Federal offices. The offices included here reflect the wide variety of special skills, experience, and documentation existing within the U.S. Government, frequently representing international leadership in those particular professional areas. The Directory was compiled not only to facilitate the exchange of information and expertise within the Federal Government's international development community but to underscore for those outside the Government the resources currently available within it.

It is appropriate that AID, as the focal point for U.S. international assistance, initiate, compile, and distribute this first attempt at such a service. The assistance units in various Federal agencies are valuable supplementary resources to the responsibilities of the Agency for International Development and these offices frequently act as extensions of AID activities. A directory of Federal expertise is therefore a useful tool. While the individual offices vary greatly in size, their combined resources are impressive and important. The listing of U.S. agencies involved in international development endeavors, even down to the smaller operational units, helps maximize use of existing resources and avoid duplication of efforts within the U.S. Government development community.

In some instances, the individual U.S. agencies cooperate directly with foreign govern-

ments or international agencies as part of their domestic mission. In other cases, foreign activities of U.S. Government units can be performed only at the request of AID or the Department of State. There is an increasing number of instances where agencies are providing assistance on a reimbursable basis; that is costs are paid by recipients.

It may be useful to define what is meant by a "development activity" for the purposes of this Directory. The terms "development" and "less-developed country" refer to the degree of modernization of institutions within a nation, to the general living standards of the population, and to the processes by which these institutions and standards are upgraded. Within each office listed in the Directory, therefore, a substantial portion of current activity is related to improvement of public and private institutional efficiency, stimulation of the local economy, or improvement of the general welfare of the population in less-developed countries. Activities may consist of advisory services, training, commodity assistance, research, or information-sharing; the first two predominate.

To avoid becoming either retrospective or promissory, this Directory is restricted to those offices that were engaged in Fiscal Year 1975 in development activities substantial enough to be defined and recognized as such by the administrative units responsible. Individual entries in the Directory are predominantly "program" offices as opposed to "policy" offices. However, a few major Government units which affect international trade and monetary policy are listed because of their direct attention to, and effect upon, the economies of other countries.

The Directory is organized into two major groupings—executive departments and autonomous Federal agencies. Units are listed alpha-

betically within these two groupings. The vast majority of the units are in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area. There is virtually no development activity directly sponsored by the Judicial or Legislative Branches of the Federal Government.

Units administering research programs abroad funded by U.S.-owned foreign currencies, generated by sales of U.S. commodities to foreign governments, are included. While the research is, by law, an extension of the domestic missions of the individual offices, the establishment and results of such programs often have development significance.

Users of this Directory should be aware of two AID units with particular experience and responsibility in this general area of Federal development resources: the Participating Agency Services Staff of the Office of Contract Management (SER/CM/PAS, Room 671 PP. Telephone 703 235-9120) and the Office of Inter-agency Development Coordination (AA/IDC, Room 2744 NS. Telephone 202 632-1754).

This project was carried out under contract as an activity of the Office of Program and Methodology of the Bureau of Technical Assistance. It was conceived and directed by Sherwin Landfield under the general supervision of Abraham M. Hirsch, Chief of the Methodology Division.

And finally a word of thanks to the many Government officials who shared their time and information with courtesy and good humor and who encouraged this first effort to list the Federal international development offices in a single publication.

Because this Directory is the first of its kind, suggestions, reactions, and changes will be especially appreciated. For this purpose there is a self-addressed form inside the back cover.



II. DEPARTMENTS

The Foreign Development Division of the Economic Research Service is responsible for coordinating all of the Department's numerous foreign technical assistance and economic development activities. Through this office the Department of Agriculture provides training programs for over 2,000 foreign trainees per year in agricultural administration, policy, and economics; agricultural education; agricultural engineering; home economics; agronomy, horticulture, conservation and development of agricultural and forest resources; animal husbandry, and extension methods. Over half the participants are from less-developed countries. These are sponsored by AID, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) and other international organizations. This office also administers several one-month training programs in other countries, in such subjects as agricultural project analysis. It plans to add additional courses in agricultural credit and range management.

This staff provides U.S. agriculture missions overseas with relevant materials as they appear. In addition it maintains the USDA/AID library within the Department of Agriculture (Room 3504-South Building). This staff has access to the CAIN Data Base (CAtaloguing and INdexing) of the National Agricultural Library, and to CRIS (Current Research Information Systems), another USDA data base.

Approximately 25 percent of the participants in these programs are from the less-developed countries.

Its International Programs Division administers similar research overseas under the special foreign currencies program. The ARS also provides temporary and permanent overseas advisors to less-developed countries through AID or on reimbursable detail, and monitors foreign trainee programs related to biological research. The International Programs Division acts as liaison for the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) of USDA regarding international requests for assistance.

The Agricultural Marketing Service is the regulatory agency which inspects and grades agricultural products. The function is standardization rather than sanitation. The Cooperative State Research Service coordinates the activities of the USDA in its relations with the land-grant colleges and universities which are primary centers of U.S. Government agricultural research. Within this framework the Council on International Science and Education has been set up to focus on the agricultural needs of the less-developed countries and the utilization of the resources of the land-grant system to meet those needs.

This staff arranges training programs for foreign trainees at forest stations and colleges and universities.



Such services are either provided through agreements with AID or are negotiated directly with foreign governments. This Office publishes periodic reports about its programs and provides descriptive pamphlets upon request.

The Office publishes the "Training Branch Newsletter" and a syllabus of courses offered.

In addition, this Office administers a portion of the federal budget in support of the U.S. Maritime Academy at Kings Point, Long Island, New York, which provides scholarships for undergraduates from the Latin American countries. There are occasionally United Nations sponsored short-term orientation seminars for foreign nationals. The Office of Maritime Manpower also cooperates with the Department of Labor in providing short-term consultations in Washington for foreign nationals concerned with port manpower problems.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration combines several major federal services within the Department of Commerce including the National Weather Service and the National Marine Fisheries Service. The Office of International Affairs coordinates the foreign programs among NOAA services, AID and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) sponsor training programs for approximately 40 foreign nationals a year in the National Marine Fisheries Service. The National Weather Service cooperates with other nations in the Voluntary Assistance Program, under the auspices of the World Meteorological Organization, whereby training and advisory services are provided to help the less-developed countries strengthen their capabilities in the environmental and atmospheric sciences. This program trains approximately 40 foreign nationals per year and is funded through the Department of State. The training programs of NOAA are conducted in-service at their various installations in the United States and in colleges and universities.




