## INTRODUCTION

This directory is intended to facilitate communication among librarians interested in international aspects of the profession. Many of the people who worked on this directory have been involved with Washington State University's development projects through overseas assignment or campus support activities. Realizing the need for the exchange of experiences among library consultants to development projects, a proposal for the directory was submitted to the University's Memorandum of Understanding committee. The work on this directory was funded in part by monies from the the Memorandum of Understanding/Program Support Grant to Washington State University from the U. S. Agency for International Development.

The directory has been compiled from responses to a questionnaire that was circulated to all land-grant institutions, the university of each of the fifty states, and library schools in the United States. In addition, announcements of the survey were published in library journals. Individuals who responded to the published announcements include information specialists in private industry, government, international organizations, and some foreign countries. Only librarians and information specialists who have served overseas as a library consultant to a development project or to a developing country in Asia, Africa, Latin America or the Middle East have been included.

The main section of the directory is arranged alphabetically by last name. Listed under each individual is his/her title, address, telephone number, education, area of specialization, language proficiency, project experience and additional relevant experience. The name of the project appears on the first line of the narrative description of the project. The name of the host country, dates in country, and the project's sponsoring agency(ies) are listed to the left of the narrative for each project.

The directory also includes an:

- Index by area of specialization and experience.

- Index by host country.

- Index by language proficiency.

Only minor changes were made to the information provided on the questionnaires. An update is currently under consideration, therefore, any corrections, additions, or comments would be appreciated.
