PREFACE

The role of non-government and voluntary organisations was always a significant point of consideration in relation to the extent of their co-operation with the Government, involvement of community influentials and their contribution to the Population Control Programme. Mr. Rafael M. Salas, Executive Director, UNFPA observed, "NGOS have played pioncering role in drawing the attention of the world to population issues. Success in Population Programmes could not have been achieved without the contribution of NGOs."

2. For Bangladesh, non-government and voluntary organisations have also a glorious past in promotion of population control programme. Since 1953, the voluntary sector has been complementing and supplementing the efforts of the Government with significant contribution to the programme. During this period, quite a good number of non-government organisations were formed with diversified activities, integrated programme objectives and innovative approaches. Some of the organisations could not sustain the spirit with the passage of time while many of them demonstrated commendable success.

3. It was, therefore, strongly felt to have a documentation of the activities of non-government organisations working in population control programme. The Ministry of Health and Population Control, Population Control Wing thus decided to publish a Handbook containing a brief historical background of NGOs alongwith the existing rules and procedures for formation and operation of non-government organisations and a Directory showing the position of non-government and voluntary organisations. A committee was also constituted comprising the following :

The committee which met several times devised the questionnaire for collection of information and supervised the editing and publication of the document.

4. The remarkable feature of this document is that it has been divided mainly into three portions. The first portion contains the background, nature and scope of NGOs and the system of registration, co-ordination and monitoring of programme activities in the non government sector. The second portion comprises relevant ordinances, rules and procedures provided in the Appendices. The third portion contains the Directory of non-government and voluntary organisation: names, addresses and activities of organisations primarily and actively involved in the population control programme. There could be some errors and omissions which are not intentional, we expect one to view it leniently since it is a first attempt on the voluntary sector.

5. I believe, the publication of this document could not have been possible without the guidance of Mr. A.B.M. Ghulam Mostafa, Secretary Ministry of Health and Population Control. I am also indebted to Mr. Jalaluddin Ahmed and Prof. M.A. Haleem, Additional Secretaries, Population Control Wing, for their valuable advices as Chairmen of the Committee. I should convey my heartfelt thanks to Mr. S.R. Choudhury, Director, Management Information System, Directorate of Population Control and Mr. A. Rouf, Chief Executive, Family Planning Services and Training Centre, for their valuable contribution as members of the Committee. I convey my special gratitude to Mr. Dhiraj Kumar Nath, Deputy Secretary, Population Control Wing for his initiative in the publication of this document and the significant contribution he has made in the preparation of the Directory and for personally supervising the work at different stages. I must appreciate Mr. Shafqat Ahmed, Deputy Director, Mr. Ramen Saha, Chief Artist and also the research staff of the Population Information Service of the IEM Unit, Directorate of Population Control, for their untiring efforts in co-ordinating the activities for publication of this document.

6. I hope, this handbook containing useful informations will serve as a practical guide for programmer, executives of non-government organisations and benefit the programme managers, researchers, educationists at large. It is likely that a work of this nature might have few shortcomings as the first attempt and as such, all suggestions for improvement of the book will be gratefully acknowledged and efforts will be made to incorporate those in future editions of this book. With this expectation and belief, I am happy to say that the publication of the document is a landmark in the record of the IEM Unit of the Directorate Population Control, Ministry of Health and Population Control.

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Chapter-I

INTRODUCTION

Non-Government and Voluntary Organisations have a glorious past in pioneering the population control program in Bangladesh. The family planning activities in this country started in early 1953 with the voluntary efforts of the private organisations. During the last 30 years, Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations have been supplementing/complementing the government efforts with significant contribution in the program performance. It was therefore, a widely felt need since long to provide an authentic source of information on the nature and extent of participation of Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations in the population control activities. The Ministry of Health and Population Control decided in December, 1983 to publish a comprehensive documentation of the population control program activities in the non-government sector.

1.2 Objectives of the document :

The major objectives of this document may be summarised as follows :—

- i) To provide information on the nature and extent of participation of Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations in the population control program.
- ii) To provide a source of reference to the policy makers, planners, program managers, researchers, academicians on private sector activities in population control program.
- iii) To provide information on the terms and reference on formation and procedure of registration of Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations working in the population control program.
- iv) To assist in the appraisal and evaluation of population control activities by Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations.
- v) To provide a bench mark statistics for determining the future need and scope of voluntary efforts in family planning.

1.3 Background of voluntary program :

Family planning activities started in Dhaka in 1953 with the formation of Family Planning Association by a concerned group of individuals. Initial activities of the Association were mostly confined to remove existing social prejudice and taboos against family planning and approaching the Government to adopt family planning as official program. Persons renowned for such voluntary movement were late Dr. (Mrs.) Humaira Sayeed, Late Dr. Alauddin Ahmed, Late Dr. Mozharul Haque, Mrs. Raisunnessa Haque, Dr. Md. Ibrahim, Mr. Alamgir M. A, Kabir, Mrs. Saïda Waheed and Dr. Zarina Fazalbay.

At the initial stage, a clinic was set-up for providing information on prevailing contraceptive technology and motivational literature for popularizing family planning. There was practically no official support till 1958 except a minimum grant of Rs.10,000/- from the Pathfinder Fund, Boston, USA, to the Family Planning Association. After 1958, when a new Government assumed the power and recognised population as a problem, a financial support of Rs. 50 lacs was provided to promote family planning through voluntary efforts. But the clinic based program of 1960-65 could not make a dent to popularise the program, generate awareness and involve the community with the program activities.

During the period 1965-70, Government emphasised on the population control program and formed the Family Planning Board. The establishment and construction of clinic and field-based infrastructure under the Ministry of Health, Labour and Social Welfare were undertaken as priority program. Besides, financial compensation for wage loss, transportation etc. to acceptors and referrers, training of paramedics, TBA/ Dais were intensified. Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations were limited during this decade and were mostly confined their activities in the motivational efforts. No substantial support was given to promote the family planning activities in the Non-Government sector. Besides FPAB, organizations like Bangladesh Mahila Samity, Jatiya Tarun Sangha, Bangladesh Mahila Samaj, APWA were formed and started functioning during this period.

During the post liberation reconstruction phase under first five year plan of 1973-78, although the Government was mostly concerned with the economic, social, administrative reorganisational activities on priority basis, the population control program was also continued as planned program of the Government. International agencies, who had provided assistance to Bangladesh during the war of liberation and post liberation period had shown their interest and concern on the population problem. HEED Bangladesh, Oxfam, Save the Children Fund, CARE (Bangladesh) Radda Barnen, New Life Centre, RDRS, MCC etc. took up programs on health and population control and started to provide assistance to the local voluntary organisations. The national population policy of the Government declared in 1976 emphasised on the participation of Non-Govt. Organisations as quoted below :

“The policy with regard to youth, women, may be to support them financially and otherwise more extensively, so that their involvement in MCH and FP activities is expanded and intensified. These organisations will be actively involved at all levels of family planning”.

In fact, during the period of 1973-78, quite a good number of Non-Govt./ Voluntary Organisations came forward to complement the population control program, with their innovative approaches and community based distribution services programs. Organisations like BAVS (1974), CHCP (1974), CWFP (1975) etc. started functioning during this period. The Ministry of Health and Population Control has also taken a project namely “Use of Voluntary Organisations

in MCH-FP' with the assistance of World Bank to promote and support the Non-Govt. Organisations having innovative ideas and approaches.

In order to ensure effective operation of voluntary organisation, the Government established a council namely "Family Planning Council of Voluntary Organisation" in early 1978. The FPCVO felt the need of creation of a service cell to provide promotional, technical and other support to the voluntary agencies and sought approval of establishing the cell from the National Population Council, the highest policy making body. Family Planning Services and Training Centre (FPSTC) was then established in late 1978 to function as an organisation outside the Government set-up. The FPSTC started its functioning effectively from January, 1979. (Appendix-A).

During the period from 1978 to 1983, a good number of local level voluntary organisations were promoted with the active support of international agencies like USAID, Family Planning International Assistance, The Asia Foundation, The Pathfinder Fund, Population Crisis Committee, Oxfam. The Government also continued to provide seed money to certain organisations working in the population control program. During the period, Population Control and FP Division has issued notification regarding the rules and procedures of registration of voluntary organisation-involved in the population control and also issued a circular indicating the guidelines for the purpose of formation, operation and co-ordination of the program by voluntary organisations.

Chapter—2

NATURE AND SCOPE OF THE NON-GOVT./VOLUNTARY ORGANISATION

2.1 Definition : As per Foreign Donation (V.A.) Regulation Ordinance, “Organisation means a church or a body of persons, called by whatever name, whether incorporated or not, established by persons for the purpose of undertaking or carrying on any voluntary activity in Bangladesh”.

“Voluntary activity” has been defined as “an activity undertaken or carried on partially or entirely with external assistance by any person or organisation of his or its own free will to render agricultural, relief, missionary, educational, cultural, vocational, social welfare and development services and shall include any such activity as the Government may, from time to time specify to be a voluntary activity”.

The term “Non-Govt. Organisation” is being widely used around the world to indicate the activities undertaken in the private sector. In fact, all Non-Govt. Organisations are established with the initiative of a group of persons to undertake voluntary activities. Most of the persons who initiate the organisation are not in the pay roll of the organisation but providing services on voluntary basis with salaried executive staff. These organisations are operated with the approval of the Government and implemented as per guidelines given by the Government with the objectives to complement and supplement the program undertaken by the Government. Activities of these organisations are also implemented keeping in view the Govt. rules and procedures but having financial and operational flexibility to ensure the implementation of innovative approaches. The source of finance of almost all these organisations is the foreign donation/local contribution obtained with the approval of the Government. Thus, activities undertaken by these organisations are regulated by the Government although their constitution, nature, mode of operation etc depend on the body of persons who established the organisation. Therefore, these organisations are formed on voluntary efforts with the approval of Government for a national cause and managed by volunteers keeping in view the Government’s guidelines. Thus these organisations are frequently and interchangeably called Non-Govt. and Voluntary Organisations as have been used in this document also.

2.2 Nature of Organisations : In order to ensure the proper monitoring of the activities of Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations, the Ministry of Health and Population Control has classified these organisations into three major categories ;

- i) National level organisations.
- ii) Local level organisations.
- iii) Foreign voluntary organisations.

A national level organisation is one having at least 10 branches or projects throughout the country e.g. FPAB, BAVS, CWFP, BMPA etc. Organisations established and functioning in a particular area/locality having no branches/projects employing at least 10 workers are regarded as local level organisations e.g. Comilla Atmanivedita Mahila Sangstha, Sobhanbag Mothers Club, Patiya Samaj Kallyan Mohila Samity. Organisations formed outside but working in Bangladesh are termed as Foreign Voluntary Organisations e.g. New Life Centre, Radda Barnen, Save the Children Fund etc.

The Non-Govt. and Voluntary Organisations are mainly involved at present in the following field of activities :

- i) Community based distribution program,
- ii) Clinical Services
- iii) CBD-cum-clinical services
- iv) Family Planning integrated with income-generating, MCH and Nutritional activities.
- v) Research and Evaluation
- vi) Social Marketing of Contraceptives

2.3 Area of operation :

Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations are basically urban based organisations. In population sector, these organisations are operating mostly in urban areas due to the fact that operation of a community or clinic based project in urban areas is more easier than in rural areas. Besides, the Directorate of Population Control has its field workers already operating in rural areas. In practice, whenever a NGO is allowed to operate in a particular area, the workers of the Directorate of Population Control are withdrawn and the area of operation is well demarcated for the purpose of effective supervision and monitoring of the NGO performance. But there is no restriction on the NGO to work in the rural areas with their program of innovative nature and income generating activities. In fact, about 15 organisations out of 23 being financed by The Asia Foundation have their program in rural areas. Presently, Govt. has also recruited field workers for a few urban areas.

2.4 Target of Performance :

Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations were allowed earlier to fix up their target of performance on area and worker basis at their own convenience. These procedures of fixation of target, however, could not produce a convenient and uniform format to evaluate the comparative performance of the organisation. Therefore, the Ministry of Health and Population Control has set up a committee to recommend a workable organisation-wise contraceptive target. This was also felt necessary in order to estimate the performance of the organisation to be eligible for reward as announced

by the Government. The Government has accepted the recommendations of the committee and fixed up the method-wise target for different organisations as noted below :

- a) There will be two separate sets of contraceptive targets-one for the Community Based Distribution Projects and the other for the Clinic Based Projects.
- b) There will be separate method-wise target for the workers of the old and new projects as stated below :

- c) The monthly target per clinic for sterilization has been fixed organisation-wise as follows :

i) BAVS	300
ii) FPAB	200
iii) CHCP and others	100

2.5 Worker-Population Ratio :

Normally, at least one full-time worker will be employed for every 5000 population and there will be one supervisor for such 5 workers.

The Ministry of Health and Population Control has issued guidelines for Non-Govt. and Voluntary Organisations in 1983 detailing the rules and procedure. (Appendix-B)

Chapter—3

REGISTRATION, COORDINATION AND MONITORING

3.1 Registration/Affiliation of Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations

Registration of Voluntary Organisations were administered under the Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance 1961 (XLVI of 1961). In 1979, the Population Control and Family Planning Division issued a notification vide No. FP II/354/75/155 dated 25.4.79 exercising powers conferred by clause (e) of Section-2 of the Ordinance and authorised the officers to exercise the powers of of Registration Authority under the Ordinance.

The Foreign Donation (Voluntary Activity) Regulation Ordinance (amendment) 82 provided that the Registration is obligatory for both foreign and Bangladeshi agencies or persons undertaking voluntary activities in Bangladesh with foreign donation. For registration, agencies or persons are required to apply to the Director, Department of Social Welfare in form FD-I under rule of 3 of Foreign Donation (VA) Regulation Ordinance and take action for registration of an organisation and/or issue approval for receipt and operation of foreign donations on the basis of approval of ERD. ERD will also convey the approval on the basis of the recommendation of Standing Committee constituted for the purpose in the ERD. The details procedure for according permission for receipts of foreign contribution and registration of voluntary organisations or persons receiving and operating foreign donation is given at **Appendix—C**. Foreign Donation (VA) Registration Ordinance 1981 and 1982 (amendment) at **Appendix—D** and Foreign contribution (Regulation) Ordinance. at **Appendix—E**.

Since the responsibility of Registration of Voluntary Organisations as per Foreign Donation (VA) Regulation Ordinance (amendment) '82 has been given to the Deptt. of Social Welfare, notification issued from the PCFP Division in 1979 has no effect. In order to monitor the activities and performance of the Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisation, the Ministry of Health and Population Control has devised the procedure of affiliation of organisation, primarily involved in the population control program. In accordance with the same, all organisations having the primary and main objective of FP will require the affiliation of the Directorate of Population Control. For this purpose, Dte. of Population Control will accord affiliation to organisations having more than 10 branches throughout the country. For other local organisations, concerned Deputy Director, FP may accord affiliation.

3.2 Coordination of Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations

The coordination of activities of the Non-Govt./Voluntary organisations working in the population control program is an important responsibility, in view of the fact that a large number of Non-Govt./Voluntary organisations are actively involved in

population control program with diversified project activities. Government in the Ministry of Health and Population Control has developed a mechanism to coordinate the activities of Non-Govt. Organisations.

The procedure of coordination comprises the following :

- i) Family Planning Council of Voluntary Organisations headed by the Secretary, Ministry of Health and Population Control meets quarterly to review the performance of all Non-Govt. Organisations, discuss their problems, if any, relating to the funding, supply of logistics etc. FPSTC serves as the Secretariat to this Council.
- ii) Deputy Directors, Family Planning of every district are supposed to hold a meeting of NGOs in every month to resolve the issues relating to area of operation, achievement of the target, supply of contraceptives, MSR etc. and identify the field of activities requiring extensive cooperation and coordination between Non-Govt. Organisations and the Government functionaries at the field level.
- iii) As per requirement of the Foreign Donation (VA) Regulation Ordinance and Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Ordinance of 1952, the Population Control Wing has also established a Steering Committee for monitoring of projects being implemented by voluntary agencies (**Appendix-F**).

3.3 Monitoring and Reporting :

A multi-channel working system has been developed for monitoring and reporting of the activities of the Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations.

The system comprises the following :

- i) Management Information System Unit of Population Control Wing collects the information of contraceptive performance of all NGOs through its normal channel and exhibit the same separately in every month in the monthly contraceptive performance report.
- ii) Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations send their report of activities and performance to main organisations they belong who further examine the same in relation to given target and contraceptive prevalence rate. Say, all FPSTC sub-projects submit their report to FPSTC and equally the branches of FPAB, BAVS, CWFP etc.
- iii) DD (FP) of the concerned Zila monitor the NGO activities in every month in a meeting.
- iv) FPCVO in its quarterly meeting discuss in details the performance of Non-Govt. sector along with their constraints and future program strategies.

The reporting system has also been modified to reflect the accuracy of performance and avoid duplication. At present, Non-Govt. Organisations having clinical facilities are to report their clinic-wise performance as "performed" whereas NGOs having no such facilities report their performance of Sterilization, IUD, MR, Injection as "Referred" and follow-up activities are not reported as "performed".

3.4 Evaluation :

The evaluation of performance of all Non-Govt./Voluntary Organizations is done as usual and routine matter. The Asia Foundation, The Pathfinder Fund, FPIA and other donor agencies usually make evaluation of the performance of each and individual organisations prior to refunding. The Government also from time to time evaluates the performance of an organization as and when required. FPSTC evaluates the performance of all organizations receiving the support from Subvention Committee. FPSTC evaluates the performance of their sub-projects every year and the Scrutiny Committee takes the same into consideration prior to the refunding of the projects. Besides, the Ministry advises its field functionaries to conduct an evaluation of a project as and when it is felt necessary.

Chapter--4

SOURCE OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Source of funding of NGO/Voluntary Organisations :

Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations are presently getting financial assistance from the following sources :—

- i) Government sponsored ADP Project through Subvention Committee.
- ii) Directly from foreign donor agencies e. g. The Asia Foundation, The Pathfinder Fund, Oxfam, FPIA etc.
- iii) From USAID, FPIA, Ford Foundation through the FPSTC.
- iv) Contribution from members of the organisations.

i) The Subvention Committee provides the seed money as grant-in-aid to Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations against the IDA supported Annual Development Program project namely : "Use of Voluntary and other organisations in the MCH-FP and other activity". The subvention committee headed by the Secretary, M/O. Health and Population Control approves the proposal for funding on the basis of the recommendation of a technical committee headed by the Addl. Secretary, M/O. Health and Population Control. The composition and terms of reference of the Subvention Committee and Technical Committee are at **Appendix-G**.

Non-Govt. Organisations receiving the fund from Subvention Committee are to develop their projects in the line of the FPSTC and with its technical support. Evaluation of these projects is conducted by FPSTC and Project Finance Cell claims the reimbursement on the basis of evaluation report and expenditure statement submitted by the respective organisation. Auditing of expenditure incurred by those projects is conducted by Project Finance Cell and the special audit team, assigned by the Accountant General (Civil).

ii) Foreign donor agencies, mostly intermediary donors like IPPF, IPAVS, The Asia Foundation, The Pathfinder Fund, Family Planning International Assistance, Population Crisis Committee, OXFAM etc. provide financial assistance. The procedure of funding by these donors is followed strictly as per Foreign Donation (VA) Regulation Ordinance and Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Ordinance 1982. Population Control Wing acts as an administrative ministry and represented in the Standing Committee at ERD for approval of the plan of operation of those projects and registration of the organisation by the Department of Social Services.

iii) Family Planning Services and Training Centre provides funds to about 40 projects with the financial support from USAID, FPIA, Ford Foundation, FPSTC

receives the fund under agreement with USAID and Bangladesh Government. The projects are usually examined by a technical committee headed by Deputy Secretary, (Cordination) and approved by a Governing Body headed by the Addl. Secretary, M/O. Health and Population Control.

iv) A few of the Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations working in the population control program have their own contribution for operating their project as a whole or part of it. A good number of organisations have however, been floated with the voluntary contribution of the pioneers.

Chapter-5

SUPPLY OF CONTRACEPTIVES AND OTHER LOGISTICS

In order to ensure the adequate and timely supply of contraceptives and other logistics to Non-Government and Voluntary Organisation, the Ministry of Health and Population Control has developed a mechanism of procurement and supply of contraceptive and other logistics.

At present, about 8 national level organisations are getting supply of contraceptive directly from Transport Equipment Maintenance Organisation (TEMO) (a central store of M/O. Health and Population Control) Dhaka. All organisations/projects under FPSTC get supply from FPSTC directly who in turn procure the same from TEMO. Family Planning Association of Bangladesh receives the store of contraceptive from TEMO for all organisations financed by FPIA, The Asia Foundation, The Pathfinder Fund. Foreign Voluntary Organisations and Organisations supported by the Subvention Committee get their supply of contraceptive from Deputy Director Family Planning of the concerned district. The details of the source of supply of contraceptive and logistics is shown at **Appendix-H**

In supplying the contraceptive and logistics to a Non-Government/Voluntary Organisation, the following principle is followed :—

a) All Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations get the wageloss, transport cost, food charge, surgical apparel, referral fee etc. from the Directorate of Population Control as admissible by the Government for each case of Sterilization.

Similarly, Referrel fee, Follow up fee, Insertion fee etc. are also paid by the Directorate of Population Control for each case of IUD as admissible by the Government.

b) Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations get these supplies on the basis of their performance. Usually, the supply is ensured on the principle of one month running and one month stock in advance to each organisation which is again estimated on the basis of the average of the previous 3 months performance and requirement.

c) All methods of Contraceptive, Condom, Pill, IUD, Injectable, Foam, etc. are given to all affiliated NGOs free of cost on the basis of their performance.

d) MCH-drugs and DDS Kits are also supplied to Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations on the basis of certain principle.

In fact, at present NGOs do not find problem of contraceptive supply for their effective program performance.

Chapter-6

PERFORMANCE OF NON-GOVT./VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS

The performance of Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations in the contraceptive performance of population control program has been found to be satisfactory. United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) in their country review report of early 1984 observed that the Non-Government and Voluntary Organisations are contributing to the extent of 40% of the total national performance. The contribution of NGOs is around 29% in Sterilization, 62% in IUD, 12% in Pill, 51% in Injectables.

In method-wise performance, some of the Non-Govt./Voluntary Organisations have the remarkable contribution as observed from the analysis of the contraceptive performance. The contribution of Family Planning Social Marketing Projects (FPSMP) in Condom distribution is around 65% and 85% in Foam Tablet and Community Health Care Projects contributes 56% in injectables. The performance of BAVS in Sterilization is around 25% to 30% in a given year. The contribution of Non-Govt. sector in the total contraceptive performance of the country has been shown in **Appendix-I.**

Chapter-7

FUTURE PROGRAM NEEDS IN THE NON-GOVT. SECTOR

It is expected that the Government will promote and support the activities of the Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations during the Third Five Year Plan. For Non-Government Organisation, Third Five Year Plan period will be a challenging one in view of the intensification of Government activities in the population control program. NGOs will have to identify new areas of activities with the objective of ensuring community participation, integrated development activities, innovative approaches and activities toward self-reliance. Although the funding mechanism, may remain same as of now but effective steps will have to be taken to develop the management capabilities through coordination, supervision and substantial improvement in the program performances by Non-Government Organisations.

The mobilisation of resources for NGOs will depend on their capabilities to absorb the same usefully to the program and national interest, not for their survival's sake.

During the Third Five Year Plan period, activities of the Non-Government Organisations could be strengthened at the Upazila level and below to ensure the participation of rural people with the program through proper education, motivation and understanding of welfare society and small family norms. For the purpose, substantial fund will have to be placed at the Upazila level. Family Planning Committees will have to be activated by providing operational cost and support from national level.

In brief, the demonstration of effectiveness in real terms will be the key factor for existence of Non-Government Organizations and Non-Govt. Organisations will need substantial support both material and moral to prove their usefulness in the Population Control Program during the year 1985-1990.

Chapter-8

SPECIAL PROJECTS UNDER POPULATION CONTROL WING

There are special pilot projects of innovative nature under the Ministry of Health and Population Control as follows :

- (a) Family Planning Social Marketing Project (SMP).
- (b) Bangladesh Fertility Research Program (BFRP).
- (c) Family Planning Services & Training Centre (FPSTC).
- (d) Integrated Family Planning, Nutrition and Parasite Control Project (IFPN?CP).
- (e) Mohammadpur Fertility Services and Training Centre (Model Clinic).
- (f) Metropolitan Dhaka Family Planning Satellite Project (Satellite Clinics).
- (g) Menstrual Regulation Training & Services Program (MRTSP).

All these pilot projects have their special features in providing family planning services, promoting the population control program, identifying the future program needs and experimentations of innovative approaches. All these projects are being operated under special arrangement, managed by Executive Council/Governing Body headed by the Secretary/Additional Secretary, Ministry of Health and Population Control. These projects are not operated in the Govt. sector and exempted from the provisions of Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activity) Regulation Ordinance 1978, in view of their special operational arrangement. The activities of these projects are summarised as follows :

(a) Family Planning Social Marketing Project :

FPSMP came into being in 1974 under an agreement with the Population Services International and the Population Control Division to promote the sale of contraceptive and other nutritional items as socially desirable products. The FPSMP has at present 8 regional sales offices, 1,08,200 (May '84) retail outlets for the sale of Condom (Raja, Panther, Majestic), Maya (Pill), Foam Tablet (Joy) and also started administration of Injections on pilot basis. Besides, FPSMP distributes ORS, Safe Delivery Kits (SDK) on non-profit basis. FPSMP's contribution in the national performance of Condom distribution ranges around 60%—65% in a year. An Executive Council headed by the Secretary, M/O. Health and Population Control is responsible for overall management of FPSMP.

(b) Bangladesh Fertility Research Program :

The recent trend of development of fertility regulation technology indicates to the clinical and biological complexities of contraceptive methods,

which need for additional applied research to establish the suitability of fertility regulation methods in a particular society in the context of social, cultural and biological situation. With a view to addressing the above needed research in fertility regulation, BFRP was formed in 1976 under an agreement between Population Control Division and International Fertility Research Program which is supported out of USAID grant. BFRP is governed by an Executive Council headed by the Secretary, Ministry of Health and Population Control. BFRP undertakes studies, independent or collaboration research, conducts training, organizes seminars, conferences and publishes reports on different aspects of fertility management relating to the Population Control Program.

(c) Family Planning Services and Training Centre :

FPSTC came into being as a cell outside Government set up to provide secretariat services to the Family Planning Council of Voluntary Organizations promote family planning services and impart training to the personnel of Non-Government Sector. FPSTC is providing assistance to 40 NGOs for undertaking CBD program alongwith MCH and income generating activities. The average contraceptive prevalence rate in FPSTCs sub-project areas ranges from 30% to 40% with a reasonably minimum cost for recruitment of per client. The Governing Body of FPSTC is headed by the Additional Secretary, Ministry of Health and Population Control. USAID, FPIA and Ford Foundation provide financial assistance to FPSTC.

(d) Integrated Family Planning, Nutrition and Parasite Control Project :

Population Control Program needs to be integrated with other programs to bring direct benefits to the people, improve their health status etc. Parasite Control and Nutrition have been considered to be potential partners of integration to establish credibility of family planning workers by yielding immediate result of deworming and providing nutrition services as incentive and conducive factor for acceptance of family planning. Like other 12 countries of the world, with assistance of Japanese Organization for International Cooperation in Family Planning, Inc. (JOICFP) this project is operating since 1979 in 4 areas of Bangladesh (Naldanga at Rangpur, Panchdona at Narsingdi, Noyra at Khulna and Nayapara at Sylhet). The rate of parasite infestation in some project area has been reduced from 90% to 23% and the contraceptive prevalence rate has been raised to 52% on average in the project areas.

(e) Mohammadpur Fertility Services and Training Centre :

Mohammadpur Fertility Services and Training Centre is popularly known as Model Clinic was established in 1974 to provide family planning services and impart training to Doctors and Family Welfare Visitors. During the 10 years of its operation, the Centre has earned a wide reputation

not only for providing quality services but also standard of training. The Pathfinder Fund and Population Crisis Committee have been providing financial assistance to this Centre. A Managing Committee under the chairmanship of the Additional Secretary, Ministry of Health and Population Control is responsible for the overall management of the Centre.

(f) Metropolitan Dhaka Family Planning Satellite Project :

In 1978, this Satellite Project was established with a view to providing family planning service facilities in the outskirts of greater Dhaka City including Narayanganj. Four clinics are commissioned at Bashaboo, Mirpur, Rampur and Narayanganj to provide family planning services and recruit client through the field agents. The Pathfinder Fund has been providing assistance for the operation of the Project. Additional Secretary, Ministry of Health and Population Control is Chairman of the Managing Committee of this Project.

(g) Menstrual Regulation Training and Service Program :

The MRSTP was formed in late 1983 to provide menstrual regulation training and services through 9 medical colleges and Sadar Hospitals. The Population Crisis Committee has been providing financial assistance to this Project and the Project is managed by a 9-member Council headed by the Secretary, Ministry of Health and Population Control.

NOTIFICATION

The Family Planning Council of Voluntary Organizations (FPCVO) has been constituted under the sponsorship of the Population Control & Family Planning Division. The National Population Council in its meeting held on July 4, 1978 approved the proposal of the Council to set up a Family Planning Services and Training Centre for providing promotional, technical and other services to the voluntary organizations engaged in MCH, Nutrition and Family Planning, specially in the urban areas. The principal functions of the Centre will be as follows :—

- a) to promote voluntary organizations in MCH, Nutrition and Family Planning specially in the urban area ;
- b) to assist voluntary organizations in the development of MCH, Nutrition and Family Planning projects ;
- c) to review voluntary organizations' projects and recommend for funding by the Government and donor agencies ;
- d) to provide technical assistance, as required, on Family Planning & MCH, education and motivation, medical and clinical matters, programme administration, training, accounting and financial management, logistics and supplies and research and evaluation ;
- e) to provide to the Population Control and Family Planning Division on a regular basis information regarding the performance of voluntary organizations' projects and lessons learned therefrom ;

f) to act as the staff and principal resource organization for the FPCVO and coordinating agency for the associated voluntary organizations and

g) to act as the executive agency for the FPCVO.

2. The centre will be governed by its own rules and regulations regarding pay-scales and other procedures as decided by the Governing Body and approved by the Council.

3. The Centre will function under the administrative control and supervision of a Governing Body since constituted with representatives of the Government, voluntary organizations and donor agencies under a separate notification.

4. The Centre will initially have the officials as provided in the project agreement with the Ford Foundation.

5. Detailed pay-scales and other benefits of the posts and their job-descriptions and recruitment procedures will be worked out by the Governing Body of the centre for approval of the Council.

6. The Ford Foundation and the Family Planning International Assistance will bear both initial and recurring costs of the centre in accordance with the budget estimates detailed in the agreements with the Ford Foundation and the FPIA. The Government may also provide grants-in-assistance under appropriate projects.

7. The centre has been set up with immediate effect for a period of **two years** for the present in conformity with the tenure of the **second project** under Ford Foundation grant.

C I R C U L A R

In order to facilitate working of the Non-Government Organisations/Voluntary Organisations in conformity with the over-all objectives of the Population Control Programme and ensure better coordination, it has been decided to set guidelines as follows :

(1) Classification.

An organisation constituted on voluntary effort primarily with the objective of supplementing the Government policy/programme in Health and Population Control Sectors and functioning with the approval of the Government having operational and financial flexibility will be covered within these guidelines. For the purpose of convenience of identification, Non-Government Organisations/Voluntary Organisations are classified as follows :

(i) Foreign

An organisation originating in a foreign country and operating in Bangladesh with prior permission (viz. Radda Barnen, New Life, Centre, Luthern Mission etc.).

(ii) National level ;

An organisation having 10 or more branches originating in Bangladesh (viz. FPAB, BAVS, CHCP, CWFPP).

(iii) Local level :

An organisation working in a particular area employing at least 10 workers/volunteers (viz. Atmanivedita Mahila Sangstha, Palashipara Samaj Kalyan Samity etc.)

(3) Pay and Service Structure :

- (a) All Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations will adopt their own service rules, prepare job description of their workers and manage their organisation.
- (b) Non-Government Organisations operating with foreign donation shall not employ anybody without clearance as prescribed vide No. 12-Circular-4/82 (Nira - III)/89(150) dt 17. 1. 1983 of M/o. Home Affairs.
- (c) The administrative cost of a Non-Government Organisation Project should not normally exceed more than 10% of the total budget. The pay and salary of the field workers involved in the Population Control Programme shall, however, be considered as operational cost.
- (d) TA and DA of Non-Government Organisation projects will be regulated as per guidelines prescribed for FPSTC.

2. Registration/Affiliation :

Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations operating with foreign donation will have to be registered with the Department of Social Welfare on the recommendation of Standing Committee as per provision of the Foreign Donation (V. A.) Regulation Ordinance 1978 as amended in 1982. There will be no registration from the Directorate of Population Control. For the purpose of monitoring, there will be a system of affiliation. National level organisations will have to obtain the affiliation from the Director General, Directorate of Population Control and local level organisations will be affiliated by the Deputy Director, Family Planning of each district. No organisation will be allowed to operate in Population Control Programme without prior affiliation from the concerned authority.

3. Procedure of approval of project :

All Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations will have to submit a project proposal spelling out the details of their operational plan, objective, budget etc. to the Population Control Wing of the Ministry of Health and Population Control for approval.

Projects under FPSTC and Projects operating with the assistance of Subvention Grant have to follow the procedure as prescribed by the Governing Body of FPSTC and Subvention Committee. For refunding also, approval will be necessary. No Non-Government Organisation Project will go on operation with the foreign assistance without the clearance from External Resources Division. For a particular organisation/project/scheme funding from a particular source will be preferred.

4. Programme operation :

- (i) Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations may operate in urban and rural areas with the permission of the Government as per rules under the Foreign Donation (V. A.) Regulation Ordinance. The plan of operation will have to be submitted to the Government well ahead of time,

- (ii) Clinical contraceptive programme will require the specific approval of Technical Committee.
- (iii) All Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations operating in the Population Control Programme will maintain proper record of their operation, performance, books of accounts etc. and conduct annual audit. Competent authority in the Population Control Programme will verify the same annually or as and when required for public interest.
- (iv) A copy of project proposal of Non-Government Organisations will have to be submitted to the affiliating authority of the Population Control Wing.

Supply of Contraceptives :

Non-Government and Voluntary Organisations will get the supply of contraceptives from the Government free of cost. The channel of distribution of contraceptives to approved Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations will be guided as per approved system of the Ministry of Health and Population Control.

6. Contraceptive Target of Non-Government/Voluntary Organisations :

(a) Target of Community-based Distribution (CBD) Projects and Clinic-based Projects :

There will be two separate sets of Contraceptive Target for Community-based Distribution Projects and Clinic-based Projects.

(b) Separate Target for new and old Projects :

In view of the fact that the workers of the old projects are to undertake follow-up activities to ensure minimum drop-out, there will be separate target of contraceptive performance for new and old projects. For the purpose of identification of new and old projects, a project during the first year of its operation will be regarded as new one and from the second year, it will be considered as an old project and contraceptive targets will be fixed up accordingly.

(c) Targets for old projects :

The targets for the old project per worker per month will be as follows :

Sterilization	— 2
IUD	— 2
Condom	— 2
Pill	— 3
Injectables/others	— 1
Total—	10

Each old project will have to provide follow-up services to their continuing users of contraceptives and the question of drop-out in a particular project will have to be taken into consideration for refunding of a particular project.

(d) **The target for new project per worker per month will be as follows :**

Sterilization	— 2
IUD	— 2
Condom	— 4
Pill	— 6
Injectables/others	— 1
Total—	15

(e) **Clinical Target :**

The monthly target per clinic for Sterilization will be as follows :—

(i) BAVS	— 300
(ii) FPAB	— 200
(iii) CHCP & others	— 100

All the clinics should, however, provide minimum standard and perform IUD and Injectables as far as possible. Special projects under the Ministry of Health and Population Control like Mohammadpur Fertility Services & Training Centre etc. will perform their target as per project document.

(f) **Worker Population Ratio :**

Normally at least one full-time worker will be deployed for every 5,000 population and there will be about one supervisor for five workers. The project will remain responsible for complete coverage of services in the area assigned to the project by the Government. In case any project is unable to deploy adequate number of field workers in the project area, it will surrender the relevant portion of the area so that the same may be given to any other Non-Government Organisation. On the other hand, any on-going project having more workers than the ratio as indicated above may be allocated additional adjoining area provided the performance of the project is satisfactory.

(g) **Monitoring & Reporting :**

(i) Upa-Zilla Family Planning Officer and Deputy Director, Family Planning will report the performance of Non-Government Organisation Projects operating in their areas separately to avoid duplication in reporting the performance of Government workers and Non-Government Organisation workers. MIS Unit will also separately indicate the performance of Non-Government Organisations in their monthly report.

(ii) *R:eferral* should not be accepted as *performed* in clinical method. While reporting the performance of Sterilization, IUD, MR and Injectables, reports received from the clinics should be considered as the cases *performed*

(iii) Follow-up activities should in no way be recorded as cases performed.

7. Training/Seminar of Non-Government Organisation Programme :

Training will be part of any Non-Government Organisation Programme. All personnel of Non-Government Organisations/Voluntary Organisations will have to obtain prior permission from the Ministry of Health and Population Control and ERD for obtaining training/attending seminar abroad with foreign donation.

8. Evaluation :

All Non-Government Organisations/Voluntary Organisations should have a built-in mechanism for evaluation of their own project. Deputy Director, Family Planning will also meet all organisations once in every month to evaluate their performance. Government may direct any authority to evaluate the performance of any organisation. The performance of organisations receiving fund from the Subvention Committee will be evaluated by FPSTC.

9. Supervision :

Supervision of the activities will be done by the management of those organisations. Registration/Affiliation authority may, however, inspect the activities of any Non-Government Organisation/Voluntary Organisation and recommend/suggest measures as felt necessary.

10. Winding-Up :

In case of winding-up/termination of a Non-Government Organisation/Voluntary Organisation, assets and liabilities of the project will be disposed of as per provision of the project or as per instruction to be given by the Government.

11. The method-specific contraceptive target for NGOs primarily and actively involved in the Population Control Programme has been worked out and enclosed herewith. All concerned are, therefore, requested to follow the guidelines as mentioned above and take necessary steps for the achievement of targets as shown against each. Their future funding as well as awards etc. will be evaluated on the basis of performance and achievement of the targets.

No. 12—Circular—4/82(Nira-III)/89(150), Dated : Dhaka January, 17, '83.

Subject :—Procedure for according permission for receipt of foreign contributions and registration of voluntary organizations or persons receiving and operating foreign donations.

Under the Foreign Contributions (Regulation) Ordinance, 1982 and the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance, 1978, it has been considered necessary to streamline the procedure of regulation of contributions as also of voluntary activities funded with foreign donations. Accordingly, the following procedure has been laid down to deal with cases under the two ordinances and the Rules made under the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance, 1978. These instructions supersede previous instructions issued on the subject vide memo. No. ERD/Cord—III/V—49/79 of January 24, 1979 and Home Affairs memo. No. 12--Circular—1/79(Raj—4)636/60 of May, 1979.

2. The Foreign Contributions (Regulation) Ordinance of 1982 applies to all donors as well as recipients. Any contribution in cash or kind including free air tickets comes under the purview of the law. It is obligatory for both donors and recipients to obtain government permission for making or receiving any contribution. If such contribution is to be used for voluntary activities the provisions of the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance & Rules made thereunder become applicable. If any voluntary activities are funded by foreign donations, then the need for registration of the agency or individual undertaking such voluntary activities arises. Registration for undertaking such voluntary activities funded by foreign donations is one exercise, while obtaining permission for receipt of foreign contributions is another.

3. Registration is obligatory for both foreign and Bangladeshi agencies or persons undertaking voluntary activities in Bangladesh with foreign donations. For

registration, agencies or persons are required to apply to the Director of Social Welfare in form FD 1 under rule 3 of Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Rules.

4. The Director, may on receipt of an application under sub-rule (1), call for any other information from the applicant which he may consider necessary and the applicant shall furnish the information called for within the period specified in that behalf.

5. The Director will, after making such enquiries as he may consider necessary to ascertain the correctness of the information as contained in the application and the information supplied under sub-rule (3), if any, submit the case to the Standing Committee referred to in para 10 of this memorandum.

6. For receiving donations for undertaking or carrying on voluntary activity all applicants are required to apply in form FD 2 to ERD. Twelve copies of application are required to be submitted. Application in form FD 2 should be made simultaneously with the application for registration in form FD 1 by the agencies or persons not yet registered but obligated to do so to the Director, Department of Social Welfare.

7 All applications for permission to receive funds must be accompanied by a similar number of declarations regarding receipt of foreign donations and their sources (in form FD 3) and, where applicable, the manner of their utilization (in form FD 4).

8. For receiving foreign contributions which are not specifically meant for voluntary activities, all recipients are required to apply to ERD in form FC 1. Twelve copies of such application should be submitted.

9. For making contributions, foreign agencies or individuals are required to seek permission from ERD furnishing information on (a) beneficiary of the contribution, (b) purpose of contribution & (c) amount and terms of contribution (form FC 2).

10. The applications for registration of persons or organizations, for receipt or grant of donations for undertaking or carrying on voluntary activities and for approval of plans of their operations under the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance, 1978 as well as the applications for receipt or grant of contribution under the Foreign Contributions (Regulation) Ordinance, 1982 will be examined in the ERD which will seek the views of the concerned Ministries through a Standing Committee consisting of the following :

(Representative of Ministries/Division/Planning Commission shall not be below the rank of Deputy Secretary/Deputy Chief).

11. The recommendations of the Standing Committee will thereafter be submitted to the ERD who will accord necessary approval/permission/or take other necessary action.

12. Effects will be made by the ERD to process the applications to the organization (or the person) within one week of the meeting of the Standing Committee with copies to the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Ministry of Relief & Rehabilitation, the concerned Ministry/Division, the Department of Social Welfare and the National Board of Revenue. A rejected applicant can seek a review of the decision by furnishing new facts and additional information. Such review applications will be considered by the Standing Committee in which the applicant will be affected an opportunity of hearing.

13. In cases of very urgent nature, provisional permission may be given by ERD on prima facie examination (which may be confirmed, revoked or modified later by ERD) with the concurrence of the Ministry of Home Affairs.

14. In respect of receipt of foreign contributions not meant for voluntary activities, permission given for such receipt will specify the manner in which utilization report would be furnished, donation will be monitored and who will undertake the responsibility.

15. In the case of foreign donations for voluntary activities, Director, Social Welfare, on the basis of the approval of the ERD, will take action for registration of the organization/person and or issue approval for receipt and operation of foreign donations. The terms and conditions for operation of the voluntary activities with foreign donations will be fully specified in the letters of registration and approval for project under intimation to all concerned including the Ministry of Home Affairs, the administrative Ministry, Bangladesh Bank as well as the concerned Deputy Commissioners and Subdivisional Officers.

16. No Government agency shall sign any agreement or memo of understanding with a voluntary agency except when authorised by the ERD in pursuance of an understanding with bilateral or multilateral official donors. Registration of voluntary agencies under the Joint Stock Companies Act should also cease and all of them should be registered in accordance with the procedure laid down in this memorandum. When the field of activities or its location is intended to be changed by any voluntary agency, it should be cleared with the Standing Committee through the concerned Ministry or Directorate of Social Welfare.

17. All proposals for employment of expatriates under any voluntary organization must be within the sanctioned strength as decided by the Standing Committee. The organization will apply to the Director, Department of Social Welfare in specified forms (to be devised by the Director) for employment and/or extension of employment of any foreigner under it. The Director will then forward the cases to the Ministry of Home Affairs for clearance, endorsing copies of the same to the Director-General, National Security Intelligence and the Deputy Inspector-General of Police, Special Branch with the request to send their views to the Ministry of Home Affairs within ten days. The Ministry of Home Affairs will give its views within 15 days as per existing procedure and practice. Thereafter the Director will communicate the decision to the organization/person concerned under intimation to the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Administrative Ministry. The organization will, however, keep the Director as well as the D. C. and S. D. O. concerned informed about the arrival and departure of any expatriate in their respective areas.

18. In the matter of employment of local staff under any voluntary organization, the provision of sub-rule(4) of Rule 5A of the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulations Rules, 1978 as amended by Home Ministry's Notification No. SRO/352-L/82, dated 6-10-1982 should be complied with. The organization will apply to the Director, Department of Social Welfare in a specified form (to be devised by the Director) who, in his turn, will obtain prior clearance of the Ministry of Home Affairs for employment of any local staff under it. In urgent cases, however, an organization may employ local staff provisionally under intimation to the Ministry of Home Affairs pending issue of clearance as required under the said rule.

19. Inspection and audit of voluntary activities will be carried out in the following manner :—

- (a) The Administrative Ministry will exercise the power of inspection, auditing of accounts, etc. as provided in section 4 & 5 of the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance 1978 and rules 6 & 8 of the Rules framed thereunder. Employment of auditors under sub-rule (3) of rule 6 will be made in consultation with the Administrative Ministry who will ensure supply of two copies of the accounts audited to the External Resources Division under intimation to the Director, Department of Social Welfare.
- (b) The Administrative Ministry will establish a Steering Committee for monitoring projects under implementation by voluntary agencies. These Steering Committees will undertake quarterly review of projects with the voluntary agencies and communicate the results of the review to the Social Welfare Department and the ERD.
- (c) The Deputy Commissioners will be provided with a list of Projects under implementation in their jurisdiction periodically by the Director of Social Welfare. They will keep a watch on implementation of those projects. Any development of significance noted by the D.C. will be reported to the Administrative Ministry, the Social Welfare Department and the ERD.
- (d) All funds in foreign exchange will be received by every organization/ person through an account specified by the Bangladesh Bank. The Bangladesh Bank will submit the statement of the funds so received for each organization/person to the ERD, the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Department of Social Welfare in June and December every year. The Bank will be provided with a list of projects and organizations by the Director of Social Welfare periodically.
- (e) The Standing Committee will undertake annual review of plans of operation on the basis of reports from the Steering Committees of Administrative Ministries and the D.C.s and returns from the agencies and Bangladesh Bank.

20. Complaints under section 5(2) of the Foreign Contributions (Regulation) Ordinance, 1982 will be lodged by the D. I. G. of Police, Special Branch after obtaining prior approval of the Ministry of Home Affairs.

21. Orders under section 6(1) of the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance will be issued by the Director of Social Welfare after referring the case to the Standing Committee. Complaints under section 6A of the said Ordinance will be lodged by the Director of Social Welfare after obtaining prior approval of the Ministry of Home Affairs.

THE FOREIGN DONATIONS (VOLUNTARY ACTIVITIES) REGULATION
ORDINANCE, 1978.

Ordinance No. XLVI of 1978.

AN
ORDINANCE

to regulate the receipts and expenditure of foreign donations for voluntary activities.

WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate receipts and expenditure of foreign donations for voluntary activities ;

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Proclamations of the 20th August, 1975, and the 8th November, 1975, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance :—

1. **Short title.**—This Ordinance may be called the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance, 1978.

2. **Definitions.**—In this Ordinance, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(a) "foreign donation" means a donation, contribution or grant of any kind made for any voluntary activity in Bangladesh by any foreign Government

or organisation or a citizen of a foreign State and includes, except in the case of a donation made for such charity as the Government may specify any donation made for any voluntary activity in Bangladesh by a Bangladeshi citizen living or working abroad ;

- (b) "organisation" means a church or a body of persons, called by whatever name, whether incorporated or not, established by persons for the purpose of undertaking or carrying on any voluntary activity in Bangladesh ;
- (c) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Ordinance; and
- (d) "voluntary activity" means an activity undertaken or carried on partially or entirely with external assistance by any person or organisation of his or its own free will to render agricultural, relief, missionary, educational, cultural, vocational, social welfare and developmental services and shall include any such activity as the Government may, from time to time, specify to be a voluntary activity.

3. Regulation of voluntary activity.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, no person or organisation shall, save as provided in this Ordinance, undertake or carry on any voluntary activity without prior approval of the Government nor shall any person or organisation receive or operate, except with prior permission of the Government, any foreign donation for the purpose of undertaking or carrying on any voluntary activity.

(2) A person or organisation receiving or operating any foreign donation for the purpose of undertaking or carrying on any voluntary activity shall register himself or itself with such manner as the Government may specify.

(3) Except in such cases as the Government may, by order in writing, exempt, all persons and organisations undertaking or carrying on voluntary activities with foreign donation, in whole or in part, shall submit to such authority and by such date as the Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, specify a declaration showing therein the foreign donation received by them, the source from which it has been received and the manner in which it has been utilised :

Provided that, in a case where the Government considers it necessary, it may, by order, require such declaration to be submitted at any time to be specified in the order.

(4) A person or organisation carrying on any voluntary activity immediately before the commencement of this Ordinance may continue so to carry on a voluntary activity for a period not exceeding six (6) months from such commencement unless the Government has, upon an application made in this behalf in such form and containing such particulars as the Government may direct, granted him or it a permission to continue so to undertake or carry on thereafter.

(5) Nothing in this section shall apply to an organisation established by or under any law or the authority of the Government.

4. **Power of inspection.**—(1) The Government may, at any time, for reason to be recorded in writing, cause an inspection to be made, by one or more of its officers, of the books of accounts and other documents of any person or organisation required to submit declaration under sub-section (3) of section 3, and, where necessary, direct all such books of accounts and other documents to be seized.

(2) Every such person or organisation shall produce books of accounts and other documents and furnish such statements and information to such officer or officers as such officer or officers may require in connection with the inspection under sub-section (1).

(3) Failure to produce any books of accounts or other documents or to furnish any statement or information required under sub-section (2) shall be deemed to be contravention of the provision of this Ordinance.

5. **Audit and accounts.**—(1) Every person and organisation referred to in sub-section (1) of section 3 shall maintain his or its accounts in such manner and form as the Government may specify.

(2) The accounts of every such person or organisation shall be audited by such person or persons as the Government may direct and two copies of the accounts so audited shall be furnished to the Government within two months after the financial year to which the accounts relate.

6. **Penalty for false declaration, etc.**—If the Government is satisfied that any person or organisation referred to in sub-section (1) of section 3 has failed to submit a declaration under sub-section (3) of that section or wilfully submitted or caused to be submitted a declaration which he or it knows or has reason to believe to be false or has otherwise contravened any provision of this Ordinance, it may, by order, stop any voluntary activity undertaken or carried on by such person or organisation:

Provided that no order under this section shall be made without giving such person or organisation a reasonable opportunity of being heard.

7. **Power to make rules.**—The Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, make rules to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

No. S, R. O. 352-I-In exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Ordinance, 1978 (XLVI of 1978), the Government is pleased to make the following amendments in the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Rules, 1978, namely :

In the aforesaid Rules :—

(a) in rule 4, for sub-rule (3) the following shall be substituted, Namely —

“(3) No approval or permission for receiving or operating any foreign donation for undertaking or carrying on voluntary activity shall be accorded without prior approval of the Ministry of Home Affairs”.

(b) in rule 4, the following new sub-rules shall be added, namely;—

“(4) Every person or organisation registered under sub-rule (3) of rule 3 shall receive all funds in foreign exchange through an account specified by the Bangladesh Bank”.

“(5) The Bangladesh Bank shall submit statement of the funds so received for each person or organization separately to the External Resources Division in June and December every year” and

(c) after rule 5, the following new rules shall be inserted, namely :—

“(5A) Submission of schemes, etc. (1) Every person or organization shall, on or before 31st March each year, submit to the External Resources Division and the Department of Social Welfare his or its scheme on voluntary activity for the next financial year showing the estimated cost, expected receipts, purpose and objects of the scheme, etc.

(2) Each person engaged in voluntary activity shall submit his particulars with reference to nationality, period of stay in Bangladesh, remuneration, the agency under whose supervision he is undertaking or carrying on voluntary activity, etc. to the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Department of Social Welfare.

(3) Each organization shall, once in every six months, submit to the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Department of Social Welfare a statement showing all relevant particulars relating to age, qualification, nationality, period of service with the organization, remuneration, etc. of persons engaged in different schemes undertaken or carried on by it.

(4) Each organization shall obtain prior clearance of the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Department of Social Welfare for employment of any staff for its voluntary activities to the External Resources Division with copies to the administrative Ministry, the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Department of Social Welfare''.

THE FOREIGN CONTRIBUTIONS (REGULATION) ORDINANCE, 1982

Ordinance No. XXXI of 1982

AN

ORDINANCE

to regulate receipt of foreign contributions WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate receipt of foreign contribution.

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance :-

1. Short title :- This Ordinance may be called the Foreign Contributions (Regulation) Ordinance, 1982.

2. Ordinance to override all other Laws :-The provisions of this ordinance shall have effect notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any other Law for the time being in force or in any contract or agreement.

3. Definition :-In this Ordinance, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context, 'foreign contribution' means any donation, grant or assistance, whether in cash or in kind, including a ticket for journey abroad, made by any Government, organisation or citizen of foreign state.

4. Receipt of foreign contribution without permission prohibited :- (1) No citizen of, or organization in, Bangladesh shall receive any foreign contribution without prior permission of the Government.

(2) No Government, organization or citizen of a foreign state shall make any donation, grant or assistance, whether in cash or in kind, including a ticket for journey abroad, to any citizen of or organisation in, Bangladesh without the prior permission of the Government.

(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to an organisation established by or under any Law or the authority of the Government.

5. Penalty, etc. (1) whoever receives or makes any foreign contribution in contravention of the provisions of section 4 shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months, or with fine not exceeding two times the amount or value of the contribution, or with both.

2. No court shall take cognizance of an offence under this ordinance except on a complaint made by the Government or any officer authorised by it in this behalf.
