PREFACE

This Directory of Current and Planned AIDS - Related Activities in Sri Lanka is intended to be a reference work and a useful resource for people working in the field of AIDS control. Listings include 99 departments of government and universities, bilateral and multilateral donors, as well as foreign and domestic NGOs, service clubs and professional organizations. Whether the user wants to phone someone for information or plan a program that will complement the work of other organizations, this directory should prove useful.

Over 320 departments and organizations were contacted during the research to prepare this directory. Initially, the 1991 IRED directories of Sri Lankan and Foreign NGOs were used as a basis for contacting organizations, as well as lists of NGOs obtained from CARE, the National NGO Council, and the NGO Subcommittee of the National AIDS Committee. Additionally, member organizations of the National AIDS Committee were contacted, as well as other governmental organizations likely to be involved in AIDS - related work. As interviewing progressed, additional information became available about collaborating organizations, which were also contacted. Because face-to-face interviews provide more reliable and richer information, an attempt was made to contact all organizations in person. In a few cases, however, face-to-face interviews were not possible: (1) organizations in the Northern and Eastern Provinces were mailed questionnaires due to the unsettled situations in those areas; (2) some organizations, distant from Colombo, were notified by letter and visited once, but could not be interviewed, because nobody was present at their offices; and (3) the very few organizations who refused to participate in a face-to-face interview but agreed to return a questionnaire by mail.

Criteria for inclusion of an organization in the directory were twofold:

- (1) current involvement in AIDS related activities, either as an implementing agency, donor or source of technical assistance; or
- (2) definite and formulated plans to begin AIDS-related activities within twelve months.

One difficulty with these criteria is that the questionnaire provided no means to evaluate either on-going activities or the capacity of an organization to implement its plans. Furthermore, the mere asking about future plans may have stimulated NGOs who otherwise had no involvement with AIDS. Consequently, in the cases of some NGOs, the decision to include them in the directory or in an appendix was based upon an impressionistic assessment of their capacity for carrying out the program they proposed. Those excluded from the directory due to lack of adequate information have been listed in an appendix with their addresses. Similarly, those organizations which replied affirmatively to our initial inquiry, but could not be contacted for an interview in spite of diligent attempts to do so, are also listed in an appendix.

Inclusion of an organization in this directory should not be regarded as an endorsement of that organization's program. The compiling of this directory did not permit systematic evaluation of either on-going or planned programs. The information reflects an organization's own presentation of its program.

The directory is organized so that a user can rapidly scan lists of standard information for each organization, including: address, contact persons, major program areas, collaborating organizations, current and planned AIDS activities and target groups, and geographic coverage. The "Highlights" at the beginning of each entry summarize significant aspects of the AIDS activities, while the comments at the end permit a narrative elaboration on details of the program or organization.

Originally, it was hoped the directory would be a comprehensive guide to AIDS-related activities in Sri Lanka. As the work continued, however, it became clear that many small NGOs are incorporating AIDS prevention messages into their on-going programs or holding one or more AIDS awareness programs in addition to their regular programs, usually with the assistance of local health personnel, the Health Education Bureau or larger NGOs. Some of those organizations are listed in this directory. Due to the large number of NGOs in Sri Lanka, however, the directory has probably not succeeded in being truly comprehensive. Nevertheless, it is hoped this reference work will provide users with information on all the major AIDS projects as well as many of the smaller ones.

The Center for Society and Religion has worked for eight years in two shanty communities having a total population of about 8000 people. One Project Officer and a staff of five in each area operate pre-school and drop-out programs, as well as after school and nutrition programs.

At the time of the interview, the Center had conducted two AIDS awareness programs, attracting 60-70 shanty dwellers to each one. A WHO speaker gave a two hour presentation including videos and slides. Within a month of the lecture, Dennis Gunasekera held discussions and role play to reinforce the message of the lecture. Mr. Gunasekera observes that about 50% of people in the shanty communities have not heard of AIDS.

The 8 youth groups already have anti-drug and peace programs. The AIDS awareness program is expected to begin in January of 1994 with the training of 15 peer leaders. After their initial training, they will go to the field, then return in a month for discussions and additional training.

Blood donated in government blood banks is being screened for HIV as well as for hepatitis B, malaria and syphilis. Screening for HIV began in 1988, and the Blood Banks have not paid donors since 1987, thereby attempting to reduce the number of donors from high risk groups. As an additional precaution, the Blood Bank discards donated blood if the donor is thought to be from a high risk group, such as seamen. Each donor must sign a certificate stating he/she does not have certain diseases; however, the certification does not include HIV.

Dr. Zoysa comments that the blood supply in Sri Lanka is as "safe as possible," given that no blood supply can be 100% safe, due to the window period in which the HIV antibody is not detectable. In Sri Lanka, not a single case of HIV has been traced to transfusions. Additionally, the Central Blood Bank produces Factor VIII which hemophiliacs need for clotting their blood, and registers hemophiliacs. As a result, no hemophiliacs have contracted AIDS from contaminated Factor VIII.

The objective of Dr. Sirisena's research is to determine the relationship between condom use and knowledge of AIDS in a high risk group, i.e. clients of the Katugastota STD Clinic. The sample includes 300 males and 150 female clients. It was carried out in collaboration with Dr. P. Wedisinghe, Venereologist at the Katugastota STD clinic. Preliminary results are due in November, 1993 and a final report in January, 1994. The Pathology Department at Colombo General Hospital is the focal point of infection control efforts in Sri Lanka's government hospitals and clinics. Dr. S.D. Atukorala has authored several booklets relevant to control of HIV transmission in medical settings:

1. *Infection Control Handbook*. (1991).
2. *Safety Precautions in Patients with Hepatitis B and Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS)*. (no date).
3. *Disinfection of Endoscopes*. (no date).

The Department of Pathology also carries out surveillance on post-operative sepsis and needle stick injuries. Universal Precautions were initiated in 1991. Due to lack of funds, however, infection control cannot rely entirely upon the use of disposable equipment. Currently, disposable needles are used routinely as well as disposable gloves for venipuncture. Strict sterilization procedures have been implemented for other re-usable supplies and equipment.

Dr. Atukorala comments that the field of infection control is advancing rapidly. It would be beneficial for the Department of Pathology to be linked with an organization in the United States for exchange of ideas; collaboration in research; and visits by foreign consultants to help up-grade infection control in Sri Lanka.

As Health Coordinator for the Community Front for the Prevention of AIDS (CFPA), Prof. Weeramunda is currently engaged in the following two studies.

Survey on the Use of Mass Media for AIDS education. The objective is to explore the feasibility of using radio, television, newspapers and other published media for AIDS education. The survey explores patterns of media use by consumers; public attitudes toward use of media for AIDS and sex education as well as promotion of condom usage. One thousand respondents will be interviewed using a household level survey questionnaire. Additionally, 500 individuals will be interviewed in focus groups of selected traders, taxi drivers, CSWs, beach boys, and STD to test certain messages patients. These focus groups will also explore media usage and ways to reach these high risk target groups.

Socio-economic Site Assessments. The objective is to determine the number of people at high risk for HIV/AIDS; the local facilities available and the feasibility of counselling and promotion of safe sex methods among CSWs and their clients. The goal is to utilize local resources such as temples, churches, clinics and clubs for one to one counselling. CFPA will set up a project office in Hikkaduwa for counselling.

Previously, Prof, Weeramunda has conducted AIDS-related research which is available in journals or at local offices.

The Don Bosco Technical Center is operated by the Roman Catholic Selesians of Don Bosco for the welfare of youth. Their vocational training center offers two year, as well as three month, courses. The two year courses include: machinist, motor mechanics, electronics and carpentry. A course for outboard motor maintenance and repair lasts for three months.

The Don Bosco Center participates in the Anti-AIDS Task Force of Negombo. Boys apprehended by the police for prostitution are enrolled by Don Bosco in a rehabilitation program. They spend the first month in residence at a house where they learn values, before joining a vocational training course. After completion of the course, three animators follow up on their activities.

The Don Bosco Center became involved in AIDS prevention activities through their efforts to eliminate child prostitution in Negombo. Catholic priests became vociferous against this increasing practice and lead a silent march to two guest houses known to encourage liaisons. It was this involvement that stimulated formulation of the Anti-AIDS Task Force.

Father Pinto feels that the government should be encouraging NGOs to carry out AIDS prevention activities, but that it is more concerned with safeguarding the tourist industry. As a result, the government has obstructed some of their efforts.

There are several faculty members concerned with ethical and legal issues surrounding AIDS. **Professor Peiris**, Vice Chancellor of the University of Colombo, attended a conference in Cebu, Philippines, and as a result, the University of Colombo is now the nucleus of a networking effort. Topics being considered include: compulsory testing; confidentiality; disclosure of HIV status to sexual partners; duty of the state to provide housing, employment etc. for HIV/AIDS patients who suffer discrimination. Professor Peiris is well known for his wide-ranging knowledge and his lectures on AIDS and associated ethical and legal questions.

In addition to her academic responsibilities, **Ms. Charika Marasinghe**, Senior Lecturer, teaches *human rights* of HIV/AIDS patients to mobile health workers, first aid instructors and field staff of the Sri Lanka Red Cross. In the future, she hopes to become involved with the Sarvodaya AIDS program by teaching factory workers in Ratmalana about human rights issues.

Ms. Marasinghe is beginning doctoral research for a dissertation on *international law and AIDS*. The study will examine international conventions and declarations and identify specific social, economic and political rights applicable to AIDS patients. Then, the domestic legislation of states which have passed AIDS-related legislation will be examined to determine whether laws fall within the international standards. This study is concerned with the questions of whether present standards are applicable and sufficient; the degree of a state's responsibility for preventing violations of international standards within its boundaries; and how to impose an obligation on private groups and individuals to respect the rights of AIDS patients.

The Fever Hospital has a staff of 7 doctors, 20 nurses, 2 lab technicians and a number of nonprofessional staff. All doctors and nurses have received one week of AIDS training through the Family Health Bureau. Though the hospital has a capacity for 200-300 patients, the average occupancy is about 40. There are currently two small AIDS wards, accomodating two patients at the time of this interview.

According to Dr. Nirmal K. Fernando, the hospital faces three problems. First, additional funds must be allotted to purchase medicine for illnesses associated with AIDS. Second, lab facilities must be set up separately for AIDS patients in the Fever Hospital so that routine blood and urine tests may be run. At present, although the Medical Research Institute will do any microbiological lab work necessary for AIDS patients, there is nowhere to have blood and urine tests run. Third, a home needs to be established for persons with AIDS, not requiring hospitalization, but also not able to live alone. He feels an NGO will need to establish this.

Public Health Inspectors (PHIs), Public Health Midwives (PHMs) and Public Health Nursing Sisters (PHNs) are trained only at NIHS; Assistant Medical Officers (AMOs) and laboratory technicians are also trained there.

The Institute is involved in Health Systems Research and in the production of Health Learning Materials (HLM). NIE is carrying out two AIDS-related projects: (1) an accelerated AIDS awareness and teaching project to meet the need for immediate information in the highest risk areas; and (2) research which will provide the basis for development of a Population and Family Life curriculum for islandwide use.

NIE has a very methodical approach to bringing AIDS education into the school system. First they are training nearly 500 principals, including 54 Tamil speaking ones to gain their support for this project. The one day sessions for principals will be completed in February, 1994. Additionally, 40 master teachers were trained in 4 day courses; thereafter, they attended a four day workshop to develop teaching materials for training 1,000 teachers, i.e. two teachers selected by the trained principals from their schools. Their courses will also be completed in February, 1994. The teachers thus trained will use prepared lessons to give children in grades 6-13 approximately two hours of AIDS awareness presented by means of lectures and discussion. This accelerated program is not integrated into the curriculum but will consist of separate sessions. Additionally, master teachers will carry the AIDS awareness to school children's parents at meetings of the School Development Councils.

NIE's research on knowledge, attitudes and practices is being conducted by NIE's Research Dept. on a sample of 5,840 students in grades 8-11 from 146 schools, plus 4 parents, 2 administrators and 10 teachers from each of those same schools. The survey covers a national sample selected from the Central Bank's economic zones and will provide the data for developing the Population and Family Life Curriculum. The revised curriculum should be in use islandwide sometime in 1995, with the information incorporated into social studies, science and health courses. AIDS and STDS are one component of the curriculum which also addresses human reproduction, the physiological and psychological changes during adolescence, marriage, family life and quality of life issues such as population.

Comments

On July 24, 1993, the National YWCA sponsored a national conference on AIDS. Five regional conferences have also been planned, of which two have already been held. There are currently 3 field secretaries, posted in Galle, Kurunegala and Negombo. Each participated in a three week training program at ARTI in 1992; the Family Planning Association and MOH provides them some training on AIDS.

The YWCA implements its AIDS awareness activities through its Youth, Family Life and Public Affairs programs. The National YWCA is a coordinating body for about thirty local branches. It is the branches which have membership; each branch has its own president and operates fairly autonomously. The national YWCA does not monitor their outreach programs. Complete information is not available for all YWCA branches. Kandy and Galle are described below as examples.

Representatives attended a conference on *Women and AIDS* sponsored by the Sri Lanka Women's Public Health Network (SLWPHN) in December, 1990. As a follow-up, a seminar on *AIDS and Adolescents* was conducted in June, 1991 with the SLWPHN for 74 boys and girls from 15 Kandy area schools.

The Kandy YWCA organized an AIDS poster competition in January, 1992 and later in the same year co-sponsored two conferences with the YMCA and with a Catholic organization. From 1992 to 1993, the YWCA has sponsored 3-4 programs for a total of 150-200 students invited from 15 schools in the Kandy area. Speakers have come from WHO, FPA and the SLAVSC. A typical program lasts about four hours and includes a lecture, discussions and tea. Future plans include introducing AIDS education through 15 school health clubs for children aged 15-19.

The organization considers its target groups for AIDS education to be school children, the general public, rural and urban poor, and YWCA members. About Rs. 5000.00 a year is spent on AIDS activities, constituting between one and two percent of the total budget. Funds for AIDS activities are from the YWCA's revenues from their girls' hostel, an annual craft fair and from the National YWCA.

Comments

Three staff members participated in a full day training course on AIDS given by the Family Planning Association. The Navayuga Social Development Forum began its AIDS education in June 1992 and has sponsored 24 AIDS seminars since then. Its staff lectures on AIDS for an hour and a half, then has discussions; for each lecture, the staff select 23-30 participants of reproductive age from among the members of their estate groups, as well as laborers from the urban poor. Additionally, they purchased brochures and posters from the Family Planning Association and posted them in estate libraries.

Mr. R. Michaelraju noted that many women leave the estate area for employment in Colombo and Moratuwa; upon return, they are often diseased. He notes the lack of hygiene in the estates and says their on-going health education program includes the following topics in addition to AIDS: purpose and use of toilets; sanitation; where to go for medical care; drugs, alcohol and smoking; safe drinking water; and baby care.

In the future, Navayuga would like to target visitors to Sri Pada during the peak season, December to May. Noting that many couples come for the outing, they want to distribute literature and talk to people about AIDS. The aim is to start this project in December, 1994.

Nest was founded in 1986 because of the "forgotten women" in the Mulleriyawa Mental Hospital, Unit II. Its goal is to promote understanding in areas of mental health; promote coping within communities; and "lift the yoke of labelling and stigmatization."

The organization operates 5 centers, the one at Hendala being a residential center. The name, Nest, reflects the goal of providing a safe haven to which one may come and from which one may fly away at will. Nest currently has 12 Community Health Workers (CHWs), and Ms. Hulugalle estimates that over 500 Public Health Midwives (PHMs) have received training as a result of Nest's efforts.

Nest has produced a home video in Sinhala, Tamil and English on attitudes towards AIDS, death and on care of the dying. For details about the video *He's My Brother*, contact Sanjaya Paul at 531305. Additionally, Nest has published a pamphlet, *Caring for the Dying* by Dr. D. Samarasinghe.

The residential center in Hendala is prepared to accept AIDS patients, and Nest will provide speakers on request to address groups about attitudes towards AIDS, stigmatization and caring for the dying. Nest has recently approved plans for two new AIDS activities. First, each of the five centers will have an open house on Saturdays from 1000 hrs. to 1700 hrs. for people living in the vicinity. The staff will serve refreshments, encourage people to relax and use the occasion for AIDS awareness.

Second, Nest will place an eye catching cartoon in newspapers along with a mail-in coupon to request information on AIDS. Requests received will be divided among Nest's CHWs according to location. Then, the CHWs will contact the individuals and give them information packets.

Until now, however, Universal Precautions are being implemented without disposable needles, syringes, gloves etc. The manual will be available in three months for use in hospitals.

80 Infection Control Nursing Officers (ICN) have been trained. Their responsibilities include
a) surveillance of hospital infections; b) daily follow-up of the epidemiological situation in a hospital;
c) development of hospital infection control policies; d) informing personnel on infection rates;
e) investigating outbreaks; f) training personnel in infection control; g) working as Secretary of the Infection Control Committee.

There are 12,170 nurses in government service and 291 hospitals. Nurses are involved in collecting, screening and testing blood; distribution of condoms; HIV testing; education, screening and treatment of STDs. Primary responsibility for those functions, however, lie outside the Nursing Section.

Eight volunteers trained in AIDS are working in Mannar. Another 33 are being trained for work in Kalpitiya, Puttalam and Murdel. The Rural Development Foundation runs full and half day seminars on AIDS as part of its health education program, averaging one AIDS seminar a month. Additionally, RDF handles funds and recruits widows for programs implemented by the Family Rehabilitation Center; their residential program for widows in Colombo includes an AIDS component. To date, ten AIDS awareness programs have been held in schools in Bandaragama (Colombo) and in Puttalam for a total of 1,075 school children. Additionally, 23 village programs have been held in Bandaragama and in Puttalam District for 1,197 participants.

Separate AIDS awareness programs are held for men, youth, women and elders. Founded five years ago, the Sarvodaya Women's Movement is a separate, legally registered entity. Though the Movement does not have a separate AIDS prevention program, it incorporates AIDS into on-going programs and has availed itself of opportunities to train its staff and grass roots workers.

On May 18, 1993, an AIDS/STD awareness program was held at the Borella Day Shelter for Street Children, an institution managed by the Women's Movement and funded by Save the Children Fund (UK). The seminar was attended by 35 mothers, fathers and teenagers and featured speakers and slides from the Health Education Bureau. Blood samples were taken from all participants. Prior to this program, Save the Children Fund had sponsored a program in February; Women's Movement staff at the Borella Center received AIDS education at that time.

In December 1992, 45 women from a community of beach squatters received AIDS training. Thirty-five grass roots level workers were invited for a seminar by the Family Planning Association in 1990, and another 25 were trained by the Family Health Bureau in October, 1992. Finally, a few staff of the Sarvodaya Women's Movement attended a seminar on Women and AIDS sponsored by the Sri Lanka Women's Public Health Network in 1990 and participated in an International AIDS Candlelight Memorial Program in May 1992.

Services Civil International is affiliated with an international organization of the same name. It is a membership organization having 250 members, including some in medical and paramedical professions. One member is Mr. Sirimal Pieris, a health education officer with the Health Education Bureau; he assists SCI as well as Gami Seva Sevana with their AIDS education efforts. All of SCI's AIDS awareness activities depend upon the volunteer labor of their members; the organizers of lectures pay the costs of transportation. As a result SCI spends little or nothing on AIDS awareness.

SCI has worked for three years in *10 camps* housing 1000 displaced families along the northwest coast. They have given numerous lectures, up to an hour long, and include information on prevention and transmission of AIDS, use of condoms and blood testing. Other AIDS awareness discussions are introduced into two week residential *work camps* which include study programs with villagers. Finally, SCI operates a *residential center* in Puttalam; the Center receives rehabilitated drug abusers from a residential program run by the NDDCB. In the center, the client receives some information on AIDS.

Currently, SCI is invited to give AIDS lectures once a month or once in two months. They do not advertise this service, but respond to requests from village organizations and schools.

SCI has two *resource people* who are willing to assist others.

(1) Dr. Athula Adhikari is a Medical Officer at the Base Hospital in Matale and is very active in conducting AIDS programs for SCI. He is willing to help others as well.

(2) Mr. M. Chandran (c/o SCI, Kandy) translates literature from English to Tamil. He is willing to translate AIDS literature on a voluntary basis.

SEDEC's Health Advisor, Dr. Joel Fernando, is also coordinating the Distance Education Project of the Independent Medical Practitioners' Association and is a member of the Sri Lanka Medical Society. SEDEC sponsored him to participate in the Work Group on AIDS organized by Caritas Internationalis to set out guidelines for the Catholic Church's response to the AIDS pandemic. In this capacity, he has travelled widely learning about AIDS. Additionally, SEDEC sent abroad one priest and a nursing nun for AIDS training. Thereafter, the priest designed a course of AIDS education, but has gone to the Philippines before implementing his plans.

In one edition of *The Animator: SEDEC Development Education Information Sheet*, Dr. J. Fernando summarized the Church's international policy on AIDS as a "providential challenge . . . to reassert healthy ethics . . ." The Bishop's Conference in Sri Lanka has approved of having AIDS awareness programs, though the concept of "safe sex" is a disputed area within the Church.

Until now, SEDEC's AIDS awareness efforts are limited. Three or four times a year, SEDEC conducts residential workshops of about five days duration in Colombo for women and youth leaders. During these workshops about half a day is devoted to health issues, and within that segment Dr. Fernando gives an hour lecture on AIDS. Therefore, between 60 and 80 trainees a year hear this AIDS awareness message.

Dr. Fernando is aware of the need for AIDS education and is recommending to SEDEC three areas of involvement:

1. AIDS awareness as a regular component of women's and youth programs;
2. increasing awareness among Catholic clergy, nuns and lay leaders of the Church; and
3. strengthening the AIDS Information Center at SEDEC Headquarters.

Fr. Firth expects to implement an AIDS awareness program among their current target groups upon the return of the trained priest in mid-1994, though no definite plans have been made.

SEDEC is the coordinating body for *10 branches* in Sri Lanka. The branches operate quite independently, while SEDEC assists in monitoring and evaluation; finding funds; providing training and research support and maintaining links with international organizations. Of the ten organizations, SETIK appears separately in this directory, and EHED in Trincomalee has indicated they are training community health volunteers, including AIDS in the curriculum, currently with the assistance of doctors from the Sri Lanka Red Cross Society and previously with help from Medecins Sans Frontieres' doctors. The main AIDS educators for the Air Force are Public Health Inspectors (PHIs), first trained at the National Institute of Health Sciences and afterwards trained in three day courses organized by the Ministry of Defense and conducted by the Family Planning Association. The additional training focuses on AIDS, STDs and family planning.

According to Dr. Gunaratne, all 10,000 Air Force personnel have heard an AIDS awareness lecture and there have been at least 200 programs in 1993 alone. He comments, that he would like to extend AIDS awareness activities to the general public in the area of Air Force bases. For example, the Air Force could conduct school programs or transport blood samples for testing.

Comments

SLANA is a membership based organization with 4,800 individual and institutional members who are mainly under 18 years of age. All members receive the *SLANA Newsletter*, which regularly incorporates some information on AIDS.

Additionally, SLANA's drug prevention awareness programs include about 15 minutes of awareness raising in an hour and a half program. The AIDS component is concerned with eliciting adolescents' knowledge and attitudes about HIV/AIDS, though some information on transmission and prevention is also included.

SLANA's planned research aims to develop guidelines for integrating AIDS awareness in a culturally appropriate manner into their programs for primary prevention of drug abuse. Sample size has not been determined, but the sample is expected to include school children and youth, SLANA membership, youthful offenders, clients of drug rehabilitation centers and STD clinic patients. The research will go on for 6-8 months, including 2-3 months of field work. A draft report should be available by July 1994.

Comments

Prior to 1993, AIDS awareness activities in the Army were carried out by some NGOs, especially the Family Planning Association, as well as by Dr. J. Moonemale. Since January 10, 1993, the Army has implemented AIDS awareness with its own trainers. One circuit of the Army's bases has been completed; due to personnel turnover, trainers will begin another circuit in the near future.

As of June, 1993, the Army decided to train three lab technicians to do serodia tests for HIV; 2 medical officers for AIDS; and 20 paramedical staff for prevention programs. In fact, 15 Army staff have been trained as trainers in residential programs, and 28 AIDS awareness programs have been carried out between January and November 1993 by Army trainers. A typical AIDS awareness program includes two hours of exposure to AIDS information; lectures, videos, discussion and posters are included in the program. Condoms are made available to the soldiers at the awareness sessions.

The Army Medical Services also plan to establish an AIDS Center at the Military Hospital in Colombo; the center will be responsible for testing, surveillance, counselling and awareness programs. Until now, surveillance is only being done on returnees from India and Pakistan as well as volunteers.

Comments

SLAPSW was one of the earliest organizations to engage in AIDS prevention activities and one of the least publicized. Working largely with its own resources, including volunteer work by its members, the President estimates SLAPSW has trained up to 10,000 people about AIDS to date. As professional social workers, some members also work in key positions in organizations carrying out AIDS prevention activities, including at WHO, NDDCB and SLAVSC.

The current *research* on drugs and AIDS is being carried out by two students from the School of Social Work in Colombo under the direction of W.S. Dissanayake in an 8 month project. The research will examine relationships among prostitution, IV drug use and issues of treatment rehabilitation and prevention. The work is being carried out in Matale, Kurunegala, Kegalle, Nawalapitiya, Nuwara Eliya and Kandy. Contact W.S. Dissanayake for details. Additionally, 10 social workers were trained to be independent teachers on drugs and AIDS in Kurunegala.

Mr. W.S. Dissanayake is *translating* some writings on AIDS from English to Sinhala. His work includes a WHO manual on training counsellors; policy papers on AIDS by the International Federation of Social Workers; a UNDP report on AIDS in Asia; and documents on populations. Comments

The Sri Lanka Bureau of Foreign Employment (SLBFE) conducts two and four day orientation programs for Sri Lankans going abroad for employment. Currently, participation is voluntary and, in 1992, attracted only 500 participants out of an estimated 55,000 legal migrants, i.e. less than 1%, and a total of 125,000 migrants including illegal ones.

Typically, an orientation program includes training in proper use of appliances, language skills, investment and savings, travel formalities and health. The health component consists of an hour and a half lecture, including information on STDs and AIDS, with about 20 minutes being devoted to AIDS. No written information is distributed.

Mr. L.K. Ruhunage, the Senior Research Officer, comments that the SLBFE is in a position to assist the National AIDS/STD Program in disseminating AIDS information among persons going abroad for employment. If the MOH provided the SLBFE with AIDS brochures in Tamil as well as in Sinhala, the Bureau could distribute them at orientation sessions and at their airport information desk.

SLEJF's emphasis is on influencing media personnel to disseminate AIDS information. This organization won the UN Environmental Program's (UNEP) Global 500 Award at the Rio Conference in 1992. SLEJF has 87 volunteers, all of who are media personnel.

There are two street drama troupes composed of volunteers and formed in February 1993. Of the 25 shows done to date, about 8 have included a 15 minute segment on AIDS. The content stresses the dangers of AIDS and its association with tourism and foreign culture, but does *not* include much information on transmission or prevention. All performances are in Sinhala and performed in the open air.

SLEJF has been doing about four school programs a month since 1987; each program addresses 600-700 students. Since 1992 about half of the programs have included information of AIDS; in other words, about 1200 to 1400 students a month hear about AIDS in these programs. SLEJF invites speakers from the Health Education Bureau.

The Sri Lanka Women's Public Health Network (SLWPHN) was founded in June, 1989 by concerned women, mainly from the fields of medicine, media and government. The objective was to contribute to alleviating the increasing ill health of women due to growing socio-economic pressures by providing practical assistance, creating awareness and disseminating information about services available to women.

The Network's first public activity was to observe World AIDS Day, December 1st, 1990 with a seminar on *Women and Aids*, organized by the SLWPHN, sponsored by WHO and in collaboration with the National AIDS/STD Program and the Health Educational Bureau, MOH. Twenty-one women's NGOs, as well as a cross section of women from media and health agencies, were encouraged to undertake AIDS prevention activities. As a follow-up to the seminar, an *AIDS and Adolescents* program was conducted in June, 1991 with the YWCA of Kandy. Seventy four A-level boys and girls participated, representing 15 schools in the Kandy division.

Again, the SLWPHN organized a conference in collaboration with the Commonwealth Medical Association, and to be held from October 23rd to 27th, 1993. The Conference is entitled: *The Role of Women in the Prevention and Control of AIDS and HIV Infection and in the Care and Support of those affected by the Disease*.

In 1992 and 1993, ten workshops have been held, and a total of 372 field officers have been trained, including Rural Development Officers (RDOs), Assistant Directors of Planning and people implementing women's activities. Comments

The "Model Residential, Welfare and Education Center for Women Workers" is a 42 month UNFPA funded project being implemented by the Workers' Education Division of the Department of Labor. This is the Division's sixth project with UNFPA funding, which began in 1973. AIDS awareness forms a significant component of a more comprehensive project which aims to improve the living, educational and recreational facilities for migrant female workers in the Katunayake Free Trade Zone (FTZ).

The Workers' Education Division carries out four types of AIDS awareness programs:

(1) "In-plant" programs are done in work places. During a three hour program, a doctor spends about one and a quarter hours talking about AIDS with slides and transparencies.

(2) Outdoor programs are held at eight o'clock in the evening near boarding houses where the women workers live. The programs include a film (not about AIDS), a family planning lecture and a forty-five minute lecture on AIDS with transparencies.

(3) The Division has trained 94 "big sisters," selected from among nurses working in the FTZ and opinion leaders from among the workers. These women received 36 hours of training over 12 - 13 weeks on AIDS, STDs, maternal/child care, substance abuse, self-defense and labor laws. These women are available to provide information informally to workers. Additionally, the Assistant Warden of the Divisions' Model Hostel is a retired nurse, trained in counselling.

(4) Even outside this FTZ project, all workers' education programs in the Western Province, conducted by Labor Secretariat personnel, include a fifteen minute talk on transmission and prevention of AIDS.

There are 84 factories in the Katunayake FTZ; the Division has covered 48 of them in 68 work place meetings, which reached 18,680 workers. The outdoor meetings reached 1,905 people in 12 meetings held in 1992 and 6,988 people at 54 outdoor programs in 1993. The Division expects to reach another 20,000 by the end of 1994 when the project will end.

Mr. R. Dharmalingam comments that the Division would like to expand their health education programs and incorporate AIDS awareness into all workers' education programs. Currently, AIDS is included only in programs conducted in the Western Province by Labor Secretariat personnel. Additionally, the Division would like to build a permanent education center in the Katunayake FTZ. He feels the Department of Labor already has links to employers and work places and the capacity to educate organized as well as unorganized workers.

World View International Foundation (WVIF) is carrying out 2 AIDS projects, one funded by SIDA and the other by NORAD. The SIDA funded project, "Population and AIDS," will produce a series of videos on population, environment and AIDS; the target audiences include 100 NGOs and 100 Seva Wanitha Groups in government departments and ministries. This is a three year project which began in September, 1993.

The NORAD project, "Awareness and Education on AIDS. Communication Strategy for the Prevention of AIDS in Sri Lanka," has six components.

1. Inter-Youth Club Stamp Competition. This component targeted 6,000 Youth Clubs of the National Youth Services Council. First, 130 youth trainers received AIDS training, with each participant being given a communicator's manual; an AIDS training manual from the Health Education Bureau; a set of 5 audio tapes containing recorded lectures on AIDS related topics; and a set of laminated prompt cards for use in small discussion groups. Those trainers carried out 250 - 300 programs at district level, inviting one or more participants from each of the 6,000 youth clubs. Club representatives received a WVIF booklet on AIDS. As a follow-up activity, WVIF sponsored an inter-club stamp competition, culminating in a stamp and poster exhibition at the Lionel Wendt gallery and a winning stamp which will be issued by the post office in December, 1993.

2. Television docudrama on AIDS. WVIF produced a 58 minute Sinhala drama, Dayabara Priyanka which has been aired once on television. Copies are available for Rs. 4,000 by contacting WVIF.

3. Symposia for Ayurvedic physicians. WVIF held 17 one day symposia in 17 districts for a total of 1,886 participants out of 2,433 invited. The program imparted information on AIDS as well as communication skills for teaching about the subject. WVIF would like to develop a follow-up program for Ayurvedic physicians.

4. Radio Program. WVIF produces a 30 minute weekly radio program on AIDS; the format includes an educational component as well as a short drama. The last of 52 programs will be aired in December, 1993. Through letters received from the public, WVIF has identified 387 members of the audience with whom WVIF would like to develop long term relationships.

5. Community based information on Aids will not implemented due to lack of funds.

6. Messages on Railway Tickets cannot be implemented due to official policies.

NORAD funding is only guaranteed until December, 1993, at which time Phase I, including components 1-4 will have been completed.
