THE DEMOGRAPHIC DATA FOR DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

The Demographic Data for Development Project at Westinghouse was initiated in October, 1982. This five-year project has four major objectives: (1) To provide technical assistance in developing countries to develop capabilities to process and analyze existing data sets; (2) to prepare tabulations, conduct analyses and prepare reports on selected population topics; (3) to transfer micro-computer technology to developing countries; and (4) to develop a special user-oriented data bank. Each of these tasks is described briefly.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

This objective involves providing assistance in developing countries to more fully utilize existing data such as censuses, vital registration systems and surveys. Assistance is provided in data evaluation, data processing and analysis. Technical assistance will be provided in ten to fifteen countries over the five year life of the project; half of the countries will be in Africa.

TABULATIONS, ANALYSES AND REPORTS

This objective involves providing special tabulations of population and related social and economic data. It also calls for the preparation and dissemination of reports and policy briefs (1-2 each per year) on population issues, as well as the dissemination of existing publications (1-2 per year) on population and development topics considered to be particularly useful to policy makers and planners.

MICRO-COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

This objective involves selecting and introducing appropriate microcomputer technology in developing countries. It includes the purchase and installation of microcomputers in developing country institutions, training, modifying existing software as needed, providing documentation and assisting in resolving problems encountered by microcomputer system users.

FAMILY PLANNING AND DEMOGRAPHIC DATA BANK

This objective involves the development of a databank containing family planning, demographic and related population and socioeconomic data. The data bank has been constructed from data sources compiled by the U.S. Bureau of the Census, the Secretariat of the United Nations, the Population Reference Bureau and the Demographic Data for Development Project.

THE FAMILY PLANNING AND DEMOGRAPHIC DATA BANK AND INDEX

The Family Planning and Demographic Data Bank consists of computerized databases and files containing cross-national family planning, demographic and population policy data. These databases and files were originally compiled by the Center for International Research at the U.S. Bureau of the Census, the Department of International Economic and Social Affairs of the United Nations, the Population Reference Bureau and the Demographic Data for Development Project at Westinghouse Social Sciences International. The Demographic Data for Development Project has assembled data from these different sources in order to make their contents available at a single source.

This Family Planning and Demographic Data Bank Index provides an overview and description of each database and file. Users are provided with a unified reference volume for identifying specific family planning, demographic and population policy data that can then be requested from the DDD project.

This index:

- Describes the content and source of each data base or file in the data bank.
- Provides samples of questions that might be asked from each data base or file.
- Provides an example of what computer output looks like for a sample question from each data base or file.
- Provides a list of all countries, regions and subregions for which data are available (Appendix A).
- Provides a list of all variables and tables in the data bank cross referenced by data base and subject matter (Appendix B).
- Outlines simple procedures for requesting information (see the HELP section).

FAMILY PLANNING DATA FILE DDD FAMILY PLANNING (DDDFP)

The Demographic Data for Development Project has assembled family planning and contraceptive use information from different sources in order to create a computerized file of family planning data. This data file contains the most recent available data for many family planning parameters, and will be continually updated. Included are data on contraceptive use by method, projected number of contraceptive users to the year 2000 for selected countries, and World Fertility Survey (WFS) tables listing variables such as contraceptive use by current age and by number of living children. Also included are WFS data, where available, on age at first marriage and years since first marriage by exposure status (i.e., whether pregnant, breastfeeding, or contracepting). Announcements about information added to the Family Planning Data File will be distributed as the file is expanded.

Recent contraceptive prevalence rates, by method, are currently available for 60 developing countries. The regional breakdown using AID's Regional Classification is listed below. (See Appendix A for a listing of countries).

- What are recent estimates on projected number of contraceptive users in Jamaica to the year 1990?

UNITED NATIONS DEMOGRAPHIC INDICATORS OF COUNTRIES, UN-A

The Demographic Indicators are derived from data available during the middle of 1982. Besides data for over 200 countries, territories and areas, estimates are also available for the World, More Developed and Less Developed Regions, 8 major regional geographic areas and 23 subregions. Estimates of demographic indicators are provided by five year increments from 1950 to the year 2025.

For most countries, the information in this data base (UN-A) and the next data base (UN-B) was obtained from national sources. The major share of these data were collected from national demographic reports. Another important source was United Nations publications, which in many cases included unpublished official national data. Other sources include published and unpublished reports by research scholars and institutes. The published volume of Demographic Indicators, including technical notes and discussions of data limitations can be found in Demographic Indicators of Countries: Estimates and Projections as Assessed in 1982, United Nations, 1984.

DEMOGRAPHIC DATA BASES - U.S. CENSUS BUREAU

This section contains information about two international demographic data bases developed by the U.S. Bureau of the Census, Center for International Research:

(1) WOMEN IN DEVELOPMENT IV DATABASE, WID.

(2) INTERNATIONAL DATABASE, IDB.

The WID data base is essentially a subfile of the larger International Data Base (IDB). The DDD project maintains WID as a separate data base because that portion of IDB has become well known as "Women in Development." The user should remember that the Census Bureau now includes WID as part of its present International Data Base. The Census Bureau is continually providing new information, expansions and updates to its International Data Base which is maintained on the U.S. Commerce Department mainframe computer and accessed by DDD.

WOMEN IN DEVELOPMENT IV DATABASE, WID

This data base contains national level data concerning female and male differentials over a range of demographic and socioeconomic variables for 120 countries, 96 of which are developing countries. Breakdowns by age and by urban and rural areas are included whenever data are available. The information comes primarily from censuses and reliable surveys, and includes the most recent information available at the time of compilation. Data have been compiled for all countries of the world with a population of 5 million or more.

There are several ways to use this index to find specific information for any country, set of countries or region. Each major section of the data bank is referred to as a data base. Every data base has a special section in the Index with a specific name and thumb index tab. Each data base contains data in the form of specific variables or tables.

- (1) If you wish to learn about a particular database, use the thumb index and turn to the section that describes that data base. The variables or tables included in that data base are described along with sample output and directions on how to request information.
- (2) If you have a particular country or subject in mind, special "locator" appendices are listed in the back of the index.
 - (a) Appendix A lists countries and regions of the world (using the U.N. classification) and shows which databases are available for each country and region.
 - (b) Appendix B cross references variables and tables by general subject matter. A brief description of each variable and table is included, along with the database in which they can be found.

WANT HELP?

A suggested way to begin using the index is to find the country (Appendix A) or topic of interest (Appendix B). Each appendix indicates the data base or bases where information can be found. Use the appropriate thumb tab to turn to the section of the index that describes the database containing the particular variable(s) or table(s).
