

INTRODUCTION

This report should be considered the preliminary statistical summary and analysis of the data gathered by the Cameroon - U.S.A.I.D. Study and Design Project of the Cooperative Sector, initiated by Letter No. 5979/MINEP/CT3 of September 18, 1978.

One of the methodologies used in this project to assess the existing cooperative situation in the United Republic of Cameroon was a questionnaire sent to all cooperative societies (and responded to by 85% of them). This questionnaire was answered by cooperative managers, Divisional Chiefs of the Department of Cooperation and Mutuality, expatriate volunteers, and other cooperative staff between May and August of 1979. Response verification was the task of the Study and Design Team in Yaounde and in the field. Major credit for the success of this information gathering activity rests with the Department of Cooperation and Mutuality, whose collaboration was exceptional.

While this report, as stated above, is a statistical summary, detailed data analysis of all items in the questionnaire has been performed with the assistance of the Department of Information and Teleinformation (Computer Services) of the Presidency of the United Republic of Cameroon along with the Department of Statistics and Accounting of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Planning and their computer facilities. These analyses are available at the Department of Cooperation and Mutuality, Ministry of Agriculture, Yaounde and at the USAID/Yaounde office.

Several minor discrepancies between the computer analyses and this summary are explained by the fact that manual analyses of the questionnaires allowed further refinement of the data.

All information contained within this report is referable to the May 1979 to August 1979 period, except where otherwise noted.

Cooperatives in Cameroon directly benefit ^{/1} an estimated 1,460,000 persons and their families. Of these beneficiaries 21.5% are subscribed members with rights to participate in the decision-making process of these 429 societies. In areas where cooperatives have monopoly marketing rights the impact and member awareness of cooperation is inevitably high. It is interesting to note that within these monopoly zones memberships as a percentage of total member and non-member beneficiaries is quite high and probably reflects both farmer awareness and their perception of the benefits to be derived from cooperative membership. By geographic area the percentages of member beneficiaries to all beneficiaries are as follows:

- Lekie Division	:	78.4%
- U.C.C.A.O.	:	63.0%
- South West Province	:	41.2%
- SOCOODERs	:	37.2%
- Mungo Division	:	34.8%
- North West Province	:	24.9%

Member/non-member ratios for the other types of societies are a direct function of their activities. For example, credit unions normally only service their members by providing them with savings and loan facilities and thus the number of non-member beneficiaries is negligible. Women's and other diverse societies normally

provide access for services by their members to other parties, evidenced by their respective 4.3% and 4.0% ratios.

Approximately 2,300 persons are employed by cooperatives on a full-time basis, of which only 32.7% have been adequately trained for their jobs. The breakdown by cooperative grouping of the percentage of trained full-time employees is as follows:

To be considered in conjunction with the above is that, although a type of society may presently have a high percentage of trained personnel, its total staff requirements may still not yet have been met. Thus, the above breakdown only reflects the effects of different types of hiring practices.

As a percentage of total staff, part-time employment is 74.8% for all cooperative societies. In those marketing societies where operations are carried out by the cooperatives themselves, this is reflected by a high proportion of seasonal (part-time) labor - North West : 91.7%, U.C.C.A.O. : 67%. The range among the other cooperatives is from 12.3% for the SOCOOPEDs of the North to 90.2% for the marketing cooperatives in the Mungo. (This latter figure is mostly due to the fact that these societies experience a serious lack of full-time staff.

The tonnage of products sold by cooperatives for members in 1978 was about 120,000, of which 69% was cocoa, 18% arabica coffee, and 11% robusta coffee. The fact that only 2% of these products were consumable foodstuff items points out the lack of a country-wide diversification program in this area. Actually, such a program has only taken root in several societies in the North West and West Provinces.

Supply services were operated by 58 cooperatives in Cameroon. Of these, 37 were able to provide statistics on this activity. The estimated total surplus for all societies was 553,575,000 francs (\$2,575,000).

The average profit distributed per member/farmer by cooperatives at the end of the 1978 fiscal year was 1,931 francs. This varied from no distribution at all from the Mungo societies to 4,258 francs from the U.C.C.A.O. societies. Total profits distributed were approximately 1,341,830,000 francs (\$6,241,000).

Members of Cameroonian cooperatives averaged 1,927 francs in paid-up share capital. By group, the largest average payment per member was 4,633 francs for the diverse societies, while the smallest was 587 francs for the marketing cooperatives in the South West Province. Total payments throughout the country were 605,035,000 francs (\$2,814,000).

Reserve funds at the disposal of cooperative societies in 1979 were estimated to be 8,460,000,000 francs (\$39,350,000). Of these 7,533,000,000 francs (\$35,037,000) - 89% - were held by the U.C.C.A.O. group. The lowest holdings per type of society were by the credit unions - 379,000 francs - and the Mungo Division marketing cooperatives - 452,000 francs.

The value of fixed assets (after depreciation) was determined to be 2,615,000,000 francs (\$12,161,000) for all societies. 68% of these were owned by three types of societies - U.C.C.A.O., the North West marketing cooperatives, and the SOCOODERS. The average value per society was 8,353,600 francs; by far, the lowest being among the credit unions, which, among those reporting, averaged only 51,270 francs each. In general, the value of fixed assets equaled 4.3 times the paid-up share capital, with variations from 12.99 among the South West marketing societies to 0.16 among the credit unions.

The following savings and loan figures reflect only the activities of credit unions and discussion groups. Savings in this category have attained a level of over 2,000,000,000 francs (\$9.4 million) and loans 1,315,000,000 francs (\$6.1 million). The average loan granted per member of 64.9% of his/her savings. A point not obvious from the statistics given within this report is the growth of savings among credit unions. Since 1974, they have grown 8,891%

(from 22.8 million francs), while membership has only grown 173% (from 26,269).

The 1978 year-end surplus for all cooperatives in Cameroon was estimated at 2,529,000,000 francs (\$12,274,000), of which 1,585,000,000 francs (63%) was recorded by the six marketing cooperatives in the West Province and their union (U.C.C.A.O.). The average surplus per society was 8,106,433 francs (\$37,700), and per member was 8,051 francs (\$35).

The breakdown per grouping is as follows:

1.1. Membership and Employment

With respect to the West Province marketing cooperatives - U.C.C.A.O., 149,221 persons benefited in some way from services in 1979, of which 93,321 (63%) were actual members of the cooperatives. (It should be noted that the membership figures include all those who have joined a given cooperative since its inception, although many may no longer be actively served - having left the area of the cooperative's operations or being deceased). The CAPLAME (Dschang) is the largest individual cooperative, by a considerable margin, with 28, 496 registered members, while the CAPLANDE (Bangangte) is the smallest with only 2,940. The CAPLANDE and the CAPLABAM are further distinguished in that their non-member beneficiaries are nearly or twice as many as their members.

The six societies employed a total of 582 full-time staff, of which 70 (12%) were considered adequately trained for their jobs. Another 1,181 persons found part-time employment - 67% of the total staff. The Union itself employed 135 full-time staff of which 3 (2.2%) were trained and 9 part-time. In all, six civil servants and seven expatriates work with the various cooperatives or the Union.

1.2. Sale of Produce

Arabica coffee is the backbone of agricultural production sold through the cooperatives of the West Province with 12,598 tons - or 73% of the total 17,211 tons of produce sold - having been marketed in 1978. Only two cooperatives, CAPLAHN (Bafang) and the CAPLANDE rely most heavily

on robusta coffee, with 2,018 and 676 tons having been sold respectively. Cocoa is produced and marketed in four of the six divisions, and sales amounted to 658 tons in 1978, of which the CAPLAHN alone marketed over half. Palm oil and corn were marketed in marginal quantities, 152 and 124 tons respectively, by the CAPLANDE and the CAPLABAM.

1.3. Operations

The fantastic surpluses registered at the end of the 1978 fiscal year by the U.C.C.A.O. cooperatives were due almost completely to the unique direct exporting license which has been accorded to U.C.C.A.O. The 1,584,534,898 francs surplus represents approximately 60% of the total surpluses for the 429 functioning cooperative societies in Cameroon.

Supply service surpluses amounted to 207,804,608 francs for the three reporting cooperatives reporting. Since all six cooperatives, as well as the Union ran supply services, the estimated total surplus was 484,877,419 francs.

Bonus payments for arabica coffee sold to the cooperatives by all farmers in the area was the form of profit distribution used. (This bonus was a second payment of 50 francs per kg., following the original 275 francs for that year). Total profit distributed was estimated at 635,323,506 francs or 4,258 francs per farmer.

Paid-up share capital for the six cooperatives amounted to 86,454,475 francs - an average of 926 francs per member. Reserves were high, being

commensurate with the historically strong earning power of the U.C.C.A.O. cooperatives. The six member cooperatives reported a total of 7,450,439,982 francs in their reserve funds, with 36% being held by the CAPLAME alone.

The value of fixed assets after depreciation were estimated to be 867,901,788 francs - or about 144,650,300 francs per cooperative, although extremely wide variations were reported: from 1,533,852 francs at the CAPLAHN to 305,682,245 francs at the CAPLAME. The Union's assets were valued at 203,312,009 francs. Assets for the member societies were worth about ten times the paid-up share capital.

The average year-end surplus per member for all of the U.C.C.A.O. cooperatives was 16,527 francs at the end of the 1978 fiscal year. Again, wide variations were reported: from 28,642 francs/members at the CAPLABA (Foumban) to 3,577 francs/members at the CAPLANDE. One society, the CAPLAHN, was not able to furnish information concerning the year-end surplus.

2.1. Membership and Employment

The total estimated number of beneficiaries in the SOCOODER zone in the year 1979 was 190,657 of which 70,930 (37.2%) were members. The cooperative with the most members was that of Mefou/Mfoundi with 14,275. Full-time employees were estimated to be 342 and part-time employees 269 (44%). A relatively high proportion of the full-time staff (33%) were described as being adequately trained for their jobs. There were 14 civil servants posted to these societies (i.e., all but one - Nyong and Mfoumou - was managed by a government employee), and fourteen outside staff (SODECAO agents and Peace Corps Volunteers).

2.2. Sale of Produce

The major crop marketed by the SOCOODERs was cocoa whose total tonnage sold was 54,686 ~ or 287 kilos per farmer (at 1978 prices this brought each farmer approximately 57,000 francs). The average tonnage sold per cooperative was 3,645 and two - those of Ntem and Mbam - sold more than 10,000 tons each.

In addition to cocoa, another important crop marketed through the SOCOODERs was robusta coffee, whose sales totaled 5,101 tons for the 1978 year - or 566 tons per cooperative which marketed this crop.

Diversification in terms of produce sold is definitely not a strong point of the SOCOODERs. Various other crops were sold by these societies, but none by more than one society and in very limited quantities.

2.3. Operations

A supply service was operated by thirteen of the fifteen cooperatives,

however, figures were only available for eight of these. The average surplus registered for this activity was 1,997,884 francs.

For the fiscal year ending in 1978 profits were distributed as bonuses for cash crops (cocoa and coffee) to all beneficiaries. These bonuses were estimated to total 243,889,521 francs or approximately 16,259,000 francs per cooperative. The average payment per farmer was 1,279 francs, which represented, in total, 53% of these cooperatives' net income (i.e., bonus payments + year-end surplus).

The average share capital paid per member was 1,169 francs, which indicates that a majority had paid at least 1,000 francs each. Estimated total share capital paid for the zone was 82,895,299 francs, nearly equaling the estimated value of reserves at the cooperatives' disposal (88,015,438 francs). The value of fixed assets was determined to be 310,469,025 or 3.75 times the paid-up share capital. Fixed assets averaged 20,697,000 francs per SOCOODER.

Eleven of the fifteen societies were able to furnish the financial results for the fiscal year ending in 1978. For these the average was 14,163,000 francs and the estimated total for all societies was 212,445,195 francs, or 2,995 francs per member. The SOCOODERS with the highest surpluses per member were those of Boumba and Ngoko (12,515 francs) and Ntem (7,962 francs).

3.1. Membership and Employment

Total membership for the 209 credit and savings societies was estimated to be 45,487 or 241 per society. The province with the most members per society was the Center South with an average of 428, and that with the least was the North West with 161. Non-member beneficiaries were defined here as being children who had passbook savings accounts under the responsibility of their parents, or groups (e.g., marketing societies) which had received credit union loans. These totaled 88, although an additional 17,268 beneficiaries were estimated by the Center South credit groups through communal loans for such projects as water points and school construction. (In order that a standardized measure be used, however, the latter figure was not used in these calculations).

Total employment for the entire grouping of credit societies was estimated to be 128, of which 4% were hired on a part-time basis. Among the full-time staff, 75.6% were termed "trained", 20% working for an apex organization. Three civil servants were posted to the Cameroon Cooperative Credit Union League, Ltd., and eleven expatriates were attached to the apexes (ten to CamCCUL, Ltd.).

3.2. Operations

Profit distributed to members averaged 203,293 francs per society. Broken down by province the highest distribution both per society and per member was found to be in the South West, at 533,878 francs and 2,000 francs respectively. The lowest was in the Center South at 8,293 francs

and 19 francs respectively. The average profit distributed per credit union (or discussion group) member for 1978 was 934 francs.

Paid-up share capital per society averaged 306,899 francs, while per member it was 1,410 francs. The South West was the province with the highest amount of shares paid for by members (2,399 francs) and the Center South had the lowest (508 francs). Per society, the Littoral and North West had the lowest amount of paid-up shares at about 170,000 francs, while the South West had the highest (640,449 francs).

Only 133 of the 211 societies questioned provided the depreciated value of their fixed assets. For these they totaled over 9 million francs (6,716,522 francs for the societies and 2,329,476 francs for the apexes). The 51,271 franc average reflects the fact that credit unions are traditionally low-overhead organizations. The interpolated estimated value of fixed assets as a proportion of paid-up share capital was 0.16.

Credit unions affiliated to CamCCUL, Ltd. held 94% of total savings at the end of 1979. The contrast between this and their 81% membership ratio represents a difference in policies between the two apex organizations, as well as the extremely large savings per society found in the South West Province, as opposed to the country as a whole (22,313,098 francs : 10,135,994 francs). Traditionally, savings in the CamCCUL societies are withdrawn only when a member leaves a society or dies. In contrast, members of credit groups in the Center South have withdrawn their savings at various times throughout the year (as evidenced by an average savings per member of only 1,270 francs), rather

than using them as loan collateral, as is the CamCCUL policy. Recently, however, there have been indications that this former policy may be reconsidered in favor of an adaptable version of the latter.

In 1979, the average loan per member was 28,909 francs which was 64.9% of savings (44,554 francs). The largest proportion of savings allotted was in the North West Province (78.3%), while the lowest was in the Center South (24%). The most loans granted per society were in the South West Province, where each society averaged 14,345,929 francs. Again, the difference in the policies of the affiliates of the two apexes is evident in that only about 10% of loans were granted by the Center South credit groups, where savings are more often than not withdrawn, rather than loans granted.

The 1978 year-end surplus for all credit unions, discussion groups, and their apexes was estimated to be 68,591,083 francs - or 343,524 francs per society. The region with the highest surpluses per society was the South West Province (750,023 francs) and that with the lowest was the Center South (113,902 francs). The average surplus per member was estimated to be 1,578 francs, with a range from 266 francs per member in the Center South to 2,810 francs per member in the South West.

4.1. Membership and Employees

As concerns the North West Province's marketing cooperatives, in 1979 there were 144,460 beneficiaries of their services, of which 35,960 (24.9%) were members. The marketing union with the most members was the Nso Area Cooperative Union, Ltd., which had 8,708 (24.2%) registered. More farmers were found to have benefited (both as members and non-members) in the area covered by the Nkambe Area Cooperative Union, Ltd. (32,660 or 22.6%).

These cooperatives employed 398 total full-time employees, of which 144 (36.2%) were defined as being trained. The majority of these trained employees (60 or 41.7%) were working for the North West Cooperative Association, Ltd. Part-time employees totaled 4,407 (91.7% of all staff): 829 from Nso Union and 808 from Kom Union. There was a civil servant posted only to Ndop Union and 8 persons who were neither from the cooperatives or the government attached to these societies.

4.2. Sale of Produce

By far the greatest amount of produce sold for farmers by these societies was arabica coffee. The average tonnage sold per union was approximately 572 tons. Of the total, three unions (Kom, Nso, and Santa) sold 3,340 tons (53.1%). The other product most prevalent among these cooperatives was robusta coffee which was sold by seven of them. Generally, the variety of crops sold shows a variety which is not at all typical of cooperatives in Cameroon. The total tonnage sold was 7,599 for 9 crops.



4.3. Operations

The negative year-end surplus for this grouping is due to the fact that the North West Cooperative Association, Ltd. registered a loss of 22,941,985 francs. Without this, the total surplus for the unions was 2,968,796 francs or 269,891 francs per union. For this year the union with the largest surplus was Moghamo and two (Ndop and Santa) registered losses.

The total 1978 supply service surplus was only 435,696 francs due to a loss of 7,023,014 by Kom Union. Apart from this union the average surplus per union was 646,913 francs.

Profit distribution is meant to mean here the bonus payment (or second price) for arabica coffee sold to the societies by all farmers in the North West Province. (In 1978 the first price was 275 francs and the bonus was 50 francs). The average distribution per farmer was 1,948 francs.

Paid-up share capital by members of primary societies totaled 28,288,017 francs or approximately 787 per member, while reserves averaged 38,750,298 at each union's disposal with about 43% being held by Nso Union.

The value of each Union's fixed assets (after depreciation) was 36,650,172 francs with three unions (Nkambe, Kom and Nso) accounting for 59.6%.

The average year-end surplus per union was 83.7 francs per members, although among those unions which showed a profit it was 961.2 francs.

The union which showed the highest surplus per member was that of Pinyin at 3,317.8 francs.

5.1. Membership and Employment

The marketing cooperatives of the Lekie Division were estimated to have 34,115 beneficiaries as of 1979, of which 26,740 (78.4%) were members. The average membership per cooperative was 5,348 and of the four responding societies, that with the most membership was SOCOPSA (Saa), which also had the most beneficiaries - 10,536.

The total number of full-time employees was estimated to be 87 of which 29.9% were described as being trained. Part-time employees were estimated to be 84 or 49.1% of the total staff. The number of civil servants was estimated to total thirteen and external personnel five.

5.2. Sale of Produce

Two products produced by farmers were marketed through these cooperatives - cocoa and palm kernels. Of these, cocoa was by far the predominant one with an estimated 22,016 tons of it sold as opposed to 239 tons of palm kernels. Each cooperative averaged 4,403 tons of cocoa marketed and each farmer 645 kilos (worth 130,000 francs).

5.3. Operations

Of the five cooperatives, only one (the SOCOPAM) was able to provide the results of their supply service activity. An estimation through interpolation has been made, but, since the sample is only 20%, a reasonable quantitative analysis is not possible.

Profit distribution for these cooperatives was the bonus payments

made for cocoa sales. These averaged 16,416,596 francs per cooperative and 1,761 francs per farmer. Profit distribution for these cooperatives represented 31% of net income (bonuses + year-end surplus), with a very low range of difference - 29% to 33% - at the various societies.

The average share capital paid per member was 1,634 francs and per cooperative it was over 8,700,000 francs. Reserves were estimated to be 74,439,600 francs for all of the cooperatives in the division, or about 14,877,000 per society. Only two cooperatives were able to furnish the present value of their fixed assets and this averaged 25,315,290 francs.

Unfortunately, only the societies headquartered in Monatele and Saa could provide their year-end surplus. This averaged 55,415,779 francs per cooperative and 8,506 francs per member.

6.1. Membership and Employment

In 1979 there were 46,404 beneficiaries of the South West Province's marketing cooperatives' services of which 13,544 were members. The cooperative with the most members was in Bangem (2,928) and Kumba had the most beneficiaries (14,710).

The employment situation had to be estimated through interpolation since those cooperatives in the CENADEC zone (Kumba, Tombel, Nguti) were undergoing a reorganization process at the time. The estimated number of full-time employees was 139 (14.4% trained) and part-time employees totaled 207 or 59.8% of all staff. No civil servants were posted to these cooperatives, while four volunteers were advisors.

6.2. Sale of Produce

Only cash crops - cocoa and robusta coffee - were sold by these cooperatives. A total of 8,021 tons were sold of which 65.7% was cocoa. Although a breakdown of the number of producers per crop was not possible, farmers averaged 173 kilos of both crops combined, while the cooperatives averaged 891 tons.

6.3. Operations

Figures were only available for supply service operations from the Tombel cooperative and there a surplus of only 2,500 francs was shown.

Only four cooperatives distributed profits to their beneficiaries.

In these cases the average was 650 francs per farmer. Although the average distribution per cooperative was 2,378,547 francs, among those cooperatives which gave bonuses it was 5,351,732 francs.

Paid-up share capital averaged 882,868 francs per cooperative and 587 francs per member, while reserves available averaged 6,554,161 francs per cooperative.

No figures were available for the present value of fixed assets from three cooperatives. However, the average value per cooperative was 11,467,650 francs.

A lack of data was again a problem in the determination of the 1978 year-end surplus, which was only possible by four of the nine cooperatives. The average surplus attained by these societies was 15,102,805 francs, with the greatest surplus being that of the Mamfe cooperative at 30,498,834 francs. The estimated surplus per member for the same period was 10,039 francs.

6.4. Cooperative Reorganization

It is worth noting here that the marketing cooperative structure in the South West Province underwent a reorganization process at the time of the request for the above information. A result of this process not obvious from the above is that a Provincial Union (SOWEFCU) of these cooperatives was formed in September of 1979. The figures which were available should, however, be considered reliable, since they take into account the new areas of operations of these nine societies.

7.1. Membership and Employment

The registered membership of the marketing cooperatives in the Mungo Division in 1979 was 8,753, which represented 34.8% of all beneficiaries (25,118) of these cooperatives' services. The cooperative with the most members was the COOPLABAM (Nkongsamba) with 3,302, and that with the most beneficiaries was the COOPLAMEL (Meiong). Apart from these two societies, average membership was 363.

Total full-time staff numbered forty-three, five (11.6%) being defined as trained. Additionally, 394 part-time employees worked for these societies, which was 90.2% of the work force. A civil servant was posted only to the COOPLAMEL, and three German Volunteers were posted to the various societies.

7.2. Sale of Produce

The only agricultural product marketed through these cooperatives was robusta coffee, whose sales totaled 4,121 tons, of which 57.2% was marketed by the COOPLABAM and the COOPLAMEL. Since these cooperatives do not operate in monopoly zones and records are not very efficiently kept, it was not possible to determine the average sales of this crop per member/farmer.

7.3. Operations

A supply service was operated by three of the societies - COOPLABAM, COOPLAMEL, and COOPAGRIL (Loum). Surpluses registered totaled 13,764,744 francs, or 4,588,248 francs per cooperative. Again, the preponderance of the COOPLABAM and the COOPLAMEL were evident, as they attained 87.9% of this surplus.

There was no profit distributed by any of these cooperatives.

Paid-up shares averaged 1,867,980 francs per society and 1,921 francs per member. Only three of these cooperatives - the COOPLAMEL, the SOCOOPLACACARM (Manjo), and the COOPRODICAM (Loum) - had reserve funds at their disposal. These totaled 4,064,403 francs, or an average or 1,354,801 francs for each of these societies. The value (after depreciation) of fixed assets was estimated to be 130,532,734, which was 7.8 times the paid-up share capital.

Although only three of the nine cooperatives registered a positive surplus, the total surplus was still 326,371. The surplus per member for all of the societies was 37 francs, while at only those cooperatives which did not register a loss it was 1,940 francs. The society with the highest ratio was the COOPACROM (Melong) at 29,212 francs per member, while the lowest was -5,308 francs/member at the COOPROCAM (Loum).

Women's cooperative societies discussed here are all of those functioning ones which were not affiliated to a marketing union at the time of the study.

8.1. Membership and Employment

Membership in these societies was estimated to be 4,463, which was 4.3% of all beneficiaries (104,071). The society with the largest recorded membership was that of Mezam, with 1,374.

All together, there were 11 staff of these societies, of which 8 (72.7%) were full-time and none trained.

8.2. Sale of Produce

The only product sold by these societies was palm oil, which members bought for retailing operations in the local markets. The total estimated tonnage of palm oil sold was 464: 66 per society and 0.1 per member.

8.3. Operations

Only one society (Kom) operated a supply service, and its 1978 surplus was 36,000 francs.

Profit was not distributed in three cooperatives and figures were not available for three others. In the two where they were available, the amount distributed was 232,350 francs or 178 francs per member.

The total estimated paid-up share capital was 10,780,838 francs: 1,347,605 per society and 2,399 francs per member; while reserves

averaged 1,062,967 francs per cooperative. Only two of these organizations (Mezam and Kumba) were able to provide the present value of their fixed assets and these totaled 6,295,361 francs, which was 1.7 times the paid share capital.

The year-end surplus was available from four of these cooperatives, and for these totaled 3,219,789 francs: 804,947 francs per cooperative and estimated for all societies at 2,416 francs per member.

9.1. Membership and Employment

Because membership in the SOCOOPEDs of the North Province is determined by a poll-tax payment, rather than payment of share capital as described by the Cooperative Law, this Study and Design Project terms what these societies call "members" - beneficiaries, and does not recognize anyone as being a member. Beneficiaries totaled 347,687, an average of 57,948 per SOCOOPED.

Full-time employees numbered 143, of which 40.6% (58) were described as being trained. Additionally, twenty employees were hired on a part-time basis, making up 12.3% of the work-force for the SOCOOPEDs and their union.

9.2. Operations

No crops which were produced by farmers in the area of operation of these societies were sold through these societies, and no profits were distributed.

Supply services were operated by all of the SOCOOPEDs, in addition to the union, and the estimated surplus for this activity was 13,690,711 francs or 1,955,816 francs per society.

Three SOCOOPEDs reported no reserve funds being available, while the other three averaged 24,560,429 francs and the union had 2,076,712 francs. The total value of fixed assets for the societies and the union was 208,435,456 francs (599 francs per beneficiary).

Although two societies did not report their year-end surpluses, the estimated totals for the SOCOOPEDs was 5,743,299 francs, while the

10.1. Membership and Employment

Membership in this diverse grouping of cooperative societies was estimated at 14,920, representing 4.0% of all beneficiaries (372,100). Of all full-time employees (278), 77% were described as being trained for their jobs, and, part-time employees (178) made up 39% of the work force. Four civil servants and two others from outside of these societies were posted to them.

10.2. Sale of Produce

The greater number of these societies did not market members' produce. Of the sixteen societies which reported, only four - the Bamenda Cooperative Vegetable Society, the Bamusso Fish Processing and Marketing Society, the Kumba Butchers' Cooperative Society, and the Agricultural Cooperative of Galim - engaged in this activity, and they marketed 152 tons.

10.3. Operations

Of the three cooperatives which reported having operated a supply service, only the Traditional Handicraft Society ran it at a surplus. Profit was only distributed in several of the reporting societies - the Traditional Handicraft Cooperative, the Bamusso Fish Processing and Marketing Society, the Handicraft Cooperative of Djingliya, and the Cooperative of Cameroonian Brothers (COO-FRE-CAM). Among these four, the total distributed was 15,617,150 francs among their 1,060 members. However, excluding the COO-FRE-CAM (which distributed 1,500,000 francs

per member, the distribution was 588 francs each. For this entire grouping, an estimated 2,335 francs/member was paid out.

Paid-up share capital was estimated for all cooperatives to be 2,304,078 francs per society and 4,633 francs per member. The estimated reserves available were 3,042,750 francs per cooperative, while the value of fixed assets was 5,180,582 francs per cooperative or 2.2 times the value of the paid-up share capital.

Only five of the societies were able to report whether or not they had a year-end surplus at the end of the fiscal 1978 year. One of these, the COOPAGAL (Galim), reported a loss of 412,082 francs. Overall for the grouping, the average surplus was 9,679,990 francs per cooperative and 18,821 francs per member. However, if the enormous surplus per member ratio for the COO-FRE-CAM (4,304,100 francs) is not included, the estimate becomes 2,147 francs per member.
