1. Agricultural Projects Services Centre. Impact Study of Small Farmers Development Project. Agricultural Projects Services Centre, 1979.

Examination of SFDP's social and economic impact on small farmers in the Central hills and terai done for the Agriculture Development Bank.

2. Agricultural Projects Services Centre. Feasibility Study of Integrated Rural Development Project for Mahakali Hills. Kathmandu: Agricultural Projects Services Centre, 1979.

Investigation of the possibility of designing and funding a development project concentrating on food, livestock, horticulture, irrigation, forest conservation, social services, cottage industries and basic infrastructure.

3. Agricultural Projects Services Centre. Report on Baseline Survey for Tinau Khola Catchment Area Conservation Project. Kathmandu: Agricultural Projects Services Centre, 1979.

Research covering demographic structure; land, crops, livestock and horticulture in agriculture sector; and other sectors in a Swiss soil and water conservation project in the western hills.

4. Agricultural Projects Services Centre. Socio-Economic Study of Sikta Irrigation Development Project Area. Kathmandu: Agricultural Projects Services Centre, 1979.

Survey of socio-demographic structure, agricultural conditions, and trade flow of cereal grains for GON in the Far West terai.

5. Agricultural Projects Services Centre. Socio-Economic Survey of Kanchanpur and Bardia Resettlement Project Area. Kathmandu: Agricultural Projects Services Centre, 1978.

Study of socio-economic aspects, project land use, agriculture, farm management analysis, and income and expenditure for GON in the Far West terai.

6. Agricultural Requisites Scheme for Asia and the Pacific. Marketing, Distribution and Use of Fertilizer in Nepal. Bangkok: United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific, 1977.

Information on marketing and distribution of fertilizer; consumption, prices and returns; and agricultural research and extension.

Annual Report by visiting mission covering agriculture and forestry, manufacturing and power, tourism and transport, social sectors, domestic finance, external finance and development plans.

8. Asian Regional Team for Employment Promotion. The Challenge for Nepal. Bangkok: International Labour Organization, 1974.

Concentration on employment and growth with emphasis on agriculture, manufacturing, tourism, construction, and trade by a visiting mission.

9. Asian Regional Team for Employment Promotion. Nepal Rural Household Survey. Bangkok: International Labour Organization, 1976.

Household survey attempting to measure total income, income distribution, the contribution of different sources of income, the influence of some indicators on income and some income characteristics of recently migrated households.

10. Bajracharya, Bhuban Bjra. An Impact of Village Sajha Society on Small Farmers. Kathmandu: Centre for Economic Development and Administration, 1978.

Research to find out the importance of cooperative credit in the adoption of high yielding cereal varieties and chemical fertilizer, to find when and how critical the adoption of cooperative credit can be, to assess the importance of the marketing aspect of Sajha Societies in the adoption of high yielding varieties, and to analyse the distribution pattern of cooperative credit.

11. Bista, Dor Bahadur. Padipur: A Central Terai Village of Nepal. Kathmandu: United States Agency for International Development, 1968.

Anthropological paper on socio-economic variables, agriculture and attitudes.

12. Caplan, A. Patricia. Priests and Cobblers: A Study of Social Change in a Hindu Village in Western Nepal. San Francisco: Chandler Publishing Company, 1972.

Study of changes coming about in the past two decades in the relation between high castes and untouchables, especially shudras in the economic and political links between the two groups.

13. Central Bureau Of Statistics. Census of the Manufacturing Establishments 1972-73. Kathmandu: National Planning Commission Secretariat, 1973.

Figures for establishments, persons engaged, wages and salaries, gross output and input, source of finance, fixed assets, fuels consumed, raw materials consumed, commodities produced, and sales and exports of finished products.

14. Central Bureau of Statistics. National Sample Census of Agriculture 1971-72. Kathmandu: National Planning Commission Secretariat, 1976.

Collection of quantitative data on areas under different crops by size of holdings, tenure, mode of operation, and land utilization and productivity.

15. Central Bureau of Statistics. Population Census-1971. Kathmandu: National Planning Commission Secretariat, 1975.

Presentation of general, social characteristics, economic characteristics, fertility characteristics and selected localities tables.

16. Central Bureau of Statistics. Sample Census of Agriculture. Kathmandu: Ministry of Economic Planning, 1962.

First agricultural sample census done in Nepal as a part of the World Agricultural Census conducted by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations.

17. Central Bureau of Statistics. Sample Survey of the Cottage and Small Scale Industries 1972-73. Kathmandu: National Planning Commission, 1973.

Estimates number of cottage and small scale industries, number of persons engaged, amount of production and home consumption, amount of sales and consumption of raw materials.

18. Department of Food and Agricultural Marketing Services. Agricultural Statistics of Nepal 1977 and 1972. Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Irrigation, 1977.

Compilation of agricultural, economic, price, international, planning, population and climatic data.

19. Department of Food and Agricultural Marketing Services. Statistical Information. Kathmandu: Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Irrigation, 1976.

Information on area, production and yield rates of crops; estimated population; planting and harvesting seasons; consumption of agricultural inputs; area covered by improved needs; and irrigated areas by district.

20. The Economist Intelligence Unit, Ltd. Quarterly Economic Review of India, Nepal. London: The Economist Intelligence Unit, Ltd., quarterly.

Review of politics; agriculture; industry; prices, money and fiscal policy; and foreign trade and payments plus tables of indicators of economic activity and trade.

21. Food and Agricultural Marketing Service Department. Agricultural Marketing Information Bulletin. Kathmandu: Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Irrigation, monthly.

Contains prices, demand and supply outlook, market information and articles on agricultural commodities.
22. Food and Agricultural Marketing Services Department. Production Costs and Returns. Kathmandu: Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Irrigation, 1978.

Cost of production and returns on one hectare by crop and district.
23. Food and Agricultural Marketing Services Department. "Special Issue." Agricultural Marketing Information Bulletin, Vol. VII, No. 1 (January 1, 1977).

Tables of production, area, and prices of agricultural commodities by district.
24. Hagan, Albert R. The Agricultural Development of Nepal. Columbia, Missouri: University of Missouri, 1976.

Evaluation of agricultural sector from an extensive review of government reports and agricultural development projects in Nepal since 1951.
25. Institute of Nepal and Asian Studies. Sedentary and Mobility: A Study of Hill Migration in Far Western Nepal. Kirtipur: Institute of Nepal and Asian Studies, 1977.

Anthropological report of Socio-economic variables collected from five field sites in the Rapati Zone.
26. Karnali Bheri Integrated Rural Development Project. A Hand book of Statistics. Surkhet: Karnali Bheri Integrated Rural Development Project, 1978.

Collection of demographic, agriculture, industry and services data from households and from government and corporation records for a Canadian integrated rural development project in the Far West mountains, hills, and terai.
27. Mathema, Sudarshan B. and Van Der Veen, Marlin G. Socio-Economic Research on Farming Systems in Nepal: A Key Informant Survey in Five Cropping Systems Research Sites. Kathmandu: Integrated Cereals Project, 1978.

Presentation of climate, cropping patterns, farm size, crop production and use, labor and livestock information from four hill areas and one Central terai site.

28. McDougal, Charles. Village and Household Economy in Far Western Nepal. Kirtipur: Tribhuvan University, 1968.

Study of village and household economy based on field research done in four selected districts with the village and household taken as the unit of analysis in dealing with economic problems.

29. Ministry of Economic Planning. Cereal Grain Production, Consumption and Marketing Patterns: Nepal 1965. Kathmandu: Ministry of Economic Planning, 1965.

Report prepared to provide basic data for economic planners and to present an appraisal of the situation which may be useful to agriculturalists.

30. Ministry of Finance. Economic Survey: Fiscal Year 1978-79. Kathmandu: Ministry of Finance, 1979.

Presentation of development activities and production, money, finance, foreign trade and balance of payments, and price situation for the year.

31. Ministry of Health. Annual Report Integrated Community Health Project 2034-35 (1977-78). Kathmandu: His Majesty's Government, 1978.

Presentation of yearly progress in training personnel, converting health posts to the integrated model, and strengthening of nutrition and immunization activities.

32. Ministry of Health. Mid Term Health Review 2035. Kathmandu: Ministry of Health, 1979.

Reports on specific program areas, interface between the community and health services, institutional resources and process and service problems from national survey.

33. National Planning Commission Secretariat. The Effects of the Impact of Development Programs on the Lives of People. Kathmandu: National Planning Commission, 1977.

National study to determine the effects of various projects on people, to compare the effectiveness of the programs on a geographic and regional basis, and to relate socio-economic characteristics with benefits derived from development.

34. National Planning Commission Secretariat. A Survey of Employment, Income Distribution and Consumption Patterns in Nepal. Kathmandu: National Planning Commission Secretariat, 1978.

National survey generating basic data on employment patterns, the extent of unemployment and underemployment, components and levels of income, income disparities and inequalities, pattern and level of consumer expenditure, relation of consumption with income and occupation, minimum subsistence level of expenditure and income and the magnitude and concentration of poverty.

35. Nepal Family Planning and Maternal Child Health Project. Nepal Fertility Survey 1976. Kathmandu: Ministry of Health, 1976.

National survey on nuptiality and exposure to child-bearing, fertility, preferences for number and sex of children, and knowledge and use of contraception as a part of the World Fertility Survey.

36. Nepal Rastra Bank. Agricultural Credit Survey: Nepal. Kathmandu: Nepal Rastra Bank, 1972.

Collection of information about farmers' credit needs and attitudes, financial structure of farm families, and agricultural credit agencies from twenty-two districts throughout the country.

37. Nepal Rastra Bank. Household Budget Survey. Kathmandu: Nepal Rastra Bank, 1976 to 1978.

Findings of household budget surveys covering eighteen selected centers of the country designed to obtain appropriate weight factors for building up a reliable and comprehensive consumer price index for the country.

38. Nepal Rastra Bank. Main Economic Indicators. Kathmandu: Nepal Rastra Bank, monthly.

Monthly figures for monetary, price, and balance of payments and trade situation and for credit operations of financial institutions.

39. Nepal Rastra Bank. Production Costs and Return of Major Cereals and Cash Crops F/Y 1976 - 77. Kathmandu: Nepal Rastra Bank, 1977.

Collection of data to find out the costs incurred in the production of various cereals and cash crops and return there from under the existing farm practices in the terai.

40. Nepal Rastra Bank. Quarterly Economic Bulletin. Calcutta: Nepal Rastra Bank, quarterly.

Current tables for money, banking and credit; government finance; prices; and external payments and trade.

41. Nepal Rastra Bank. Urban Consumer Price Index. Kathmandu, Nepal Rastra Bank, 1978.

Series of urban consumer price index for the nation, hill towns, inner-terai towns, terai towns, and Kathmandu broken down by category of expenditure.

42. New ERA. Junla Small Area Development Program Survey Report. Kathmandu: New ERA, 1976.

Generates general socio-economic information descriptive of present conditions in the Junla Small Area Development Program area and proposes an integrated set of development activities and programs designed to improve the lives of the local population.

43. Pyakuryal, Kiran Nath. Impact of Rural Development Programmes on Income, Employment and Output of Small and Big Farmers. Kathmandu: Centre for Economic Development and Administration, 1978.

Comparison of agricultural output, income patterns, education, health services, and local leadership for small and big farmers in the central terai.

44. Rana, Retna S.J.B. An Economic Study of the Area around the Alignment of the Dhanagadi - Dandeldhura Road, Nepal. Centre for Economic Development and Administration, 1971.

Compiles basic information directed towards formulating guidelines for incremental investment within the region to complement the ongoing investment in road construction in the Far West.

45. Rasuwa/Nuwakot Development Project. Household Base-Line Survey. Kathmandu: Rasuwa/Nuwakot Development Project, 1978.

Very thorough base-line questionnaire results on household, agriculture, income and consumption, assets and debts, migration, cottage industry, labor use, and development participation and contribution for a World Bank project in the Central hills and mountains.

46. Rockefeller Foundation. A Study of Hill Agriculture in Nepal. 1976.

Focuses on identifying opportunities for adaptive research to improve agricultural production and food availability in the Hills.

47. Schroeder, Mark C.M. and Sisler, Daniel G. Impact of the Sonauli-Pokhara Highway on the Regional Income and Agricultural Production of Pokhara Valley, Nepal. Ithaca, New York: Cornell University, 1971.

Provides an analysis of the economy of Pokhara Valley in the West before construction of a road into the valley changed the traditional pattern of farming and appraises the effect of improved transportation on that economy.

48. Seed Technology Laboratory. Seed Production and Supply in Nepal. Mississippi State: Mississippi State University, 1977.

Economic analysis and technical analysis and proposal for expansion of seed production and supply, facilities and equipment needed, location of facilities, training and technical assistance, and organization and procedures.

49. Shrestha, G.R. Foodgrain Distribution System in Nepal. Kathmandu: Nepal Food Corporation, 1978.

Analyses the foodgrain situation in the country from production, consumption and distribution aspects with a short reference of the country's ecological and economic background.

50. South Asia Programs Department. Nepal Country Economic Memorandum. Washington, DC: World Bank, 1978.

Annual report on development plans, programs and administration by a visiting mission.

51. South Asia Programs Department. Nepal Development Performance and Prospects. Washington, DC: World Bank, 1979.

Reviews Nepal's policies and achievements during the Fifth Plan and identifies major issues that must be addressed, discusses the strategy options for the key development sectors, presents a macro-framework to evaluate Nepal's medium-term prospects and financing requirements, and discusses Nepal's external assistance needs.

52. South Asia Projects Department. Nepal Agricultural Sector Review. Washington, DC: World Bank, 1979.

Updates and analyzes developments in the agricultural sector, identifies the elements of a medium-term strategy and discusses alternative options, and outlines an action program addressed to the most urgent needs of the sector.

53. Special Programming Mission to Nepal. Report to the International Fund for Agricultural Development. International Fund for Agricultural Development, 1979.

Provides analytical framework for identifying projects and identifies a set of five complementary projects to be prepared for eventual funding by IFAD which would increase food production, reduce rural poverty and improve nutrition.

54. United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Nepal Nutrition Status Survey. Kathmandu: United States Agency for International Development and His Majesty's Government of Nepal, 1975.

Provides statistically valid data on the type, extent and distribution of protein-energy undernutrition using anthropometric measurements and selected clinical criteria and quantifies the prevalence of anemia.

55. Upreti, Dr. Bishu P. Journal of a Terai Village: Padipur and Its Environs. Kathmandu: United States Agency for International Development, 1978.

Followup investigation of "Padipur: A Central Terai Village" especially concerning villagers' attitudes towards family planning and health behavior.

56. World Health Organization. Country Profile Nepal. Kathmandu: World Health Organization, 1979.

Review containing general and health information as well as country programs and collaboration and evaluation chapters.

57. Zevering, K.H. Agricultural Development and Agrarian Structure in Nepal. Bangkok: Asian Regional Team for Employment Promotion, 1974.

Contains observations, analyses and recommendations made in connection with "The Challenge for Nepal" reflecting the author's personal assessment in a number of interrelated fields.
